Bart Wolf wins Gold Medal

Prototype 2 gold medal awarded at 60th anniversary SCCA® **National Championship** Runoffs® presented by Sunoco

It was Bart Wolf who won the Prototype 2 (P2) gold medal during the 60th anniversary SCCA® National Championship Runoffs® presented by Sunoco. Taking place Sept. 28-Oct. 6, 2024 at Road America, the 4.048-mile, 14-turn circuit welcomed P2 racers with temperatures in the high 60s, but also a healthy wind blowing to the north.

The field was led to the green flag on the second of three Hagerty Race Days by Milwaukee Region member Wolf and his No. 28 Wolf Motorsports Ligier JS49 Honda, in which he'd earned the Tire Rack Pole. The qualifying gap to twotime National Champion Mike Reupert was not much, although the top two had a comfy margin to third-, fourth-, and fifth-place qualifiers Tim Day, Jr., Greg Gyann, and Raiden Nicol.

As the racers headed toward the starter's stand for the green, they were desperately trying to anticipate the flag for the best chance to cut through the wind into Turn 1. When the green flag flew, more than a dozen highly tuned engines began to sing.

Wolf got the jump ahead of Reupert, but as Reupert tucked in behind, he appeared to make contact with Day, spinning Reupert backwards in Turn 1. Unfortunately, Reupert couldn't refire his car, and a full course caution was called.

The restart saw Wolf repeat his performance from the original green, with him retaining the lead and pulling a gap on Day, Nicol, and the rest of the field. Nicol was quick to drop a spot, but a deep dive into Turn 5 claimed the position back from Gyann.





While Wolf pulled a 3.5sec lead over Day by lap five, Gyann and Pancea had caught Nicol and began to challenge for the third step on the podium, with Nicol's larger Radical punching a sizable hole in the air for the smaller Stohrs. Nicol protected, but it wasn't enough, and Pancea and Gyann made the pass on lap seven, making it Pancea's turn to defend the bronze position.

Tucked together, Gyann and Pancea had Day in their sights, reeling in the second-place Day at the the rate of half a second per lap. Gyann slipped a little wide into Canada Corner on lap 12, with Pancea not hesitating to slip into third as the two continued their pursuit of Day.

By lap 11, Wolf had afforded himself a nine second lead while the battle for second raged. At Turn 5, Pancea made the pass on Day, leaving Day to drag race down the straight with Gyann as Pancea began to build an untouchable cushion

The last lap involved Wolf cruising to victory, followed by Pancea with a wellearned gap to third. The story for third was different - it was an all-out battle between Day and Gyann, with challenges occurring in nearly every braking zone. As the pair entered the Hurry Downs, Day poked inside and went super deep into Canada Corner, making the pass.

The duo engaged in another drag race down the front straight, this time for the checkered flag, with Day edging out Gyann for third by just 0.096 seconds. Sherman Chao followed in fifth, some two seconds later.

Wolf's pre-race plan was to drive away from the field but, racing being racing, he wasn't positive his plan would come to fruition. "We were trying, I mean, that was the idea," he laughed after the race, adding, "but it usually never works as planned. Since the June Sprints®, we've pretty much lived and camped [at Road America]. So, yeah, it was a lot of testing, a lot of development."

The statue is at the Villa VonBaumbach (also known as The Overflow). It is a copy of a statue designed by Alfred Lunt in the 1930's. Here is what the folks at Ten Chimneys Foundation in Genesee Depot said when I asked for more history.

"Her name is Siglinda and the original statute would be around 90 years old. The statute out now is a duplicate because the original had decayed beyond repair. I am unsure exactly when the duplicate was created (early years of TC?).

Siglinda was made by the Wilbur Lumber Company in Waukesha during the depression. They were willing to take any jobs they could. She is based off a drawing Alfred sketched. I am not sure but do think she is based on something he saw in one of the Scandinavian countries."

My late husband, Joe Garton, and I bought the Villa from the Wintzer family who

I think some folks at Elkhart refer to her as Clara after one of the VonBaumbach family members who died there in the early 1900's.

Joe was always interested in historic preservation thus his work to preserve Ten Chimneys.

The picture shows the statue of the self proclaimed Elkhart Lake "lady of the lake". In Elkhart lake, people used to see what was often described as an apparition, or a ghost, of a woman who would wander around the town, usually by the lake. The townspeople worked together to figure out what the woman looked like and made a statue of her. After the statue was placed, the woman specter disappeared. The statue and house are located on



New Mobile Manufacturing Lab Unveiled at Lakeshore College

The state-of-the-art training on wheels is ready to hit the road.

Lakeshore College unveiled its new mobile manufacturing lab Oct. 1, making advanced manufacturing training more accessible throughout the community. The state-of-the-art self-contained training space is available to any organization interested in providing or demonstrating hands-on manufacturing-focused training. Lakeshore provides the instructors.

Funding for development of the lab was provided through the Workforce Innovation Grant program, in cooperation with the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation and Department of Workforce Development. The lab was a key component of the \$1.64 million grant awarded in 2022 to address the pandemic-exacerbated critical labor shortage threatening the economic stability of the region.

"With manufacturing serving as the largest industry sector in our community, we understand how critical it is for Lakeshore College to not only provide the workforce education and training employers need to succeed but also to make it accessible," says Lakeshore College President Dr. Paul Carlsen.

Carlsen explained the value to the community of having various organizations host the lab. Schools



can capture the attention of students interested in high-paying, stable career options. Employers can make upskilling workers more convenient, leading current workers to advance their skillsets and earning power. Organizations wanting to help lift disadvantaged populations can host the lab anywhere to demonstrate new skills, which can elevate income.

Lakeshore College provides instructors and delivers the mobile lab to an organization's desired location. Individuals trained in the lab can become certified in 15 industry-relevant skills in

welding, quality assurance, computer numerically controlled machine tooling, and electro-mechanical systems. The lab can be stocked with equipment including programmable logic controller machines, Fanuc robot trainers, hydraulic systems, and AC/DC electrical trainers.

WHITETAIL RIDGE & THE PRESERVE AT ELKHART LAKE

The two developments are nearly occupancy for at least some of the buildings. The Preserve also just got approval to place solar panels on its roof, so you may see this construction in the coming weeks. The Village is waiting on a few final items for completion of Leonard's Way. We are waiting on streetlights from We Energies, as well as solar lighting on the pathway to Aero Drive.

FACILITY PLANNING

The Village continues to plan for future facilities, including a welcome center and a new Public Works facility. The Village is working with PRA architects with the designs of the buildings. The Village is also working with Jos. Schmitt on pricing and construction management. We are working on the interior design of both of buildings, then we will have outside renderings completed. The current discussion is that construction on new facilities would begin sometime in 2025.

SEWER RATES INCREASING

Sewer rates will be increasing in 2025. The increase is due to Northern Moraine increasing rates and a high rate of infiltration which we are trying to solve, so in turn we need to increase our rates. These rates will not increase until January 1, 2025. The sewer consumption rates will increase from \$7.55 per 100 cubic feet to \$8.00 per 100 cubic feet. WINTER RULES BEGIN NOVEMBER 15TH

Winter parking regulations go into e ffect on November 15th. As a reminder, here is the ordinance. There will be no overnight parking allowed on Leonard's Way for this winter from November 15th through April

Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am, at that time your vehicle must be moved.

PARKING REGULATIONS All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 am. and 6 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

SNOW REMOVAL

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

Snow Removal Warning

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient and you will be in violation.

VILLAGE ORDINANCE -8.32 ANIMAL FECES

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!! If you see this happening, you can report it to the police. If you know the owner of the dog, you are able to make a statement to the police and the owner will be cited. Also, if you catch someone on video (doorbell cameras) not picking up animal waste you can turn the video to the police, who can than cite the owner of the animal.

Failure to do so will result in double the permit fees, potentially tearing out of what has been done, and could even result in a fine of up to \$1,000.



Paul Sartori Memorial Fund.




MEET THE DIRECTOR: BARB ZIRWES-NYSSE


The Plymouth Arts Center "CELTIC CHRISTMAS"


CHAMBER SPOTLIGHT



A Wisconsin Historic Site. Located in Greenbush, WI, The Wade House showcases the horse-powered world that existed before planes, cars, and railroads. Explore the golden era of the carriage through their stagecoach inn and historic structures, a state-of-the-art modern museum, and Wisconsin's largest collections of carriages and wagons. Visiting The Wade House historic site takes you on a journey through Wisconsin's past with tours of the Wade House Stagecoach Inn, stops at the blacksmith shop & sawmill, and the exhibits of the Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum & Visitor Center. This historic site is named for the inn built by the first European settlers of the town, Sylvanus and Betsey Wade.

This stately stagecoach inn offers a fascinating glimpse into the long-ago era of horse-drawn travel, but it's far from the only reason to hop in the car and venture to this historic site in the scenic northern Kettle Moraine. The beautifully preserved inn is just one of many interactive attractions exploring pioneer life in the 1800s that you will find on the site's 280 acres.


