



championship for the men's cross-country program all-time.

more Even significantly, Bett is the first Lion to win a conference championship of any kind at the Division I level across all sports.

"What an incredible moment and significant first

for our entire athletic department," said UNA Director of Athletics, Josh Dr. Looney. "Congratulations Brian on this historic accomplishment for UNA Athletics and our crosscountry program. Coach (Connor) Callahan, who arrived at UNA in late July, masterfully engaged, motivated and trained our athletes to accomplish things that have never been done before at UNA. We're so proud of everyone with our associated cross-country program and their efforts in pushing UNA Athletics to new heights!

Bett won the ASUN championship with a time of 23:29.6, beating last year's champion, Taha Er Raouy οf Eastern Kentucky, by nearly six seconds.

While Bett was excited to make history with his championship win, he was even more excited to help his team match their highest Division I finish in school history. The Lions placed fifth out of 12 teams, which was last achieved in 2019.

"This is the best thing that has ever happened (in my life)," said Bett after the win. "We have a good team. The teamwork is great. We have a good coach — the best coach. The training is perfect. We get the best results, and we always prepare well. I like being the champion and being the first at UNA. It's perfect."

Bett has achieved multiple school records this season, including a 23:26.4 time for a new personal-best at the Gans Creek Classic earlier this season. He was three seconds off that time at the ASUN Championship.

a church in South Carolina last weekend. There were several little girls present. By the time I left, I was fast friends with two of them, a 9-year-old and a 7 year old. I told my story in my talk. I questioned whether I should, because there were such young ones present. But I told of how once when I was about 11, my parents were fighting and there was a knife. All I could do was get on my knees between them and start praying. The fighting deescalated. Those two little girls heard me when I said that there is hope for anyone, because alcoholism left our house a few years later, because of the power of God. My desperate prayer was answered. Those two little girls hugged me with sincerity and hope every time they passed by me that weekend. They were there at church with their grandmother, because they had been experiencing some of the same things that had been in my childhood. I was so glad to be able to love them for a moment during their hardship. During that last goodbye hug, I wanted to take them home with me. But we can't protect the little babies from everything. We can only give them the power and the hope to know that they

When he came, we went for a walk in a park that had been devastated by Hurricane Helene. There were trees crashed down everywhere. We could barely see the creek because of the tree parts piled up to clear the pathway. But when we looked up, the changing colors of the leaves were so lovely. We chose to focus on the lovely. I decided to enjoy his company. He knows that I want every good thing for him. What he needed from me was for me to believe in him during his struggle. He had come to me and we had a sweet time together. That's what we needed. It was lovely.

> I traveled home, I got to stay overnight with our 5 year old grandson and his family. He recently had his adenoids and tonsils out, but he's still not sleeping well. I told him that those words mean, "I won't choke," and "I can breathe." I believe that the fear of being startled

Cooking A Turkey In A Deep Fryer Without Causing A Dangerous Fire Is On The Menu This Holiday

Thanksgiving is typically a time for family and holiday traditions which may include enjoying classic Thanksgiving recipes, and that often means turkey as the main dish. Nowadays, those holiday recipes and traditions might include deep-frying a turkey because of the flavor and juiciness.

Holiday cooks should carefully use a turkey fryer because turkey fryer accidents have the potential to cause a fire and serious injury. Each year these deep fryers on average cause 60 injuries, 5 deaths and over \$15 million in property damage according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).

TIPS TO HELP PREVENT DEEP FRIED TURKEY ACCIDENTS

- · Never leave frvers unattended.
- Keep outdoor fryers a safe distance from structures, off wooden decks and away from trees.
- Never use fryers in garages.
- Place the fryer on a level surface and avoid moving it once in
- Be cautious of the weather. Avoid operating a fryer in the rain or snow
- There should be 2 feet between the burner and tank.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions to avoid overfilling with cooking oil.
- Choose the proper size turkey. Typically, a bird that's 8 to 10 pounds works well.
- Never attempt to deep fry a frozen turkey. Ice or water that mixes into the hot oil can cause flare-ups. Follow directions on the label to assure the turkey has been properly defrosted and is completely dry, prior to placing in the fryer.
- Also, skip stuffing the turkey before frying.
- Consider using a fryer with temperature controls. Continuously check the oil temperature carefully. Cooking oil that is heated beyond its smoke point can catch fire. If you notice the oil is smoking, TURN OFF THE FRYER.
- **Turn off the burner** before lowering the turkey into the oil. Once the turkey is submerged, turn the burner back on.
- Wear protective cooking gear. Put on goggles to shield your eyes and use oven mitts to help protect your hands and arms.
- Keep protective equipment within reach, such as an "ABC" or grease-rated fire extinguisher. NEVER use a water or garden hose on a fire related to turkey fryers. Remember: a turkey fryer fire is a grease fire and water can cause grease/oil to spread.
- · Keep children and pets away from the fryer.
- Once finished, turn off the burner and carefully remove the pot. Place the pot on a level surface and cover it to let the oil cool overnight before disposing.
- Opt for an oil-less or air fryer. These use infrared heat, rather than oil, to cook the turkey.

Unfortunately, Thanksgiving Day is the busiest day of the year for local fire departments, who in 2021 responded to approximately 1,160 home cooking fires, according to the NFPA. you plan to deep-fry your holiday bird, keep these turkey fryer safety tips in mind so you can safely use the fryer and help protect yourself, your guests and your home from fire.

Also, before your turkey and side dishes are prepared, consider these Thanksgiving food safety tips to help ensure that your family has a safe and enjoyable holiday.

With votes still adding up in the disjointed state California as of this writing (11/14), the AP's vote tracker has Trump with about 75.9 million votes or 50.2%, compared to Harris with 72.9 million votes and 48.2%. Third party vote totals hover in the 2.6 million range. What stands out from

everything is that Biden won 81.28 million votes in 2020, the most ever cast for a candidate in a U.S. election- by far. Kamala Harris is over 8 million votes shy of that total four years later with so many more registered to vote and with "our democracy on the line." Where did all those votes go? We can't really say they went to Trump, because his total is only about 1.7 million higher than what he received in 2020 with a very strong and determined following.

Some 70 million people voted early, so the schedule wasn't a hindrance. The only aspect that should have adversely impacted turnout would have been storm ravaged areas in Florida, North Carolina, and Tennessee, and those would likely be more of Trump's voters.

Were people fed up with election overload? Sure. However, this was supposed to be the first woman and the first Black woman to be elected President Either Harris did not reach out effectively or the votes just were not there.

Looking back at Barack Obama's first term victory, with all that groundswell for change in America, the extensive registration and recruitment efforts to elect the first Black US President, he garnered only 69.5 million votes. Yes, fewer people were registered than when Biden won in 2020, and the BLM movement gets some credit, but following Obama's was HUGE and highly motivated. Nothing was going to be left to chance. The crowd footage of his first inauguration ceremony demonstrated his popularity. Obama received fewer votes in his second term in 2012, and the first woman on the Presidential ballot with heavy liberal heavy support received about 65 million votes in 2016. However, Hillary was overconfident, haughty, and still uninspiring to a lot of Democrats.

So, we are back to almost 73 million votes for Harris, an impressive total as history will attest, but far short of a whopping 81.2 million for a boring, old, partially cognizant white guy who with a fresh ear of corn in each hand, couldn't excite a squirrel. If Biden had stayed in the race, who thinks he would have even come close to Harris' total this time?

So, the question may not be about where Kamala Harris' votes went. The real question may be where all of Joe







institutions. Political interference disrupted scientific communication and undermined public health messaging. Proposed health czar, Robert Kennedy, and Project 2025 promise to repeat that strategy and s strip the CDC's ability to issue critical vaccine guidance, weaken FDA's approval processes, and further slash funding for the National Institute Health.

Trump does not consider climate change a problem. During his first term, he appointed people to key positions who deny climate science. He withdrew from the Paris agreement on climate change and rolled back more than 100 environmental regulations.

Now, he is likely to government weaken expand fossil agencies. production; fuel and impede clean energy. He has promised permits to drill oil on public lands and waters, keep coal plants burning, and make it easier to build gas pipelines.

The ten deadliest weather disasters since 2004 killed at least 570,000 people, and a new study shows how all of them were intensified by global warming, "caused by the burning of oil, gas and coal, and deforestation."

Medicare Minute "Types of Medicare Advantage Plan"

There are basically two types of Medicare Advantage Plans. One type is a HMO. HMO stands for Health Maintenance Organization. The other type is a PPO or Preferred Provider Organization. Although both are Medicare Advantage Plans there are some distinct differences in the two.

In most HMO plans you generally can only go to doctors, health care facilities or hospitals that are on the provider list of the plan except in emergency. HMO plans require you to name a primary care provider (PCP). Your PCP becomes the quarterback of your health care. This means you may have to have a referral from your PCP if you want to see a specialist or another health care provider. All HMO plans do not require a referral, so this is a question you will want to ask of considering an HMO.

In a PPO plan, you also have a defined network of providers. You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network but, unlike a HMO, you may have some coverage if you go to an out-of-network provider. You will pay more for using an out-of-network provider versus an in-network provider. Also a PPO plan may give you the option of getting your health care from a provider outside your immediate geographical area whereas a HMO can be more limited.

HMO and PPO plans are similar in many ways. They both have a defined network of providers, both have a copay on most services you receive and except for a few exceptions will both include prescription drug coverage. Finding a Medicare health plan is about finding the plan that is right for you. It's a good idea to research both HMO and PPO plans if you are considering a Medicare Advantage Plan.



You Can **Fight City** Hall

Claims against city governments are different than claims against a person or a private business. Governments in general have a different set of laws that apply to how and when they are liable for damages they cause. Kings created a system of settling disputes but when they did so, they limited claims against the kings. This idea is known in modern legal parlance as sovereign immunity.

In Alabama, personal injury claims have to be filed within two years from the date of the incident causing the injury. Certainly, there are exceptions for minors and other causes of action like fraud that may not be discovered on the date that the incident actually occurred. Nonetheless, for personal injury claims against a city, those claims must be presented within six months.

Not only is the time period reduced drastically, but the manner in which the claim is filed can be complicated. Typically, a claim has to be filed in affidavit form - meaning under oath before a notary. That written claim has to be filed with the city clerk.

A recent case out of Birmingham, Alabama went sideways for a person who claimed to be injured when they used the form provided by the City of Birmingham and mailed it to the address on the form. The Birmingham City Attorney acknowledged receipt of the claim.


The circuit court later dismissed the case because the city argued that it wasn't properly addressed to serve the mayor or the city clerk as required by the Code of

The Court of Civil Appeals reversed the Circuit Court because it said that mailing the claim form provided by the city to the address provided by the city would prevent the city from later arguing that it wasn't properly filed. The city attorney acknowledged receipt within the time allowed by law. The court held that a person was entitled to rely upon the forms and addresses supplied by the city.






