Lakeland student wins Packers **Internship Draft event**

at Lakeland University for about three months. Based on her involvement and accomplishments it feels like she's been a fixture for much longer.

Rank, a 2024 Lakeshore Technical College graduate from Manitowoc, Wis., is majoring in accounting and making the most of the programs and services at LU along the way.

She came to Lakeland thanks to the Lake to Lake program, which provides a seamless pathway for LTC graduates to enroll at Lakeland as juniors.

She was also attracted to Lakeland's Cooperative Education program, which lets LU students earn academic credit for working at Co-Op partner companies.

"The program was very apparent when I was transferring and I thought, this is perfect," Rank said. "I work and I need credits, so it goes hand in hand."

Rankisearningfour academic credits for her work as a client accounting and advisory services intern at CliftonLarsonAllen.

"I am learning so much on the job," said Rank, also a member of Lakeland's Accounting Club. "It's really cool. I was in tax last spring with them and that taught me a lot, too."

She is also earning two academic credits through a Co-Op role as time management skills coach with Lakeland's

Erin Rank has only been a student Life & Career Studies program, which provides a complete college experience for young adults who have an intellectual disability.

> Rank will soon be starting a new role as chief financial officer for Launch: Lakeland Student-Run Businesses, which gives LU students the tools and support to create, develop and manage income-generating businesses.

> She's making moves off campus, as well. Last week, Rank won the 10th Annual Internship Draft Day, hosted by the Northeast Wisconsin Manufacturing Alliance. She earned a \$2,500 scholarship, announced by Green Bay Packers President and CEO Mark Murphy, topping a field of more than 250 students.

> She placed second in the competition last year and used what she learned in that experience to her advantage. Students participate in interviews with employers - Rank did five - and earn points based on their performance as well as other items like grade point average, campus participation

and recruiting peers to attend the event.

"I felt confident going in because I knew what I was doing," Rank said. "I've gotten so much more comfortable, especially being a leader. I am approachable and I feel like I can talk to anyone."

Rank is on track to graduate from Lakeland in the spring of 2026 and at age 25 is far removed from when she graduated from Brillion High School in 2017 when she was unsure of her future.


"I always needed extra help in high school," Rank said. "I am a completely different person than I was. I am succeeding and getting recognition and it makes me want to work harder. I'm making people proud for what I am doing."

Despite being older most of her peers, she enjoys living on campus and plans to apply to be a resident assistant in the future.

"Coming in I thought 'I am not making friends with 18- and 20-year-olds' and here I have made several best friends," she said. "This was the best decision to live at Lakeland. It feels comfortable here."

Village Tax Collection


Tax Bills were mailed by December 15th. Property taxes may be paid at the Village Offices at 40 Pine Street from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday-Thursday and from 8:00 am until noon on Fridays. We will also be closed on December 24 and 25, 2024 and December 31, 2024 and January 1, 2025. If the Village office is closed, payments can be dropped in the drop box located to the left of the doors at the Pine Street entrance. You can also drop your payment off at National Exchange Bank & Trust or Cleveland State Bank in Elkhart Lake. If you have any questions, please call the Clerk's office at 876-2122. The first installment of taxes is due by January 31, 2025. If you want to mail in your tax payment, please mail it to PO Box 143, Elkhart Lake, WI 53020. Receipts will not be mailed, unless a self-addressed stamped envelope is included.

Village Holiday Hours

The Village offices will be closed on December 24 and 25, 2024 and December 31, 2024 and January 1, 2025.

Tax Rate Increasing for 2024

The overall Village tax rate increased by \$.42 per \$1,000 of assessed value. If your house is assessed at \$300,000 your tax bill will decrease by approximately \$126 dollars, depending on the lottery credit and first dollar credit.



mailbox also needs to be 6" to 8" back from the curb or curb line. Below is a drawing with these specifications. If your mailbox is damaged due to snow plowing and it does not meet the US Postal Service guidelines, you will be responsible for any repairs or replacement that is needed.

Winter Rules began November 15

Winter parking regulations when into effect on November 15th. As a reminder, here is the .ordinance.

Parking is allowed overnight in the N. East Street parking lot overnight until 6 am, at that time your vehicle must be moved until 9 am to allow for plowing of the parking lot.

Parking Regulations All Night Parking Regulated.

6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any Village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 8 am. and 10 am, and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 am until 9 am commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

Snow Removal Warning

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the Village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient, and you will be in violation ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period. Also, if you live at a corner intersection, remember you need to clear the sidewalk approaches to the streets.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto Village Streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home.

Sewer Rates Increasing

Sewer rates will also be increasing as of January 1st. The increase is due to Northern Moraine increasing rates, so in turn we need to increase our rates. These rates will increase on January 1, 2025. The sewer consumption rates will increase from \$7.55 per 100 cubic feet to \$8.00 per 100 cubic feet. 

North Town Partners continues to grow, develop

North Town Partners owners Chuck Van Horn, Chris Merklein and Tom Stocco had a successful year and the business partners are looking forward to the upcoming year as they continue to bring developments to the local communities.

Recently, North Town Partners was awarded the 2024 Economic Driver of the Year award by the Sheboygan County Economic Development Corporation. According to the press release, the award highlighted North Town Partners' transformation impact on housing and retail development projects across Sheboygan County and setting a new standard for quality and innovation within the region.

"We were totally surprised," Merklein stated during a recent interview regarding the award. "It is a big award and we were honored to be considered, much less be given it. Chuck is really the man and he said it best that we are fortunate to live in the community that we do. We are blessed in so many things and that so many privatelyheld companies are willing to pump resources back into the communities they are part of. It really is a blessing."

During a recent interview, Chris Merklein gave updates regarding two major developments that are currently underway within the communities. The first of two major development projects is Kingsbury Village, which Merklein explained is located where the Kingsbury Brewery Co. used to be located in Sheboygan.

Taking the vacant field, Merklein explained how the partners built 33 luxury townhomes. He also shared that since opening, the building has been 95 percent occupied and has a waiting list of people interested in moving in.

In addition to the townhome units, North Town Partners has an agreement with the Town of Sheboygan for the North Town project. This 99-acre development includes a 93-room Home2Suites by Hilton which has been operating since July and is showing early success.

They are also constructing two buildings (Adeline Apartments and Charlotte Apartments) with a total of 170 living spaces, including One, Two, and Three bedroom apartments. There is also 16,000 square feet of commercial space





that is already leased for RISE Fitness and Golf 365-which will be adding a restaurant/bar to their establishment. The first of the two buildings, as reported by Merklein, opened in October and is leasing as projected, while the second building opened in late November and has new residents currently moving in.

Next on the list for North Town are The Villages: a combination of singlefamily homes and townhomes across the street from the Adeline and Charlotte apartments. Merklein explained that North Town will be using a concept that is used and recognized worldwide, but will be new to Sheboygan called pocket neighborhoods. This neighborhood concept encourages community interaction with the front of the living areas all facing a park-like, landscaped courtyard. With all that activity at North Town, Merklein added that he and his partners are not finished. Continuing to develop this growing community is a key priority for North Town Partners.

the second major development that is happening behind the Elkhart Lake Fire Department-will have high-end townhomes available for leasing in 2025. Each town home will be three floors-the first floor a heated garage with a floor drain, the second floor a combined living room, dining area and kitchen with an open-floor design and the third floor for bedrooms. As a result of the design, residents-excluding those homes on the ends of the buildingswill have neighbors to their left and right instead of above and below. All 70 units within the Whitetail Ridge development are two and one-half baths, with 63 being 3-bedroom units and seven being 2-bedroom units.

Merklein explained that they are building on six of the approximate 10 acres, giving potential for phase two of the Whitetail Ridge development.

"It has been wonderful working with the municipalities where we have our developments," Merklein said. "The Elkhart Lake community leaders we worked with

were aware of what their constituents were looking for: drawing in families to be fulltime residents of the community.

"Whitetail Ridge," Merklin added, "would definitely not have happened without participation and support from Sargento. We are deeply grateful for what they (Lou and Louie) have done for the development, as well as the community."

North Town Partners have \$85 million worth of assets under management which includes retailers like Harbor Freight, Michael's and Ollie's Bargain Outlet and Memorial Plaza. For 2025, North Town Partners is looking to add \$100 million to their portfolio.

In addition to the above mentioned projects, Merklein stated they are always looking for additional projects in Sheboygan County and the surrounding areas. "This is our home, and we're committed to further development in the region", said Merklein.

Altitude, Stuart's exhilarating new album, is proof of that. Recorded in Nashville with his longtime band, The Fabulous Superlatives, the collection finds Stuart picking up where he left off on 2017's Way Out West, exploring a cosmic country landscape populated by dreamers and drifters, misfits and angels, honky-tonk heroes and lonesome lovers. There's a desert flare to the music here, a sweeping, spacious feel that conjures up wide-open horizons and endless stretches of two-lane highway, and the production is raw and cinematic to match, tipping its cap both to Bakersfield and Laurel Canyon as it balances jangle and twang in equal measure. It would be easy for an artist as accomplished as Stuart to rest on his laurels at this point in his career, but Altitude instead showcases the work of a searcher with an insatiable appetite for growth and reflection, one whose ambition, much like his keen wit and rich imagination, only seems to grow with each and every release.

"I've always loved songs that feel like old friends but still sound new and fresh," says Stuart. "The beautiful thing about country music is that the blueprint Jimmie Rodgers laid down—rambling, gambling, sin, redemption, Heaven, Hell—it's all just as relevant now as it ever was. It's the human condition, and if you're honest about it and you've got a real band around you, you can make something that's uniquely yours and stands the test of time."


A Country Music Hall of Famer, five-time Grammy Award-winner, and AMA Lifetime Achievement honoree, Stuart knows a thing or two about standing the test of time. Born and raised in Philadelphia, Mississippi, he landed his first big gig in Lester Flatts' band at the tender age of thirteen, and by twenty-one, he was working on the road and in the studio with Johnny Cash. Though Stuart built his early reputation backing up country and bluegrass royalty, it wasn't long before Nashville recognized him as a star in his own right, and over the course of forty-plus years as a solo artist, he would go on to release more than twenty major label albums, scoring platinum sales, hit singles, and just about every honor the industry could bestow along the way.

"If country music had a president, it would be Marty Stuart," famed documentarian Ken Burns once proclaimed. "He is the embodiment of the culture."

Stuart emerged as an unofficial caretaker of the culture, too, spending much of his career rescuing and collecting country music artifacts from throughout the genre's history. The first piece he picked up? Patsy Cline's makeup kit, which he bought from a junk shop for \$75. These days, Stuart, who Rolling Stone calls "one of the world's foremost country experts and archivists," has roughly 20,000 pieces in his collection, including a handwritten copy of Hank Williams' "I Saw The Light" and Johnny Cash's first black performance suit. While select items have been exhibited everywhere from the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame to the Louvre, Stuart is hard at work building a dedicated arts and cultural center to preserve and display it all in his hometown of Philadelphia.

"I'm calling it The Congress of Country Music, and I want it to serve as an inspirational spot," says Stuart, who's raised funds for the center with annual late night jams at the Ryman featuring everyone from Emmylou Harris and Sheryl Crow to Tyler Childers and Billy Strings. "I want it to be a touchstone where younger generations can learn about this stuff and figure out who they are and embark on their own musical journeys."

It's that last part that particularly excites Stuart, whose musical journey came full circle on Altitude. Written primarily on the road, the



collection was inspired in large part by Stuart's 2018 tour supporting Byrds co-founders Roger McGuinn and Chris Hillman, who reunited for the 50th anniversary of their seminal Sweetheart Of The Rodeo album.

"I bought my first copy of Sweetheart Of The Rodeo for \$2.99 at the discount bin in a shopping mall record store in Goodlettsville, Tennessee, and it became the blueprint for my musical life," Stuart recalls. "Revisiting it on the road with Roger and Chris put me back under its spell all over again. I was writing songs in dressing rooms and soundchecks and on the bus, and then one day, I looked up and there was enough to make an album."

Stuart and his band spent much of 2019 breaking in the new material live, and by 2020, they were raring to get into the studio. COVID, however, had other plans. Not wanting to lose any momentum, Stuart moved the sessions from the temporarily shuttered Capitol Studios in Hollywood, CA to East Iris Studios in Nashville, TN, where he and his bandmates were still able to perform live on the floor (albeit masked and six feet apart).

"We knew if we didn't find a way to make the record in that moment, we might never recapture the same circle of fire around the songs we had going for us," Stuart explains. "If we waited for COVID to pass, the album might very well have passed us by, too."

The electricity in the room is palpable on Altitude, which opens with the blistering and trippy "Lost Byrd Space Train (Scene 1)." Played on Byrds guitarist Clarence White's original B-BenderTelecaster (another prized possession in Stuart's collection), the instrumental track chugs along at a breakneck pace, flirting with country, bluegrass, and even psychedelic rock as it sets the stage for the wide-ranging sonic journey to come. Stuart keeps the energy high here-the scorching "Country Star" squeezes a lifetime's worth of absurdist imagery into a three-minute tour-de-force, while the ecstatic 'Time To Dance" is a slice of pure honky-tonk joy, and the rousing "Friend Of Mine" even offers hints of Link Wray and The Venturesbut he never loses sight of the emotional core of the music, even amidst all of the instrumental fireworks. The ringing 12-string and bittersweet harmonies of "Sitting Alone," for instance, only serve to heighten the song's sense of distance and isolation; the hypnotic sitar line on "Space" amplifies the uneasiness and longing that simmers just beneath the surface; and the spare acoustic delivery of "The Angels Came Down" underscores the raw vulnerability in Stuart's deeply autobiographical lyrics.

"The Angels Came Down' is probably the most truthful song on the record," Stuart reflects. "There have been times in my life when I've felt like a lost and wandering soul, just chasing all the wrong things. Some people lose their lives to that, but sometimes the angels offer you a hand up out of the darkness."

It's that big picture perspective that guides Stuart on the album's old-school, shuffling title track, which takes a bird's eye view of what really matters most in this life. "To get to go and stay, must give all your love away," Stuart sings over what turned out to be one of the final performances from late piano legend Pig Robbins.

"I like to say that the most outlaw thing you can possibly do in Nashville right now is play country music," Stuart says with a laugh. "This album is a reminder to me, and to anyone else out there who's interested, that there's still a few of us left who know how to do it. This music is in our hearts."


St. Paul Christian Church/St. Peter Evangelical Church

Our December Chamber Member Spotlight is St.Paul Christian Church/St. Peter Evangelical Church. Led by Reverend Ted McCurdy, St.Peter/St.Paul are two sister churches with one family of fellowship. St. Peter is located at W5375 County Road FF in the Town of Rhine and St. Paul Christian Church is located at W7101 Sexton Road in the Town of Russell.

St. Peter Evangelical Church was organized in 1858 by German immigrants in the Town of Rhine. Its first church building was on the corner of Highway FF and Rhine



Road. Later, the church was deeded to the town and it was used as the town hall for many years. St. Peter's second church still stands on Highway FF and is now used as a garage. In 1867, the present church was

built. The church joined the Evangelical Synod of North America. Two bells were brought back from Germany by the pastor in 1869. These bells are rung simultaneously before every worship service. The rooster atop the steeple has become a symbol of the church. St. Peter is sometimes lovingly called "the rooster church". Many early Evangelical churches in the country bore roosters on their steeples, a reminder of Apostle Peter's Denial of Christ and a symbol for us to remain strong in our faith.

St. Paul's Christian Church is a family-

centered church with a strong commitment to traditional values and missions, reaching out not only to the community of Town of Russell and the surrounding area, but also to the world with the good news of new life in Jesus Christ. This new life is available to all who confess Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, and seek to follow His word. Following the Evangelical and Reformed tradition of their past, they accept the Scriptures, continued in the Old and New Testaments, as the final authority in all matters of faith and life. They encourage all who share their faith to grow together with them, in Christ, and serve together with them, using time, talents, and treasures to enhance their church ministry in Town Russell and their community to the glory of God.
