Kern CCD Announces Partnership Offering No-Cost College Credits

The Kern Community College District (Kern CCD) and the Mexican American Opportunity Foundation (MAOF) have announced a new partnership that allows students enrolled at MAOF's Skill Center in Bakersfield to receive credits that are transferrable to Bakersfield College.

The initiative is part of a statewide movement in higher education known as Credit for Prior Learning, which aims to quantify skills that students have learned outside of a traditional academic institution so that they have a head start on their academic career. For this partnership, Bakersfield College is leveraging its existing Credit for Prior Learning program, which allows students to submit military transcripts, industry certifications, documentation from apprenticeships, and more in exchange for college credit.

"As an organization dedicated to uplifting the socioeconomic status of residents in Kern, we're excited about the potential of this initiative to create upward mobility within the communities we serve," says Dr. Ciriaco "Cid" Pinedo, President and CEO of MAOF. "By offering college credit to students in our accounting and clerical programs, which are high demand skills among employers in our region, we're incentivizing first-generation students to continue their education further."



Cheers! It's National Egg Nog Month

Eggnog is the quintessential, waistunfriendly drink of holiday celebrations, a beverage people either love or love to hate.

Here are a few fun facts about this seemingly innocuous holiday drink.

Eggnog Was Once Only a Drink for Wealthy Aristocrats- In 14th century England, only the well off could afford eggnog, as milk and eggs were both scarce and expensive. However, that changed in the American Colonies where they had easier access to dairy products.

The Word Eggnog Has Many Origins-Many etymologists believe the name stems from the word "noggin" which referred to small wooden mugs that were often used to serve eggnog.

The FDA Limits the Amount of Egg In Store-Bought Eggnog To 1%- If you pick up a carton of eggnog with your groceries, you may be getting more "nog" than yolk. Due to our fear of raw egg, U.S. FDA regulations limit egg yolk solids to no more than 1.0% of a products' final weight to bear the eggnog name, while your typical homemade version has roughly one egg per serving.







KID-FRIENDLY HOT HOLIDAY PUNCH

Family gatherings bring warm memories during the holidays, but it can still be chilly outside. Snowy scenes and freezing temperatures are common in late December. As it gets colder, families can cozy up with a warm "Hot Holiday Punch" from Lines+Angles.

16 cups water, divided

5 cups cranberries, fresh or frozen, plus extra for garnish

21/2 cups granulated sugar

1/2 cup red hots cinnamon candies

3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

12 whole cloves

3 cinnamon sticks

1 lemon, sliced

Cheesecloth

- 1. In a large saucepan, set over medium-high heat, bring 1 quart of water and cranberries to a boil. Reduce heat, cover and simmer for 8 to 10 minutes or until the cranberries begin to pop. Drain, reserving liquid and cranberries. Put cranberries through a fine mesh strainer or food mill. Set aside.
- 2. In a Dutch oven or large pot, combine sugar, red-hots, lemon juice, cranberry liquid and cranberry pulp, and remaining 3 quarts of water.
- 3. Place cloves and cinnamon sticks in a double thickness of cheesecloth. Tie with string to form a bag; add to pan with the punch. Bring to a boil; stir until sugar and candies are dissolved. Discard spice bag. Strain juice through a fine mesh strainer. Serve hot with lemon slices and cranberries.





- 1 1/2 Cups Granulated White Sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 2 3/4 Cups Sifted All Purpose Flour
- 2 Tsp. Cream of Tartar 1 Tsp Baking Soda
- 1/2 Tsp Salt
- 2 Tbsp Cinnamon
- 2 Tbsp Sugar

Stir together Sifted flour, Cream of tartar, Baking soda, Salt

Refrigerate the combined dough for 1 hour.

Dog Math: The **Only Relevant Math**

hen Samantha was four, everything was about dogs. We talked about dogs. We read about dogs. She drew pictures of dogs and walked our dogs on leashes inside the house and pretended to be a dog. On rainy days, we would go to PetSmart to watch the dogs being groomed. It was all dogs. All day. Every day.

She was interested in numbers-as long as the numbers were about dogs. So I asked her one day, "If you have a mommy dog at the animal shelter, and she has fourteen puppies and you find homes for eight of the puppies, how many puppies still need homes?"

Her immediate answer was. "None because I will take all six of the puppies home with me - AND the mommy dog, too."

It would be another two years before I could ask her what fourteen minus eight was and get anything close to six. Math only mathed for her if it was math about dogs.

Fast forward to the summer after sixth grade. She took a math review class on Outschool. The teacher asked everyone what their favorite number was. Samantha's immediate response, like this was something she felt in her SOUL and had been just WAITING to be asked, was, "Two-because two plus two is four, AND two times two is four. Also, two is the only prime number that is even." Then she looked at me, hoping that I would change my favorite number on the

spot to two because who could love any number but two?

Throughout seventh grade, I had to bribe her to check her work before turning it in. Because, you see, she would get so distracted by the lack of dogs in the math problems that she would write things like seven times seven is fourteen. (I am quite sure that if she had seven people each bring her a van full seven dogs, she would know straight away that there is no possible way that she only had fourteen dogs.)

In eighth grade, she had a math teacher who resonated with her. He told dad jokes. He told math jokes. He bounced around the room on his tippy-toes, tossing out math trivia. Samantha was hooked. This new way of doing math was even better than bringing home six puppies and a mommy dog.

She baked this teacher a pie for Pi Day with a cut out in the top crust the shape of the pi symbol.

From then on, she was lost to me. No more box and whisker plots. No more ratios. No more solving equations. It was her and her math book.

Now she is doing geometry behind my back.

She hasn't asked for help or so much as shown me a math problem in two years.

This is what they mean, I suppose, when they say your child will leave the nest. It's like she has grown her own math wings and has no need for me anymore.

She is going to go through the entire rest of her math life without me.

Which is a little disappointing because I was so looking forward to revisiting those calculus problems about ladders sliding down walls (because that is the most practical use there is for math).

So much has changed.

And yet.

And yet, two is still her favorite number. And it's still because two plus two is four, and two times two is four, and two is the only even prime number.

And if she had the chance, she would bring home six puppies and a mommy dog from the shelter.
