Chief of
Police**

FLORENCE — The Civil Service Board in Florence selected Acting Police Chief Mike Holt for the permanent police chief position last week.

Holt was appointed acting chief by Mayor Andy Betterton in June while the Civil Service Board decided who would take

the permanent role. Holt replaces Ron Tyler, who recently retired.

A release from the mayor's office indicated that Holt assumed the permanent position immediately.

"With 28 years of experience and leadership at the Florence Police Department as well as instructor experience at NWSOC and UNA, Chief Holt is well-equipped to handle the demands of his new position. He has dedicated his life to the protection of our citizens and has received numerous awards and honors along the way," the release stated.

"We are happy to have an individual with Chief Holt's experience and expertise, and we look forward to working with him as head of the police department."

ARLINGTON—The United Athletic Conference was set to host its 2024 Football Media Day on Tuesday, July 23 as the University of North Alabama joined the eight other league members in Arlington, Texas.

UNA was to be represented by seventh-year wide receiver, **Takairee Kenebrew**, incoming redshirt senior linebacker, **Jackson Bratton**, and second year head coach, **Brent Dearmon**.

For the second straight season, the UAC was hosting a full day of media activities at Texas Live! near Globe Life Field, home of the Texas Rangers baseball team.

Kenebrew, Bratton, and Dearmon were to

be involved in several activities Tuesday, including an exclusive interview on ESPN+ at noon, some one-on-one interviews, social media interactions and promotional photos for the conference.

UNA opens the 2024 season one week early, as the Lions will participate in the Week 0 FCS Kickoff hosted by ESPN Events on Saturday, August 24 at the historic Cramton Bowl in Montgomery. The game will kickoff at 6pm against Southeast Missouri and will be nationally televised on ESPN.

director for the Parks and Recreation Department, said the field has been a long-time goal of the department's, and anyone who experiences a game will understand why.

"If you've never seen a game like this, you'll have fun, you'll laugh, you'll cry, and you'll probably dance," Adams said.

The field will host two one-inning games at 4pm on Thursday, July 25. Two children's teams will play each other in one game and two adult teams will play another game. The event also is expected to feature a "home run derby" that allows all participants to run the bases.

Florence is organizing an autumn Miracle Field league that will start this year, Adams said. Anyone interested can call 256-760-6416. He said Muscle Shoals has a Miracle Field and he has watched many games there. In fact, he said Muscle Shoals Parks and Recreation officials have been supportive of the Florence field.

"We'll work closely with Muscle Shoals, SCOPE 310 and with schools," Adams said.

He said players in Muscle Shoals select walk-up music for when they come to bat, and during the home-run derby they run bases to the music, often dancing from third base to home plate.

"We want to do that here," he said.

There is 30 feet between bases, which are level with the ground so anyone in a wheelchair can roll over them. In fact, the entire field is level. The dugouts are deep and have wide entrances for access.

Adams said the field was built with the community in mind.

"It's about building the community and bringing them together to see something like this," he said. "If you ever have a bad day, come out here and I guarantee that'll change things."

Forrest to Play in Germany...

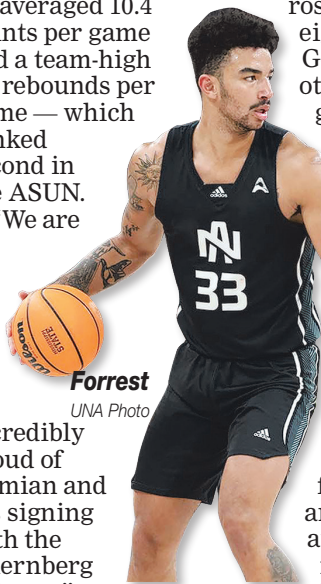

Kathrine Griggs and former UNA golfer Carter Goodwin. Now, men's basketball forward **Damian Forrest** can be added to the list. Last week, Atlantic Sun Conference All-Tournament selection and multi-time Academic All-ASUN selection signed a pro contract with Nuernberg Falcons BC in Germany. He will begin play this upcoming season.

"This would not have been possible without my teammates, coach **Tony Pujol**, coach **Ahmad Smith**, as well as the rest of the UNA coaching staff," said Forrest, who completed three seasons of games for the Lions. "They brought me on years ago and saw the potential in me and greatness I can achieve as a player and a man before I even knew. They are instrumental in me being able to have achieved the opportunity

to play professionally." Forrest started 92 career games for the Lions over three seasons, making the fifth-most appearances for UNA since moving to Division I in 2018. As a senior, he averaged 10.4 points per game and a team-high 8.2 rebounds per game — which ranked second in the ASUN. "We are

incredibly proud of Damian and his signing with the Nuernberg Falcons," said Pujol, UNA's head coach. "His discipline, determination and contagious personality has impacted our men's basketball program and the athletic department. He has been a great ambassador for the University of North

Alabama and Shoals community. We look forward to watching Damian do great things in his professional career."

Forrest is one of six Americans on the roster, while the other eight players are from Germany. He joins one other recent NCAA graduate, **Mohamed Fofana**, who is from Harlem, N.Y. and played at Valdosta State before joining the Nuernberg roster in 2023.

One interesting fact about Forrest is that he can speak multiple languages, including German. In fact, Forrest recorded an introduction video and addressed his new fan base in German. That video was recorded in the UNA locker room.

"I am so grateful for UNA and the community of support and love that embraced me when I first got here," Forrest said. "UNA and the surrounding community made my journey so enjoyable, helped me really fall in love with the game of basketball and created life-long friendships and relationships. It makes me proud to say I will always have a home in Florence because of that."

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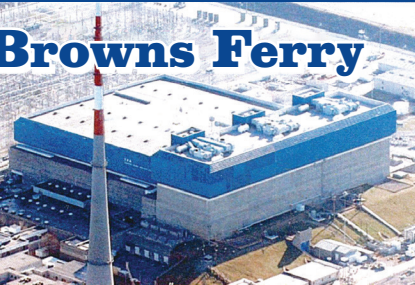

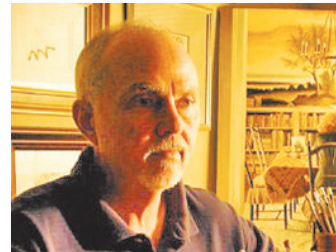

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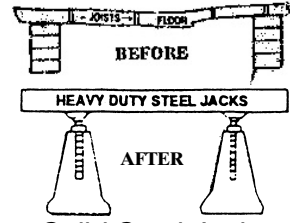

What Is Rental Car Coverage and How Does It Work?

It's usually a standard question at a rental car company counter: "Do you need rental car insurance?" Considering the rental car company has insurance on their car, you have insurance on your personal car and you may also have rental coverage available through your credit card, what should you do?

What is rental car insurance coverage?
 Typically, coverage through a rental car company falls into five categories:

- **Collision damage waiver (CDW) or Loss damage waiver (LDW):** Releases you from damages that occur to the rental car, including vandalism and theft.
- **Liability:** Provides coverage for damages or injuries you may cause with the rented vehicle.
- **Personal accident insurance (PAI):** Protects you and your passengers should injuries occur while driving the rental car.
- **Personal effects coverage (PEC):** Covers personal items that may be stolen from the rented vehicle.
- **Roadside assistance:** Covers emergency roadside expenses, lost keys and travel assistance.

Do I need rental car insurance?
 Many personal vehicle insurance policies already include some sort of car rental insurance coverage — so if you purchase a rental car policy, you're paying extra when you may not have to. Let your State Farm® agent know the reason for the rental so they can help assess how coverage from your personal vehicle policy might apply.

Does my credit card cover rental car insurance?
 If you pay for a rental car with a major credit card, the card issuer may offer secondary car rental insurance at no charge. In general, this coverage will be used after your personal auto insurance policy is used. Keep in mind that credit card coverage varies from card to card and the institutions which issue the cards.

Review your rental coverage options
 Don't sign anything or agree to coverage without reading the policy thoroughly.

What if I'm using a car sharing or a peer-to-peer service?
 According to the Insurance Information Institute (III), coverages can vary greatly. If you're renting from a nontraditional car sharing company, review the agreement.

Do I need international car rental insurance when abroad?
 Contact your agent and credit card company well in advance of your trip.

Renting for work or play?
 Coverage extensions from your existing policy or your credit card may not apply if you're renting a car for business.

Select the right size rental vehicle
 When reserving a car, know how many people will be traveling with you and how much luggage room you will need. You'll want to have enough space to see clearly out of each window and to keep passengers comfortable.

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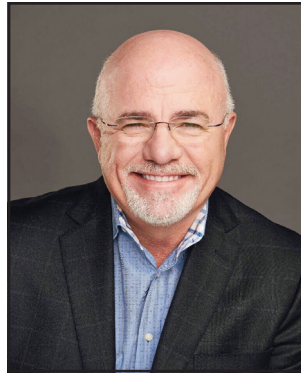
DAVE Says

 Okay, you're telling me you just got out from under \$800 worth of car payments



each month, and you want to dive right back in by financing another one? I think you've missed the point of my plan. The point is to get out of debt, not just move it around or try to juggle smaller portions.

What you're actually saying is you're thinking about putting your family's financial future in jeopardy, because you want to go on camping trips in a roomier car. That's a bad plan! For you guys, something like this right now would be a luxury item. Did you know I went without a vacation for four years trying to get my life back together after I went broke? Four years! I'm not suggesting you live with this attitude for the rest of your life, but I'm pretty sure there are other ways to make family camping trips happen.

Long story short, you don't need a different vehicle to go camping. And you definitely don't need to go back into car debt to go camping. Buy a couple of tents, throw them in the

back of the car and head for the woods. If your cars are *really* just too small to handle everything, then rent a bigger car for the weekend. I'd rather you spend a few bucks doing something like that once in a while than picking up another car payment.

Your mindset on this worries me, Sara. The reason for getting out of debt is to live a better life. Living debt-free is smart, less stressful and it makes everything else feel lighter and easier to manage. Live like no one else, so that later, you can live like no one else. Remember?

Please, don't do it.

Kitchen Ideas for Aging-in-Place

Dear Savvy Senior,
My 77-year-old mother, who loves to cook has had several kitchen-related accidents over the past year. What tips can you recommend for making a kitchen safer and more practical for seniors, without doing a big expensive remodel.
Inquiring Daughter

Dear Inquiring,

There are a number of small improvements and simple modifications you can do that can make a big difference in making your mom's kitchen safer and easier to maneuver. Depending on her needs, here are some tips for different aspects of her kitchen.

Lights: If the lighting in your mom's kitchen needs improvement, replace the old overhead fixture with a bright new ceiling light, and add LED lighting under upper kitchen cabinets to brighten up her kitchen countertops.

Floors: If she has kitchen throw rugs, to reduce tripping or slipping, replace them with non-skid floor mats or consider gel mats, which are cushiony and more comfortable to stand on for long periods. GelPro.com and WellnessMats.com offer a nice selection.

Cabinets and drawers: To reduce bending or reaching, organize your mom's kitchen cabinets and drawers so that the items she most frequently uses are within comfortable reach. You can also make her lower cabinets and pantry easier to access by installing pullout shelves or lazy susans. And, by installing pull-down shelves in her upper cabinets (see Rev-a-shelf.com) so she doesn't have to get on a stool to reach things on high shelves. I also recommend replacing her cabinet and drawer knobs with "D" or "C" shaped pull-handles because they're more comfortable for arthritic hands to grasp than knobs.

Faucet: If your mom has a twist-handle kitchen faucet, replace it with an ADA compliant single handle faucet, or with a touch, motion or digital smart faucet. They're easier to operate, especially if she has hand arthritis or gripping problems. And, for safety purposes, set her hot water tank at 120 degrees to prevent possible water burns.

Microwave and cooktop safety: If your mom's microwave is mounted above her stove, consider moving it, or get her a small microwave for the countertop so she doesn't have to reach over a cooktop to insert or remove food. And if you're worried about your mom forgetting to turn off the stove there are automatic shut-off devices you can purchase and install to prevent a fire. [iGuardStove](http://iGuardStove.com) (iGuardFire.com) makes one of the best smart shutoff devices for gas and electric stoves. And to guard against microwave fires, there's the SmartMicro microwave shutoff made by Pioneering Technology (PioneeringTech.com).

Shopping for Appliances

If you're looking to upgrade some of your mom's appliances, here are some different features to keep in mind.

Refrigerator: French-door refrigerators that open in the middle are great for seniors because it makes it easier to see and reach what's inside. Pullout adjustable height shelves and a water/ice dispenser on the outside of the door are also very convenient.

Stove or cooktop: Look for one with controls in the front so your mom won't have to reach over hot burners to turn it off, and make sure the controls are easy to see. Flat surface electric or induction burners, or continuous grates on gas stoves are also great for sliding heavy pots and pans from one burner to the next. And ask about automatic shut off burners.

Oven: Self-cleaning ovens are a plus and consider a side-swing door model. They're easier to get into because you don't have to lean over a hot swing-down door. Also consider a wall-mounted oven, installed at your mom's preferred height to eliminate bending.

Dishwasher: Consider a drawer-style dishwasher that slides in and out for easier access and, if possible, have it installed on a raised platform 12 to 24 inches above floor level so it can be loaded and unloaded without bending over.

Washer and dryer: Front-load washers and dryers with pedestals that raise the height around 24 inches are also back-savers and easier to access.

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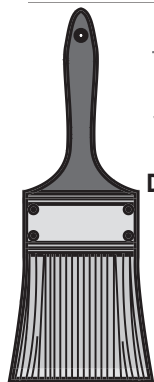

Few More Yards), states, "When the Student Government Association passed a resolution in favor of an on-campus stadium for football in 2018, the document indicated the willingness of students to shoulder a fee as part of making the dream a reality. The Board of Trustees set a fee that students would pay for construction of the football stadium. This fee was \$30 per semester hour. Were the students aware of this amount when they gave their indications? Many of UNA students have college debt to repay at graduation.

Based on the press release, the noted fee should have been called a Football Construction Fee! This was not the case. The Trustees designated the term, General Studies Fee. This is very misleading to all students but especially for those enrolling in 2019 and later.

The UNA press release omitted the amount the students had provided for the construction. For one year, 30 credit hours over two semesters, the GSF would be \$900 (30 x \$30) per student. Let's say for year 2019 UNA had 3,000 students that paid the full GSF of \$900. The total raised for the year would be \$2,700,000 (3,000 students times \$900). For years 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023, the total raised (using 3,000 students again) would be \$10,800,000. The overall total would be \$13,500,000 and I believe that is low! UNA must provide the actual amount received from all students through the General Studies Fee!

The press release also stated, "There is no plan now or in the future to assess a student fee to build or operate Bank Independent Stadium." This press release leads one to believe that UNA eliminated the GSF in 2024. But according to the *FLOR-ALA*, UNA's student newspaper, fees depending on student's major (area of study) were significantly increased. These fees ranged from \$60-\$100 per semester hour. The smallest fee, \$60, is for the College of Education

and Human Services and for two semesters would provide \$1,800 (30 semester hours times \$60) per student. The highest fee, \$100, is for the Anderson School of Nursing and Health Professions and would provide \$3,000 (30 times \$100) per student.

The students must be recognized for their contributions!

"4 Parts of Medicare"

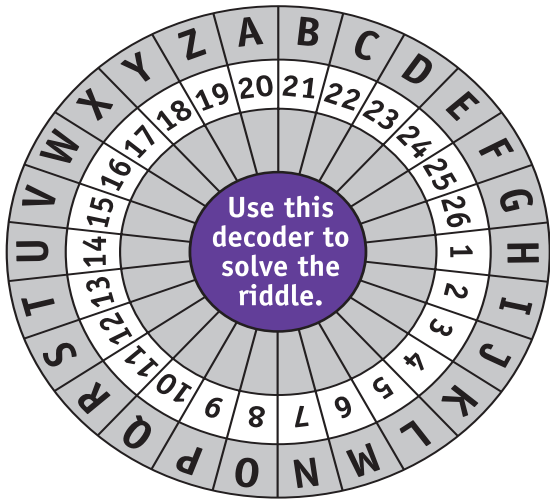

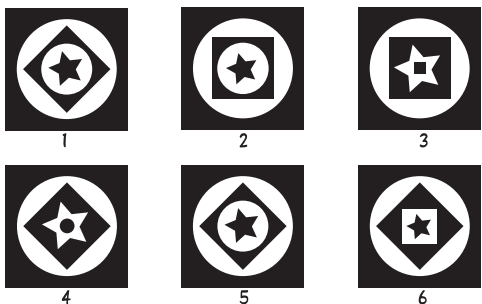

Florence Historian

SPOTLIGHTING CHIEF DONALD WHITE

Mr. Donald White served as the Chief of the City of Florence's Fire Department for the entire first half of the twentieth century. Near the end of his long tenure, he compiled an interesting list entitled "Some of the Hardest Fires I Ever Fought." It totaled 25 major fires covering the period, 1902-1955, and it noted the location of each fire, along with the exact date and the time of day that each occurred. Here are eight of the 25 on the list:

1. Rogers Department Store – June 5, 1909, 6:30 p.m.
2. First Baptist Church – July 6, 1909, 4:00 p.m.
3. Normal College [now UNA] Wesleyan Hall – March 26, 1910, 10:30 p.m.
4. First Methodist Church – December 20, 1919, 12:05 a.m.
5. Jefferson Hotel – April 26, 1923, 11:30 a.m.
6. Martin Stove and Range – December 13, 1936 3:00 a.m.
7. Stricklin Lumber Company – April 5, 1943, 6:00 a.m.
8. Sheffield Bakery – November 30, 1952 (no time listed)

Of course, there were many other fires, but Mr. White considered these the top 25 in terms of difficulty. Serving as the Chief for more than a half century, he became a kind of legend in his own time. And his list is an important document in Florence's archives. With it, a historian can easily take the information and find a newspaper online to learn the details of a specific fire event.

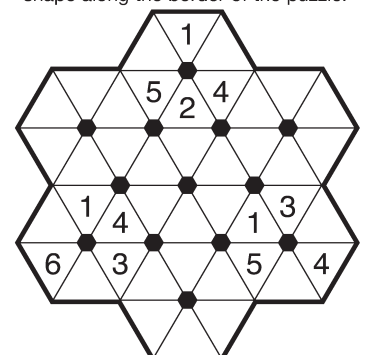
