"Value of a Local Agent 2"

A local agent can be a valuable asset to you when signing up for a Medicare Plan. Medicare Advantage and Prescription Drug Plans can be complicated because they have premiums, copays, deductibles and a specific provider network. Knowledge of what you are enrolling in is crucial.

One thing you will want to know from anyone helping you enroll in a plan is; "Do you make a commission on this sale?" You want the answer to that question to be "YES"!! Why? Because if a person makes a commission for enrolling you, that person can go to the insurance company on your behalf if you have a problem. If a person does not make a commission they cannot help you with a problem unless they have Power of Attorney for you.

Agents offering Medicare plans fall under the oversight of Medicare, whereas most non-agents do not. This should give you the peace of mind that the local agent is showing you all of your options. It's also important to know that your premium will be the same whether you go through a local agent or someone else. If that's the case, why not use someone who can go to bat for you if you need it!!







Is combining health insurance helpful toward meeting a deductible?

According to 2020 regulations, no family may pay more than \$16,400 for out-of-pocket costs, and that includes multiple family members on one policy, so it may make sense to combine health insurance plans if it helps you more easily reach that out-of-pocket maximum where insurance pays 100% for covered services. Otherwise the total will apply to each separate policy.

Is there a health insurance spousal surcharge?

Nearly 90% of employers that offer health insurance also offer spousal coverage, with some caveats. Some may only offer coverage if the spouse doesn't have their own employer option. Others — over 30% of companies in fact — may charge a premium to add a spouse, while some may reimburse an employee who enrolls in their spouse's plan instead.

Taking all of these factors into consideration — available options, medical needs, costs, etc. — can help you determine which choice is best for you and your spouse.





Can I Sue For **Emotional Distress?**

Sure, you can. You probably want to know if you can win a claim for emotional distress and the answer is that these claims are in many ways limited. Certainly, pain and suffering are forms of emotional distress and recovery may be had whether that was in the past or even if they will continue into the future. The jury may consider physical and mental suffering caused by the injury.

Generally mental anguish is not an element of damage arising from a breach of contract. Where

somebody's conduct results in property damage only, damages for emotional distress are not allowed unless you were within the "zone of danger." For instance, where an air conditioner caught fire and burned down a home, the homeowners could not recover because they were not at home at the time of the fire. On the other hand, when Wal-Mart failed to put the plug in the oil pan of the car, it caught fire and burned down a lady's home while she was there, she was entitled to recover damages for emotional distress.

The most common claim that I hear is people who are experiencing fear of driving following a serious motor vehicle crash. I know those claims are real and I believe that most people who experience anxiety following an accident are genuine in their experience. Defense lawyers typically are extremely dismissive of those claims, probably in part because it's their job to be dismissive of other people's injuries and probably in part because it's so common and generally goes away without counseling or treatment. There are those cases where people have to have counseling and medication and certainly people who go through a traumatic experience are entitled to have their claims heard and respected.

I think it's helpful to distinguish between physical pain and mental anguish. Physical pain is just that. It hurts sometimes more, sometimes less and sometimes deprives you of sleep. Mental anguish is what you feel when you're the one who takes care of people, and you have to be taken care of, or you watch and endure the pain and suffering of someone you love dearly. The two are separate but both are elements of damages that a jury would consider in awarding damages.




