Drake is Dancing After Dominating the Valley Drake has been one of the best stories in all of college basketball this season, losing their coach, Darien DeVries and their best player, Tucker DeVries to West Virginia after last season's 28-7 record that included a Missouri Valley Conference Championship and trip to the NCAA Tournament. Drake also lost the rest of their key contributors off that 2023-24 team either through graduation or the Transfer Portal and expectations were low for the Bulldogs to make their third straight trip to the March Madness. Drake hit a homerun on their head coaching hire, luring Ben McCollum from Northwest Missouri State, where the Storm Lake native had won four Division II National Championships. McCollum brought his top four players with him from NW Missouri State and also signed a strong group of players from high school and the Transfer Portal. There were still a ton of questions about how the Division II success would translate at the Division I level for McCollum and the players he brought with him. Those questions were quickly answered when Drake stormed through the preseason undefeated with wins over Power Five teams Miami, Vanderbilt and Kansas State. The Bulldogs kept things rolling in the Missouri Valley Conference, winning the league by two games with a 17-3 record and entered March Madness as the #1 seed. Despite Drake's 27-3 overall record, there still were doubts that they would earn an at-large spot in the NCAA Tournament, especially after last year's regular season champion, Indiana State was snubbed after the Bulldogs beat them in the 2024 MVC Championship game despite the Sycamores impressive resume. McCullom and his Bulldogs left nothing to risk by winning the 2025 MVC Championship on Sunday, with a dominating defensive performance in a 63-48 victory over #2 seed Bradley. The game was close at halftime, with Drake clinging to a 31-27 lead, but the Bulldogs defense smothered the Braves in the second half, holding them scoreless during a 10-minute stretch as they put the game away behind MVC Player of the Year and Tournament MVP Bennett Stirtz, who finished with 24 points, 4 assists and 4 rebounds. Drake also got a huge game from the MVC Sixth Man of the Year, Tavion Banks, who finished with 13 points and 9 rebounds. This Drake team does the little things at such a high level for 40 minutes of basketball. They play tremendous team defense, they rebound very well and they all play to their strengths as one unit. Stirtz by far is the key to the Bulldogs success, having the ball in his hands for a majority of the game and controlling things on both ends of the court. The 6'4" junior plays with such a calm demeanor that flows through the rest of the Bulldog team, and he left no doubt that he belongs at the Division I level, averaging 19.1 points, 4.4 rebounds and 5.7 assists this season. The other DII transfers have also had outstanding seasons, as Daniel Abreu averaged 10.1 points per game, Mitch Mascari led the team in 3-pointers with 86, and Isiah Jackson has been great off the bench. Last year, Drake earned a 10 seed in the NCAA Tournament and I would imagine this year's team will be seeded in a very similar position. Drake has not won an NCAA Tournament game since 2021, and that was a First Four game as an 11-seed playing another 11-seed in Wichita State (sorry, I don't count play-in games as NCAA Tournament victories). The last Drake victory in the field of 64 dates way back to 1971 when the Bulldogs took down Notre Dame before falling to Kansas. That was so long ago that it was the year that this old man was born! This team is not just a feel-good story, they are a very good basketball team that is extremely well-coached. I know if I was a 7 seed I would want no part of playing this Bulldog team in the first round, and I look for this group of Division II transfers and cast-offs from other programs to end that 53-year-old drought;

One of the coolest things I remember about being a Boy Scout was the Pinewood Derby races. We all got the same kit – a block of wood, wheels, and nails for the axles. From there, you could design anything you wanted in order to make it go faster down $a \sim 40$ foot long track. It was great competition, and we all had ideas on how to make our car go faster. From aerodynamics, to special dry lubrication on the nails, to polishing the wheels. Some even drilled holes in the wood and selectively added weight on the front end of the block of wood, all the while staying below the overall weight limit.

But I had a secret weapon. I had a grandfather.

My grandfather on my mother's side had a woodworking shop in his garage. It was full of the smell of sawdust, and just about every kind of wood you can imagine. I just knew he would help me design and build the best pinewood derby car and help me win the contest.

I was 10 years old at the time when we met in his garage. I got my kit out and explained to him what the objective was and asked him to build me a car. He asked a few questions and then got down on one knee and looked me in the eye and said, "I can't do what you are asking, but if you have any questions on how to use any of the tools, I'll be more than glad to teach you. If I were to build you a car, it wouldn't be your project, and it wouldn't be fair to the other kids."

I don't remember much about what I did that day to build the car, but I did remember what he told me for the rest of my life. He taught me several things that day:

- It wouldn't be fair to the other kids if he did • Fairness the work
- Work Ethic No short-cuts, I should do the work
- Itwasmyproject, nothis. Integrity demanded Ido • <u>Integrity</u> the work.
- It wouldn't behonest in the spirit of the project for • <u>Honesty</u> him to do it.
- Mentoring He would teach me, but he wouldn't do the work for me.

My grandfather on my father's side lived on a working farm and it was always a pleasure to visit them. The cinnamon rolls, the hearty meals, and the endless ways a kid can find adventure on a farm.

One time, also when I was around 10 years old, my father asked me to help Grandpa Thelen clean up the brush around a grove of trees. We had a John Deere Model B tractor with a loader on it. Grandpa drove the tractor, and I piled up all the brush and other debris in the bucket. I worked as hard as I have worked my entire life up to that point.

When my father came out to check on us, he asked grandpa how I was doing. I'll never forget what he told my dad, "He's a good worker, but I could do without all the belly aching and complaining". The standard for my work ethic and how I handled myself changed that day and forever more.

As I've aged and thought about these events early in my life, and how I've lived my life since. I do believe, after all, that I did have a secret weapon in my grandparents.

Their wisdom has been invaluable to shaping my life. I think we all have people in our lives who make deposits into our future - parents, siblings, bosses, friends, teachers, and so on. Here's to the "grandfathers" in our lives. To those who pour into us whether we know it at the time or not. May we accept their wisdom and use it to become the best version of ourselves.

We intend to deliver 20 weeks/times for your enjoyment of our boxed produce half or full share but wish to have an understanding that our growing season can be unpredictable and have included the 17 week minimum. Deadline to purchase a CSA share is May 1, 2025.

The following fruits and vegetables will be available sometime during the 2025 growing season in the CSA box share: apples, asparagus, beans-green, beets-red or golden, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage-green or red, carrots, cauliflower, celery, chard, cucumbers-slicers-burpless-pickling, eggplant, *garlic, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce-leaf green-red-romaine, onions-red-yellowwhite, peas-sugar snap, peppers-sweet bell-hot, pie pumpkins, potatoes-red-white-Yukon, rhubarb, radishes, rutabagas, scallions, shallots, summer squash-yellow, sweet corn, tomatoes, winter squash- 10 varieties, and zucchini.







LRH Board Approves County Tax Rate For Fiscal Year 2026

The Lakes Regional Healthcare (LRH) Board of Trustees recently approved the hospital's property tax rate for the upcoming fiscal year, maintaining the county tax rate at \$0.48 per \$1,000 of property value. This decision ensures continued financial support for vital healthcare services without increasing the tax burden on Dickinson County residents.

At just 2% of the average property tax bill in Dickinson County, LRH's tax rate remains one of the lowest among county-supported hospitals in Iowa. In fact, out of 44 county tax-supported hospitals statewide, LRH has the second lowest tax rate, ranking 42nd out of 44 hospitals. The median tax rate for similar hospitals in Iowa is \$1.98 per \$1,000 of property value - more than four times LRH's rate. Additionally, most hospitals receiving tax dollars are designated as Critical Access Hospitals, which are typically much smaller and provide fewer services than LRH.

The \$0.48 allocated to LRH funds essential healthcare services in Dickinson County, with the majority directed toward ambulance services and hospital operations:

• \$0.27 for Ambulance Services:

Unlike many counties where ambulance services are operated separately from hospitals, LRH provides this critical service directly. Tax support in this area generates \$1.1 million, covering approximately half of ambulance operations, as patient insurance payments account for the other half. Additionally, these funds help support the purchase of replacement ambulances, which the 2025 cost runs around \$300,000 per ambulance.

• \$0.21 for General Hospital Operations:

Generating \$850,000, these funds help address staffing costs and inflationary pressures. Healthcare salary costs continue to outpace inflation, and national staff shortages have forced hospitals including LRH to rely on contract workers at significantly higher costs. Meanwhile, inflation peaked at 9% in fiscal year 2023, while insurance reimbursement rates only increased 2-4%. This funding allows LRH to continue to provide high quality care by narrowing the financial gap created by these economic challenges. Additionally, the funds are used to offset care that is provided to patients who are unable to pay for them. Over the years, that number has been between \$1 million and \$2 million annually.

We take being good stewards of the funds we receive very seriously," said LRH President and CEO, Jason Harrington. "By maintaining a stable tax rate while providing essential healthcare services, LRH remains committed to serving Dickinson County with quality, accessible, and affordable care."

Reflections of a winner

Beardsley has done well over the past several years in the annual photo contest, winning the Iowa Water category in 2023-24 and placing second in the same category in 2022-23. In 2021, Beardsley was a winner in two categories: Iowa Wildlife and Iowans in Action. His winning photos have also been chosen the Public Favorite for the past two years.

According to Beardsley, "Thanks to Keep Iowa Beautiful for sponsoring the contest and thank you to everyone who voted for my photo in the Public Favorite category. Entering the contests are fun, but I take photos as a creative activity and for enjoyment. Entering contests is just a great way to share my creativity."

Beardsley notes that he takes a ton of photos, and sometimes opportunity arises. He shoots landscapes primarily during the golden hour, one hour after sunrise and one hour before sunset. For wildlife, the golden hour can also work well. As he says, "You discover a new perspective to shoot. For instance, recently I was shooting photos at sunset on Big Spirit, but the best shot ended up being puddle reflections on the lake without the sunset in the image.'
