Math and reading performance still below pre-COVID levels

Minnesota's performance on the 2024 National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) reveals a mixed picture, with modest improvements in math scores but continued struggles in reading, particularly among younger students. Despite record levels of state and federal aid aimed at addressing the ongoing learning loss from the COVID-19 pandemic, Minnesota students' test scores have yet to return to pre-pandemic

The NAEP, often referred to as the "Nation's Report Card," is administered every two years to a representative sample of fourth- and eighth-grade students across the United States. The results provide a benchmark for academic performance and serve as the only objective measure of student learning outcomes that can be compared across states.

In Minnesota, the average math scores for both fourth- and eighth-grade students increased by two points from 2022. However, reading scores showed little improvement. The average reading score for fourth-grade students declined by one point, while eighth-grade reading scores remained unchanged.

A particularly concerning trend is the rising percentage of Minnesota students scoring below the basic achievement level in reading. In fourth grade, 39 percent of students performed below the basic level, a figure that mirrors the 2022 results and marks the highest percentage since NAEP reading assessments began in 1992. The percentage of eighth-graders scoring below

basic in reading increased slightly to 29 percent, setting a new high for this grade level since the test was first administered in 1998.

Disparities persist across student groups

Disparities between different student groups remain pronounced. Black students in Minnesota showed some gains in both math and reading, with improvements in average scores for fourth- and eighth-grade students in these subjects. Hispanic students also made progress, particularly in fourth- and eighthgrade math, although their reading performance showed mixed results — fourth-grade scores stayed steady while eighth-grade reading scores improved.

White students, on the other hand, experienced a decline in average reading scores at both the fourth and eighth-grade levels compared to 2022. In math, white students saw improvements in fourth-grade scores, but their eighth-grade math scores remained unchanged

Impact of recent state legislative changes

The 2023 legislative overhaul of Minnesota's approach to literacy, with the passage of the READ Act, is aimed at improving reading outcomes across the state. The law mandates that teacher preparation programs, school districts, and educators implement evidence-based reading instruction. While these changes represent a significant step in addressing the state's long-standing literacy challenges, they have yet to show a measurable impact in the 2024 NAEP results. Teachers are still undergoing professional development, schools are adjusting curricula, and literacy plans are being put into place.

Experts have cautioned that improvements in student performance, particularly in reading, will take time and may not be immediately visible in the NAEP results.

National trends mirror statewide struggles

Nationally, the 2024 NAEP results echo Minnesota's challenges, particularly in reading. The national reading scores have continued to decline since 2019, reaching record lows. Daniel McGrath, of the National Center for Education Statistics, noted that the declines in reading achievement cannot be fully explained by the pandemic alone, suggesting deeper, more complex issues within the educational

While some states, such as Louisiana and Alabama, have seen improvements in certain grade levels and subjects, the majority of states, including Minnesota, have either seen stagnant or lower scores in key areas. The continued declines in reading achievement are cause for concern, with implications for both students' future academic success and their long-term life outcomes. **Catholic schools outperform** public schools nationwide

Students attending Catholic schools nationwide continue to outperform their public school peers in both subjects and grade levels tested. This trend reflects the consistently higher average test scores observed in Catholic schools compared to their public counterparts, particularly in reading and math. The performance gap between students in Catholic and public schools remains a key point of discussion among education experts, with some attributing the difference to factors such as smaller class sizes, a greater emphasis on academic rigor, and stronger community involvement.







Joy was born on June 9,


