



Registration Open for Boys & Girls Clubs of Kern County Workforce Readiness Program

Local high school teens (ages 15-18) can register for the 2025 Boys & Girls Clubs of Kern County Workforce Readiness Program that will run from February 24 through May 9. Participants will meet at the E.L. Jack and Monica Armstrong Youth Center, 801 Niles Street, one day per week from 5 to 6:30 pm. After the training, the teens will have the opportunity for a paid internship with local employers as part of the Summer Jobs Program from June 9 through July 11.

Employers provide interns with mentorship and hands-on experience in various occupations. The interns work at their internship site for five weeks (after attending one week of youth employee onboarding). On Fridays, they participate in professional development that includes financial literacy; business, dining, and cell phone etiquette; First Aid, CPR & AED; and food handler certification. The Summer Jobs Program brings the benefits of job training to

youth and businesses in Kern County. Since 2013, nearly 2,000 local teens have received workforce training skills, and 434 teens have received a paid summer job by participating in the Club's Workforce Readiness Program. Program sponsors: Bank of America, Taco Bell Foundation, and US Bank.

Fluoride Fight: New Study **Raises Safety Concerns**

A new report once again raises the question of whether there is a link between fluoride in drinking water and lower IQ levels in children. A recent study published in JAMA Pediatrics reviewed 74 other studies exploring how the mineral may affect children's IQ levels and found a statistically significant association between higher fluoride exposure and lower children's IQ scores. According to Kyla Taylor, author of the study and a health scientist at the National Institute of Environmental Health Studies, results showed "the more fluoride a child is exposed to, the more likely that child's IQ will be lower than if they were not exposed."

The researchers did not suggest that fluoride should be removed from drinking water. According to the study authors, most of the 74 studies they reviewed were low-quality ones. All were done in countries other than the United States, such as China, where fluoride levels tend to be much higher than in the U.S.

Dentists worry the findings will be potentially damaging to public health. Health experts say that in areas where fluoride has been removed dental decay rates have increased dramatically. Major public health groups, including the CDC, American Academy of Pediatrics, and the American Dental Association all support the use of fluoride in water.

FDA Bans Red Dye No. 3 in the US

The US Food and Drug Administration has banned the use of red dye No. 3 in food, beverages, and ingested drugs due to cancer links found in animals. Known chemically as erythrosine, this synthetic color additive is used to give products a bright cherry-red color. Some companies use red dye No. 40 as an alternative, but California banned it in public schools due to behavioral concerns in children.

The ban follows a petition by advocacy groups like the Center for Science in the Public Interest and the Environmental Working Group, citing cancer links. The FDA's decision mirrors California's October 2023 ban. Manufacturers using red dve No. 3 have until January 2027 (food) and January 2028 (ingested drugs) to reformulate their products.



Popular Foods that can Compromise Heart Health

February is National Heart Health Month, a perfect time to focus on cutting out foods that can increase your risk for cardiovascular diseases. Here are a few foods that might be delicious but have a reputation for compromising heart health:

Bacon: High in cholesterol and saturated fat, bacon is a no-go for heart-healthy diets. A single slice of uncooked bacon typically contains 110 calories.

Red Meat: Red meat is high in saturated fat, though the content varies depending on the cut and type. Grass-fed beef contains less saturated fat than grain-fed,









and lean cuts like sirloin are better choices.

Baked Goods: Cookies, cakes, and muffins can elevate triglyceride levels, which can lead to hypertriglyceridemia, harming the heart and blood vessels.

Processed Meats: Foods like sausage, hot dogs, and deli meats are high in salt and saturated fat. A 2021 study in The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition found that consuming over five ounces of processed meat per week increases cardiovascular disease risk by 46%.



Calcium's Role in Reducing Cancer Risk

A UK study found that consuming more calcium, equivalent to a glass of milk a day, reduces bowel cancer risk. Calcium may protect against bowel cancer by binding to bile acids and free fatty acids in the colon, lowering their carcinogenic effects.

Researchers analyzed the diets of over half a million women for 16 years, finding that calcium-rich foods like bread, dark leafy greens, and non-dairy milks also had a protective effect. High alcohol and processed meat consumption, however, increased the risk. The study, from

Oxford University and Cancer Research UK, reported that an additional 300mg of calcium daily lowers risk by 17%, while more alcohol and processed meat raise the risk by 15% and 8%, respectively.

Dr. Lisa Wilde from Bowel Cancer UK highlights that half of bowel cancers could be prevented with healthier lifestyles. Non-dairy calcium sources like broccoli or tofu can also reduce risk.

Sweet Potatoes: A Real Spud

Sweet potatoes pack a nutritional punch year-round. One cup of baked sweet potatoes provides 213% of the recommended daily value of vitamin A, promoting a healthy immune system. They are also high in vitamin C, offering 44% of

the daily intake per cup, which supports a strong immune system and lowers the risk of diseases like heart disease and cancer. Sweet potatoes contain both soluble and insoluble fiber, promoting gut health by remaining in the digestive tract.



ear and uncertainty have loomed large over the recent fires in Los Angeles County. Coordinated aid from state agencies and nonprofits in Kern County have joined national efforts to help those affected. Cindy Huge, a volunteer with the American Red Cross's Kern County & Eastern Sierra Chapter, shared about the organization,

along with her hope-filled perspective. Cindy has been an American Red Cross volunteer for 12 years. She serves in multiple capacities, including as a public information officer, national spokesperson and chaplain.

"We have so many different functions within the American Red Cross," said

Cindy. "Volunteering is my way to give back to my community, that definition of 'community' being broad-based throughout the U.S."

Cindy believes her life experiences have contributed to her aptitude to volunteer.

Originally from a suburb of Cleveland, Ohio, Cindy has been married to her husband, Russ, for 44 years. They are the parents of three adult sons, with five grandchildren and counting.

Cindy was a board-certified respiratory therapist for 19 years before moving to Kern County in 1994 with Russ's job as an operations manager and engineer for a roofing company. Through her children's PTA, she made a professional contact that led to working as a radio personality for 11 years with American General Media, skills she still uses.

"When I retired, I didn't know what direction I wanted to take my life," said Cindy. "A friend suggested I volunteer with the American Red Cross. Our local radio and TV stations in town are wonderful in helping us spread the word."

Cindy has served 45 volunteer deployments nationwide, as close to home as the Borel fire and as far away as Puerto Rico. At the time of this interview. Cindy was preparing to help with the situation in Los Angeles County.

"The American Red Cross cares for everyone. Volunteers come from every walk of life and we all have one core value: we care about people and want to help, with no judgment," said Cindy. "Our work helps people find a connection point and move forward."

DISASTER RESPONSE Q&A

Q. How can families prepare for an emergency?

Think through your plan and logistics. Talk together about what you would do, depending on the emergency. Designate a gathering place to meet and make sure every household member knows where it is. You are going to evacuate, with your family members, when you are told to evacuate. Decide where you would go. Visit RedCross.org for our list of shelters. Have a "go bag" packed in your home and one in your car with essentials.

Also, set aside time now to take pictures or videos of your house or apartment so you can know what you had for insurance purposes.

Q. What should the public know about the work of the American Red Cross?

Our volunteers also respond to private home fires and other situations at the request of the family or the fire department. Your insurance agent may not pick up the phone at 3 a.m. but the American Red Cross is 24/7. Within 24 hours of being notified, we have a volunteer caseworker asking how their needs are being met. They can coordinate access to a nurse to help replace medication, arrange for professional counseling and more.

Q. How can the public best support the work of the American Red Cross's Los Angeles fire response effort?

The best support to offer is financial. We are not collecting material goods at this time. Donate online and get volunteer information at RedCross.org.

Q. How do you find hope and continue volunteering after seeing so many adverse experiences while helping others?

It helps to have a husband who is also an American Red Cross volunteer. Additionally, I receive support from my church community at St. John's Lutheran. I text with my pastor during deployment and with friends. I usually come home and sit for a few days quietly to reflect and write down some of the stories.

PARENTING ADVICE Q&A

Q. What advice do you have for parents raising young children?

Have good routines and clear expectations. Take the time to sit down and listen. Children don't have to have the latest gadget; they just want to spend time with you. Hardest of all, have patience.

Q. What should families in the Kern County area know more about in their community?

Bakersfield is a hidden jewel because of the exposure to so many other people,

Repeat with the remaining ladyfingers, mascarpone mixture, and another layer of sliced strawberries.

You can also assemble individual portions - layer 3 soaked lady fingers on a plate, add a layer of mascarpone mixture and a layer of sliced strawberries, and repeat.

Cover and chill at least 8 hours or overnight.

From Poop to Planning:

A Mom's Journey with Al

had just spent hours researching how to get to all the destinations on my child's bucket list for a fantasy trip to Japan. Finally, I just gave ChatGPT the list. Within seconds, it spit out an itinerary. Then I changed the arrival airport, and it updated my itinerary. Upon request, it also gave me a budget and told me which week I should go based on my preferences. I then asked for more downtime, and it delivered.

I'm not saying I'm going to blindly follow artificial intelligence to book a trip of a lifetime. But I think I just saved about seventy hours of research time.

Which made me think... maybe it could write my story for me.

And it turned out that ChatGPT got a lot of things right. It started my story this way:

"When I first became a parent, I had visions of perfection. My child would eat organic vegetables, say 'please' and 'thank you' like a Victorian gentleman, and sleep through the night. I bookmarked homemade baby food recipes and told myself I would never let my kid watch YouTube. Fast forward to today, and I've served Goldfish crackers for breakfast [and] my child once yelled 'POOP!' across Target just to hear it echo."

The only fiction in that introduction is that yelling "poop" never needed a reason. Ashley yelled that regardless of whether or not she could get an echo out of it. Daily. From age four to six. (Also a few other words I almost wrote down before I remembered that I can't.)

ChatGPT continued, "I now wake up to the sound of someone three feet tall breathing directly into my face like a pint-sized villain asking for waffles." Not exactly, but speaking of waffles, I did once ask a two-year-old child of mine if she wanted waffles or eggs for breakfast, and she said, "hot dogs." Also, once when I could not get another two-yearold back to sleep in the middle of the night, after hours of rocking and singing and pacing and vacuuming and baby wearing and driving in the car, she finally looked at me, at 4am, and said, "Mom, it's no use. I'm not tired. Let's just have a party right now."

Chat GPT next described how parents bribe their children: "One bite of egg, then you can have half a cookie!" In our family, the line was, "chicken, chicken, chip," meaning, take two bites of chicken, then you may have one chip. My chickenchicken-chip girl is now a teenager and laughs at this story about herself — BUT DOES REMEMBER trying to change the rule to "chip-chip-chicken."

The artificial intelligence thought that naps "make you believe you can survive the day." If only I'd had a child who napped. Or slept at night. Or slept at all. At any point. Ever.

We did not quite have these ChatGPT inspired moments, either: "The thing about parenting is that you're constantly making up rules you didn't think would ever need to exist. 'We don't lick the dog.' 'No, you cannot trade your sister for a cookie.' Instead, it was, "We do not put stamps on the dog," after my toddler used an entire roll of 100 stamps all over the dog. And my other toddler once said, after seeing me pay for groceries, "Maybe Grandma can buy me. She can give you money, and then I can live at her house." Nice.

So I guess I'll keep writing my own stories and use technology for things like planning my child's fantasy trip to Japan.






