New pastor blows in from Florida with energy and plans

Verbeke, 27, a native of Fort Myers, Florida, is the new lead pastor at Northwoods Community Church in Aitkin. Verbeke, (a William, not a Bill) lived in For Myers until Hurricane Charlie forced the family to move to Central Florida with his grandparents. He attended high school in Tampa.

"My aunt invited me to go to church with her when I was a high school junior. God was there, but he wasn't active in my life. I heard that God was crazy about me and sent his son to die for me, and it was free. Since I grew up poor, anything free was great."

He gave his life to God, enrolled in Trinity College of Florida and was eventually ordained by the Church of

"I married the first girl I dated and it was a bad idea. We started drinking a lot and I learned that I come from a long line of alcoholics. My wife and I would shut down the bars. My wife decided that she didn't want to be married to a man anymore and found herself in the arms of a woman."

Working as a youth pastor at the time ("being a divorced alcoholic doesn't mix well with being a youth pastor)" he fled to Maine and a job referral from his mentor. He soon lost his job, due to drinking, and was living in his car. He connected with Greg, his childhood pastor,

who "loved me back Colleen. to life."

He and his first wife divorced. She now identifies as a man and although he wanted to stay married forever, he believes that his relationship met the biblical test where divorce is allowed.

Moving back to Florida with a new purpose in 2019, he began working for Real Life Church, as well as the hotel in-

dustry. When the pandemic hit, he lost both of his jobs at once. He eventually landed a position as the manager of a hotel opening in Florida during the pandemic. He also got church employment again. On the plus side, he also got ordained with the Reformation Movement and

"God put it on our hearts that we needed to move on, even though we had great answers to our prayers by obtaining a house and furniture when we needed it. We came to Northwoods and they need stability. The congregation here is resilient but they have a lot of changes. God used a messed-up man to spread the gospel here."

Growing up with hard-working parents who sometimes found money tight, Verbeke knows what it is like to eat food from a food pantry and to live on a salvaged boat. That is reflected in Ruby's Pantry, a ministry at Northwoods that distributes food to community members.

"Our vision is to reach people who are far from God with the good news of the Gospel."

'Shaping and Reshaping' — potter adapts to changing circumstances

For Marie Brown, her pottery work has been a study in adaptability. Each step of her journey has been an exercise in learning new techniques and adapting to circumstances. When an accident this spring shattered both major bones in her left wrist, Brown found new ways to work. Pottery by Marie Brown will be featured at Ripple River Gallery along with pottery by Nick DeVries and jewelry by Jehn Kuehn, through Sept. 22. The artists will be on hand to talk about their work during the gallery's annual fall open house and benefit for Wild &

Organization on Sept. 21.

Marie Brown has been working with clay for over half her life—first while earning her BFA in Studio Art with a concentration in ceramics at University of Wisconsin-Stout. After graduation and a deadend corporate job, a friend connected her with a potter who was willing to share studio space, putting Brown back on the pottery path.

Brown's husband, Jake, built a studio for her in the basement of a house in St. Paul. "It was amazing to have my own studio. It was also amazingly cramped to work in," she recalled. Later Brown

bought a couple of used electric kilns, which were housed in a tiny shed behind their home.

When Brown and her family outgrew their St. Paul home, they sold the house, bought raw land in Pine County and set out to build their current home and studio—off grid. Since It would be some time before their solar system could handle an electric kiln, they built a wood kiln, a process that took about six years. Brown used that time to refine her glaze palette to suit atmospheric firing techniques, essential to succeeding with a wood kiln. "After three very

successful, although somewhat nerve-racking wood firings, I was looking forward to a productive year in the studio," Brown said.

Then in the spring Brown fell off a stool during a studio remodeling project, breaking her wrist and requiring a metal plate to hold the bones together. "So I focused on what else I could do and the idea of making mobiles out of small hand-built pieces evolved." Brown is making pots on the wheel again, and full mobility has returned. "With each shift in circumstance my work has grown, from this round I've

already learned how much I like unglazed porcelain as decorative elements and I'm excited to see where that takes me."

Potter Nick DeVries, Brainerd, makes forms based on a tradition of function and use. "My current body of work is made from porcelain and I often work in a reductive fashion, throwing heavier pieces, then altering, rasping, and carving the pots to reveal the final forms. I enjoy balancing large areas of subtle texture and color with small additions: stamps and other details that suggest windows

or doorways."

Jeweler Jehn Kuehn, Mora, says she cannot imagine a life without art and imagination. "I have been making my jewelry for about 12 years. Each piece starts with a beach stone from Lake Superior. I drill the rocks and embellish them with stones and beads. I like to use wood, amber, jasper, bone, shells, and some man-made beads to finish my pieces. Nature starts each piece and I finish them to create a unique piece of jewelry."

READER RIBBET Questions for Rep. Ben Davis

I was tempted to write a response to Rep. Ben Davis's two articles, "Democrats Radical Left Policies" and "Rep. Ben Davis's Legislative Update" in both the NewsHopper and The Crosby Courier a few weeks ago, but I chose not to do so. Then Governor Waltz was chosen to be the Democratic Vice-Presidential nominee, and I began to read much about Gov. Waltz and the legislative activity of Minnesota's 93rd legislature. As I researched more, I realized that Rep. Ben Davis in his articles was highlighting only a handful of social/cultural bills with a few sentences a mere "sound bite" if you will and ignoring many other important topics. Rather than a "sound bite" a bit of further context would have been appreciated.

Rep. Davis in his Legislative Update writes at length of the possible fraud stemming from the Minnesota Autism Centers and the Feeding Our Future program. However, one can't help but wonder why in the column, "Democrats Radical Left Policies" Rep. Davis gives one or two, "sound bites" for each topic he chose to highlight? Such inadequate explanation does not do justice to the bills he writes about.

HF1 Reproductive Health Rights is the first bill Rep. Davis chose to comment upon. This bill, depending on your political or religious beliefs, can be debated. However, what this bill does is allow a woman to have autonomy over her own health care with no interference from the state. Rep. Davis mentioned that this bill allows "abortion up to the moment of birth" and "allows minor children to be sterilized without parental consent." If you read the entire bill, you will see there is no clear evidence from the text that it explicitly allows minors to be sterilized without parental knowledge and abortion up to the moment of birth is a bit misleading. The bill supports the life of the mother in extreme medical emergencies. (You can view all bills passed by Minnesota's 93rd legislature just Google Minnesota State Legislature's Bill Search and Status.) Why did Rep. Davis choose

to only highlight social/cultural issues, i.e., abortion, immigration, transgender, etc. and not any others such as education, medical, environmental, etc.? It is unfortunate that Rep. Davis has led all readers (regardless of one's political beliefs) down a very simple path that denies a more complete context in reference to the bills passed. Not to mention the bills he chose not to write about. Also included in the article was a long list of mostly social/cultural bills that were not passed, one must ask why include non-passed bills, what's the purpose of telling his constituents what wasn't passed?

As one of Rep. Davis's constituents it would be appreciated if in one of his press releases, he acknowledges what he has done specifically for Crow Wing County. Surely, there must be some piece of legislation that Rep. Davis had a hand in crafting or co-authoring, or signed onto, something that he would be proud to tell his constituents how this piece of legislation adds value to Crow Wing County and its citizens. As Rep. Davis said in relation to the attempted assassination of former president Trump, "may it serve to unify us as Americans." If future articles Rep. Davis writes are more balanced, maybe they can help all his constituents


