San Jose has a new vice mayor

wo-term San Jose Councilmember Pam Foley is getting a new title: vice mayor. Foley, who represents District 9, will take over the ceremonial role from District 1 Councilmember Rosemary Kamei, who Mayor Matt Mahan in 2023 appointed in an attempt to bridge political divides between labor and business interests.

Foley's new role will start Jan. 28 pending approval by the full San Jose City Council.

Foley, who like Mahan is more fiscally conservative and business friendly, will take over the responsibility of filling Mahan's role of chairing meetings — and appearing at public events - on occasions where Mahan can't show up. She said her fiscally conservative approach to governance makes her a sound pick ahead of looming budget woes.

"The concerns he wants to focus on in the city are pretty much those which residents of District 9 want to focus on," Foley told San Jose Spotlight. "In many ways I am aligned with the mayor."

But she said that doesn't mean See FOLEY, page 4

Humane Society of Silicon Valley resumes services

It may take up to a year to rebuild fire-damaged shelter's building **By William Bellou**

doption services at the Humane Society Silicon Valley (HSSV) are back to normal, except for operating rooms after a fire that broke Aout on December 16 destroyed half the building and temporarily closed the space.

The crucial operating rooms are so badly damaged, the organization is searching for a surgical unit near the shelter. It's estimated that the damaged parts of the building could take at least a year to complete the repairs.

The shelter's laundry operations were damaged, along with its medical areas, shelter operation offices and all the animal-holding areas. The adoption area also sustained damages leaving only two-thirds of the floor operational. No one was injured in the fire.

To keep pet adoptions and housing going during that time, the shel-

ter's staff has been relocating animals to foster homes. More than 100 animals found their new homes.

The shelter has reached storage capacity for donations, so the staff is now encouraging monetary donations from the community as the staff figures out the costs associated with demolition, construction and other services including renting storage spaces.

The HSSV consists of more than 150 employees and more than 3,000 volunteers. Last year, the shelter found homes for more than 6,000 animals.

Pacheco and Speiser replace incumbent trustees on Santa Clara County Board of Education

wo new trustees have joined the Santa Clara County Board of Education Board following the results of the November election.

Jorge Pacheco Jr. and Jessica Speiser have replaced incumbents while a pending investigation is underway.

Trustee Jorge Pacheco Jr. replaced incumbent Joseph DiSalvo, while trustee Jessica Speiser replaced incumbent Grace Mah, who has been the subject of at least two investigations for alleged wrongdoing.

Pacheco has served as a board member for the Oak Grove School District since 2018 and president of the California Latino School Boards Association since 2019.

Pacheco said his priority is serving the county's most vulnerable students. He also advocated for improved special education and fiscal responsibility.

Speiser served on the Los Altos School District board for four years and as president of the Santa Clara County School Boards Association for the 2023-24 school year.

Speiser wants to ensure students meet grad-

uation requirements and are prepared for college or the workforce, expanding educator resources and improving transparency. The leadership change comes months after

the shocking removal of former superintendent of schools Mary Ann Dewan caused outrage in the community, resulting in Dewan subsequently suing the board and unveiling reports that suggest her firing stemmed from alleged tension with board members.

A recent state report criticized the board's leadership for failing to follow policies and the "dysfunctional" relationship between board members and the office of education's administration. And in November, interim superintendent Charles Hinman called for investigations into the county office's finances and operations over a possible misuse of public funds.

The change also comes as the Santa Clara County Board of Supervisors considers changes to the office of education, including looking into appointing board trustees and making the county superintendent of schools an elected position rather than the current process of appointment by trustees. she'll go along with every position Mahan takes. "I am thoughtful in my decision-making process," she said. "We have this relationship where initially

we didn't really know each other, but developed a trust and respect. I am honored to be selected for this." Kamei, who won her first election in the West San

Jose district outright in 2022, held the title for two years. Mahan's selection of her was notable for political reasons.

San Jose politics are often split between a laborleaning, progressive faction and one that's more business focused, which leans toward loosening rules on development and business taxes. Mahan, who typically aligns with business interests, started his twoyear term in 2022 with a labor majority on the city council that at times hindered his ability to pass policies. With Mahan starting his first full four-year term, councilmembers have been more inclined to agree with his business-focused decisions.

Kamei has previously said she considers herself more moderate, not leaning too heavily on one side versus the other. She said Foley is "an excellent choice."

"She brings a lot of experience and is our most veteran councilmember," she told San José Spotlight. "This is going to be a tough year and we're going to have to make tough decisions. We have economically challenging times ahead — weighing different tradeoffs and budget priorities."

She said it's been a privilege to hold the title for the last two years.

"I think I have brought a lot of my own experience and sense of bridge building to the council and I look forward to working with Pam and the mayor and my fellow councilmembers," Kamei said.

Jimmy Carter's journey through Silicon Valley

For the strong impression on the people, including Silicon Valley leaders who spent time with him during his decades of social justice work post-presidency.

Carter died on Dec. 29, 2024, at age 100. Since his death, Silicon Valley leaders have reflected on a 2013 visit from Carter and his wife, Rosalynn, with Habitat for Humanity.

The Carters championed the social services organization and spent years helping build affordable housing for families in need. The East Bay/Silicon Valley branch of Habitat for Humanity is hosting a memorial for Carter on Thursday — designated as a national day of mourning — at San Jose City Hall's East Plaza from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. President Joe Biden will deliver a eulogy at the Washington National Cathedral in D.C.

"The Carters were just so real, and so there was such affection for them," Michael Fox Jr., former CEO of Goodwill Silicon Valley, told San José Spotlight. "It had nothing to do with, 'He's the president of the U.S. *Continued, next page*

and she's the first lady.' ... It was genuine." Fox met Carter in 2013 at a fundraising dinner for Habitat for Humanity hosted by his father, Michael Fox Sr., at their family home in Saratoga. The Carters were in the Bay Area for multiple projects with the nonprofit, including community improvements near Lake Cunningham Park in East San Jose. The Carters helped build shade structures at the park and renovate 10 homes for low-income homeowners.

Fox said he introduced himself before others at the dinner party "mobbed" the Carters, clamoring for a conversation with the former president. Watching how the couple interacted with others was inspiring, Fox said.

"They were the most gracious, down to earth people you've ever met," he told San José Spotlight.

State Sen. Dave Cortese, then a Santa Clara County supervisor, sat next to Carter at the dinner party, along with his wife Pattie, who is now an East Side Union High School District trustee.

Dave Cortese said talking with Carter at the dinner party felt more like talking to a religious figure in how he showed vulnerability.

"Jimmy Carter was not superficial, I doubt he was ever superficial," Cortese told San José Spotlight. "He was just a deep guy, the kind of person that if you wanted to put a picture next to the word sincerity in the dictionary, you would put his picture there. ... It's easy to open up to someone like that." Throughout the dinner, Pattie Cortese, who holds a master's degree in interfaith studies, talked with Carter about spirituality and his work teaching Bible studies in his hometown of Plains, Georgia. She said she looked up to the couple for the work they'd done since Carter's presidency. It empowered her to work on issues that reflected her own faith and beliefs, such as working with incarcerated people.

"Some people could be president and then just retire and enjoy their life, and I'm not saying he didn't enjoy his life, but their work was clearly a ministry," she told San José Spotlight. "They stayed active in that until they literally could not anymore."

Rosalynn Carter died in 2023 at the age of 96.

That hands-on work ethic also inspired former San Jose Vice Mayor Rose Herrera, who met Carter the day after the dinner party while the couple worked on projects at and around Lake Cunningham Park. She was inspired to see the Carters working on the buildings, not just attending for a photo opportunity. She remembered being surprised to see singers Trisha Yearwood and Garth Brooks there — also ready to work on the project. It impressed her that these celebrities were also dedicated to the work they were doing.

"What (Carter) cared about was work and doing that work and doing things for the community, that was really what he was about. He was the real deal," Herrera said.







SJ Chamber Orchestra presents 'Drizzle, **Downpour, Desperation,** and other stories'

A family trio of soloists explores grace in the face of adversity

he World Premiere of a triple concerto from composer Durwynne Hsieh debuts with the San Jose Chamber Orchestra on Sunday March 23, 7 p.m. at St. Francis Episcopal Church.

Drizzle, Downpour, Desperation and Other Stories by composer Durwynne Hsieh is a triple concerto for violin, viola, and cello soloists with chamber orchestra, that is also a set of three contrasting tone poems.

Commissioned by SJCO for the Fong- Costanza Family Trio (Debra Fong, violin, Ezra Costanza, viola and Christopher Costanza, cello) as soloists, the piece explores grace in the face of adversity. Drizzle, Downpour, Desperation depicts a dark, rainy day and the emotions that take hold as the water falls. As for the "Other Stories", Excess Solitude is a reflection on loneliness, both the pain of isolation as well as the warm relief that can come from being with loved ones. Action, Traction and Satisfaction definitely has us on the road, but to where? Hopefully someplace good.

The three soloists sometimes shine individually, but more often interact as a trio, recognizing that the piece was commissioned specifically for a family trio of soloists, not just three players.

The piece contains elements of the classic

concerto form, with three contrasting movements arranged fast-slow-fast, passages where the soloists interact with the orchestra as well as those where they play unaccompanied, and an extended virtuoso cadenza near the end of the final movement.
