wide Fame receiver Rice. Jerry Past recipients include NFL standouts Cooper Kupp (Rams), Chase Edmonds (Buccaneers) and Trey Lance (Cowboys), well as current Univ. of Miami quarterback, Cam Ward and Colorado quarterback, Shedeur Sanders. All five played their freshman seasons at the FCS level.

To be eligible the Jerry Rice Award, must player considered a freshman by his conference in his first academic year, or second if he redshirted as a true freshman.

Anglin makes the list as one of UNA's defensive leaders, totaling 51 tackles over eight games this season to rank second on the team. The former Mill Creek High School standout also has 4.0 tackles for loss, a forced fumble, a quarterback hurry and a pass breakup this season.

Fletcher has been spark plug on the offensive side, as he has rushed 36 times for 305 yards and a touchdown. The former West Morgan ball carrier is averaging a whopping 8.5 yards per carry. He has also caught four passes for 79 yards and another score.

Fletcher is current leader in United American Conference Freshman of the Week awards with three. Anglin has been honored twice.

Only one other player from the UAC is on the watch list - Southern Utah defensive back Robertson. Jayden Alabama State running back Jamarie Hostzclaw was the only other instate player on the list. No other school outside of North Alabama had more than one selection on the 30-player watch list. In 2022, former UNA quarterback Noah Walters was a finalist for the award.

The 2024 Jerry Rice Award recipient will be announced on Dec. 4 and honored at the Stats Perform National Awards Banquet on Jan. 4 in Frisco, Texas.

After active Duty as an Army Lt., he served at the Marshall Space Flight Center and Kennedy Space Center. He was a Project Engineer/ Engineering manager for NASA on the Apollo, Skylab, ASTP, and Shuttle Programs. He earned Management MS from FSU in 1972. After completion of the Shuttle Development phase, he returned to the US Army

Missile Command. There, he managed engineering support to the Army's long range missile systems before becoming Chief Engineer/Deputy Program Manager. Paulus then became manager of a missile development program in Full Scale Engineering Development. After retirement from the Army Missile Command, established $engineering\, management$ consultant firm.

After active duty. Paulus stayed in the Active Reserve and National Guard finally retired as Colonel. became locally known for designing, building and donating 8 Adirondack type shelters with 115 built in bunks at Westmoreland Boy Scout Camp. was the also a recipient of the NASA Space Flight Medal (1984 and 1985).

A partial list of his other awards include: Army Aviator of the Year, 1984; AHS Feinberg Memorial Award; AIAA Oberth Award; US Army John B Medaris Award, Distinguished Graduate, University of Texas at Arlington, 1990; University of Southern Mississippi Alumni Hall of Fame, 1993; Air Force Command and Staff Gathering of Eagles, 1990; Elected to the Army Space Pioneers Hall, 2005; and the Army Aviation Hall of Fame, 2007; US Army Heritage Center Foundation Living Legend Award, 2023.

After flying helicopters Vietnam, Stewart became a test pilot and flew 38-40 test aircraft. He then became a Shuttle Astronaut. He was one of two Astronauts who flew the Manned Mobility Unit in orbit around the earth. When promoted to General, he returned to several Army leadership roles centered around Missile Defense and Space before he retired. He now lives in Huntsville, AL with his wife Mary and serves as a Docent at the US Space and Rocket Center.

Ed Yeilding was born in Auburn, AL, and graduated in 1967 from Coffee High School in Florence. He was an electrical engineering coop student at Auburn University, working Tennessee at Arnold Engineering Development Complex, at TVA's Cumberland Steam Plant, and commissioned through ROTC. training at Williams Air Force Base in Arizona, Yeilding's assignments were the RF-4 at Bergstrom AFB TX and Okinawa Japan, the F-4E fighter at Moody AFB GA, the SR-71, and the C-20 at Andrews AFB near Washington DC. While at Moody AFB in 1982, he earned a Masters in Management through an extension of Troy University.

In 1983, he was selected for the SR-71 at Beale AFB CA. He flew 93 SR-71 overseas reconnaissance missions and became an SR-71 instructor pilot and developmental test pilot. When the SR-

Sen. Tommy Tuberville Honors Alvin Lynch of Muscle Shoals as June "Veteran of the Month"

Congressional Record - Senate

Mr. TUBERVILLE: "Mr. President, this month. I am proud to recognize U.S. Army Sergeant Alvin Lynch of Muscle Shoals. Born in Hamilton, AL, Alvin was drafted for the Vietnam War at age 21. He was deployed as part of the 82nd Airborne Division, participating in some of the most intense combat operations in Vietnam. Alvin was wounded in action, and had multiple brushes with death.

On one particular night, he decicled to sleep on the small air mattress provided to him, instead of sleeping on the ground as he normally did. This decision to sleep on an air mattress would save his life. The mattress absorbed the blow of a piece of shrapnel from a nearby explosion, keeping it from hitting him instead. Another time, he escaped a battle in the jungle with a shoulder wound that left him in the hospital for 3 weeks. He was one of the few men in his platoon to survive the encounter.

Alvin credits the prayers of his wife and local church members for bringing him home safely. He received several awards for his heroism, including a Purple Heart and Bronze Star. For more than 40 years, he has been providing heating and cooling services to The Shoals region.

In 1981, he began working at C & H Cooling and Heating. He bought the business in 2006 with a friend and still runs it today. Alvin credits the military for teaching him discipline and how to deal with stressful situations that businessowners often experience. But the most important thing Alvin took away from his time in the military is his faith, and he does not shy away from sharing his testimony with others.

Alvin is now actively involved in Grace Life Church in Muscle Shoals, where he serves as an elder. Alabama is thankful for Alvin, and it is my honor to recognize him as the June Veteran of the Month."

According to the White House, in January 2023 plans were finalized for the "National Strategy to Develop Statistics for Environmental Economic Decisions (SEED)."

This creates a new line-item on the Federal Balance Sheet that will record the value of real assets such as land and water, as well as natural processes such as air and environmental services.

This is where the "Sustains Act" becomes one of the implementing components of this strategy. It will create a monetary value for these natural processes derived from the conservation programs, the ownership of which is being decided by the contributing entity and the Secretary of Agriculture - not the private landowner.

All these actions - the Inflation Reduction Act language change, the implementation of the Sustains Act, and the White House addition of environmental services to the Federal Balance Sheet are working together to transfer the value and control of private property from the citizens to government and

IMITATE SUCCESSFUL BEHAVIOR

Dear Dave,

My wife and I have paid off all our consumer debt, and we're in Baby Step 3 building up our emergency fund to six months of expenses. When do you recommend buying a new car in the process? Do we have to wait until we've finished all the Baby Steps?

Aaron

Dear Aaron.

Congratulations! You two are taking really positive steps forward in gaining control of your finances. I'm proud of you!

Ok, I'm not sure if you're talking about buying a newer car—like a great twoor three-vear-old model-or an actual *new* car. I don't advise buying a brand new car, unless you have a net worth of at least \$1 million. Why? Because at that point. vou've got enough assets that you won't get rocked by the crazy depreciation that comes with buying a brand new vehicle.

Don't get all down after hearing this. I'm not saying you should drive a junker until you pay off your house. I recommend that people drive the minimum they can in terms of a car until they complete the first three Baby Steps. As you already know, Baby Step 1 is a beginner emergency fund of \$1,000. Baby Step 2 is paying off all debt except for your home, and Baby Step 3 is fully funding your emergency fund with three to six months of expenses.



After you've accomplished the first three steps, then you can move up to a nicer car. Notice I didn't say move up to a new car. File a police report immediately, and if possible, have this woman arrested. That may sound harsh, but the fact is she has committed criminal fraud. That's not something you, or anyone else, should take lightly. If you haven't already, make sure you both also put fraud victim alerts on your credit reports immediately.

I'm very serious about this, Kendra. Don't stop

with just alerting the credit card companies. You should speaking with, and communicating via email plus snail mail—directly with the fraud victim division at every credit card company involved. And here's the really important part. Make sure they understand that this is a denial of responsibility on your part—not simply a

Try to be nice, and let them know you're sorry this happened. But clearly explain that all these charges are the result of a criminal act perpetrated against you. You may have to stand your ground with some of the credit card companies, because they might try to lay a guilt trip on you—or outright lie—to get you to pay the bills. Don't do it. These charges are not your responsibility.



Understanding Your Settlement

We had a gentleman come see to us who was significantly injured in a wreck. I would place the value of his case in the \$75,000.00 range. He signed a personal injury release believing that he was signing a property damage release. The insurance adjuster explained to him what he was signing and recorded the conversation. This man made a \$75,000.00 mistake. We are going to try and fix it, but we may not be able to. Some injury cases can and should be handled without an

attorney, others should not.

If there is a question in your mind about understanding what you are doing, don't do it. We really do offer free consultations. It's our job to make sure that you understand the legal issues. Stateside who want to see the United States and the "west" fall, and they are always preparing to help facilitate that end, even if it means their death in the process.

This is not about the communists of our number who want the U.S. Constitution burned and

a new Amerika to surface in its place. That "enemy within" was thought about long before Donald Trump started using the term in this election cycle. Our founders knew people would surface and detailed it in their writings. It started slowly about 100 years ago. Only in the last 20 years have people become more emboldened to publicly denigrate our liberties

and question their pride in being a citizen of the United States.

However, the immediate concerns are the terrorist elements who want to bring Mideast chaos and economic ruin here.

We also have 535 federal representatives who seem perfectly content to fund some truly irrational projects in other areas of the country if they get their share of pork in their home district as well. That's just the way it is in good ol' boy buddy system. A clean bill is a wasted opportunity.

We insist on supporting other countries and international entities with our financial assistance and resources. However, they don't care about us in the least. We need to reprioritize.

Then we need to come to grips with the deterioration of our infrastructure.

The American Society of Civil Engineers estimates that there is a water main break every two minutes. Virtually every U.S. home is at risk of extended power outages because of power grid failures and deteriorating power lines. Spotty or insufficient telecommunications is common. Cell and internet service is in question regularly, sometimes

covering huge portions of the country. Is that hardware? Software? Outside interference as a test?

Some 40,000 bridges in the U.S. needs repair (that is one in 3), that endanger up to 150 million commuters every day.

Look at the aging dam system on the Tennessee River, the frequent problems with the main lock a here at Wilson. A guide wall for the barges above the lock sank in 2021.

Three years later, Nikki Berger, navigation program supervisor for the Teni Valley Authority Tennessee was commenting in TheWaterways Journal how the first of a three spud barges as part of a temporary replacement plan was completed in late summer of 2024. Completion of the other $two\,spuds\,along\,with\,lights$ and handrails is expected in the fall of 2025. The temporary solution... "We continue to seek funding sources for a permanent solution," Berger said. "The funding is not in our business plan.'

How is this situation at Wilson alone going to be addressed? Other significant projects along America's waterways are in the hundreds of \$millions each. Now look at a thousand similar projects in need now or in the coming couple of decades to avoid catastrophe.

Hurricane Helene is not the first example of government's failure to respond adequately to weather related disasters.

Helene was federal. Yet, federal monies had been allocated specifically to bolster Louisiana's inadequate levies prior to Hurricane Katrina in 2005, but it had been squandered in other directions by state and local leaders in New Orleans. We saw what happened there.

Both parties vote to fund endless wars, expand government with money we don't have, disrespect the rule of law, follow the money of big business, and care less about our liberty and more about their positions of power.

And we have billionaires who blackmail communities to help fund their new \$billion sports venues or they will move their teams elsewhere.

We have close to 40 million people living in poverty.

Both parties were promising tax cuts if elected. We need to reexamine some of what is broken.

"Medicare Advantage Plans Part 2"

A Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) is a type of Medicare health plan offered by a private insurance company that contracts with Medicare to provide you with all your Part A and Part B benefits. If you're enrolled in a Medicare Advantage Plan, most Medicare services are covered through the plan and aren't paid for under Original Medicare. Most Medicare Advantage Plans offer prescription drug coverage. There are six things you will want to consider if looking at a Medicare Advantage Plan. They include the premium, copays, coinsurance, deductibles, providers that take the plan and the drug formulary of the plan. This week we will look at the premium, copays and coinsurance.

The premium of MA plans can vary depending on the type of plan you have and the company offering the plan. Although the premium of the plan should be a part of your decision it shouldn't be the only consideration. For some, the MA plan with the lowest premium may fit your needs perfectly but for others it could actually cost you more in the long run if the other five considerations don't match up for you. Also, if you are currently in a MA plan and it is working for you, switching plans solely because of the premium may not be in your best interest.

Copays and coinsurance are also two factors to consider when looking at MA plans. A copay is a set amount you will pay when you receive a service. An example of a copay would be the set amount you pay to your primary care doctor when you see him or her. Coinsurance is a percentage you pay if you receive a specific service. An example of coinsurance would be the percentage you pay for durable medical equipment.

What can you do to try to avoid hitting deer and other animals when driving on highways and roads?

Between the months of October and December, it's not uncommon to see deer leap onto a busy road, especially around nightfall. New data shows U.S. drivers on the average have a 1 in 128 chance of a collision with an animal, according to the State Farm[®] annual analysis. The company estimates there were over 1.8 million animal collision insurance claims in the U.S. between July 1, 2023 and June 30, 2024.

Where are animal collisions most likely?

The top 10 states for animal collision, with their odds for an animal collision, are:

1. West Virginia – 1 in 40, 2. Montana – 1 in 54, 3. Michigan - 1 in 59, 4. Pennsylvania – 1 in 61, 5. Wisconsin – 1 in 63, 6. Mississippi – 1 in 65, 7. Iowa – 1 in 68, 8. South Dakota – 1 in 69, 9. Virginia – 1 in 73, 10. Rhode Island – 1 in 75

The months drivers are most likely to collide with a large animal in the U.S. are (in order) November, October and December. Alabama is a medium-risk state for animal collisions.

Kind of animals that get hit by cars

The top 10 animals involved in animal collisions are: 1. Deer, 2. Unidentified animals, 3. Rodents, 4. Dog, 5. Raccoon, 6. Coyote, 7. Turkey, 8. Cattle, 9. Bird, 10. Squirrel

Can you avoid deer (and other animals) in your headlights?

The growing deer and other animal populations, combined with the displacement of animal habitats, are making it more dangerous on the road, and making driver crashes more likely. There may be no real way to keep animals off the road, but these important safety tips can help prevent animal strikes.

Tips to avoid animals on the road

- Stay alert. Pay attention to "deer crossing" and "wildlife crossing" signs and be cautious in areas near woods or water.
- Use high beams. Flicking your high beams on an animal in the road may cause the animal to scurry away. High beams also help illuminate dark roads.
- Don't swerve. If a car crash is inevitable, maintain control of your vehicle and stay on the road.
- Brake, as necessary. If you can avoid hitting the animal, reduce your speed, honk your horn and tap your brakes to warn other drivers. If there are no drivers behind you, brake hard.
- Remember peak season. Animal collisions happen most during October through December, which is hunting and mating season.
- Remember mealtime. Watch for animals in the road between dusk and dawn.
- Watch for herds. If you see one deer, there are probably more nearby.
- Don't use a whistle. No scientific evidence supports that carmounted deer whistles work.
- Wear seat belts. Always obey speed limits and wear seat belts.
