Historic Appointment

North Wood United Methodist Church Welcomes Rev. Kiki Woods-Terry as Senior Pastor

'n a significant moment for North Wood United Methodist Church (NWUM), the congregation recently welcomed Rev. Kiki Woods-Terry as their new Senior Pastor. Appointed by the North Alabama Methodist Conference, her leadership represents a historic cross-racial appointment, where the pastor is of a different race than most of the congregation. This milestone comes at a time when the United Methodist Church has experienced internal divisions. Several congregations departed over differing views on issues such as having women in ministry and other broader social

NWUM faces challenges in revitalizing its congregation, which has seen declining membership as younger generations disconnect from traditional religious practices. The appointment of Woods–Terry brings fresh hope for rebuilding and

inclusivity.
Pastor Kiki, as she is affectionately referred, recently shared some thoughts about her ministry and what it can bring to help rebuild the historic local congregation.

what we want a UNA Lion to be.'

Anglin finishes his rookie season with 81 tackles to rank Anglin second on the team. He had 7.0 tackles for UNA photo loss, 1.5 sacks, and forced a fumble against nationally ranked Illinois State.

What was perhaps his best game to date came at Southern Utah earlier this month, as Anglin tallied a careerhigh 14 tackles and 1.5 sacks. Anglin matched the FCS school record for single-game tackles, tying teammate Edwin White Schultz's 14 tackles against Mercer last season.

The Georgia native won three UAC Freshman of the Week awards this season.

In addition, Anglin added another award to an already full trophy case last week as just before our press time he was named the United Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year in a vote of the league's head coaches.

Anglin is the first UNA football player to win conference freshman of the year at the Division I level. Former linebacker Christon Taylor is the last Lion to win Freshman of the Year. earning the honor from the Gulf South Conference in 2017.

Medicare Minute

"Year-end Reminders"

We have spent the past two months discussing the Medicare Annual Enrollment Period. We have talked about Medicare health plans. We have covered the different types of health plans and how to choose the one that may be best for you. We also discussed Medicare prescription drug plans and how they can change and need to be reviewed each year. But, just because the Annual Enrollment Period is over doesn't mean you can go to sleep at the wheel. There are some things you need to stay on top of.

To begin with you should make sure you have received your enrollment card from each insurance company you signed up with. If you enrolled into a Medicare Supplement and prescription drug plan you should have received two cards. One card from the company handling your supplement and another card from the company handling your drug plan. If you enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan you should have received one card and that's from the company your Advantage

The second thing to verify is your premium is coming from the appropriate place such as your bank account or Social Security check. You may not know this until January. If the premium is taken out of your bank account, for example, and you don't see it deducted in January you will want to contact the company. You don't want to go two or three months without paying the premium and then have to pay those months at one time. It's better to address it up front.

(Clay County) has clergy colleagues and friends from across the North Alabama UMC connection who serve and live here, however, this is her first appointment in Northwest Alabama.

"North Wood is actually my third cross-racial appointment," Kiki noted. "My first came during the COVID pandemic in July 2020 when I was appointed

to full-time ministry at Crumly Chapel UMC in Birmingham and served there two years.

At first my own preconceived notions and biases prevented me from fully embracing the church. It was through honest and difficult conversations that we not only learned to accept obvious cultural

differences, but we also became a church family.

"Since racism is based on power of the majority and lack thereof of the minority, I was extremely timid about serving at a White affluent church," Kiki said. "In accepting my new assignment, I headed to Florence with renewed confidence in my call to serve cross-racially."

This appointment may seem historic; however, it is in line with Methodism's founder, John Wesley's vision. The UMC prides itself in being a connectional system. Connectional is the itinerant system that Wesley based his ministry on, according to Kiki.

"The idea is that churches and communities are connected through a common vision of "reforming" the nation. The church should spread holiness, discipline, and spiritual direction.







The Impact of Tariffs on **Electronics**

PICTURE THIS: YOU'RE SHOPPING FOR

A NEW SMARTPHONE or a snazzy pair of wireless headphones. Maybe you're researching a fancy smart TV so you can enjoy those detective shows you've been binging. Now imagine seeing the price tag suddenly jump by 20% to 25% out of nowhere. Thanks to a new round of proposed tariffs, this is expected to be the case in upcoming months.

What Are Tariffs?

A tariff is a specific tax placed on goods entering the county from abroad. For instance, the phones and TVs vou see in stores were more than likely purchased by a wholesaler or retailer from a foreign country. The purchasing company paid the tariff to the U.S. Department of

Treasury at one of the 328 U.S. Custom and Border Protection's entry points.

How Will Electronics Be Affected?

For decades, China has been a world leader in manufacturing—building massive factories, training skilled workers, and perfecting assembly lines. This allows them to pump out products more cheaply and efficiently than most other places. As a result. American companies could make their gadgets at lower costs and then sell them here at decent prices.

When a tariff is slapped onto these imported goods, the math changes. Suddenly, that low-cost smartphone or TV isn't so low-cost anymore by the time it reaches American soil. If new tariffs become a reality, the Consumer

Technology Association expects customers will see a 45% increase in pricing on tablets and laptops as most of these electronics are manufactured in China

While companies could offset some of these costs by shifting production to other countries or even building domestic industry options, this is usually not the easiest route. Building new factories, training workers, and creating new logistic details requires a lot of time and money. Consequently, it's often simpler for them to raise prices

As the consumer, this kind of price hike can leave your pocketbook feeling a bit lighter, especially if you are on a fixed income. Since electronics aren't just

fancy luxuries these days, but are useful tools for staying connected with family, managing finances, or even reading the news, paying more for these gadgets can feel frustrating, to say the least.

On top of that, smaller companies or newer brands trying to make a name for themselves have an even tougher time when tariffs drive up their costs. They may not have the extra cash to absorb the added fees or invest in moving their factories

somewhere else. This can lead to less competition and fewer options on store shelves. It's a domino effect: Tariffs push prices up, reduce choices, and sometimes slow down innovation as companies struggle to keep costs under control.

In the end, while the reasons for tariffs are often political and economiclike trying to encourage manufacturing in the U.S.—they often mean steeper price tags. For the everyday consumer,

especially a senior on a fixed income, that's not exactly the friendliest deal.

Recycling Wind Blades

Editor,

Wind turbine blades play a crucial part in clean energy generation, but their disposal poses a growing challenge. Luckily, innovative solutions provide new ways to keep them out of landfills.

As the wind industry grows, there is an increasing need for replacement of older wind turbine blades with larger, more efficient ones. With a lifespan approximately years, the sheer number of blades and components that will eventually need to decommissioned will strain current repurposing and recycling capabilities, leading to increased landfill waste if new solutions are developed.

address challenge, developers and rural communities have explored various recycling initiatives. One approach, mechanical recycling, typically uses a shredding facility to down turbine Companies, like break REGEN Fiber in Iowa, use the resulting product to create construction materials such concrete by mixing fiberglass with rock or mixing plastic.

Greg Birkhofer, an Iowan with a passion for conservation, has taken blade recycling a step further by repurposing the most challenging section—the eight-foot base—into fence posts for agricultural use.

According to Greg, the recycled posts are stronger and more durable than traditional fence posts, and they are fully insulated. His innovation eliminates the need for constant maintenance, including replacing insulators.

If they can be mass produced, Greg believes the blades will prove less expensive than current fencing materials. His vision extends beyond fence posts alone; he believes recycled blades have the potential to be used for a wider range of products, such as dock posts.

Pioneers like Greg lead the way in finding new life for decommissioned wind turbine blades. Distinctive vision and creativity will be crucial in shaping the future of wind energy and responsible waste management.

Anyone can make a nomination. Below are descriptions for each of the five Eagle Awards categories:

Elected Official:

Community Partner:

Retaliatory **Discharge**

The only time a worker in Alabama is protected legally from being fired under state law is when they are terminated in retaliation for making a claim for workers compensation. The federal protections of race, creed, color, age, etc., still exist.

Here's the catch. If an injured worker files for unemployment the employer has the right to challenge the payment of benefits. There will be a hearing, usually over the phone. These hearings take place quite soon after separation from employment.

The employer will have participated in these hearings in the past and will often have a lawyer and witnesses for the hearing. The injured and newly discharged worker will not.

The Alabama Supreme Court has ruled that this hearing is the equivalent of a full-blown trial and if the employee seeking unemployment loses, they are barred from bringing a <u>retaliatory discharge</u> case.

If you have had an on the job injury and you believe you were terminated because of your on the job injury, do not apply for your unemployment benefits without consulting an attorney. Even though your employer may have a pattern and practice of retaliatory discharge, if you lose your unemployment hearing you cannot go

Firing an employee who was hurt on the job is morally and legally wrong. It not only hurts the injured worker, but also prevents other workers who are hurt on the job in the future. These (as yet uninjured) workers know if they get hurt and report an injury, they will lose their job. If you are hurt on the job and your environment changes, hostility increases, your duties change, etc., make notes of names and dates and what happened and give these notes to your attorney.





A ROADMAP TO **FINANCIAL PEACE**

Dear Dave,

A friend told me about Baby Steps plan, after years of living and after years of

paycheck-to-paycheck and running up credit card bills, I'm ready to get control of my finances. I just have one question. Baby Step 1 is saving \$1,000 for a beginner emergency fund. Do you recommend getting current on past due bills before starting Baby Step 1? Miles

Dear Miles,

Congratulations! I'm glad to hear you're finally sick and tired of being financially sick and tired. This is the perfect question someone is vour situation, because it gives me a chance to walk you all the way through the Baby Steps. So, let's go!

First, make sure all your necessities are taken care of. By necessities, I'm talkingaboutfood, clothing, shelter, transportation

and utilities. Then, get current on anything you owe, or make payment arrangements for past due bills. After you've done this, it's time to take your very first Baby Step.

already You've mentioned getting \$1,000 in the bank for a starter emergency fund. That's Baby Step 1. After that comes your debt snowball, which is Baby Step 2. Here, you'll pay off all your debts from smallest to largestexcept your home. Attack the first balance on your list by paying as much as you can each month, while making minimum payments on the other debts. When you've paid off the first one, add what you were paying on it to the payment on your next debt and start attacking it. As the snowball continues to roll over, you're picking up more and more money to apply to your debts.

In Baby Step 3, you'll save money and increase your emergency fund from \$1,000 to a full three to six months of expenses. You're going to be surprised how fast vou can save money when your income isn't flying out the door to pay off debt every month.

Now, it's time to really start looking toward the future. In Baby Step 4, start investing 15 percent of your income for retirement. College funding is next in Baby Step 5 for any kids you have, or plan on having one day. And here's a big one. Baby Step 6 is where you pay off your home early. How great will that

But Baby Step 7 is the real deal. Now, you start building wealth and giving with outrageous generosity. When you've completed all the other Baby Steps, and are able to do these two things, you've achieved the pinnacle of smart money management. Or in other words, you've reached the point of financial peace.

Make it happen, Miles. You can do this!




