THE EVER EXPANDING TEXAS TECH



Tumbleweed Smith

Forty thousand students are on the Texas Tech campus in Lubbock and attend classes in buildings with the Spanish Renaissance style of architecture. Another 20,000 students are on affiliated campuses around the state. "We continue to get bigger, but we still feel small," says Curt Langford, Alumni Director. "Tech, I think, is the second or third largest in the Big 12 but you wouldn't feel it.

Tumbleweed Smith There's a very intimate feel here."

"Governor Pat Neff signed Texas Tech into legislation on February 10th, 1923. We are the only school in the Big 12 that was founded in the 1900s." Tech graduates now number around 300,000. "We're graduating more every semester than we used to in the earlier years of the university so we're growing fast."

Pat Green, John Denver and Patrick Mahomes attended Tech. "When John Denver was here, he played in the student union building. Once an administrator told him to put away his guitar and get to studying, that he shouldn't plan on any future playing guitar. Patrick Mahomes is one of our most visible alum now. Everybody is proud of him for bringing life back to the Kansas City Chiefs and winning a couple of Super Bowl games. The first Super Bowl game with Patrick as quarterback, was fifty years after another Tech football player, E.J. Holub played for the Chiefs in another Super Bowl game."

Tech has a School of Medicine, a Llaw School and a new Veterinary School. "A lot of people said it would bever happen, but the administration met the challenge. It was long overdue. There are too many students who were having to go out of state to go to vet school. It was just in the best interest in the state of Texas for this to take place. That's another element of the Texas Tech university system that continues to grow. This year we'll have our second class of graduates in the vet school."

Curt has probably been on more college campuses than anyone else. For 18 years he sold class rings to graduating seniors. When the position of alumni director opened up, he made application and was accepted. He says he put all his rings in one basket. He was glad to be home. His father was a professor at Texas Tech.

Curt has archived 10,000 oral histories of Tech graduates about their memories at the school.

He attends Tech alumni events all over the country. One is in Ruidoso the third week in June. It's called the Red Raiders at the R88aces in Ruidoso. There's a new alumni chapter there and we're attempting to raise money for scholarships. There's a golf tournament associated with it, a big reception at a winery, then of course the races. The Matador, our Masked Rider, the modern day version of our mascot, rides rapidly around the track and that's a big thrill for Tech fans."





Extreme Weather Occuring In The United States!

From March 13 to 16, 2025, a historic tornado outbreak affected much of the Midwestern into the Eastern United States, with additional severe weather and impacts occurring on the East Coast as well. These tornadoes hit parts of U.S. as severe storms kill at least 42, unleashing winds and fanning wildfires Violent tornadoes ripped through parts of the U.S., wiping out schools and toppling semitractor-trailers,

part of a monster storm that has killed at least 42 people across six states.

The deaths came as a massive storm system moving across the country unleashed winds that triggered deadly dust storms and fanned more than 100 wildfires. Forecasters assigned an unusual "high risk" designation to the system, which was also blamed for icy winter weather in northern parts of the country and severe thunderstorms, including on the West Coast, on Sunday.

In all, extreme weather conditions were forecast to affect an area home to more than 100 million people. Winds gusting up to 80 mph were predicted from the Canadian border to Texas, threatening blizzard conditions in colder northern areas and wildfire risk in warmer, drier places to the south.

Heavy thunderstorms in the forecast for Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida, prompted schedule changes for the 2025 Players Championship, CBS Sports reported. The tournament moved up tee times Sunday and grouped golfers together to ensure the last 18 holes would be completed before the evening.

Impacts and aftermath

The "Wearin' of the Green" parade in Baton Rouge, Louisiana was postponed by one day due to the expected severe weather. Due to high non-thunderstorm winds, over 400 flights were cancelled at Dallas Fort Worth International Airport. Around 20% of flights at Lubbock Preston Smith International Airport were also canceled.

In Rolla, Missouri, significant damage occurred to eight businesses at a strip mall. Strong storms caused a roof collapse at a business in Canton, Illinois. Numerous signs were knocked over in Hanna City, Illinois. Heavy tree damage occurred in Elgin, Illinois, and four tornadoes were confirmed across the Chicago Metropolitan Area on the overnight of the 14–15, with over 500,000 Commonwealth Edison customers losing power. 99% of these outages were resolved by 7:30 p.m. on the 15th.

In Mississippi, widespread tornado damage occurred, with Governor of Mississippi Tate Reeves stating that "Grenada County was the hardest hit", with major damage occurring in Elliott and Gore Springs.

On March 17, days after the outbreak, ABC reported that the office of the Storm Prediction Center in Norman, Oklahoma, which had provided forecasts throughout the outbreak, was listed as a property to be terminated by the Department of Government Efficiency, an executive branch entity headed by Elon Musk. Tom Cole, the Republican representative for Oklahoma's 4th congressional district, stated that he had intervened in the matter and the office would not be closed; despite this, the office still appeared on the list of properties facing lease termination.

Tornado Alley

Tornado Alley, also known as Tornado Valley, is a loosely defined location of the central United States and, in the 21st century, Canada where tornadoes are most frequent. The term was first used in 1952 as the title of a research project to study severe weather in areas of Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Kansas, South Dakota, Iowa and Nebraska. Tornado climatologists distinguish peaks in activity in certain areas[2] and storm chasers have long recognized the Great Plains tornado belt.

As a colloquial term there are no definitively set boundaries for Tornado Alley, but the area common to most definitions extends from Texas, through Oklahoma, Kansas, Nebraska, South Dakota, Iowa, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Missouri, Arkansas, North Dakota, Montana, Ohio, and eastern portions of Colorado, New Mexico and Wyoming. Research suggests that the main alley may be shifting eastward away from the Great Plains, and that tornadoes are also becoming more frequent in the northern and eastern parts of Tornado Alley where it reaches the Canadian Prairies, Ohio, Michigan, and Southern Ontario.

According to the National Severe Storms Laboratory (NSSL) FAQ, "Tornado Alley" is a term used by the media as a reference to areas that have higher numbers of tornadoes. A study of 1921–1995 tornadoes concluded almost one-fourth of all significant tornadoes occur in this area.

Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Indiana, Michigan, and western Ohio are sometimes included in Tornado Alley. Some research suggests that tornadoes are becoming more frequent in the northern parts of Tornado Alley where it reaches the Canadian Prairies.

No place on earth is entirely free of tornadoes, however, they occur much more frequently in the United States, particularly in the Central states, between the Rocky Mountains to the west and Appalachian Mountains to the east. Texas has the most overall number of tornadoes of any state. Per data collected through 2007, Kansas and Oklahoma ranked first and second respectively in the number of tornadoes per area. However, in 2013 statistics from the National Climatic Data Center reported Florida ranked first in tornadoes per area, although Florida is not a part of Tornado Alley. Florida's high ranking on the tornado list also has to do with the fact that the state sees a high number of waterspouts, small tornadoes that form over water. Although strong land-tornadoes have hit Florida and reports show Florida has a very high number of overall tornadoes, the tornadoes in the state seldom reach the velocity of those that may occur in the Southern Plains. In the United States, tornadoes typically occur in late spring and early summer during the changing season patterns as a warm air mass typically collides with a cold air mass resulting in tornadoes.
