Effective Friday, August 16, walleye anglers on Mille Lacs Lake will have an exciting new opportunity to enhance their fishing experience. Under the updated regulations, anglers will be allowed to harvest up to two walleye until Saturday, November 30. The new guidelines stipulate that both fish can measure between 18-20 inches, or one may be within that range while the other must exceed

Brad Parsons, fisheries section manager for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR), explained the rationale behind these adjustments. "With high angler catch rates last fall, we opted for conservative fishing regulations this season, anticipating continued high catch rates," Parsons said. "While the first two months of the season showed promise, a combination of catch and release practices and inclement weather resulted in fewer anglers fishing Mille Lacs than expected. This has created additional room for harvest."

As of mid-July, state-licensed anglers had only harvested approximately 26% of their allowed walleye quota. The new regulations reflect both current fish population data and anticipated fishing conditions, as meteorologists forecast a hot and dry summer ahead. Originally, regulations set to begin August 16 would have permitted the retention of one fish measuring 21-23 inches or over 28 inches. However, recent population surveys indicate a healthy population of walleye measuring 18-20 inches, prompting the DNR to broaden the harvest limits to benefit anglers.

"We hope that anglers come out and take advantage of this opportunity to fish walleye on Mille Lacs," Parsons stated. "Anglers have advocated for relaxing walleye regulations to increase harvest opportunities when conditions allow, and this is one of those times."

The shared fishing rights on Mille Lacs Lake are an important aspect of state-tribal agreements. State-licensed anglers and Ojibwe tribes, who retain fishing rights by treaty, collaborate to set of 91,550 pounds, while Lake and regularly updated annual safe harvest levels. ensuring the sustainability of the fishery. Currently, state-licensed anglers have harvested around 24,000 pounds of a potential total

tribal harvest has reached 53,671 pounds of an allowable 65,950 pounds.




Minnesota Governor Tim Walz selected as Kamala Harris' running mate

Minnesota Governor Tim Walz has been chosen by Vice President Kamala Harris as her running mate for the upcoming presidential election on November 5. Harris announced her decision in a text message to supporters, praising Walz as a "battle-tested leader" with a proven track record in serving Minnesota families.

Expressing his enthusiasm, Walz took to social media, stating, "I'm all in. Vice President Harris of what's possible."

The pair will compete against former President Donald Trump and his running mate, Ohio Senator J.D. Vance.

Walz, who has served as Minnesota's governor since 2019 and was a U.S. Congressman from 2007 to 2019, saw his national profile rise during the "veepstakes." Reports indicated that Harris

narrowed her options to Walz, Pennsylvania Governor Josh Shapiro, and Arizona Senator Mark Kelly before making her selection.

Supporters, including Minnesota Senator Liz Boldon, have praised Walz's leadership, highlighting his legislative accomplishments in areas such as child care affordability, school lunch

programs, and health care access. Boldon emphasized that Walz's effective communication skills have garnered national attention, showcasing his suitability for the vice presidency.

Reproductive Freedom for All President and CEO Mini Timmaraju hailed Walz as a "steadfast champion for reproductive freedom" who has worked diligently to protect and expand abortion access for Minnesotans. Timmaraju emphasized that the Harris-Walz ticket represents the most pro-reproductive freedom presidential pairing in U.S. history.

In a post on X (formerly known as Twitter), the Democratic Socialists of Amerrunning mate. "Harris choosing Walz as a running mate has shown the world that DSA and our allies on the left are a force that cannot be ignored."

However, not all reactions have been positive. Minnesota Senator Steve Drazkowski criticized the decision, arguing that Democrats should consider a more moderate candidate. Drazkowski contended that Walz's policies reflect what he described as "cultural Marxism" and that his selection signals a lack of confidence in securing Minnesota's electoral votes.

Overall, Walz is facing significant criticism for his administration's response to the Black Lives Matter protests in 2020, which resulted in widespread destruction across the state. Critics allege that Walz failed to take decisive action as riots erupted, causing millions in damages, including an estimated \$55 million in Minneapolis alone.

Reports indicate that his administration spent millions on unused morgues and mismanaged funds that were intended for feeding low-income children, raising questions about the effectiveness of his response during the health crisis.

In contrast, DFL Chairman Ken Martin celebrated the selection of Walz, asserting that his leadership experience and commitment to working families make him an ideal candidate to complement Harris in the race against Trump and Vance. Martin is optimistic that Walz will showcase Minnesota's progressive policies on the national stage.

As the campaign unfolds, it is hoped that Walz's background as a veteran and former high school football coach will resonate with voters, particularly in rural areas where the Democratic Party has struggled to connect in recent elections.

Under the national spotlight, Walz's military service tional Guard has come under scrutiny. While he highlights his over two decades of service in his political campaigns, records suggest he resigned shortly before his unit —southern Minnesota's 1-125 FA Battalion — was scheduled to be deployed to Iraq. Critics claim that this decision contradicts his assertions about the honor of his service, pointing to documentation indicating he did not complete the necessary retirement paperwork and left his battalion abruptly. His discharge documents show he was reduced in rank from Command Sergeants Major, retiring as a master sergeant. Despite this, at their first campaign rally in Philadelphia on Tuesday, Harris referred to him as "Sergeant Major Walz."



Minnesota sued over omnibus bill

filed a lawsuit against the Minnesota Department of Human Services, challenging the legality of an expansive omnibus bill passed by the DFL-controlled legislature during the final moments of the legislative session this spring. The health insurance giant alleges that the bill, known as HF5247, violates the Minnesota Constitution's "Single Subject Clause."

The lawsuit, filed in state district court on August 2, names Attorney General Keith Ellison as a defendant and seeks to prevent the Department of Human Services from enforcing a provision that affects the company's contracts as a for-profit health maintenance organization (HMO). UnitedHealth Group argues that the legislation, comprising 1,400 pages and covering a range of unrelated topics, fails to meet constitutional requirements regarding legislative titles and subjects.

In the complaint, United-Health Group describes the legislation as the "Jumbo Omnibus," highlighting provisions that it claims harm its business operations. Specif-

UnitedHealth Group has ically, the lawsuit contends to cover abortion, and regthat the bill's lengthy title, spanning six pages, violates the Title Clause of the state constitution by encompassing numerous disparate subjects, from higher education to traffic regulation. Republican leaders in the

legislature had previously warned Governor Tim Walz about the bill's constitutionality and urged him to veto it. Despite these warnings, Walz signed the legislation into law on May 24, with Democratic leaders defending their actions as a necessary response to Republican obstruction.

UnitedHealth Group's legal action underscores ongoing concerns regarding the increasing reliance on large omnibus bills in Minnesota, which the company argues have raised constitutional issues in recent years.

The state's Single Subject Rule, is designed to prevent unrelated provisions from being bundled into a single piece of legislation. Critics point out that the bill includes a diverse range of topics, such as the establishment of new State Patrol headquarters, mandates for health plans ulations on gun purchases. Additionally, it addresses issues like traffic light cameras and motorcycle regulations, which do not align with a single legislative focus.

Democratic leaders in the House have acknowledged that the bill was a strategic move to counter delays caused by Republican lawmakers, who were slowing down the legislative process.

State Senator Justin Eichorn (R-Grand Rapids) releases a statement critical of the DFL,"This lawsuit is not surprising to anyone who witnessed the disastrous end to the 2024 Legislative Session. Under Governor Walz's leadership, we witnessed chaos, confusion, and the potentially unconstitutional passage of a 1,400-page omnibus bill housing all of the bills the DFL couldn't pass properly because of their inability to manage their own session timeline. The news is a sore reminder of how the Democrats catered to the far-left demands in their party all session long and failed to properly legislate under Walz's leadership."






