A CITY BLOCK OF RARE TREASURES



Tumbleweed Smith

"This is Napolean's saddle," says Charles Trois of Brady. "That's his death mask, Napolean's death mask. These two big Amazon women, they were the front entrance to Coney Island back in its day."

Tumbleweed Smith Charles is giving me a tour of his museum which he is building in the old Western Auto building near downtown Brady.

"This clock is from the 1700s. It's a hundred and four pounds of solid silver." We came to a collection of Native American artifacts. "This is one of the best collections of tomahawks in the world, smoking tomahawks."The items in his museum resemble collections in the Smithsonian. Valuable historic items are everywhere. Charles grew up in Philadelphia and had careers in art, music and real estate. He had some musical hits in the 60s. "We had everything from 'YUMMY, YUMMY, I GOT LOVE IN MY TUMMY, ONE TWO THREE RED LIGHT, to MONTEGO BAY. Lots of hit records."

He traveled a lot. "I was in California, where a friend of mine was doing THE BEST LITTLE WHOREHOUSE IN TEXAS and he told me I would love Austin. I came in 1980 and it was wonderful," Charles said with a chuckle. "I just slowly kept moving toward the hill country. And finally ended up in Brady." On his way to Brady, Charles and his wife established the Trois resort near Fredericksburg.

He bought a city block in Brady to house some of his collections. "I like the little town. I wanted to get away from the cities. I'm building a museum which sounds kind of crazy to have valuable stuff in a small town but my motto is build it and they will come. I wanted to get away from all the insanity. So, I wanted to come to the center of Texas. Eventually, this museum will represent the evolution of civilization through all the battles, all the wars, how mankind has progressed."

Charles used his artistic ability to create dioramas, displaying dinosaurs. He painted the floor in the huge building. The outside of the building is a dark brown stucco, made to look like stone.

"Right now, I have two rooms that are almost finished. The next one will house the world's largest cap gun collection. Then I'm going to knock down the building behind this one, build a three-story structure, connect them all and the museum will finally come together." Charles gives private tours.

He has some rare guns. "I have the largest collection in the world of western gun and holster rigs. The old-time stuff. Some of the rare art pieces in the museum include works by Van Gogh, Picasso, Salvadore Dali, Modigliani, Degas and Renoir. A lot of the major museums wanted a lot of the pieces that I have, but I wanted to keep everything right here."
