Minnesota DNR honors 18 individuals and one K9 for lifesaving actions

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources Enforcement Division in February formally recognized 18 people and one dog for their lifesaving actions during 2024 and so far in 2025.

Those awarded for their efforts included: conservation officers Matthew Boyle, Levi Brown, Michael Cross, Andrew Dirks, Michael Fairbanks, Michael Krauel (and his K9 partner Bolt), Tyler Lusignan, Patrick McGowan, David Schottenbauer, Curtis Simonson, Jacob Swedberg, Jimmy Van Asch, Brice Voland Shane Zavodnik; Natural Resources Pilot Grace Zeller; Forestry Division Lands Specialist Matt Boyer; and Kevin Quittschreiber, a civilian.

"It's impossible to predict when the call will come that someone is in grave danger and needs help, but these individuals responded at a moment's notice to situations that otherwise could have ended in tragedy," said Col. Rodmen Smith, DNR Enforcement Division director. "In many of these cases, we worked alongside our public safety partners and civilians in the

the character and commitment of them and our Enforcement staff to keeping the people of Minnesota safe."

CO Michael Fairbanks (Deer River station)

Late at night on Jan. 11, 2025, Fairbanks and a Deer River police officer saved the life of a woman who was riding an ATV that broke through the ice on Little Winnibigoshish Lake. She got out of the water but was face down on the ice and unresponsive when Fairbanks and the officer arrived. They transported her to shore and a waiting ambulance.

Van Asch earned two lifesaving awards. The first was for an incident on Sept. 30, 2024, when he rescued an elderly individual who had gone for a boat ride and got stuck in heavy vegetation. By the time he was located that evening, he was extremely cold and showing signs of hypothermia. In the second incident, which occurred Dec. 14, 2024, Van Asch responded to a call of a hunter who was experiencing severe chest pains. He arrived quickly on his snowmobile, then transported the man out of the area and got him to a

COs Matthew Boyle (Pelican Rapids station) and Shane Zavodnik (Virginia station)

waiting ambulance.

Boyle and Zavodnik responded Nov. 15, 2024, to a call of a man trapped under his crashed aircraft near the Eveleth airport. They trekked through rugged terrain and a half-mile spruce bog to reach the man, who had been pinned for 90 minutes and was soaked in gas. They lifted the aircraft off him, worked to keep him warm to stave off hypothermia, and treated him until a rescue team arrived.

CO Patrick McGowan (Walker)

Just after 5 a.m. on a cold Nov. 3, 2024 morning, Mc-Gowan was headed out to heard a call go out about a duck boat that had flipped over on Leech Lake and was sinking. McGowan responded immediately and on his own rescued six young hunters who were in the water and didn't have on life jackets. He transported all six to shore, where first responders were waiting. **CO Jacob Swedberg (Detroit** Lakes) and Kevin Quittsch-

reiber On Oct. 17, 2024, Swedberg received a call about a person who was in a canoe but unable to make it to shore because of poor weather and strong winds. He knew Quittschreiber – the father of late CO Kyle Quittschreiber - lived on the lake and had a boat with a mud motor, so he asked for his help. The two reached the stranded canoeist, who was showing signs of hypothermia. They got the person to shore and the medical attention they needed.

CO David Schottenbauer (Northeast Minnesota re-

gional training officer)

On Sept. 29, 2024, Schottenbauer was among about 35 COs training at Camp Ripley when another CO was stung by a bee and had a life-threatening reaction. Schottenbauer, who is also a registered nurse, quickly took control of the scene, including coordinating a Life Link helicopter and directing another officer in the use of an EpiPen. The CO was flown to the hospital and has since made a full recovery.

COs Andrew Dirks (Cuyuna **Country State Recreation** Area), Michael Krauel and K9 Bolt (Mora station), and Ashley Whiteoak (Aitkin station)

On Sept. 20, 2024, a pair of hunters flagged down Whiteoak and informed her of a hunter who was missing in Aitkin County. The three COs and K9 Bolt, along with DNR K9 Unit Leader Capt. Phil Mohs and K9 Mack, located the lost 71-year-old hunter after dark. K9 Bolt first found the hunter, who was in a remote, heavily vegetated area and unable to walk out of the woods.

CO Levi Brown (Benson)

Brown was checking on anglers July 21, 2024, when he heard a call about an individual whose head was pinned between a forklift and a tractor tire. He responded immediatecheck waterfowl hunters. He ly and arrived minutes after the call. Brown was familiar with the equipment and knew how to manipulate the tractor tire without starting the machine. He did so, which allowed the victim to free his head and release the pressure that otherwise would have killed him. **CO Tyler Lusignan**

On May 27, 2024, CO Tyler Lusignan heard a radio call that several people were trapped in rushing water after their canoes and kayaks had overturned in the Cannon River near Faribault. He was the first law enforcement officer to arrive with a boat, and quickly launched it so he and a Rice County Sheriff's Office deputy could help the stranded paddlers. The water was high and moving extremely fast, but Lusignan maneuvered the boat such that he could rescue and bring to shore the three adults and three children.

Natural Resources Pilot Grace

Zeller On the evening of Satur-

day, May 18, 2024, while she was off-duty, Zeller - a natural resources pilot in the **DNR** Enforcement Division received a phone call from **DNR Enforcement Chief Pilot** Capt. Jake Willis. There was a report of people injured and missing in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness near Curtain Falls along the Canadian border, and other air assets were not available

to attempt a rescue. Zeller responded in a helicopter immediately, coordinating with medical, law enforcement, and rescue staff at the scene. She landed at a remote location in the dark. Over the course of two flights, transported three medics and two severely wounded individuals to the Ely Airport. Two men died in the incident that triggered Zeller's rescue effort, but her efforts were instrumental in the survival of two other men – Kyle Sellers and Erik Grams, who both live near the Twin Cities.

COs Mike Cross and Curtis

Simonson COs Mike Cross and Curtis Simonson were first on the scene of a serious single-vehicle accident with injuries that occurred March 18, 2024,in Koochiching County. The two removed the victim from the vehicle, which was extensively damaged, and began lifesaving efforts, as the victim was not breathing, had no pulse, and was unconscious.

An ambulance arrived and brought the victim to the hospital. While he died the next day, Cross and Simonson's efforts were instrumental in ensuring the man's family had an opportunity to see their loved one before he passed. CO Brice Vollbrecht and **Forestry officer Matt Boyer**

CO Brice Vollbrecht and Matt Boyer, a Forestry officer in training, were patrolling Blackduck Lake when Vollbrecht received a call from Minnesota State Patrol Dispatch about a water emergency on the lake. The pair located an overturned boat with four individuals clinging to it. The water was 60 degrees – and one was having trouble breathing. Vollbrecht and Boyer helped the individuals into Vollbrecht's boat, then transported them to an ambulance waiting on shore.



DNR fisheries plans for 152 lakes

DNR fisheries populations and regulations manager, spoke about a fisheries plan being developed for 152 Minnesota lakes. These lakes are in 40 counties around the state.

"Each of these lakes is being considered for new plans. Each has its own, individual plan. We want to open up the process for public input," Fisher explained in an interview.

The DNR wants to know what the public wants. They are especially interested in views from anglers, but any users -- swimmers, boaters,

etc. -- are invited to weigh in. "What do they want provided for fisheries? What are their concerns about habitat and water quality? We are looking for feedback on what the public wants. Although the anglers are central to what we are doing we want to hear from other people with strong opinions on aspects of given lakes."

He recommends logging onto the DNR website: https:// www.dnr.state.mn.us/fisheries/lake-management/index. html and providing comments on lakes throughout the month of March.

What are some trends he sees in fishing? "As far as fish specifies, we are seeing a shift. While walleye is still the most popular, as some of lakes' habitat shifts a little bit, with more bass and crappie and bluegill populations in some lakes we see more results fishing for pan fish."

Also on the website, readers might be interested in examining the Lakefinder page to get lake-specific information to all previous lake surveys, water access sites, lake health and water quality, lake maps and fish population data from the latest surveys.

Crow Wing: Adney, Black Bear, Kego, Patridge, Turtle,

Cass: Baby, Hay, Inguadona, Little Bass, Morrison, Pillager, Sugar



"General Industrial District" of the City of Cuyuna Zoning Ordinance by including definitions related to cannabis businesses and establishing which districts allow cannabis businesses as conditional or permitted uses.

Ordinance Amendment 03-2025 to amend "Appendix A," "Fee Schedule" of the City of Cuyuna Zoning Ordinance No. 903 to include registration fees for cannabis retail businesses and temporary cannabis events and to include an application fee for the long-term placement of recreational vehicles.



Brainerd Washington Street project

The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) is inviting the community to an informational session on the upcoming Washington Street/Highway 210 roadwork project, scheduled for 2026–2027. The project will span from Pine Shores Road to Baxter Drive in Crow Wing

MnDOT is hosting two open-house-style meetings on Tuesday, March 25, to discuss plans and answer questions. The meetings will be held at the Crow Wing County Land Services Building, 322 Laurel St., Brainerd. Residents can attend one of two sessions: from Noon to 2 p.m. or from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. The MnDOT project team will have informational boards and tentative detour plans to view and will answer questions about local impacts and overall work plans for the two-year roadwork project.

The \$51.3 million project will reconstruct and improve Highway 210 (Washington Street) in both directions. The plan includes replacing and resurfacing road segments, upgrading city utilities beneath the road, including watermain, and improving pedestrian access. Two roundabouts will be added at Highway 210, Highway 25, and County Road 3. The

project will also update the Mississippi River bridge and enhance pedestrian connections, including the Cuyuna Lakes Trail.

During construction, local access will remain open, but detours will be in place for through traffic. The project will be completed in phases over two years, with work beginning in 2026 and expected to conclude in 2028.

Yellow perch adjustment on Mille Lacs

As of March 11, the daily and possession limit for yellow perch on Mille Lacs Lake will be reduced from 20 to five. This regulation will be in place through Nov. 30.

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources is implementing this adjustment to the daily and possession limit to help maintain a good perch population for the future. Yellow perch are a key species in the Mille Lacs Lake ecosystem and young yellow perch are a primary food source for predators (especially walleye). Maintaining an abundance of older perch will result in more young being produced this spring and preserve harvest opportunities for next year.

"We are pleased that the perch fishing on Mille Lacs this winter has been good for many anglers," said Brad Parsons, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources fisheries section manager. "With annual perch harvest never more than 7,000 pounds since 2012, this year's rebound is a positive sign for the health of the lake."

State-licensed anglers

share the perch harvest on Mille Lacs with Ojibwe Tribes that retain fishing rights by treaty. To conserve the fishery, an annual safe harvest level is cooperatively established by the state and the Tribes through a government-to-government, co-management process. Each party then sets fishing regulations to stay within their share of the harvest. As of Feb. 23, the state has harvested more than 43,000 pounds of perch, exceeding its share of the harvest of 36,500 pounds.
