

Gaining Insight on Education

Colleges Visit Lakeshore Technical College to Gain Insight on Competency-based Education

As recognition grows in Lakeshore Technical College's expanding delivery of competency-based education, the college is experiencing an increasing number of visits from other colleges interested in adopting or expanding the education delivery model on their campuses. The college was visited recently by Umpqua Community College, located in Oregon, and Northeast Iowa Community College.

"Moving programs to competency-based education has proven successful for many of our programs," says Vice President of Instruction Dr. Meredith Sauer. "We realized our traditional schedules with rigid requirements for students to be on campus were barriers to potential students who were working and/or had family commitments. Competency-based education provides flexibility so college can fit around their work and personal commitments."

The Competency-Based Education Network defines competency-based education as an approach to learning that emphasizes what people can do, not the amount of time they spend in a classroom. Lakeshore also describes it as a model offering students the ability to learn when they want to, progress at their own pace, and receive personalized coaching and support.

Since moving to competency-based education delivery, Sauer says Lakeshore's medical coder program enrollment has increased 100%, with welding and auto collision also experiencing significant increases of 60% and 77% respectively.

Competency-based education, or CBE, is becoming more common in higher education across the U.S. and according to a 2020 survey report from the American Institute for Research, was available at 128 institutions, with each offering at least one program. Lakeshore began offering programs through CBE in 2020; it will be offering more than 50% of its programs through the model when the fall 2024 semester begins.

Visiting Lakeshore from Northeast Iowa and Umpqua were instructors, deans, and success coaches. Northeast Iowa, which currently offers welding and



business management as CBE programs, observed how the model operates in manufacturing and technology programs at Lakeshore, engaging students in both in-person, hands-on learning and online coursework. Umpqua was interested in the potential benefits of offering

programs through CBE, though does not currently deliver any programs through the method.

Officers elected for the next term include John Wyatt, chair; Kim Rooney, vice chair; and Monica Nichter, secretary/treasurer.

Lakeshore has an appointed board consisting of nine members: two employer members, two employee members, three additional members, one elected official member who holds a state or local office, and one school district administrator. Three members are appointed to the Lakeshore Board of Trustees each year by a committee comprised of the county board chairs of the counties making up the Lakeshore district: Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Calumet, and Ozaukee. Terms for the three board members sworn in July 8 expire June 30, 2027.

Brauer has been reappointed as an employee member. He is a business representative for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local 494. His role involves leading strategic planning efforts to communicate organizational priorities and mobilize stakeholders to advocate for labor-friendly legislation on the local, state and federal levels. He also serves as a Sheboygan County Board supervisor and is a member of Habitat Lakeside's board of directors.



Elkhart Lake Cemetery Association Retirement Announced

Dennis Raeder has announced his retirement from the Elkhart Lake Cemetery Association after 35+ years of service as Sexton of St. John's and Trinity Cemeteries. 'What is a sexton?' you may ask...A sexton is responsible for the general care-taking of a church and/ or graveyard property. It is an occasional position, who's main responsibility is locating and marking grave lots at the time of purchase and for burials. General care-taking includes grounds maintenance such as overseeing physical needs such as tree trimming, lawn care (not including mowing as that is hired out), seasonal lot marking, signage or gravestone maintenance issues and reporting such to the Association's Board of Trustees. Additionally, the sexton interacts with funeral directors, grave digger and lawn cutting services.

Raeder first became interested in cemetery business partly because his father served on the Board of Trustees when Dennis was young. He helped his dad cut the grass when needed, later becoming the grass cutter and then sexton. He reports enjoying working as sexton for several reasons, including appreciation for the look of a well-cared for cemetery and meeting the families of those who were laid to rest. There were many interesting stories to tell! Dennis was proud of the work he did as sexton.

The Association is seeking a new Sexton as of January 2025, but is looking to begin training someone this year to ensure a smooth transition. The Elkhart Lake Cemetery Association was formed in 1944 and oversees the management of both

St. John's Cemetery, located at W5964 Cty Rd A on the north and south sides of the road, and Trinity Cemetery located at W6095 Cty Rd M. Although affiliated with Elkhart Lake's Community United Church of Christ, the Association is its own entity and burial rites to the lots are available for public purchase regardless of church affiliation. Informational brochures with lot purchase and pricing information are available for pick up at each site, or you may contact the Association via email shown above. The Board of Trustees is comprised of lot owners and representatives of Community UCC. Long-time board members include Fred Kramer, President and Nancy Raeder, Secretary. Additional current Board members include Cliff Miller, Sharon Dirks, Atty Sue Schleisner and Michelle Zirbel. Dennis Raeder is Sexton, and Kelly Mehre serves as Treasurer; these positions are separate from Board members.

The Cemeteries themselves have been in existence since the mid-late 1800's with graves dating back to the 1860's at Trinity and 1890's at St. John's. Burial sites of many local dignitaries of the Elkhart Lake area can be found there, such as Herman Siebkin, establisher of Siebkin's Resort; Clemens Mudrow, our first Village Marshal and charter member of the E.L. Fire Dept; William Schwarz Jr, famed local boat tour captain and was the organizer of the E.L. Fire Dept as well as our first fire chief; Louis Laun of Laun Bros Lumber, Furniture & Grain businesses and establisher of the original Bank of Elkhart Lake; George W. Brickbauer, MD, was a long-time medic in Plymouth, Elkhart and New Holstein; Howard Kraemer, who served as our first Village President, was famous for his orchestra and Naval career, and was a band instructor at E.L. High School; Clif Tufte, founder of Road America; Ronald Mauk was a renowned teacher and principal at E.L. High School; and Burdie Grashorn, prominent village resident and local philanthropist. These are but a few of the notable persons who contributed to the formation and fame of Elkhart Lake found resting at St. John's or Trinity cemeteries.

This campaign can be seen in print, digital, billboard and social media placements. Sharing these beautiful messages and images provide inspiration for planning and booking an Elkhart Lake Vacation. networking opportunities. Chamber Cash is a great member benefit which keeps dollars flowing through the Village. The popular Depot Dispatch is the Chamber's monthly newspaper highlighting new businesses, community news and events. Schnee Days, Farmers and Artisans Market, Downtown Night, Elktoberfest, Christmas in the Square are all brought to you by the Chamber of Commerce staff and volunteers. These efforts focus on encouraging sustainable economic growth and cultivating new business development.

It's not surprising that there is confusion about the differing rolls and responsibilities of Village government, Tourism Department and Chamber of Commerce. We're fortunate to have these entities working collaboratively while maintaining our different but integral roles in growing and strengthening the Village of Elkhart Lake.

Elkhart Lake Tourism is a department of the Village and located at the Elkhart Lake Welcome Center at 41 E. Rhine St. Different from other departments, the Tourism Department Tourism development is a secondary effort which involves advocating and supporting destination and infrastructure improvements. Some recent efforts include concerns with outdoor music levels, need for additional trash receptacles, and evaluating the introduction of EV charging to the Village. The goal is to strengthen the visitor economy and enhance the community's quality of life while preserving Elkhart Lake's quaint resort town culture.

New Home Dedication

Habitat for Humanity Lakeside brought its 51st affordable home to Sheboygan. They dedicated a new home on Oakland Ave in Sheboygan to the Hernandez-Perez Family on June 5th.

Community members, volunteers, and supporters gathered at the newly completed Habitat home on the afternoon of June 5th to celebrate another family's transition to home ownership. The Hernandez family is formed by a strongwilled, hardworking, and caring mother, Adriana, and a loving, strong, resilient daughter, Demi. This three-bedroom, two-bathroom home is Habitat's second ADA-accommodated home. Adriana needed to find a housing solution for her daughter that would make it easier to complete day-to-day tasks and find a home that would provide the appropriate support at any stage of Demi's life. The house was able to be built to support those needs. Habitat built wilder hallways, a curbless shower, therapy room, extra storage closet, garage, and grab bars throughout.

A home through the Habitats home buyer program is not a handout but a hand-up. As engaged contributors in establishing an improved future for their families, qualified Habitat homeowner partners must meet specific criteria: need better housing, be willing to give back in service in the form of "sweat equity" or other services, and be able to afford an affordable mortgage. Adriana completed 263 "sweat equity" hours to build their home and will receive a zeropercent interest mortgage while paying back her loan. At the dedication, Adriana spoke of hope and resilience. Habitat programs provide the foundation from which homebuyers build family stability and self-reliance. Habitat and its many partners and community volunteers benefit individual homeowners and the community. Generous donations were made by Drexel Building Supply, IBEW 494, and the SMART Union Local 18.










ELGSD Update from District Administrator: Dr. Adam Englebretson

Summer Projects:

This summer has been a busy one in the district. The maintenance staff has been working hard cleaning and updating the facilities. Summer is a great time to complete projects around the buildings.

The following items were completed this summer:

- Refinished the High School and Elementary/ Middle School Gymnasium floors

- Installed LED lighting in the High School Gymnasium

- Purchased new vans for student transportation

- Updated Elementary/ Middle School Library furniture

- Painted High School Locker Rooms

- Replaced some classroom furniture

We want to thank our summer maintenance crew, which includes our maintenance staff, some educational assistants, and past graduates, for their hard work the past few months. The buildings and grounds ready for students to return on September 3rd.

Focus on Facilities - Community Survey Results:

Community survey results are in! The survey was conducted by School Perceptions, an independent company who the District has partnered with for the past few referendum surveys. They have conducted over 10,000 surveys for 900 different school districts in the past 22 years.

The purpose of the capital referendum survey was to gauge community support for new facility projects. A facility study completed in the summer of 2022 identified a number of focus areas around the District. A facility assessment is an independent, objective analysis of building and site conditions and an evaluation of the capabilities of the facilities to meet educational and community goals. The facility assessment is often a critical first step in the planning process, helping the District better understand areas of need and focus. The document may be used to inform plans for ongoing maintenance, and as a foundation for future master planning or building projects. facilities study, the building is considered to be in "fair to poor condition" and many components are past their service life. The educational space adequacy report also indicated that spaces and curricular needs may not be met architecturally in the existing building. Areas of focus include safety, security and fire suppression systems, major building systems including plumbing, ventilation, and electrical, instructional space, and compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The District has not had a capital referendum since 1988, while neighboring Districts (including Plymouth, Kiel, Kohler, and Howards Grove) have had their most recent capital referenda between 2018-2022.

Last fall, the District explored different options to address the challenges above, which included renovating both schools, or eventually consolidating the buildings under one roof. The survey last fall indicated that a majority of respondents supported consolidating operations to one building at some point in the future. The School Board pursued this option because:

- The remodeling options are limited in the Elementary/ Middle School due to the existing layout and the number of load-bearing walls.


- The cost to renovate the buildings is between \$30 and \$50 million (depending on the conditions of components and systems).

- Consolidating under one roof will improve student safety and security.

- It will also reduce annual operating costs and some future maintenance expenses.

The majority of survey-takers communicated they would support moving towards building consolidation, but preferred to do this in phases. A total of 53.4% indicated they would support an option to add a Middle School addition to the High School. The School Board sat with the architects and design team to look for options and adjustments to reduce the overall cost of the project. By reducing some of the refurbishment projects at the high school and middle school, they were able to reduce the cost from \$43.1 million to \$39.6 million.

Phase One of long-range masterplan to consolidate District buildings would include the following projects: casings, ceilings, doors, fixtures, and flooring)

Middle/High School:

- Build Middle School addition at High School (including classrooms, gymnasium, and common areas)

- Build High School addition (including main office and vocal music room)

- Upgrade existing locker rooms

- Upgrade select finishes (cabinetry, casings, ceilings, doors, fixtures, and flooring)

- Upgrade traffic / safety patterns

Estimates provided by R.W. Baird show an average school tax impact of no more than \$2.37 per \$1,000 of property value for a borrowing amount of \$39,600,000. This equals an annual impact of \$237 per \$100,000 of property value.







LIONS PARK RIBBON CUTTING

The Village of Elkhart Lake, Lions, Club, and Werner Homes held a ribbon cutting for the new park equipment at Lions Park in July. BOATING REGULATIONS

A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 pm-10 am each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate 3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).

6. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the 3rd Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

7. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 m.p.h. on the water.

8. A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc., and during the times of high-volume boat activity.

A complete listing of Elkhart Lake and the State of Wisconsin Boating Rules Regulations and Statutes is available at the Village Office in Elkhart Lake.

LEONARD'S WAY, STORMWATER, SIDEWALK, AND PATHWAY

The concrete work on the sidewalk and curb and gutter along Highway 67 will begin in late July. Then Leonard's Way will be paved in mid-August. Please watch for the construction zone over the next month, but by the end of August the sidewalk and pathways should be ready to be used. These projects are being funded through TID #4, through the new apartment developments. Both apartment projects are expected to begin rentals in late fall.

BEACH PASS INFORMATION

The Village is reminding people that the Village beach is for residents of the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Joint School District only, per Village Ordinance. The Village Police and Village employees will be monitoring beach use more frequently. The prices of the passes is \$10 for residents and \$50 for school district residents, which are good for an even and odd year (this is the first year of the beach pass). These passes are available as of May 1st. The price of replacement passes is \$25 for Village residents and \$50 for school district residents. Rental properties are to have their guests use Fireman's Park. Fireman's Park is the public access to the lake that should be used for guests. Some of the other regulations include,

No person shall allow a dog to be on any public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

No person shall use or possess beverages containing alcohol on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

No person shall ignite nor maintain fires of any kind on the public beaches owned or leased by the Village.

NO FLUSHING OF SANITARY WIPES

Please remember do not flush sanitary wipes, sanitizing wipes or any other wipes into our sewer system. Even though they say they are flushable, these wipes are not tolerable for our sewer system and sewer treatment plant.

BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED

If you are planning a construction project on your home or business, you must apply for a building permit. Permits must be issued prior to commencement of work. We have had a few people looking to install patios and doing some work and then finding out they cannot have one. We want to prevent this from happening. It is best if you call the Clerk's Office at 920-876-2122 to find out if your project will require a permit. Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.

LEASH LAW

A reminder that the Village has a leash ordinance. Please keep your pets on leashes when walking the Village sidewalk & pedestrian walkway. Dogs are also generally not allowed in Village parks.

VILLAGE ORDINANCE -8.32 ANIMAL FECES

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!!

DOG REFUSE STATIONS

The Village has installed Dog Refuse Stations throughout the Village. We have installed two new ones along Victory Lane. These stations will dispense plastic bags to help in the cleanup effort. The dog stations are located at:



Lakeland Launches Engineering Technology Program

Lakeland University is launching a streamlined engineering technology bachelor's degree completion program to address workforce development needs raised by employers.

Lakeland's bachelor of science in engineering technology is for students

with an associate degree in engineering, engineering technology, industrial engineering, manufacturing engineering or a closely related field.

Associate degree graduates would enter Lakeland's program as juniors and need just two years or, in some cases, less of full-time coursework to finish, although most will likely take courses part-time to accommodate their schedules.

As more companies approach their employees in this field about new roles, Lakeland's program equips those employees to acquire the skills needed to make those transitions.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics reports a growing market for engineering technologists between 2022 and 2032, with 188,000 positions needing to be filled annually across the United States.

"Conversations with companies across







the region and information provided by the Sheboygan County Economic Development Corporation and the Wisconsin Center for Manufacturing and Productivity (WCMP) indicate there is a clear need for the program," said Lakeland President Beth Borgen.

In a survey conducted by WCMP in 2023, the two largest concerns for respondents were "Keeping qualified employees," and "Finding and attracting qualified employees." Fifty percent (50%) of respondents indicate that employee training and employee development are areas for increasing investment.

"These same concerns surfaced in our meetings with local companies that are seeking to upskill and retain existing employees for engineering technologist positions," Borgen said. "This degree supports companies that need employees with more technical skills, especially employees already within those companies.

"Additionally, a large percentage of Lakeland graduates remain in Wisconsin, and these conversations tell us there are sufficient roles regionally for us to continue to import talent."

Lakeland's engineering technology program uses a combination of on-the-job learning through Lakeland's Cooperative Education program and theory learned in the traditional classroom to develop problem solvers, critical thinkers and effective communicators who will work with engineers, managers, technicians and other areas. There is an emphasis on the ability to make ethical decisions to support a more efficient and safer

workplace.

In addition to using employer input to shape the program, Borgen said Lakeland sought input from Wisconsin technical college partners who said they have students seeking to advance beyond the associate degree to options in engineering technology and related fields.

"These partners have expressed the need for a bachelor's degree completion program for many years," Borgen said. "Lakeland is proud to work with the technical colleges to find ways to continue to meet the needs of these students. This is another private/public partnership that is critical, especially in this challenging time for higher education."

Lakeland's program can be delivered entirely online and through practical on-location learning, which allows for courses to be available through a variety of hybrid formats that Lakeland traditionally employs in its course delivery.

"The program's design allows for a more economical pathway to the profession which better serves the community's workforce needs and supports those who come to the idea of engineering or engineering technology later in their careers," Borgen said.




