Select Minnesota laws that took effect January 1, 2025 part 1

Several new laws passed during the 2024 Minnesota legislative session took effect on January 1, 2025, bringing significant changes across multiple sectors, including housing, consumer protections, public safety, and healthcare.

Ticketing Fairness Act

Among the most notable is the "Ticketing Fairness Act," which aims to enhance protections for online ticket buyers. The law mandates full pricing transparency, requires ticket sellers to disclose all mandatory fees upfront, and prohibits deceptive practices

like speculative pricing. It also gives the Department of Commerce authority to investigate and take action against ticket resellers using bots to artificially inflate prices or secure tickets in bulk.

Concertgoers, sports fans, and other event attendees in Minnesota will benefit from stronger consumer protections when purchasing tickets online. The law introduces several key provisions aimed at curbing unfair practices and ensuring transparency in the online ticket market.

Among the new protections, ticket sellers will be

required to offer "all-in pricing," ensuring that consumers are aware of the total cost of their tickets upfront, including any hidden fees. This change is expected to help mitigate unexpected charges that often surface during the checkout process, a common complaint among online ticket buyers.

Additional provisions in the law include:

Proof of Purchase and Refund Policies: Consumers must receive confirmation of their purchase along with a clear explanation of the refund policy within 24 hours of completing the transaction.

Banning Deceptive Advertising and Speculative Pricing: The law prohibits misleading marketing tactics, such as falsely advertising ticket availability or pricing.

Transparency for Resellers: Online platforms operating as ticket resellers will now be required to disclose this status clearly on their website, offering greater transparency for buyers.

The law also addresses the growing issue of "bots" and other automated technologies used by resellers to purchase large quantities of tickets, often inflating prices on secondary markets. Under the new legislation, if a reseller is found using such technology to bypass ticket sale limits, the Min-

nesota Department of Commerce will have the authority to investigate the practice. The department may then refer the case to the state Attorney

General's office for potential prosecution.

The Ticketing Fairness Act was introduced by Rep. Kelly Moller (DFL-Shoreview) in the House and Sen. Matt

Klein (DFL-Mendota Heights) in the Senate.

Advertised prices to include all mandatory fees or surcharges

Minnesota businesses will be required to include all mandatory fees and surcharges in the advertised price of goods or services, ensuring that consumers are fully informed of the total cost before making a purchase. The new regulation, part of a broader effort to increase

> price transparency, aims to eliminate surprise fees that often appear at checkout.

Under the new law, any

price advertised, displayed, or offered for goods or services must reflect the total cost, including all fees or surcharges that are required



Over 5,000 area veterans awarded Quilts of Honor in service recognition

On a blustery winter's day, about a month after Veterans Day, Alex Schwartz of Aitkin was presented with a Quilt of Honor.

His sister in-law Ginny Smith presented it. An active quilter in the Brainerd area, Smith presented it on behalf of the Brainerd Lakes Area Quilts of Honor volunteers.

Schwartz has struggled with health issues and was very touched to receive the quilt. It has the place of pride on his couch and he is very attached to it, as he is to the matching pillow case which now encases his favorite pillow.

Smith, Alex's wife Ann and Alex all shed tears when the quilt was presented. Alex served in the United States Air Force from 1974 to 1978. He was a security policeman who guarded nuclear-loaded aircraft in North Dakota and Germany.

Sue Carroll, Nisswa, is one of the co-leaders for the Quilts of Honor Group in Central Minnesota.

"Our mission is to honor those who have defended our country with a quilt," she said, taking time for an interview recently.

About 60 volunteers from the Brainerd Lakes Area make the quilts that are donated to veterans. About 5,500 quilts have been handed out locally since 2004.

Anyone can request a quilt for any veteran that they know. Log onto www.quilt-sofhonor.org to request a quilt or find a chapter near you. The local group works with veterans' organizations and facilities to uncover recipients who are deserving of a quilt.

Country Fabrics in Brainerd is the staging area for the group. Fabric is mostly donated. They request that the fabric be 100 percent

cotton, gender neutral, with patriotic or neutral colors. It doesn't have to be red, white and blue because they also create nature-themed quilts. The website asks that fabric not have children's images, armed forces logos or have floral or other patterns that are not neutral.

Quilt top kits are made up of fabric cut to fit a pattern. Volunteers pick up the kits at Country Fabrics, take them home and sew a quilt top. Then, the batting is put inside and the quilt is finished with a back and binding. A longarm quilter adds the final touch. Quilting the fabric goes through all the layers – top, batting and backing –holding it together. It is often finished with an attractive design.

The quilts are sized as lap quilts, great for snuggling on the couch or in the veteran's favorite easy chair.

Donors of fabric or cash may email Sue Caroll at smc1652@hotmail.com for more information. "We really

appreciate cash donations as we buy the batting and backing fabric in bulk. Cash donations are very helpful," noted Carroll.

Several quilts were presented in November 2024 at a veteran's program at Brainerd High School. "We work with the high school and the Brainerd VFW to present quilts there," explained Carroll.

More about Quilts of Honor

Gail Belmont is the founder and Executive Director of Quilts of Honor. She is a native Californian, born in Dos Palos. After high school, she entered the Women's Army Corp Band playing trumpet. As a member of that Band, Gail played taps for fallen warriors. Since that time, Gail has played a prominent role in the support of her fellow veterans. She currently holds the position of District Director at the Jenny Lind Veterans Memorial, as well as continuing her service playing taps at the services of fallen warriors.

From the Quilts of Honor website:

"In 2005 we began our journey, one that would lead us to form a nonprofit organization called Quilts of Honor.

"Between 2005 and April 2010, Gail and our volunteers worked with an organization providing patriotic quilts to those service members touched by war. Since Gail was a veteran of the Vietnam era and had played taps for the fallen, she did not want any of our warriors to be forgotten.

"During those years, Gail and her friends worked fervently piecing and quilting quilts for our military. The Navy Seals asked for a special quilt to be given to President George W. Bush. The Presidential quilt was finally presented to him in 2007 —having been delayed by hurricane Katrina. In the fall of 2007, The Warrior Quilt, painted by Linda Hasbrook and guilted by Gail, was presented to the Pentagon and installed in the 9/11 Memorial Display Case. In June 2009, Gail, along with

her parents Bob and Virginia, left Valley Springs to travel across America to a special presentation of quilts to the Marine Corps at Camp Le-Jeune, North Carolina. As they drove across America, they picked up quilts from quilters wishing to also honor our military. They began their journey with 200 quilts and arrived at Camp LeJeune with over 1,300 quilts. In August 2009, the Lady Warrior quilt was presented to the Women's Memorial at Arlington Cemetery.

"Quilts of Honor was formed in 2010, a non-profit organization dedicated to providing healing, loving quilts to those who have served in harm's way protecting our freedoms.

"We hope you will join us to honor members of our active military and veterans by showing them how much we appreciate their sacrifice and service with our Quilted Hugs of Gratitude. Our hope is that these quilts will pro





"We're aiming to reach our goal of planting 1 million trees in Crow Wing County. To date, local landowners have purchased and planted over 924,877 trees through our annual sale," said Melissa





to complete the purchase. This includes, but is not limited to, fees that cannot be reasonably avoided by the consumer or fees that a reasonable person would expect to be part of the transaction.

The law specifically excludes government-imposed taxes, such as sales tax, from the disclosure requirements.

Rep. Emma Greenman (DFL-Minneapolis) and Sen. Lindsey Port (DFL-Burnsville), who sponsored the bil, HF3438*/SF3537/CH111, noted that the legislation is aimed at enhancing consumer protection and promoting fairness in pricing.

The law includes specific requirements for delivery platforms, which often add additional fees at the point of purchase. Under the new rules, these platforms must display any extra fees clearly at the point when a consumer selects items for purchase. The total cost, including all fees, must then be itemized on a subtotal page before the consumer completes the transaction.

However, some exemptions apply to the law. Fees related to the purchase or lease of motor vehicles that are imposed by a motor vehicle dealer are not subject to the disclosure requirements. Additionally, fees charged by businesses regulated by the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission, or fees related to real estate settlement services (with the exception of broker commissions and fees), are also excluded.

Certain provisions of the law, particularly those affecting industries regulated by the Metropolitan Airports Commission, will not take effect until June 1, 2025.

This new pricing transparency measure is part of a broader initiative to protect consumers from deceptive practices and ensure that they are not misled when making purchasing decisions.

ELECTIONS

College campus voting locale, candidate residency proof

Two significant changes to Minnesota's election laws are aimed at increasing accessibility and ensuring voter integrity.

One major provision requires that, in general elections or off-year city general elections, at least one additional polling place be designated on the campus of a post-secondary institution that provides on-campus housing for at least 100 students. This new polling place, which can be located within one-half mile of the campus, must be "reasonably accessible" to students and will be available for voting for at least one day. The provision allows for the polling place to be set up if requested by the institution or the student government

organization. To support this initiative, the Minnesota Secretary of State's office will reimburse local election officials for the operational costs of setting up and staffing the additional polling place.

The law also introduces a new requirement for candi-

dates filing for office. Starting in 2025, when a candidate submits an affidavit of candidacy, they must present proof of their current address. This can be done by providing a valid driver's license or state identification card, or by presenting other documentation authorized for Election Day registration. The goal is to improve the accuracy of voter rolls and ensure that candidates meet residency requirements for their respective districts.

Both provisions are part of a broader effort to increase voter participation and integrity in Minnesota elections. The law is expected to help address concerns around access to voting for students while also ensuring that the candidates on the ballot meet necessary residency standards.

Rep. Mike Freiberg (DFL-Golden Valley) and Sen. Jim Carlson (DFL-Eagan) sponsored the law, HF4772*/ SF4729/CH11.2

EMPLOYMENT Several new employment laws, HF3947/SF3852*/ CH110, will take effect in Minnesota, aimed at improving transparency in job postings, workplace safety in healthcare settings, and updating definitions related to minimum wage. The laws are part of a broader effort to address issues of equity, safety, and fairness in the workplace. Salary ranges required in job postings

One of the most notable changes requires employers with 30 or more employees at one or more sites in Minnesota to disclose salary ranges in all job postings. Under the new law, companies must provide the starting salary range or fixed pay rate for each position, along with a general description of benefits and other compensation.

The salary range must be specific, with no "open-ended" salaries allowed. The aim of this provision is to improve wage transparency and reduce pay disparities, particularly for women and workers from historically underpaid groups.

The provision is in the 2024 labor and industry policy law sponsored by Rep. Michael Nelson (DFL-Brooklyn Park) and Sen. Jennifer McEwen (DFL-Duluth).

Surgical Smoke Safety for **Healthcare Workers**

Another key provision of the 2024 labor and industry policy law addresses workplace safety in healthcare settings. Beginning January 1, 2025, healthcare employers will be required to adopt and implement policies to prevent exposure to surgical smoke. Surgical smoke is the by-product produced by electrosurgery, laser tissue ablation, or other surgical techniques, which can be harmful to both healthcare workers and patients. The law mandates the use of smoke evac-

uation systems during any surgical procedure likely to generate surgical smoke.

This measure is a response to growing concerns about the health risks posed by surgical smoke, which can contain toxic chemicals and viruses. The new requirement aims to ensure safer working conditions for medical staff, particularly in operating rooms.

Updates to Minimum Wage

Additionally, the law makes changes to the Minnesota Fair Labor Standards Act (MFLSA) by moving the definitions of "large" and "small" employers out of the minimum wage statute and into the general definitions section of the act. The law also modifies certain minimum wage provisions, including those related to hotels and resorts with summer work travel exchange employees, as well as minor employees working for large employers.

Onamia man killed in truck crash


A 60-year-old Onamia man was killed in a single-vehicle crash on Sunday, Dec. 29 in Crow Wing County. The incident occurred at approximately 4:30 p.m. near the 8000 block of County Road 23, in Maple Grove Township.

According to the Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office, the man was driving a Ford Ranger southbound on County Road 23 when the vehicle left the roadway and crashed into a ditch. Deputies arrived on scene and found the driver unresponsive. He was later pronounced dead at the scene.

The identity of the driver is being withheld, pending notification of family members. The body has been transported to the Ramsey County Medical Examiner's Office for an autopsy to determine the exact cause of death.

The crash is under investigation by the Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office in collaboration with the Minnesota State Patrol. Authorities are working to determine the circumstances surrounding the crash.

Assistance at the scene was provided by the Minnesota State Patrol, North Memorial Ambulance, Garrison Fire Department, and Lakes Area Rescue.
