





Medical Testimony Is Required In An **Injury Case**

In every case we know that an accident happened, and we know how it happened. We know what the medical treatment was, who did it, and where it was done.

The severity of an injury really determines the value of a personal injury case. Obviously, there are other factors that drive the value up or down. Most personal injury lawyers would agree that the victim of a drunk driver is likely to get more money. Often the perception that someone

was on their cell phone or otherwise distracted can drive a verdict higher.

Injuries come in all different kinds from a catastrophic injury such as the loss of a limb or paralysis to bumps, cuts, and bruises. The monetary value to a large degree corresponds to the extent of the injury.

There are defenses to liability such as contributory negligence meaning that the person that got hurt was in some way at fault also. If there is a strong defense, the value of the case decreases.

In cases where there is medical treatment, the courts will not allow, by and large, an ordinary person to testify about their injuries unless and until a physician testifies that the injuries were caused by the accident that the lawsuit is about. In other words, you can have the accident report showing how the accident happened on one side and on the other side a stack of medical records showing what the treatment has been. Without a doctor's testimony to bridge the two, the medical treatment doesn't come into court unless a doctor says it was both caused by the accident and necessary for the treatment of the injuries.

Insurance companies are really using this requirement to not pay claims. Unless the medical records are really clear and the injuries are severe, insurance companies often elect not to pay or pay a very small value.

One of the problems that we see is that the court system has for many years allowed doctors the privilege of testifying by deposition and excusing them from having to come to court to testify. That privilege does not extend to physician assistants and nurse practitioners (PAs and CRNPs). We are seeing and will continue to see more treatment by nurse practitioners and physicians assistants. These professionals are certainly entitled to act as expert witnesses and testify to causation and treatment in the vast majority of cases; however, they have to testify live in court.



It's Not a Plane Crash

In the summer of 1967, there was a plane crash over my hometown. A Boeing 727 and a twin engine Cessna 310 crashed over I-26 in Hendersonville, North Carolina. People in Hendersonville heard the boom. And before the airline authorities could do anything about blocking off the area, word got around and people went out to see the crash. I remember creeping down I-26 with the rest of the gawkers. I remember being in the backseat of our station wagon and looking out and seeing the tail end of that Boeing pointing downward in the earth. Debris was everywhere, on the streets and in the woods where those planes had landed. Smoke. Later on that day, on the news, it was reported that body parts had flown through people's roofs and windows. A hand had landed on a coffee table, they said. All 82 people involved in those flights were killed in that crash. This was my first encounter with death. I was 8 years old.

I was an 8-year-old with a vivid imagination. And so in the ensuing weeks. I had two or three dreams about body parts. It was pretty horrific. Right now, I question my mom's decision to take us out to see that site, but at the time everybody was just fascinated that a plane had crashed near us. But I know now that that tragic and horrible situation shaped my idea of death for a long time, for many years. As a young person I thought that death was a tragedy.

At one point I wrote in this column that after the age of 50, all religious people become priests. We start to realize that honoring God is the only thing. And now after 65, I'm finding for myself that I am thinking on death a little more often. I seem to be preparing my mind for it. In my lifetime, I have witnessed many people on their deathbed. Within a week of her death, my mom started telling people if they wanted to see her, they better come see her now. My dad refused medicine so that he could work through the pain and wait for my siblings to get home so that he could talk to them one last time. I have visited older members of my congregation in their last

days, and they have been ready. My godly parents and these godly loved ones have not been afraid.

People who live by God's words have hope in death. Presently I am blessed with good health, but over the last few years I have begun to relish in that hope. Death is not a tragedy. I think older people at some point have to come to that realization. If death is the end of life, of all things, then it is a tragedy. But there are words in the scripture that say that those who have fallen

asleep in Christ will meet Him again when He returns, and that we should find comfort in these words. (I Thessalonians 4)

Wow, I am a priest, in that this is my anticipation. People who walk in the Spirit, believe that death is full of hope. Death is not a plane crash. Should I be writing about this in a column that is based on family and raising secure kids? Yes! Our kids were raised in this hope. Our adult children know Whose they are and where they are heading. They have strong guidance and deep roots. They don't just depend on themselves. They are growing in hope. I hope God is pleased with our parenting. I pray that we all will be ready where the time comes.



Florence's State Normal High School


What is known today as the University of North Alabama began its first year in Florence (1855) operating in the Masonic Lodge on the southwest corner of Court and Tennessee Streets in downtown Florence while construction of Wesleyan Hall was being completed. The following year (1856), the college moved into the grand, Gothic-style building, with both the student body and the faculty comprised of males only. By the 1870's, though, it had both males and females within both the student body and the faculty. It became known as Florence Normal College - with the word "Normal" a derivative of ecole normale, a French term applied to teacher-training schools in Europe and America. Faculty and staff in Wesleyan Hall and Wesleyan Annex, which are attached by an elevated crosswalk, were devoted to the training of teachers. Conveniently, a school for students in grades 1-12 was in the same complex of buildings. The accompanying image of a report card in the early 1930's (identity of the student purposely omitted) belonged to a student in Jr. 2 (grade 8). Note, for example 1

interestingly, the grades in Latin are better than those English. in Note, also, that the grades earned in "Deportment" (i.e., personal behavior) are stellar. not Grades overall

Today, Kilby Laboratory School, the direct descendant of Florence Normal High School, houses students of pre-school age through grade 6. It's the only Laboratory School still attached to a public university in the State of Alabama.

HOUSE MUSEUM

The Oakville Indian Mounds Museum is based on a seven sided Cherokee council house. This type of council house was used during the cooler months and an open sided rectangular pavilion during warmer weather. The descriptions used for the museum's construction came from Lt. Henry Timberlake, who visited the Cherokee cápitel at Chota in 1761, and William Bartram, who visited Cowe about 1765. Timberlake's description: The townhouse, in which are transacted all public business and diversions, is raised with wood, and covered over with earth, and has all, the appearance of a small mountain at a little distance. It is built in the form of a sugar loaf, and large enough to contain 500 persons, but extremely dark, having, besides the door, which is narrow that but one at a time can pass, and that after much winding and turning, but one small aperture to let the smoke out, which is so ill contrived, that most of it settles in the ancient amphitheater, the seats being raised one above another, leaving an area in the middle, in the center of which stands the fire: the seats of the head warriors are nearest it." The seven sides represent the matrilineal clans of the Cherokee: Wild Potato, Long Hair, Paint, Wolf. Deer, Bird, and Blue.

"Medicare Part B Coverage"

Medicare Part B is most used when you visit your primary care physician or specialist. But Medicare Part B is also used for many other medically necessary services. Medicare defines medically necessary as "healthcare services or supplies needed to diagnose or treat an illness, injury, condition or disease, or its symptoms and that meet accepted standards of medicine".

One of these other services covered by Part B is transportation by ambulance. Medicare covers and helps pay for ambulance services only if other types of transportation will endanger your health and will only cover and help pay for you to be transported to the nearest medical facility that's able to give you the care you need. If you choose to be transported to a facility farther away you may have to pay more.

Another service Part B covers is Durable Medical Equipment (DME). DME must be long lasting equipment that is used in your home for medical reasons and has an expected lifetime of at least 3 years. Medicare has a long list of equipment that falls under DME.

One of the most important benefits of Medicare Part B are the preventive services that it covers. These services include health care that is used to prevent illness or detect illness at

Medicare.gov list 23 screenings and shots that fall under preventive services. They include things such as mammogram screenings, colorectal cancer screenings and flu shots.

Part B has an annual deductible of \$257 and a coinsurance of 20%. This means that if you have Original Medicare only, with no other supplemental coverage, you will owe the first \$257 filed on Part B each year and, after the deductible is met, you will be responsible for 20% of the cost of Part B services you receive.
