Deer hunting plays a vital role in managing the state's deer population, helping to maintain a balance that benefits both the ecosystem and local economies. According to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR), hunters should find good prospects for deer harvest across most regions this season.

Know Before You Go: regulations and resources

Before heading out, it's crucial for hunters to familiarize themselves with their specific deer permit area (DPA) numbers and the regulations that apply. Understanding chronic wasting disease (CWD) guidelines is particularly important, as hunters are required to have any deer aged one year or older sampled



for CWD in designated management zones during the opening weekend and later hunts in December. The DNR provides an easy-to-use DPA lookup tool at mndnr.gov/ deerhunt, where hunters can find detailed information tailored to their hunting areas. Southern Minnesota: flourishing populations

In southern Minnesota, deer populations continue to thrive following last winter's mild conditions. Flooding in June, while concerning, has had little negative impact on overall numbers. The river floodplains in this region provide excellent habitat, with dense vegetation offering ample cover for deer. Bluff lands with oak trees are also promising spots, boasting a moderate to excellent acorn crop this year. As water levels decrease, hunters can expect improved access to prime

hunting areas. Central Minnesota: robust opportunities

Moving to central Minnesota, the deer population remains strong, and hunters have significant opportunities for success. Many DPAs allow for the harvest of up to three deer, with even more flexibility in CWD

management zones and the Twin Cities metro area, where hunters can take up to five deer. Wildlife managers encourage hunters to focus on antierless deer to help manage population levels effectively.

It's essential to note the recent redesignation of DPA 342 to DPA 642 due to CWD detection. This change brings with it specific regulations regarding carcass movement and antlerless deer harvest, so hunters should be aware of the new rules as they plan their outings.

Northeast Minnesota: cautious approach

In northeast Minnesota, deer populations are still rebounding from several harsh winters, and while this past winter was mild, recovery will take time. The best harvest opportunities will be

of this region, particularly in mixed habitats of open fields and forest. Hunters in far northern areas may have limited opportunities, often restricted to buck-only harvests, allowing local populations to recover.

Hunters should be particularly vigilant in CWD management zones (DPAs 604 and 679), where mandatory CWD testing is required during the opening weekend. The city of Grand Rapids has also implemented mandatory sampling for all deer over one year old during any season.

To help inform consideration of a proposed elk restoration project, new mandatory CWD surveillance sampling will be implemented on opening weekend of firearms A season in DPAs 156, 173, 181 and 199 as a precautionary measure within the potential elk restoration area.

Northwest Minnesota: promising outlook

The northwest region of Minnesota has experienced a significant population boost thanks to one of the mildest winters on record. Reports of does giving birth to twins and triplets abound, which

found in the southern part is a promising sign for herd recovery. Although the acorn crop was spotty this year, many food plots and hay fields remain green, helping deer maintain their health as they head into winter.

Hunters in this region may find varying harvest limits, with some DPAs allowing two or three deer while others restrict hunting to bucks only. CWD sampling will also be mandatory in certain areas, including the East Grand Forks-Crookston-Climax area and the Bemidji area.

Final Thoughts

As the firearms deer season opens, hunters are encouraged to embrace the adventure and camaraderie that comes with the tradition. Remember to respect the land, follow all regulations, and prioritize safety while in the field. Election security incident sparks legislative response in Minnesota

On Friday, October 18, an incident involving a Hennepin County contractor raised concerns about election security when sealed transfer cases containing voted absentee ballot signature envelopes were left unattended in a vehicle with an open trunk hatch for several minutes in a public parking lot. The situation was captured in photographs that circulated widely on social media, prompting an immediate review by Hennepin County officials.

The review confirmed that no ballots were compromised during the incident. Minnesota conducts its elections through local election officials at the county, city, and township levels, with the Office of the Minnesota Secretary of State providing resources, training, and support.

Minnesota Secretary of State Steve Simon addressed the incident in a statement, emphasizing its seriousness. "This incident was totally unacceptable," Simon stat-

ed. He noted that Hennepin integrity of elections. "This County has acted quickly and transparently to ensure that all ballots remained secure and accounted for.

The county has established protocols for the delivery of signature envelopes, including the use of security seals on transfer cases and verification measures to confirm that all signature envelopes remained sealed. A thorough review was conducted to match the number of signature envelopes against the records in the State Voter Registration System, ensuring each ballot was accounted for.

Secretary Simon underscored the resilience of Minnesota's election system, highlighting the multiple layers of protection designed to maintain the

The Office of the Secretary of State is providing continued support to Hennepin County and all localities conducting elections, including issuing a bulletin to remind officials of chain of custody requirements and practices to prevent a recurrence of such incidents.

Rep. Kresha announces legislation to improve ballot transportation security

In response to the incident, Representative Ron Kresha (R - Little Falls), announced on October 22, legislation requiring all ballots to be transported only by a party affiliated with a County Elections Officer or the Minnesota Secretary of State. This legislation is in direct response to the handling of ballots in Edina that occurred last week. It will require ballots to be transported by certified election officers or the Secretary of State and they must prove their US Citizenship to transport ballots.

"With decreasing trust in our elections system this is the right move to rebuild Minnesotans' confidence in our free and fair elections," said Rep. Kresha. "Every voice matters in our elections and with the recent incident of unsecured ballots in Edina, it's completely understandable for voters to be concerned that their voice could be silenced. Minnesotans deserve to know that whether they vote absentee, early in person, or on Election Day their vote matters and is just as important to our political process as anyone else's vote."

"Our election integrity is too important and a fundamental cornerstone of trust for election officials to use outside couriers or unaffiliated parties to transport ballots," said Kresha. "We cannot allow DoorDash or Uber practices as part of the election process and transportation of ballots. This legislation will restore voter confidence and improve our state's exemplary elections." CLC receives \$25,000 to combat food insecurity

Central Lakes College was awarded \$25,000 in grants from the Office of Higher Education (OHE) to continue its work in addressing food insecurities on its campuses.

CLC is one of 24 campuses awarded Hunger Free Campus grants, totaling over \$400,000, from OHE in an effort to address food insecurity at Minnesota colleges. Grants were awarded to both public and private schools across the state.

CLC was awarded a \$15,000 Sustaining Designation Grant and a \$10,000 Equipment Grant.

The Equipment Grant will help update the Staples Campus Food Pantry with shelving, a refrigerator and a freezer. Additionally, improvements will be made to make the pantry brighter and more inviting.

The Sustaining Designation Grant will be used to continue purchasing food through Second Harvest Northland, CLC's food bank partner. This amount will provide several thousand pounds worth of food, which will help keep up with the average of 475 student users per week.

"The CLC Food Pantry operates on fundraised dollars, so this Hunger Free Campus Grant from the MN Office of Higher Education is a lifeline for our students and has arrived at the perfect time," said Erich Heppner, director of Student Life at CLC. "Currently, we are seeing the highest level of student need on our campuses that we have ever experienced, and these funds will help us keep students fed and performing at a high level in their classrooms. Thanks to the generosity of donors, we will be able to continue to live by our motto of 'Eat Well, Study Well.'"

OHE Commissioner Dennis Olson added, "For too many students, food insecurity is a daily concern. This initiative is providing those students with the nutrition they need to focus on their studies and finish their program. I look forward to a day when every campus in the state is hunger free."

Investigation following fire in Shamrock Township

On Monday, October 21, at 8:17 a.m., the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office responded to reports of a camper and vehicle that had burned overnight at a residence in Shamrock Township. Upon arrival, deputies discovered human remains inside the camper.

The remains have been transported to the Ramsey County Medical Examiner's Office for identification. The circumstances surrounding the fire are currently under investigation, and an autopsy is pending.

The State Fire Marshal has been called to the scene to assist in the investigation, which aims to determine the cause of the fire and the identity of the deceased. The Aitkin County Sheriff's Office is working in conjunction with the McGregor Fire Department and the State Fire Marshal's Office to gather more information.

Further updates will be provided as the investigation progresses. Anyone with relevant information is encouraged to contact the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office.




