

The beach and campground expansions contracts were let earlier in the spring of 2024. DeChantal Excavating was the low (and awarded) bidder for the projects with contracts of \$206,595 and \$104,479 for the beach and campground expansions, respectively. Both projects are expected to be complete by November 15 of this year, although both are mainly wrapped up at this time. Below is a summary of the scope of each project:

Lum Park Campground

Expansion of the existing RV campground with 12 newly constructed sites

All campsites will have new water hookups and 50-30-20 Amp electrical pedestals

The sites are varied in size (for various size campers) ranging from 30 feet to 40 feet, with some sites having an adjacent parking stall for a passenger vehicle/pickup.

Lum Park Beach

Expansion of the existing beach nearly five times the existing size

Demolition of the old beach restroom building (has been closed for several years)

Removal of roughly 2/3 of the lower parking lot to accommodate beach expansion

Resurfacing of the remaining parking lot

Addition of new ADA-accessible sidewalk from parking lot to the beach area

Installation of 3 fabric shade structures, one of which will be ADA-accessible

Installation of foot-washing station

Construction of a new sidewalk to connect the beach and parking lot to the fishing pier, Pavilion 1, and the restroom/ shower building

Construction of an earthen berm for natural seating





Lakes Area election results: incumbents hold strong, new faces emerge

The unofficial results for the local elections held on Tuesday, November 5 show a mix of continuity and change across city councils, school boards, and county races in the Brainerd Lakes Area. Uncontested races are not listed.

County Commissioner Seats:

Crow Wing County

In the Crow Wing County Commissioner District 5 race, Jamie Lee won with 3,809 votes (52.12%) over Johnna Johnson 3,476 votes (47.56%).

School Board Elections: Aitkin

Aitkin School District No. 1 saw Brian Leitinger and Cindi Hills lead the race for three available positions, receiving 27.46% and 26.76% of the vote, respectively. Dawn Houser and Sherryl Roscoe finished third and fourth, securing 23.72% and 20.71% of the vote.

Brainerd

In the Brainerd School District No. 181, incumbents Stephanie Etterman, John Ward, and Michelle Brekken took the top spots with 18.3%, 17.89%, and 16.82% of the vote, respectively. The other candidates in the race were Jody Kalenberg 9,474 votes (15.75%), Michael Stromberg 8,848 votes (14.71%), Kevin Boyles (incumbent) 7,077 votes (11.76%) and Andrew Mendez 2,710 votes (4.50%).

Crosby-Ironton

In Crosby-Ironton, Mark Taylor 3,014 votes (22.50%), incumbent Laura Lee 2,731

votes (20.39%) and Han- newcomers Jesse Marohn nah Wesner 2,710 votes (20.23%) secured seats on the school board while incumbent Michael Domin 2,122 votes (15.84%), Casey Kannel 1,774 votes (13.24%) and Steve Hudson Cotriu 991 votes (7.40%) did not pass the test.

Voters rejected a proposed referendum to increase school funding with 53.83% voting "No".

McGregor

Voters of the McGregor School District No. 4 Board Member race elected Pat Scollard 1,230 votes (21.96%), Bethany Sellers 1,203 votes (21.48%) Jordan Moser 1,185 votes (21.16%) and Allison Paquette 1,175 votes (20.98%) with Jon Napoli failing with 760 votes (13.57%).

Pequot Lakes

In Pequot Lakes, voters chose incumbents Curt Johnson 4,292 votes (24.09%), Amy Sjoblad 3,833 votes (21.51%) Kim Bolz-Andolshek 3,296 votes (18.50%) along with Mariah Hines 3,320 votes (18.63%) who won over incumbent Susan Mathison-Young 2,979 votes (16.72%) for the school board.

Pillager

In the Pillager School District Board member race, voters re-elected incumbents Kassandra Nelson 1,717 votes (22.09%), Brian Grimsley 1,536 votes (19.76%) and Bridgette (Wyffels) Brown 1,270 votes (16.34%) with

1,003 votes (12.90%), Lindsay Martin 1,230 votes (16.44%) and Levi Nagel 984 votes (12.66%) failing the grade.

City Elections:

Several key city elections brought out passionate competition, especially for city councils and mayoral races.

Aitkin In the Aitkin mayoral

race Gary Tibbitts 827 votes (79.98%) out paced Kevin Russell Hagen 201 votes (19.44%).

Baxter

On the Baxter City Council, Patrick Sundberg earned 2,622 votes (35.5%) while incumbents Mark Cross and Jeffrey C. Phillips also claimed seats with 2,243 votes (30.37%) and 1,362 votes (18.44%) support, respectively.

Brainerd

In Brainerd, voters made a significant change in Ward 1, where Tad Erickson defeated incumbent Kara Terry with 58.21% of the vote.

The challenger Jeff Czeczok 710 votes (54.28%) also won in Ward 3 over incumbent Tiffany Stenglein 589 votes (45.03%).

The Brainerd City Council at-large race saw Mike O'Day and Kevin Stunek secure re-election with 3,888 votes (44.42%) and 2,470 votes (28.22%), respectively, while Shirley Yeager lost the race with 2,320 votes.

Todd Roggenkamp 1,335

votes (77.39%) won the Breezy Point mayoral race as the incumbent Angel Zierden who withdrew from race received 374 votes (21.68%).

Incumbents won in the Breezy Point City Council election with Steve Jensen 1,033 votes (40.19%) and Rebecca Ball 643 votes (25.02%) being re-elected over Felicia Moddes 466 votes (18.13%) and Sandra "Sam" Castrodad 406 votes (15.80%).

Crosby

In Crosby, the mayoral race was one of the tightest in the region, with incumbent Diane L. Cash narrowly defeating Chris Ryan by just 15 votes (535 votes / 50.42% to 520 votes / 49.01%). The city council race also proved competitive, with Shawn Jarvela securing 579 votes (32.33%) and Paul Heglund 410 votes (22.89%). Adam J. Cash 335 votes (18.7%), Joanna Lattery 324 votes (18.09%) and Phillip (Doc) Mihoover 140 votes (7.82%) lost the race.

Crosslake

Crosslake saw Jackson Purfeerst with1,135 votes (58.9% defeat incumbent Dave Nevin with 783 votes (40.63%) in the mayoral race. Meanwhile, Bob Heales 1,081 votes (35.89%) and Jayme Knapp 979 votes (32.5%) out paced Robin Sylvester 942 votes (31.27%) for the two open city council seats.

East Gull Lake

In the East Gull Lake city

Bergin 457 votes (40.99%) and Carol Demgen 379 votes (33.99%) won over Noelle Wallace 275 votes (24.66%). Emily

Incumbent Tracy Jones 436 votes (62.55%) won the mayoral race in Emily over Roger "Buddy" Lund 252 votes (36.15%). In the Emily council member race, Daniel Brennan 353 votes (30.83%) and incumbent Gerhart "Gary" Hanson 349 votes (30.48%) won over incumbent Bryce L. Butcher 257 votes (22.45%). and Brent Nolby 181 votes (15.81%).

Fifty Lakes

Gary Staples with 207 votes (54.47%) won the mayoral race over Randy Zeigler 166 votes (43.68%).

Garrison

Robert O. Hanson won with 61 votes (60.40%) over incumbent Loren Larson 38 votes (37.62%) in the Garrison mayoral race.

Mark Stowe 60 votes (37.74%) and Mike Bourke 47 votes (20.56%) won over incumbent Suzanne Foster 38 votes (23.9%).

Isle

Mayoral incumbent Ernie Frie won with 216 votes (51.8%) over Donald Dahlen 195 votes (46.76%).

Incumbent David Keding 194 votes (30.74%) and Rick Behnke 230 votes (36.45%) won the city council seats over Joe Ebenhowh 190 votes (30.11%).

Lake Shore

The Lake Shore City Coun-

council race, incumbents Tim cil special two-year term election favored formerly appointed candidate Darcy Peterson 491 votes (67.26%) over Karri Stodolka 233 votes (31.92%).

Nisswa

Jennifer Carnahan 826 votes (54.20%) won the Nisswa mayoral race over incumbent John Ryan 692 votes (45.41%).

Pequot Lakes

In Pequot Lakes, Tyler Gardner was re-elected as mayor with 98.26% of the vote, while incumbent Scott Pederson secured his council seat with 52.19% of the vote.
