from the Cherokee Nation to campus for this special event," said UNA President Dr. Ken Kitts. "As we approach our third century of delivering high-quality education, it is critical that we remember our history that is part of what got UNA to this place and honor those in whose footsteps we have the opportunity to follow."

As part of the visit to campus for the mural unveiling, Chief Hoskin also had an opportunity to meet with campus and community leaders, to tour local sites, and meet with representatives from the Alabama Trail of Tears Association.

"The southeast was the original homeland of the Cherokee people, along with many other tribal nations," said Hoskin. "We appreciate UNA welcoming us to their campus and recognizing Indigenous Peoples and our contributions then and today."

Amber Fite-Morgan, UNA's General Counsel, is also a citizen of the Cherokee Nation; having the Cherokee Nation delegation at UNA for an event honoring Alabama's First People is very special.

"Being able to be at UNA and being able to bring the two worlds together is especially significant for me as a proud citizen of the Cherokee Nation," Fite-Morgan said. "It is so important that we continue to build on these relationships that make both stronger."

Dr. Sean Jacobson, an Assistant Professor in Native American and Public History, worked with the students in order to create the mural, the title of which is "Tears and Triumphs: Honoring North Alabama's First Peoples."

Medicare Minute Medicare "Donut Hole"

August and September are two months we get calls on the coverage gap or "donut hole". This happens because there is a temporary limit on what your drug plan will pay while you are in the gap. The good news is not everyone will enter the coverage gap. The coverage gap begins after you and your plan have spent a certain amount on covered drugs. In 2024 once you and your plan combined have spent \$5,030 you will enter the coverage gap.

Here's the way the coverage gap works. Imagine you have a prescription that retails for \$500 per month. Your copay, hypothetically, is \$30. This means your plan would pay the rest of the cost or \$470. Medicare will track what you paid (\$30) and what your plan paid (\$470) and count the cost of the drug as \$500 for that month. Let's also say that the other prescriptions you are taking equals \$100 per month. You are now at \$600 per month. In this example you would reach the coverage gap sometime in September.

Under most plans in 2024 once you have reached the coverage gap your plan will temporarily stop paying anything on your drugs. This means you will be responsible for the entire cost of your prescriptions. The silver lining around this very dark cloud is Medicare has negotiated a discount on the drugs you use. Once you reach the coverage gap you will pay 25% of the cost of your drugs.

If you are eligible for Medicare but still on employer coverage you may wonder why you have never reach the coverage gap. This is because employer coverage does not have the "donut hole". The coverage gap only applies to Medicare prescription drug plans. Also remember that Medicare drug plans can vary which means your coverage in the gap can vary.

The new MRI suite includes a private changing room, bathroom, and waiting area. Updated Marker?

Editor,

In the past, the Florence City Council (FCC) has held discussions about moving the confederate monument at the Lauderdale County Courthouse to the section of the Florence City cemetery where many confederate soldiers are buried. The FCC has been unable to do this because of an Alabama state law that restricts such action and the uncertainty of the monument not being on city-owned property.

For several months, the FCC and Project Say Something (PSS) have worked on the wording for a marker that would give context to the Confederate monument. PSS wants

to place this monument outside the Lauderdale County Courthouse in proximity to the confederate monument. In May of this year, the FCC voted on placing the marker and it was defeated by a 3-2 vote. Council President Jordan, and Councilmen

Oliver, and Edwards voted against Councilwomen marker. Simmons and Eubanks voted for it, and Councilman Griffin was absent from the meeting. (Credit to a *TimesDaily* article for much of this information.).

A copy of the marker proposal voted down in May was recently obtained from the office of the Florence City Clerk. The Resolution for the marker stated City Council "authorizes the placement of an historical marker in the right-of-way in the southwest corner of Court and College Streets in front of the Lauderdale County Courthouse.'

If an agreement is reached on the marker, Florence citizens have a right to review it before a final FCC
















She was well-prepared, didn't give Trump any ammunition, and took the fight to him by pressing his frustration button most of the night.

That said, it was obvious she was not up there alone.

It became evident early on that ABC's World Tonight anchor News David Muir, and Prime anchor Linsey Davis. had the prearranged soft spot for Harris. She the was pitched underhand softballs that seemed to have ready-made answers waiting to leap out of her mouth. Had she been unsure of the questions or topics, her answers would have included a pause for thought processing and would have been presented more tentatively.

In addition, with those embellishments, distortions, and falsehoods flying in both directions, Muir and Davis took turns chastising and correcting Donald Trump on five

occasions. Not once did take exception either anything Harris uttered. Sure, Trump pushed the envelope often, taking more liberties with figures inflation claims, crime statistics, equipment left/investment made in Afghanistan, stereotyping immigrants, etc., but there were plenty of opportunities for some of Harris' statements to be reined in.

They were not.

Muir opened the debate with a brief preface and then asked Harris, "Do you believe Americans are better off than they were four years ago?" Harris countered instantly with her own answer to a non-existent question.

"So, I was raised as a middle-class kid..." (her first lie - She was uppermiddle, the daughter of two PhD's) and then she went on for another 1:55 about her 'economic plan' that consisted largely of assorted additional handouts. She never touched on the Muir's question and was not called or questioned by either Muir or Davis on the avoidance.

There were several instances where Trump also wanted to avoid a topic in favor of an alternative point, yet the moderators brought him back demanding an answer to their questions.

Here are just a few other examples of where Harris was way off base.

Harris asserted that Trump would preside over the installation of a Big Brother-style surveillance of every pregnancy in America.

"In his Project 2025 there would be a national abortion—a monitor that would be monitoring your pregnancies, your miscarriages," Harris without said. anv moderator's intervention. That was a flat lie, and numerous legacy media outlets have confirmed that the allegation has no basis in fact whatsoever.

Harris attempted to deny Trump's charge Democratic the that Party supports late-term abortion by denying such abortions take place. "Nowhere in America is a woman carrying a pregnancy to term and asking for an abortion," she deflected. The truth is that 21 states allow abortion until birth. Six have no legal limit protecting unborn children, and the rest abortion allow the point of 'viability' thanks to a vague and expansive exception centered around "health of the mother." Late-term abortions are They well-documented. may not be close to the majority of procedures, but they ARE an issue and far-too prevalent. Trump was accurate.

The issue of abortion AFTER birth also surfaced during the debate, as Trump cited comments made bv former Virginia Governor, Ralph Northam, about allowing babies born alive during birth to die—a position Trump called "execution after birth." Moderator Davis responded to Trump's comments on abortion by saying, "There is no state in this country where it is legal to kill a baby after it's born." That was one of several statements from Trump during the debate that media voices described afterward as a false claim, when in fact, it is true.

Maybe they can't cut the newborn up with instruments outside the womb like they can inside, but in many states the doctors and nurses can walk off, turn out the lights, and leave the struggling baby on a cold metal table to fight for life on its own.

Northam's own words: "I can tell you exactly what would happen. The infant would be delivered. The infant would be kept comfortable. The infant would be resuscitated if that's what the mother and the family desired, and then a discussion would ensue between the physicians and the mother."

Many other examples and testimonies mirror that. Whistleblowers have noted on numerous occasions (many in great detail) that abortionists regularly allowed children to be born alive, then allowed to die by neglect.

Minnesota passed legislation in 2015 that required the Minnesota Department of Health to establish a detailed record of every attempted abortion where the baby was born alive, what was done to help preserve the newborn's life, and how successful efforts were. Previous

data from the Minnesota Department of Health reveals that physicians have been leaving babies to die after failed abortions for years. Eight survived abortions in the state from 2019-2021 alone. Most were left to die. None survived

Tim Walz, the state's Democratic governor from 2019–present and Harris' Democratic vicepresidential nominee, decided that Minnesota would no longer even keep track of born-alive babies, repealing the bipartisan law in May 2023. He also nullified the state's requirement that measures be taken to preserve the baby's "life and health," replacing it with the coldest of vagaries of offering 'care.'

There are a lot more examples we could detail but the piece is already long. Suffice it to say that Trump was on target again, and Davis was off base, and in CYA mode for Harris.

Harris asserted that, "Donald Trump candidate has said in this election there will be a bloodbath if the outcome of this election is not to his liking." She knew that was a lie, that Trump used the term in an economic/financial sense related to the automotive industry. However. two supposedly the neutral arbiters of truth remained silent.

Harris repeated misinformation that Trump praised neo-Nazis and white supremacists at the 2017 Unite the Right rally in Charlottesville, VA saying that Trump said, "There were 'fine people' on each side." That claim has been debunked by every news source, and even on the left leaning Snopes.com. She knows it, but she was still allowed to throw it out for some 67 million people to digest vet again. and neither moderator called her on it.

There are several other examples of Harris not being corrected, while they couldn't pick on Trump enough.

Of course, ABC was lauded by liberal commentators and social media mavens for its excellent work.

Again, not at all surprising.



Dear Dave,

We've been following your plan for a while. We're debt-free, except for our home, and we have six months of expenses set aside in our emergency fund. Recently, I lost my job. I'm luckier than some, because received a generous severance package from my previous employer, plus my wife still has a good job. My parents always raised me to take care of things myself and not rely on others. I suppose it's because of this I feel a little guilty about filing for unemployment compensation. Do you think there's anything morally accepting wrong withunemployment benefits?

Dear Brandt,

I really appreciate your self-sufficient attitude. I don't know what happened at your last job, but I've got a feeling you're a hard worker and a decent guy. I'm sorry you and your wife are having to deal with this kind of situation.

The Social Security system in this country is a mathematical failure. But that doesn't mean I'm not going to take my money when I deserve it. The government took it from me in the first place, so I don't have a problem with accepting something I've already paid into.

Now, I'll throw out a warning here. Sometimes when people start receiving unemployment benefits, it causes them to

take their foot off the gas. The idea that "free" money is coming in can help them rationalize sitting at home on the couch, instead of working hard to find another job and being extra careful with their finances. I'm not hearing that kind of mentality from you, though. And it's obvious you and your wife have been pretty smart with your finances.

One more thing I'd suggest is making sure you look at your severance package as survival money *only*. Make a strict budget and stick to it. Cut out *all* excess spending. That means no eating out, vacations or anything like that until you're working again and everything's back on solid ground. Right now, focus on covering your Four Walls. By that, I mean food, utilities, shelter and transportation. Feed your family, keep the electricity on, pay the mortgage and put enough gas in the car to get where you need to go.

Everyone hits a rough stretch of road in life from time to time, Brandt. But you two are in a position to handle it better than most. Just remember what got you to such a good place with your finances in the first place. The discipline muscle is already there, and it's strong. Just flex it, and it'll help get you through this and back on your feet again!





TVA Now 90 Years Old

Last year (2023), the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) celebrated its 90th birthday, as it was signed into law by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1933. (See the accompanying photograph of that Valley-changing law being signed.) The goal of this massive undertaking was not just the production of cheap, reliable



was also the improvement of residents' lives through better farming techniques, high-quality education for the children and young people, excellent recreational opportunities, control of the periodic floods, etc. Locally, whole villages of houses were established for TVA workers and administrators. (In Florence, many of these houses were purchased in the 1950's by a corporation formed by Mr. Clyde Anderson and Mr. B.F. O'Steen and moved from TVA property to Wilson Dam Road, where they are still enjoyed by families today.) A school for children of families who lived on the TVA Reservation served students in grades 1 through 8. Its methodology was based on the progressive educational philosophy of John Dewey. A park for the public's enjoyment was established on both sides of the Tennessee River, with that same space in Florence known today as Veterans Park. But in the eyes of local citizens who were alive in the 1930's, FDR was revered because, in their often-repeated words, "He lit up the Valley with dependable electricity.'







Most people believe Social Security a contract the with government. Y011 pay FICA taxes and are paid back these funds upon retirement. THIS ISN'T SO! There is a Federal Accounting Journal Entry labeled Social Security. However, for the last 57 years its income has been treated like every other entry in the Federal Accounting system. The total content is subject to the needs of the Federal Budget and also may be used for any purpose deemed appropriate by Federal politicians.
In 1967, the Supreme

Court ruled in (Flemming Nestor) that the legislation authorizing Social Security contained no wording indicating the government has a contractual obligation to pay back our Social Security contributions.

Flemming v. Nestor left Washington politicians free to spend Social Security funds for any other purpose, which they have been doing for decades, depleting Social Security funds, so that full benefit payments may soon be reduced.

The Social Security Act was signed into law by President Roosevelt on August 14, 1935. The new Act created a social program designed to pay retired workers aged 65 or older a continuing income after retirement.

This raid on Social Security began back in 1967, by L.B.J. to hide his growing budget deficits. In 1990, in a bi-partisan effort. Senator John Heinz (R-Pa.) and Senator Fritz Hollings (D-S.C.) called out this raid on Social Security but to no avail.

Our trillion national debt continues to sky-rocket and Social Security is getting closer to FICA taxes being less than funds need to make even reduced payments. Currently there are three bills slowly moving through the House of Representatives, containing wording indicating FICA taxes

are a specific contract between the taxpayer and the government. cannot Congress use these funds for any other purpose without voter approval and pay back over time the trillion plus dollars raided by previous politicians for their pet projects.

Common **Problem**

This week I spoke with a very nice gentleman who was disappointed with my opinion of his case. He felt as if the legal system was in some way broken. It's not, but it's the way it is for a reason.

Here's what we're talking about. This gentleman had worked in a well-respected industry and was living off of his social security. He had a wreck that was not his fault. Money was tight and he did not go to the hospital or a doctor. He did not go to a chiropractor or a nurse practitioner. He toughed it out for over a year. He cut back on his activities and struggled to make

himself comfortable. After 14 months he sees a doctor for the first time and gets an MRI. The gentleman then discovers that he has a herniated disc.

I believe the man is telling the truth. He had no medical history prior to the accident because he didn't go to the doctor. If he had seen a doctor on a regular basis for yearly check-ups, we would know that he probably had a good back or at least he hadn't complained about it.

I tried a case in Huntsville for a very nice lady whose first complaint of shoulder pain was four months after the accident. She didn't complain about her shoulder to the ambulance crew or to the emergency room. She didn't mention it to her doctor nine days after the accident. She had shoulder surgery, and I valued that case between \$65,000.00 and \$75,000.00 for a variety of reasons personal to her case such as how likable she was, how provably honest she was and the poor result she got from the surgery. The jury gave me \$6,500.00. Not \$65,000.00. When I interviewed the jury after the trial, they felt that because she was so active with no complaints for four months, she could have injured her shoulder in one of the many activities she engaged in.

The legal reality is that a doctor has to say that the accident more likely than not or "probably" caused the injury that you are seeking compensation for. We've seen cases where people believe their cancer came out of remission or they're concerned that perhaps their ability to reproduce has been compromised. Without a doctor's opinion, you don't win. Without documentation of treatment, your case isn't what it would have been. If you're not hurt, don't say you are. If you are hurt, go tell the doctor.

Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD) Awareness Month Aims to

Empower Those at Risk of the 'Silent Amputator'

September is Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD) Awareness Month, a time to educate and empower people to act against the most debilitating disease they haven't heard of—or know that they have.

PAD affects more than 10 million Americans and is a factor in 400 amputations each day, making it the largest cause of nontraumatic amputations in the United States. Yet among Black and Hispanic adults, nearly 80% report never having a doctor or healthcare provider discuss PAD with them. PAD Awareness Month is the time to 'kick off the conversation' and change that.

That's why the PAD Pulse Alliance, a coalition of



four leading medical societies dedicated to improving vascular health, developed

PADPulse.org, an online portal that offers a wealth of resources for patients and caregivers. These include an interactive patient toolkit, links to find a physician, and animated videos that help explain PAD.

"PAD silently amputates, affecting millions of Americans, many in underrepresented communities, who unfortunately are often unaware of the risks, symptoms, or consequences of this disease until it's too late," said Dr. James B. Hermiller, MD, MSCAI, president of the Society for Cardiovascular Angiography and Interventions (SCAI), a founding member of the PAD Pulse Alliance. "Now is the time to make a difference. We hope getting a 'pulse on PAD' can save lives, limbs, and livelihoods. We encourage you to share the Patient Toolkit with your friends and family who are at risk of PAD."

The PAD Pulse Alliance includes the Association of Black Cardiologists (ABC), the Society for Cardiovascular Angiography and Interventions (SCAI), the Society of Interventional Radiology (SIR), and the Society for Vascular Surgery (SVS). Together, they represent over 20,000 physicians and health professionals and a wealth of expertise in treating PAD. Launched earlier this year, the Get a Pulse on PAD campaign has reached millions through social media, digital influencers, and media outreach to spread the word and engage with the public

"PAD is not merely a cardiovascular issue; it is a public health crisis that quietly drives unnecessary amputations, causes disabling generational impairment, and claims lives—especially among Black and Hispanic populations. We are dedicated to closing the gaps in awareness and care, ensuring that everyone, regardless of race or background, is equipped with the knowledge and resources to safeguard their health. This month, and every month, we must elevate the dialogue about PAD, empower our communities with essential information, and advocate for equitable access to life-saving care," said Dr. Foluso Fakorede, MD, CEO of Cardiovascular Solutions of Central Mississippi and co-chair of the Association of Black Cardiologists PAD Initiative.

PAD occurs when plaque builds up in the arteries that supply blood to the legs, causing reduced blood flow and oxygen to the muscles. This can result in leg pain, cramping, or fatigue while walking or climbing stairs, which often goes away after rest. PAD can also cause wounds or ulcers on the legs

or feet that do not heal or changes in skin color, temperature, or sensation. If left untreated, PAD can lead to gangrene, amputation, stroke, or death.

"Patients often dismiss common signs of PAD as part of normal aging because they are not aware it could signal a serious health problem," said Dr. Robert J. Lewandowski, MD, FSIR, president of SIR. "This is why the PAD Pulse Alliance urges patients to talk to their doctors about persistent symptoms that disrupt their lives so they can be screened for PAD early. This is especially true for patients who have a history of diabetes, high blood pressure, or tobacco use.'

The PAD Pulse Alliance urges everyone to know the three steps to get a pulse on PAD:

- Know your risk factors
- Don't ignore symptoms
- Kick off the conversation with your doctor.

"Delayed or denied care is a critical driver for higher rates of amputation in minority communities," said Dr. Matthew Eagleton, MD, president of the Society for Vascular Surgery. Statistics show that Black people are twice as likely to suffer from PAD and up to four times more likely to undergo an amputation compared to white people, and Hispanics also experience worse outcomes, including greater amputation risk. Our goal in establishing the PAD Pulse Alliance is to make sure patients have easy access to limbsaving information."

What Are the Early Signs and Symptoms of Diabetes?

Dear Savvy Senior

What are the early signs and symptoms of diabetes? I'm 60 years old, and in pretty good shape, but was just diagnosed with type 2 diabetes. What did I miss?

Diabetic Dan

Dear Dan,

The signs and symptoms of type 2 diabetes can be so mild that many people miss them. That's why testing is so important. Here's what you should know.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention more than 38 million Americans have diabetes today, and another 97 million have prediabetes, but many of them don't even know they have it.

Type 2 diabetes is a disease that develops slowly over decades. Most people have prediabetes for a long time before the disease becomes full-blown diabetes, and even then, it progresses gradually

Diabetes occurs when your blood glucose, also called blood sugar, is too high. This excess blood sugar damages blood vessels and affects circulation, putting you at risk for a host of ailments, from heart attack and stroke to blindness, kidney failure and nerve damage.

Signs and Symptoms

So how can you tell if you have diabetes? The earliest signs, which are usually subtle, including urinating more frequently (often at night), being thirster and hungrier than usual, weight loss without trying, feeling very tired, having dry itchy skin and blurry vision.

And the symptoms that can indicate advanced diabetes and long-term damage has occurred includes cuts or sores that heal slowly, having more infections than usual, and pain or numbness in your feet or legs.

Who Should Get Tested?

Because prediabetes typically causes no outward symptoms, and the signs of early type 2 diabetes can easily be missed, the only way to know for sure if you have it is to get a blood test.

Everyone age 45 years or older should consider getting tested for diabetes, especially if you are overweight with a body mass index (BMI) above 25. See *CDC.gov/bmi* to calculate your BMI.

If you are younger than 45 but are overweight, or have high blood pressure, a family history of diabetes, or belong to an ethnic group (Latino, Asian, African or Native American) at high risk for diabetes, you should get checked too.

To help you determine your risk for diabetes, the American Diabetes Association (ADA) has a quick, online risk test you can take for free at *Diabetes.org/risk-test*.

Diabetes Tests

There are three different tests your doctor can give you to diagnosis diabetes. The most common is the "fasting plasma glucose test," which requires an eight-hour fast before you take it. There's also the "oral glucose tolerance test" to see how your body processes sugar, and the "hemoglobin A1C test" that measures your average blood sugar over the past three months. It can be taken anytime regardless of when you ate.

Most private health insurance plans and Medicare cover diabetes tests, however, if you're reluctant to visit your doctor to get tested, an alternative is to go to the drug store, buy a blood glucose meter and test yourself at home. They cost around \$20.

If you find that you are prediabetic or diabetic, you need to see your doctor to develop a plan to get it under control. In many cases lifestyle changes like losing weight, exercising, eating a healthy diet and cutting back on carbohydrates may be all you need to do to get your diabetes under control. For others who need more help, many medications are available.

For more information on diabetes and prediabetes or to find help, join a lifestyle change program recognized by the CDC (*CDC. gov/diabetes-prevention*). These programs offer in-person and online classes in more than 1,500 locations throughout the U.S.






