

The November mystery photo is of Mill Street in Plymouth WI between 1957 and 1960. The corner drug store is Adam's Rexall Drugstore, owned by Oren Adam's. Oren purchased the former Fifrich drugstore in 1957 and ran it until he sold it to his son Steve in 1985. I remember as a young girl my parents and others talking about having enjoyed eating at the lunch counter they ran there. Down the street was Bades



Drug Store that was later purchased by William Heberlein in 1964, where my parents also shopped. On the opposite side of the street is The City Club. It is still operating today as City Club Bar & Grill with good food and a wonderful Friday fish fry. There are many other stores in the photo that I vaguely remember like the bakery that my parents would go to. In the opposite direction was the A&P Grocery Store where my parents would buy groceries. There were two movie theaters down that way too! My mother-in-law would tell us stories about the one she worked at as a young girl. That building has since burned down.

Community & Conservation at Elkhart Lake's First Watershed Stakeholder Meeting

While the sound of boats has quieted on the water, the Elkhart Lake Improvement Association (ELIA) has been making waves offshore this autumn. Just a few weeks ago, ELIA hosted its inaugural Watershed Stakeholder Meeting at Farm 1849, a picturesque property in Glenbeulah. The event aimed to bring together farmers, outdoor enthusiasts, and representatives from several local conservation organizations and government bodies. The goal? To get those who are working hard on local watershed preservation into the same room for an evening. ELIA was optimistic that some water quality sparks would fly.

Attendees enjoyed an evening of putting faces to names in the way that Sheboygan County residents do best- over local Sheboygan beers from Three Sheeps Brewing and Wisconsin brats cooked by Three Guys and a Grill. Each attendee kept it short and sweet with the mic to ensure that everyone had an opportunity to present on their ongoing water quality projects. Key speakers included Tyler Betry, the Sheboygan County Conservationist, Miriam Headrick from the Glacial Lakes Conservancy, Derek Sippel from the Sheboygan River Progressive Farmers & Airy Point Farms, Michael Patin from the National Resource Conservation Service, Amy Lentz from Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership, Steve Klock from Sheboygan County Conservation Association and Pheasants Forever, and Star Gerk from the Sheboygan River Basin Partnership.

The energy in the room was informative, inquisitive and inspiring as each speaker got to present their ongoing contributions to the future of the surrounding watershed. The presentations provided the perfect opportunity for everyone to be updated on each organization's status and helped the groups find overlap in ongoing projects as well as potential partnerships on future projects. Overlapping goals included reducing stormwater runoff and pollution, managing invasive species and supporting native habitat, just to name a few. As the night concluded, the room was filled with optimism and eagerness for future gatherings.

ELIA members are excited to have provided



this collaborative space for their partners to come together. Serving as a network for these groups and continuing to build momentum around the shared appreciation of our local waterways is something ELIA plans to keep on their agenda. People always say it takes a village. When it comes to water health, it often takes your village plus the other communities in your county. 



Where Has the Past 15 Years Gone???

The mission statement of the Friends of the Broughton Sheboygan Marsh, formed in 2005, is "to promote the increased use and appreciation of the unique beauty of the Broughton Sheboygan County Marsh through education and recreation". Their first project was the construction of Wisconsin's tallest wooden observation tower, which opened fifteen years ago and allows visitors to have a birds-eye view of the marsh and surrounding terrain. Hoping to commence construction in the spring, the Friends appreciated the generosity of the donors who have contributed to make this happen. They then needed to become a non-profit 501(c) 3) which they did and that helped with the funding. Next came Reed Schmitt from Jos. Schmitt Construction whose daughter Christine attended a two day field trip at the marsh and told her father what a great place this was and between Reed and his brother Steve offered to build the tower and that's how it got started.

Have you climbed this lately, the tallest wooden tower in the state of Wisconsin, 80 ft. It is located at the Sheboygan County Marsh Park. This Christmas the tower will be opened to the public for 15 years already. Where has the time gone? We started that project back in 2005 and in 2009 it was completed to be open to the public on Christmas. This tower gives you the opportunity to view the Sheboygan marsh from 80 ft high. It has 4 landings and you can sit on the second and top landings and just relax or see the view. If you are not able to climb 144 easy steps you can see the view from inside the restaurant with a camera and joy stick to move it around.

Our contractor Jos. Schmitt & Sons did an excellent job on this project.

Next the Friends started working to further enhance the park with the creation of a multi-purpose/educational center and meeting facility that will house Camp Y-Koda's environmental programs, field trips from schools throughout the area and other groups who appreciate conservation efforts and wildlife at the marsh.

Our next project was the Kohler Center for Marsh Education also located on the south end of the park. This center is open to the public for events such as showers, birthday parties, and other celebrations which if you reach out to the Sheboygan County Planning Dept. 920-459-3060 they will gladly help you make your reservation. This beautiful building was also built by Jos. Schmitt Construction. The main focus is for educating the youth from the surrounding schools on their two day field trips to the marsh. The center attraction has a 115 year old tree from the marsh which holds up the Atrium. This building

Snow Removal



Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

Snow Removal Warning

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient, and you will be in violation.

Winter Rules begin November 15th

Winter parking regulations go into effect on November 15th. As a reminder, here is the ordinance. There will be no parking allowed on Leonard's Way for this winter from November 15th through April 1st at any time.

Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am, at that time your vehicle must be moved.

PARKING REGULATIONS

All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 am. and 6 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.












Lakeland University students present research at the Society for Neuroscience meeting in Chicago



A pair of Lakeland University students presented research this fall at the Society for Neuroscience meeting in Chicago.

Lakeland juniors Savannah Szalanski and Montana Zdroik presented their poster entitled: "Using IPSC Derived Astrocytes to Explore Neurotransmitter Homeostasis." The students worked in the Lakeland Undergraduate Research Experience (LURE) with Associate Professor of Chemistry & Biochemistry Jered McGivern, Ph.D. over the summer and

The team used adult human derived tissues to examine astrocyte uptake of the neurotransmitters GABA and Glutamate. The hope is to be able to utilize these types of cells to better understand the physiology of the system and eventually use it as a model system to understand defects that may cause disease.

Szalanski, of Watertown, Wis., is a biology major with minors in chemistry, Spanish and biochemistry. Zdroik, of Stevens Point, Wis., is a chemistry and biochemistry major.

Lakeland's LURE research program allows students to work closely with a Lakeland faculty member to design a project, conduct all publishable research, troubleshoot, analyze data and eventually present findings at a state or national scientific conference.

The Society for Neuroscience meeting is a national conference with an attendance of more than 20,000 people.

Lakeland donates microscopes locally

Thanks to a grant from the West Foundation to obtain higher quality microscopes for Lakeland University's teaching labs, the LU biology department recently helped two local organizations improve their microscopy capabilities.

Over the past year, Lakeland's biology department has made a large donation of older (but functional) monocular scopes to the Howards Grove School District and a smaller donation to the John Michael Kohler Art's Center in Sheboygan.

Twenty-two monocular microscopes were donated to Howards Grove schools in August of 2023 for use in their science courses. That donation was coordinated by LU adjunct instructor Hannah Harder-Chancellor, who worked with a local teacher in Howards Grove to coordinate the donation.

This October, Lakeland made a second donation of two binocular compound microscopes to the JMKAC to assist their efforts to incorporate microscopy in their art course offerings.

































Making Spirits Bright























First-Generation College Students to Share Their Experiences at **Lakeshore College**

These steps should be completed by Sunday, Dec. 15 so that the contributions may be made available for pickup.


While many families appreciate the gifts for their children, they also have other needs, such as food and gas. This is where the Christmas Gift Plus program comes into play.


