

Milford RAGBRAI Looking for Hosts to House Riders

MILFORD

Milford, Iowa - The Milford RAGBRAI Committee is seeking volunteers who can offer overnight accommodations for RAGBRAI riders or support staff on July 20, 2025.

Host Expectations: Some riders will want or need to stay at a home versus camping in the campgrounds. Riders will expect a place to put a tent outside or inside floor space for a sleeping bag, possible access to a bathroom and shower, a place for parking vehicles for those riders who are coming with support, and possibly somewhere to fill a water bottle. It is completely up to the hosts how many guests and the amenities you would

Local housing volunteers are not expected to entertain guests or provide them with amenities. Hosts are also not required to transport or feed riders.

Rider Expectations: Riders will be well-behaved, appreciative guests who will remember the host's kindness. This is also a great opportunity to meet some fascinating people. Riders will arrive mid-to early afternoon on Sunday, July 20, and be gone before 9:00am the next day.

Sign up to be a host or if you have already matched with riders.

There are several ways you can sign up to be a host or let the Milford RAGBRAI Committee know you already have someone lined up to stay at your home.

1. Match yourself with a rider. Join the Milford RAGBRAI Housing Match group on Facebook to match yourself with a rider. There will be posts from riders on what they are looking for and you can reach out to them personally.

2. Leave the matching up to the Milford RAGBRAI Committee. Go to milford.ia.us/ragbrai to fill out the Milford RAGBRAI Host Form. This form includes several questions on what you are willing to provide and they will find a good match for you. Once a match has been made the host will be notified.

3. Already had someone reach out and they are staying at your place? The Milford RAGBRAI Committee wants to make sure riders and hosts are able to find each other on July 20. If you want your contact and address information available at the Milford RAGBRAI Information Center, please fill out the Already Matched Rider and Housing Form at milford.ia.us/ragbrai. The Milford RAGBRAI Committee will have this information $available \, at \, the \, Milford \, RAGBRAI \, Information \, Center \, for \, riders \,$ looking for their hosts on July 20.

Milford RAGBRAI will only match hosts with riders who are registered with RAGBRAI. Those who house unregistered riders open themselves up to the full liability for whatever may happen at their home. Keep this in mind when accepting requests on your own. A great way to check to see if a rider is registered is to ask for their RAGBRAI confi rmation number and check with the Milford RAGBRAI Committee.





Bulldogs Bite Just Enough vs Panthers

The college men's basketball game of the day on Sunday featured two of our in-state rivals, the Drake Bulldogs traveling to Cedar Falls to take on the red-hot Northern Iowa Panthers. Under new coach Ben McCollum, Drake has had a tremendous season, entering the game with a 24-3 record and a slim one game lead in the Missouri Valley Conference over their rival UNI, who was riding a six-game winning streak and playing their best basketball of the season. To add even more hype to the rivalry, the game was featured on national television with ESPN2 doing the broadcast.

The game definitely lived up to the hype as the Bulldogs pulled out a thrilling 64-58 overtime win in a game that featured big-time shots, questionable foul calls and both teams leaving absolutely everything they had on the court. Drake controlled most of the first half and twice took the largest lead of the game at eight, but the Bulldogs couldn't put the Panthers away as UNI trimmed the lead to 30-27 at halftime. UNI quickly cut that lead to 34-33 on a Ben Schweiger jumper early in the half, but the Bulldogs would respond with a 7-0 run to take another eight-point lead. The Panthers once again would battle back and take a 50-49 lead on a Trey Campbell layup with just over 4:00 remaining. From there, no team would lead by more than two points for the rest of regulation; Campbell hit a big three-pointer to give UNI a 54-53 lead and the Panthers would add one free throw to take a 55-53 with just :07 left. Drake got a good look from star Bennett Stirtz that was off the mark but a long rebound came to Mitch Mascari and he was fouled on a three-point attempt at the buzzer. The 88% free throw shooter missed the first attempt as the sellout crowd went into a frenzy, but Mascari calmly made the last two to push the game into overtime. Tytan Anderson gave UNI a quick lead in overtime with a bucket in the paint, but Stirtz would answer with a putback of his own miss to tie the game. Anderson then fouled out of the game on a double foul with Drake's Isiah Howard as the two battled for position on the elbow by the free throw line. There didn't appear to be much contact and UNI coach Ben Jacobsen said after the game, "It might be the worst call I've seen in my 19 years as a head coach, because of the impact it had on the game." Jacobsen did say both teams had some calls go their way and against them, stating, "Look, there were seven or eight calls that (McCollum) is going to feel like were the wrong call, and there's seven or eight of them that I feel like were the wrong call. But they didn't decide the game." Drake would take advantage of Anderson being out of the game, as UNI struggled to get any flow on offense. Daniel Abreu made a tough fadeaway jumper to give Drake a 59-57 lead that they would never relinquish. UNI was only able to score one more point and then Stirtz put the game away as his team was clinging to a 61-58 lead with a tough three-pointer as the shot clock wound down with just :16 remaining.

The win gave the Bulldogs no worse than a tie for the Missouri Valley Conference regular season title, and with games this week against two lower-level teams, including a home game vs last place Missouri State on Sunday, Drake is in great position to win the conference outright. UNI is now in a second-place tie with Bradley and will travel to Peoria to take on the Braves on Sunday in a game that will probably determine the #2 seed in the MVC Tournament, which begins on March 6th. Drake is now tied with #1 Auburn with the most wins in all of Division I with 25. While I feel like the Bulldogs deserve an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament if they should falter at the MVC Tournament, I have a feeling they will find themselves with the same fate as last year's MVC Champion, Indiana State, who Drake beat in the Finals, on the outside looking in and with a spot in the NIT. Drake has some impressive non-conference wins over Kansas State and Vanderbilt, but the Valley has recently turned into a one-bid league and I fear the same will hold true this year. Let the madness begin!

Biosecurity, Protecting Our Communities

This time of year, is a great time to talk about biosecurity So, what is biosecurity? It is the practices that the agriculture community put in place to mini-

health of those herds. We have several tools at our disposal to deal with disease outbreaks that are presented to our herds, but the best tool is mitigating the risk that the animals are exposed in the first place. This can be done by determining the different ways that animals could



be exposed to diseases. First, it is important to clean and disinfect a farm or facility before new animals arrive. The animals that were previously housed in the facility could have been carrying a disease that the new herd has not been exposed to. By doing so you are ensuring that the animals enter a barn that is free of disease challenges. Animals could also be exposed to disease from contact with other animals. Most operations use a closed herd system. This means that all the animals arrive and depart the farm at the same time. Doing this ensures that all animals are the same age and have had similar health histories. This is often referred to as an all-in and all-out procedure.

The next thing we focus on is the care giver. There are several ways for the caregiver to track diseases to the herd based on where they travel and who they come in contact with. It is a good practice to have a separate pair of shoes that gets worn to your barn where your animals are located that you don't wear to places where other animals are housed. This helps prevent tracking any diseases from your farm and makes sure you aren't carrying anything back with you. Keep vehicles clean, paying extra attention to areas you touch with your hands and your floor mats. Using a product like a disinfectant wipe or a spray disinfectant will prevent a lot of transfer. Practicing proper down time is also important. This means that you spend a certain amount of time away from any animals before encountering animals again. It is commonly suggested to wait a longer amount of time before coming in contact with breeding stock especially.

The last thing to consider is having a standard disinfecting protocol for any tools, buckets, boots, gating etc. that you have used somewhere other than your farm. This could involve spraying everything down with a disinfectant solution and letting it sit for an amount of time before using the equipment again.

All of these measures, together, can help keep your animals healthy and protect the agriculture communities in which we live. **EMPLOYMENT**



Dear Tony, How can I become better at planning for success in my

In 2013, while walking to a lecture on Oxford University, I happen to meet Harvard professor and author Clayton Christensen on a street corner. He was very gracious, smiled, shook my hand, and we walked together for about 6 blocks. He asked what I was doing in Oxford, and I shared with him how we were discussing his disruptive innovation models in our classes on strategy and innovation. He said he once studied at Oxford as a student. To this day his approachability, peaceful spirit, and friendly demeanor stand out. It turns out he didn't get this way

Clayton wrote a book in 2012 called "How will you Measure Your Life" where he asks the tough questions about establishing a purpose for your life, using your time on earth to advance this purpose, and in the end how important faith and family are in deciding true measures of a life well lived. (It is a great read - check it out on Amazon). When I met Clayton I hadn't read this book yet, but I did look up an article he wrote from 2010 in Harvard Business Review on the same topic (https://hbr. org/2010/07/how-will-you-measure-your-life). I was struck by Clayton's recommendation at the end of the article:

"Don't worry about the level of individual prominence you have achieved; worry about the individuals you have helped become better people. This is my final recommendation: Think about the metric by which your life will be judged and make a resolution to live every day so that in the end, your life will be judged a success." Clayton Christensen (1952-2020)

The interaction with Clayton, plus a few other motivating forces in my life, caused me to develop what I call my "Purpose, Goals, and Plans' each year. It is a simple, /-step process but one that I find effective. The steps are:

1. **Document**. Write down your personal and professional goals for the next year. I have 6 each, for example. Don't worry about etching these in stone but do your very best to lay out 6 good goals for home and at work. Goal, metric on what success looks like, timeframe – be specific.

2. Gather & Organize. Get a binder and enough tabs to have one for every goal in step 1. On the tab write down the goal topic. On a paper write down all goals for that area and insert it into the binder under the appropriate tab.

3. Measure & Monitor. As the year goes by, keep track of your goals and any progress. Make notes. Update goals. Hang onto any mementos – add them to the binder. The more mementos, the more color, the more impact on your life. Place the binder in a visible place.

4. Edit & Refine. As the year goes by, revisit your purpose to edit/refine, as well as remind you what it is you live for and what defines your reason for living.

5. Reflect. At the end of the year, look back and evaluate what went well, what didn't, how to improve. Be super honest

6 Recognize. An important step is to look back on the year and recognize the important people in your life. For many years I sent them a certificate (very formal!) with a personal note of appreciation, noting in detail about how they impacted my life.

7. **Repeat**. Make a new binder with goals for the next year. Meet with people you trust at least once a year to gain their input as necessary and recruit any new support you need to get where you want to go.

Pro Tip: As the year goes by, use the binder to collect mementos, pictures, artifacts, of your life journey. For example - programs from grade school / high school graduations, 5K registrations with kids, etc. Allow your binder to become a formal record of your life for that year, and over time you will cherish those memories.

'A Home for Heroes' - Ruthven Care Center Now Approved for VA Benefits

The Veterans Administration provides quality, thoughtful, skilled care services to Veterans, from those who need assistance with daily tasks in their older age to those with traumatic brain injuries. VA's longterm care options give Veterans tailored support and a peace of mind. In 2021, more than 9.2 million Veterans (roughly half of all living U.S. Veterans) were enrolled in VHA, and around 6.8 million received care through VHA. Now, the Ruthven Community Care Center has been awarded an opportunity to serve Veterans as a VA approved facility accepting VA benefits.

The Ruthven Community Care Center (RCCC) has been approved as a Veterans Affairs approved facility, partnering with the Veterans Affairs office out of Sioux Falls. The VA will be coming to RCCC on February 5th to do final training and walk-through, and hopefully they will be able to begin to accept VA benefits within just a couple weeks. The VA benefit contract is in place for five years before it is up for renewal, giving Veterans a peace of mind. They only allow so many facilities per region. RCCC already has their assisted living under VA qualifications.

To be approved, there were certain parameters that had to be met including how good site surveys are, CMS scores. This is the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services system to measure the experiences Medicare beneficiaries have with the health care system at RCCC - and RCCC has met the criteria to apply now.

Ryan Sikora, Administrator for the RCCC Campus, said typically a care center like ours would not be picked because they already have one VA facility in our region and RCCC is a relatively smaller facility than they usually choose. He emphasizes that RCCC received this honor to serve our Veterans "because of the staff; the care staff, support staff, leadership staff, a supportive board, and just all of our caring employees." Ryan said the facility is fully staffed and has not used an 'agency' in over two months, which not many facilities can say. "Our employees know our residents on a personal basis."

Ryan said "They came here and toured the facility and went through our books and our satisfactory reports and ultimately chose us. It is a huge deal – it allows us to care for and accept Veteran Affairs benefits." Veterans, as with all VA benefits, must apply for admission through the VA office and they will send RCCC referrals.

RCCC currently has 13 Veterans in

the residence – and Ryan said they have already sent their names in for Veterans Benefit approval. "Any Veteran that is already here now can also utilize those benefits. It's really a pretty good deal; it opens up a lot more referrals to us to be able to take care of our Veterans." Veterans will be referred to Ruthven from all over the region as there are only a few select care facilities that meet the stringent VA requirements. RCCC will be accepting all the VA billing.

Ryan says "it is really a win-win situation; it helps out the facility, we're able to take care of our Veterans, and it puts us on the map for the good things we have been doing with our patient satisfactory surveys, and our above-average yearly inspections that come in." The VA also does yearly surveys and walk-throughs, but Ryan said they are basically the same high standards set by the CMS and DIAL. Veterans are fully covered for all levels of care under the VA plan.

The CMS and DIAL rates care facilities on tiers. RCCC is rated a 3-Tier facility which logically is probably the highest rating RCCC can be at. "Realistically we can never be a 5-tier facility, as to be at a higher tier you have to have more certified beds than we currently have; and we have licensed 46 beds," Ryan said. RCCC reached a 3-tier status this past year after their second straight high yearly survey in a row. "We accomplished this high rating because we only had two infractions in 2023 and two this year (2024)." That is well below the Iowa state average of 11 infractions a year by care facilities. Ryan

says "We're as high as we can be (in tiers) and it's good to be recognized for that and be able to offer this new service to our Veterans who deserve so much more. In my mind, we're a 5-tier facility."

Ryan said they submitted the application a year ago, that's how long it takes to be approved - and from a business aspect, accepting VA and meeting all their high criteria, is a very good option for the facility. "We have to meet and maintain their high standards, and we are reimbursed at a higher rate than Medicaid. Actually, our Generation Management team, that the board hired, was very surprised we were awarded it. We are a small facility by VA terms and they already have a building in the region. With our quality measures we've been hitting, and everything else Ruthven brings to the table, it was really a no-brainer for them." The RCCC Board of Directors are also very happy for the work the team has done to accomplish this.

The Ruthven Community Care Center Campus is currently full. The Villa Senior Apartments are full for the first time in their 18 years of existence. The Assisted Living is full with a waiting list of 4, and the skilled care facility is mostly full, however, residents will come to recover then move to Assisted Living, the Villa, or back to their home opening up a room.

Ruthven is very fortunate to have such a wonderful facility for those with a variety of needs to live a happy healthy life – and we are very fortunate for the caring staff that truly considers everyone 'family'.
