Johnson honored with Performing Arts Center dedication

On a warm fall evening, September 28, the Aitkin High School auditorium was alive with excitement and gratitude as the community came together to celebrate Bryan "BJ" Johnson. The auditorium has been officially dedicated as the Bryan "BJ" Johnson Performing Arts Center, marking nearly four decades of BJ's unwavering dedication as the school's choral director and also a passionate advocate for the arts.

The night's festivities were expertly led by Ed Anderson, former superintendent of the Aitkin School District, who

set the tone with heartfelt words. "The contribution that he's made to this community, in this school, is unmeasurable," Anderson said, as he praised BJ for giving countless students the chance to shine on stage. He opened doors for students who "didn't even know they had that shine."

Planning for this momentous occasion began back in April, with Anderson teaming up with "co-conspirator" Karen Hillman to pull everything together. He expressed gratitude to everyone involved in the dedication, especially to BJ and his wife, Marilyn, for sharing their home and

treasured scrapbooks filled with memories of BJ's 39 musicals and 17 community theater productions. The final curtain call on BJ's theatrical journey was the hit musical, The Church Basement Ladies.



Hill. He chuckled, recounting the joy and camaraderie of participating in BJ's musicals. Since he wasn't in one of the lead roles, he spent his time playing cards in between

Hill shared a personal story, reminiscing about BJ playing the piano at his wedding in 1991. "If you got off key or forgot something, he'd just bang out the melody right there. You sounded good with him, no matter what," Hill said, pointing to BJ with admiration. He was an awesome teacher who could command the choir's attention with just a look.

The night's atmosphere was infused with nostalgia when Hill led the audience in a spirited rendition of "Sarasponda," a vocal warm-up that had become a beloved tradition under BJ's guidance. Laughter and applause filled the auditorium as attendees joined in, singing:

Christine (Bright) Marwede, representing the Aitkin County Friends of the Arts, also took the stage. She shared a message from Peter Lowe, a former student who praised BJ's commitment to excellence. "BJ always gave his full commitment to whatever he was doing whether it was musical a performance or an event. He strove for perfection in every way and we as a community benefited from that attention to deep detail because we got to enjoy those high quality performances."

Marwede beautifully encapsulated BJ's impact: "We all want to be a part of the worlds that he creates. Whether it's through piano playing, his singing or his theater production and direction. His plays and musicals created a space that was new to us. A place where we wanted to be with people we wanted to know. And isn't that the magic of the Arts? We transport ourselves into another world for a period of time and while we're hanging out there, something changes within us. Then when we return back to our regular lives, we have forever changed.

Bryan "BJ" Johnson's inspiring journey from tragedy to triumph

Bryan "BJ" Johnson was born in 1945 into a family of missionaries. In 1947, they embarked on a life-changing journey to Southeast Asia, specifically Siam, now known as Thailand. The Johnson family—comprised of BJ, his brother Bill, and sister Becky and their parents—settled in a village in French Indochina during a tumultuous time, just as the regions of Laos, Cambodia, and Vietnam were beginning to emerge.

Ed Anderson, former superintendent of the Aitkin School District, recounts this era: "It was French Indochina, and the French were being pushed out by insurgent groups. The family was right in the midst of that upheaval." At the tender age of six, BJ was sent to boarding school in what is now Vietnam, while his parents remained with Bill and Becky.

Tragedy struck when a group of bandits, seeking to rob a sugar factory, turned their attention to the Johnson family. In a horrific incident, BJ's mother was killed instantly, and his father succumbed three days later, witnessed by Bill and Becky. Following this devastating loss, the three siblings were sent to the United States to Northfield, Minnesota, to live with

BJ's introduction to music began in fourth grade, spurred on by his grandmother's insistence that he take piano lessons. He later pursued a degree in Choral Music from St. Olaf College, graduating in 1967. With dreams of shaping young minds through music, he made his way to Aitkin, bringing innovative ideas such as madrigals and musical theater, along with high expectations for his students.

In December 1968, BJ married Marilyn in Janesville, Wisconsin. Together, they welcomed a daughter, Jennifer, and a son, Stephen, and forged a life deeply intertwined with music. BJ's contributions to the local arts are extensive. He has provided piano lessons, played at

countless weddings and funerals, accompanied numerous choirs, and directed the Messiah in Aitkin for over 50 years. "He was also in the All-State Men's Choir and directed Legacy Corral for five years," Anderson noted.

Reflecting on his journey, BJ shared: It was 57 years ago that I drove to Aitkin for the first time as a senior music major at St. Olaf College, applying for my first teaching position. I was fairly sure I'd end up in southern Minnesota, especially after encountering snowflakes in early May in Bennetville, [just south of Aitkin.] But I was struck by the friendly administration and staff, including Karen Hillman.

Despite some challenges—like a choir room prone to leaks and overpowering odors during wrestling season—BJ found joy in his work. By his second year, he embraced directing his own musical, kicking off a passion that would span decades. "My love of musical theater was firmly entrenched," he recalled.

For 39 years, BJ has delighted in creating memories, encouraging self-confidence, and nurturing the talents of students eager to explore music. "I want to thank my wife Marilyn for her unwavering support and encouragement her talent for taking pictures of all events and especially for her infectious laughter during theater rehearsals and performances," he said, highlighting the importance of family in his remarkable journey.

BJ's story is not just one of music; it's a testament to resilience, passion, a lifelong commitment to the arts and the community.

son of seven children, who would later number 12. Harlan graduated from McGrath High School and enlisted in the Air Force serving in Greenland. He worked at logging, farming and gravel hauling with family before starting a job in the Aitkin County Assessor's office and eventually retiring as a senior appraiser for the MN Dept of Revenue after 26 years.

A chance meeting at a dance hall brought him the love of his life, red-headed Harriet Hensel. Although Harlan never liked to dance, they paired up and married on June 27, 1959 in Aitkin. Together, they raised six children on eight acres on the Mississippi, later building a retirement home in the woods of Thor in Glen Township.


