





## Lieutenant Governor Helps Celebrate New Lakeland Program

More than four dozen healthcare professionals and community leaders joined Wisconsin Lieutenant Governor Sara Rodriguez Monday to help Lakeland University and Moraine Park Technical nursing workforce is behind the growth needed to meet current and future This fantastic partnership will be able to train the next generation of nurses.

Rodriguez, a nurse and experienced

College formally celebrate their new nursing program partnership.

Beginning this fall, students can simultaneously enroll in both schools on their way to earning an associate degree in nursing from Moraine Park Technical College and a bachelor's degree in nursing from Lakeland in four years.

Lakeland President Beth Borgen and MPTC President Bonnie Baerwald signed documents making the partnership official, and joined Rodriguez and the program's first student, Lakeland's Paige Kirchmeier, in sharing thoughts about the program.

The need is clear. The Wisconsin Hospital Association's 20th annual workforce report found that growth in Wisconsin's healthcare executive who has worked in various leadership roles for over 20 years, said Wisconsin needs 20,000 nurses by 2040. She chairs the Governor's Task Force on the Healthcare Workforce to find solutions to the current shortages in Wisconsin's healthcare workforce.

"This is a problem we need to urgently solve," Rodriguez said. "What I am seeing here today will go far. Programs and partnerships like these will help us solve our healthcare challenge."

Rodriguez said she often visits with CNAs who want to be nurses but can't juggle everything to reach their goal.

"It's great to see you are meeting students where they are," she said. "I get excited talking about these innovative solutions.

"A nursing degree opens so many doors for you. You can truly do anything."

Students enrolling in the program will supplement classroom learning through clinical placements via MPTC's partners and Lakeland's Cooperative Education program.

"No other program in the state compares and here's why," Borgen said. "Between MPTC's clinical training and Lakeland's Cooperative Education program, students have the opportunity to rotate through a number of nursing disciplines to be able to solidly explore those disciplines, find their interests and make better decisions about their futures, all while getting paid work experience with college credit

attached."

Students can take classes at both institutions simultaneously and take the licensure examination for registered nurses (NCLEX - RN) the term they complete the bachelor's degree in nursing.

Kirchmeier, a graduate of nearby Plymouth High School, enrolled at Lakeland two years ago as an exercise science major. She started working as a CNA at Rocky Knoll Health Care Center in Plymouth, Wis., through Lakeland's Co-Op program, and said she's excited to have an opportunity to switch to a career in nursing without having to change





During the walking tour, participants can expect to learn about aspects of the Olmsted Brother's master plan from the 1920s as we visit stops between the Waelderhaus and Ravine Park, highlighting a balance of natural beauty and community spaces. 



The horse-powered world of Wade House comes alive through a bounty of activities from a new culinary event, Stagecoach Saturdays and an evening at Wade's Tayern

Revel in the traditions of the fall season when you visit Wade House Historic Site this September and October.

Located in Greenbush near Fond du Lac, Sheboygan and Elkhart Lake, the 27-room inn was a popular overnight destination on Old Plank Road (now Hwy 23) in the 19th century. Today, guests can visit Betsey Wade's kitchen, view the 25-cent-a-night, third-floor guest rooms, learn how to mold horseshoes in the blacksmith shop, visit a working water-powered sawmill and take a horse-drawn wagon ride to the Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum, housing the state's largest collection of carriages, including one owned by famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright.

The main season runs through Nov. 3, 2024 with the site being open Wednesday through Sunday from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. The cost of daily admission is \$15 for adults and teens, \$13 for seniors (65+), \$8 for children (5-12), and free for children under five. Wisconsin Historical Society members receive free general admission and 10% off ticketed events.

Sheboygan and Fond du Lac residents can take advantage of Half-Price First Saturdays and receive a 50% discount when visiting the Wade House grounds during the first Saturday of the month. Discounts are available for all family members who show proof of residence.

Kiel's newest business is getting early reviews as one of its coolest spots as well.

Lumberyard Brewery & Events opened last Thursday, Aug. 1 at the intersection of Fremont Street and Seventh Street.

For months passersby have watched progress on the exterior remodeling of

the former Laun Lumber Co. building. Now that they are getting their first look inside Lumberyard, people are more than impressed with what they are seeing.

Longtime Cedar Lake residents Jason and Jennifer Knuth are the owners and operators of Lumberyard, with a big assist from their brewmaster, Kiel native Corey Petz-old.

Jason also operates Xtreme Patios & Construction and purchased the building in which Lumberyard Brewery & Events is located in 2020. Jason said he wanted to find a use for it and they settled on it being a micro-brewery and events facility. Although she has been employed at Johnsonville for 29 years, Jennifer has some past restaurant experience.

With his construction know-how, Jason went to work last summer to start the remodeling process. Other than work which needed licensed sub-contractors such as electrical and plumbing, Jason served as the general contractor on the project and did much of the work.

Lumberyard has two separate bar areas—the taphouse in the front of the building and the brewhouse in the back. The taphouse has an overhead door which can be opened on good weather days with a view looking north up Seventh Street.

The brewhouse bar area is surrounded by the giant stainless steel vats in which the five staple beers of Lumberyard are being brewed. Petzold has 10 years of experience as a home brewer but this is his first venture into production of this volume.



Jennifer said the various equipment and product suppliers of Lumberyard have been a huge help in getting the facility open for business.

Big crowds filled the Lumberyard during its first weekend open as people were curious to see the new place, some taking part in a wine walk being held in Kiel. Normal operating hours will be Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, 3 to 9 p.m.; Fridays and Saturdays, 11 a.m. to 9 p.m.; and Sundays, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. (closed Tuesdays).

The new business does not sell food other than packaged snacks, although Jennifer said they plan to soon offer baked frozen pizzas as a food option. Since Lumberyard is an event facility, customers hosting events there will be welcome to bring in catered food from any area caterer.

The largest event room at Lumberyard is the venue hall located upstairs. There is a lift which can get people up and down for whom the stairs are an issue. The venue hall can seat up to 320 people although Jennifer said they are looking at a maximum of 250 people for weddings.

Throughout the entire building, Lumberyard can host more than 500 people—and that does not take into account 2,500 square feet of outdoor patio space on both the ground and first floors.

The children of Jason and Jennifer—Mitchell and Sydney—also have contributed to the creation of Lumberyard Brewery & Events. Sydney selected all the lighting throughout the building and decorated the bride's suite and groomsmen's lounge which are available

for weddings.

The set-up of Lumberyard allows for multiple events to be happening at once or for the public to be using one room while an event is going on in another. The brewhouse would be great for class reunions or retirement parties, Jennifer said, adding that they have their first wedding reception of about 150 people booked for Oct. 19. St. Vincent de Paul held its volunteer picnic at Lumberyard even before it officially opened.

Ample parking is located in the rear of the building with an entrance at the rear as well. Jason said a shed in the back will be taken down and the area cleaned up to provide additional parking.

The interior design of the facility fits the theme of the old lumberyard, including the brick walls which have been in the building for decades. Original wood floors, an original stairway and a lot of wood throughout the building adds to the lumberyard feel and, in fact, Jason said, "I would say 90 percent of the stuff we took out of here we put back in."

As customers enjoy the surroundings they also can enjoy a wide variety of beer, mixed drinks and soda beyond the Lumberyard's own brews which include a Citra IPA, Summer Ale, Wildberry Selzer and their own root beer.

"We've gotten really positive feedback," Jennifer said while encouraging people to keep up with new brews and other developments via Facebook. "We actually had a great weekend—new faces we've never seen before."







