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BAKED CORN PUDDING

Serves 8-10

Ingredients

- Unsalted butter, for greasing the baking dish
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 3 tablespoons cornmeal
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 6 large eggs
- 2 cups half-and-half
- 8 tablespoons (1 stick) unsalted butter, melted and cooled
- 1 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 5 cups corn kernels, thawed if frozen (about 20 ounces)
- 2 medium scallions (green parts only), thinly sliced Instructions
- Arrange a rack in the middle of the oven and heat to 350°F. Lightly coat a 9x13-inch baking dish with butter.
- Whisk the flour, cornmeal, baking powder, salt, garlic powder, and cayenne pepper together in a small bowl.
- 3. Beat the eggs in a large bowl, then whisk in the half-and-half, butter, and cheese. Add the flour mixture and stir until completely combined and smooth. Add the corn and fold to combine. Transfer the batter to the prepared baking dish and smooth into an even layer.
 4.
- 4. Bake until lightly browned around the edges, the pudding is set, and a knife inserted in the center comes out clean, 35 to 40 minutes. Let cool for 5 minutes before topping with the scallions, slicing, and serving warm.



HONEY BUTTER BUTTERNUT SQUASH

Serves 4

Ingredients

- 1 large butternut squash (about 3 pounds)
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 1/4 teaspoon red pepper flakes (optional)

Instructions

- Arrange a rack in the middle of the oven and heat the oven to 400° F. Meanwhile, place 1 large butternut squash on its side. Trim off both ends with a large, sturdy knife. Stand the squash upright and cut in half lengthwise. Scrape out the seeds and any stringy bits with a spoon. Peel the skin off with a vegetable peeler. Arrange the squash halves cut side-down. Cut crosswise into 1/2-inch thick slices.
- Place the squash on a rimmed baking sheet. Drizzle with 2 tablespoons olive oil, and season with 1 teaspoon kosher salt and 1/2 teaspoon black pepper. Use your hands to toss until well coated. Arrange the squash in a single layer.
- 3. Roast the squash for 20 minutes. Flip the squash halves. Continue roasting until the squash is golden brown and fork-tender, 10 to 20 minutes more.
- 4. Transfer the squash to a large bowl. Place 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, 2 tablespoons honey, and 1/4 teaspoon red pepper flakes if desired in a small saucepan over medium heat. Whisk until the butter is just melted and the mixture is smooth, about 1 minute.
- 5. Pour the honey butter mixture over the squash and gently toss until well coated on both sides.







THANKSGIVING SIDES

BRUSSELS SPROUT CASSEROLE

Serves 4 to 6

Ingredients

- 4 slices bacon (about 4 ounces)
- 2 pounds Brussels sprouts, trimmed and halved lengthwise
- 2 medium shallots, thinly sliced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 1 1/2 cups grated Gruyère cheese, divided

Instructions

- 1. Arrange a rack in the middle of the oven and heat to $400^{\circ}F$.
- 2. Place the bacon in a large, oven-proof skillet over medium-low heat. Cook until the fat has rendered out and the bacon is crispy, flipping halfway through, about 10 minutes total. Transfer the bacon to a paper towel-lined plate.
- 3. increase the heat to medium. Add the Brussels sprouts, shallot, garlic, salt, and cayenne pepper to the skillet and stir to coat with the bacon fat. Cook, stirring occasionally, until lightly browned around the edges, about 5 minutes.
- 4. Add the cream and mustard, use your hands to crumble in the bacon in small pieces, and stir to combine. Sprinkle with the cheese.
- 5. Bake until the casserole is bubbly, the Brussels sprouts are tender, and the cheese is melted, about 15 minutes. Turn the oven to broil, and broil until the top is lightly browned, 2 to 3 minutes.

BROCCOLI AND CHEESE SPAGHETTI SQUASH


Serves 4 to 6

Ingredients

- 1 (2 1/2 to 3-pound) cooked, halved spaghetti squash
- 2 cups sharp cheddar cheese
- 2 cups cottage cheese
- 3 large eggs
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 3 cups (1-inch) broccoli florets
- 2 tablespoons water

Instructions

- 1. Arrange a rack in the middle of the oven and heat the oven to 350°F. Meanwhile, scrape the strands from a cooked spaghetti squash out with a fork. Reserve 1/2 cup of cheese for sprinkling, then place the remaining cheddar cheese in a large bowl. Add cottage cheese, 3 eggs, salt, and black pepper, and stir to combine.
- Place broccoli florets and 2 tablespoons water in a large ovenproof skillet. Bring to a boil over mediumhigh heat. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the

CANDIED CARROTS

Serves 6

Ingredients

- 2 pounds carrots
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter, divided
- 2 fresh or dried bay leaves
- 3/4 teaspoon kosher salt, divided
- 1/3 cup packed light or dark brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Instructions

- Peel 2 pounds carrots and cut on a diagonal into 1/2-inch thick pieces. Place in a large high-sided skillet. Add 3/4 cup water, 2 tablespoons of the unsalted butter, 2 bay leaves, and 1/4 teaspoon of the kosher salt. Bring to a simmer over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally until the butter melts, about 3 minutes.
- 2. Cover, reduce the heat to medium, and cook, shaking the skillet occasionally, until the carrots start to soften at the edges, 5 to 8 minutes.
- 3. Using a slotted spoon, transfer the carrots to a plate. Add remaining the remaining 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, 1/3 cup packed brown sugar, 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger, 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon, and remaining 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt to the pan. Stir to combine, increase the heat to high, and bring to a boil. Cook until thick and syrupy, 2 to 3 minutes.
- 4. Return the carrots to the skillet and toss to coat. Reduce the heat to medium-high. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the carrots are tender, 5 to 8 minutes. Remove and discard the bay leaves.



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

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

A recent presentation to the Claybank Master Gardeners by Michael Mullen of Alabama Scenic River Trail gave us a truly insightful picture of the rich beauty we enjoy here, as "Alabama the grand garden of Creation" so named by Dr. Doug Phillips, the creator and host of Alabama's Public TV series "Discovering Alabama". We learned that we have more geological diversity than any other state except for California. 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




SPY NOVEL
