



New Parental Leave Act

MONTGOMERY -Surrounded by working parents, teachers, and public servants from across the state, Governor **Kay Ivey** last week signed SB199 into law, the Alabama Public Employee Paid Parental Leave Act of 2025, officially delivering on a key promise she made in her state of the state address.

"In Alabama, we are committed to strengthening families and supporting those who serve our state," Ivey, said. "No parent should have to choose between their paycheck and spending time with their newly welcomed child. Today, Alabama sends a clear message: We value families, and we value our workforce.'

The bill was sponsored by State Senator Vivian Figures (D-Mobile) and Representative **Ginny** Shaver (R-Leesburg). The law will provide paid parental leave for eligible public employees, including teachers and state workers.

• Female employees will receive eight weeks of paid parental leave in connection with the birth, stillbirth, or miscarriage of her child.

 Male employees will receive two weeks of paid parental leave in those same circumstances.

 Adoptive parents of a child aged three or younger will also be eligible for parental leave – eight weeks for one parent and two weeks for the other at the choice of the parents, if both are eligible employees.

This law also includes a return-to-work provision, requiring employees to return for at least eight weeks after taking leave, with exceptions in certain circumstances, including serious health conditions.





I'm 26, so I haven't had time to accumulate a lot of money yet through my career. I do have a good, fulltime job, though, and have started saving money. Do I need a will or trust when I'm so young and have so little in terms of assets? Alisha

Dear Alisha,

I love the fact that you're already thinking about things like this. You're a wise young lady.

Considering that you're young and just starting out, you don't need anything complicated in place. Trusts tend to geared toward people with complex estates, so it doesn't sound like that's something you need to worry about. But you do need a simple, inexpensive will.

They're already going to be grieving and distraught if something happens to you. You don't want to make things harder by leaving a lot of important difficult decisions and for them to make in the middle of it all.

Medicare Minute

"The Inflation Reduction Act"

The Inflation Reduction Act went into effect October 1, 2024. This act has several components such as environmental and energy regulations. But today we want to focus on how the Inflation Reduction Act affects Medicare beneficiaries.

In 2025, the Inflation Reduction Act established a cap of \$2,000 on the out-of-pocket expenditures a Medicare beneficiary can have on prescription drugs. The cap is determined by the amount paid by the Medicare beneficiary for their drugs, in addition to a percentage of the plans expenditures on those drugs. In other words, a person could reach the \$2,000 cap without actually spending \$2,000 out of their pocket. Premiums for the prescription drug plan do not count toward the cap. Only co-pays and co-insurance a person pays for their prescriptions.

The second change the Inflation Reduction Act made on prescription drugs is the elimination of the "Donut Hole" or "Coverage Gap". In 2024 a Medicare beneficiary taking a brand name drug, such as Eliquis, could reach a point in the year where their drug cost would go up dramatically. The elimination of the "Donut Hole" will stop this spike.

These changes will apply to people who are on stand-alone drug plans or Medicare Advantage plans with prescription drug coverage. We have already seen where the changes because of the Inflation Reduction Act have made a huge difference in the cost of prescription drugs for our Medicare beneficiaries.

However, there have been some adverse effects that have resulted because of the changes. Because insurance companies are now required to take on more of the burden of prescription drug costs once the person reaches their \$2,000 cap, we have seen either premiums for plans have increased, or benefits have decreased. But all in all, the changes have been positive.

It's a Rigged Game Part 2

Last week, I spoke ill of insurance defense lawyers and was wrong to do so. Let me tell you why. Insurance defense lawyers are typically very good lawyers, good parents, likable, and honest. They are involved in schools, churches, and community affairs. Most defense lawyers are people you can really trust, and if they say a case is settled, it's settled.

The problem is that they constantly work towards making

sure that the insurance company pays as little as possible to people injured through no fault of their own.

They almost always ask a doctor if the doctor can say for sure that the MRI that shows a problem after the accident can be trusted without an MRI to compare it to from before the accident. WHO HAS AN MRI BEFORE AN ACCIDENT? These tests cost thousands of dollars, and no one goes to get one "in case they have an accident."

They ask the injured person to tell them all of their injuries from head to toe. "Let's just start with your head... and list them all the way down to your toes". After they go over this question two or three times, they ask this question. Did you tell the doctor about these injuries? People always say they did. The defense lawyer then looks at the medical records to find something left out and asks the doctor if the injured person had told them about that injury that was left out. Doctors typically say it's my practice to chart things my patients tell me.

The defense lawyer then confirms to the doctor that the doctor has to rely on the truthfulness of his patients to form his opinions. At trial, when the plaintiff is confronted with the fact that the doctor didn't write down some of the problems he told the doctor about, the plaintiff looks like a liar. The defense lawyer will not call them a liar but will suggest that perhaps they are just prone to "making mistakes."

These happen in every case one way or the other. Be prepared.



Recently I've received questions about private messaging and messaging systems, specifically Signal. So I thought maybe I could address some folks' concerns in a clear, easy to understand way. is designed with a focus on user privacy, particularly concerning the management of group conversations. Addressing concerns about unsolicited

additions to group chats and the potential exposure of private communications, are important issues, Signal implements several platforms.

Signal Enhances **User Control**

features to enhance user control.

Firstly, Signal ensures that users cannot be added to group chats without their **explicit consent.** Upon receiving an invitation to join a group, a clear notification is presented to the user, affording them the decision to either accept or decline the invitation. This mechanism prevents being involuntarily added to group discussions, something that regularly happens on other

Furthermore, Signal restricts the ability to invite people to groups to folks the user has already established a connection with, such as saved contacts. Unlike other apps that may allow strangers to add random users to groups. Signal does not maintain a public directory of users, this eliminates the chance of unwanted invites from random

Signal immediately notifies all members of the group that a person has joined the group, it also notifies all the participants when a user has disconnected from the chat. This feature is useful in following what information a participant has access to and what they might have missed.

While Signal offers robust privacy features for everyday communication, it is important to acknowledge its limitations in highly sensitive contexts. For instance, the application is not compliant with HIPAA regulations and is therefore unsuitable for the transmission of protected health information. Similarly, for matters of national security, specialized and heavily monitored tools are employed, exceeding the intended scope of Signal's design. Signal's security measures are best characterized as a **strong** safeguard for typical private

communications, rather than a solution for extremely high-risk scenarios.

To wrap up, Signal provides a valuable tool for maintaining privacy in digital group conversations by empowering users with control over group membership and facilitating discreet exits. This design prioritizes user consent and aims to prevent the accidental or unwanted exposure of communications in routine interactions.

Don't be afraid to ask questions when you don't understand as always, stay skeptical my friends!

Spring weather reminders

You can't stop spring showers, but you can prepare for spring storms, severe winds and more.

Spring doesn't just mean fresh flowers and pastels; it could also mean rapidly changing weather and, at times, severe storms. Help get your home and family ready with these tips.

Let it flow. Remove debris from your gutters, drains and downspouts so that heavy rains can flow freely off your roof. Check that downspouts are secure and that water is draining well away from your homeand not toward your foundation. Add extensions if

Have your roof inspected. Especially after winter weather, inspecting your roof can be an opportunity to catch any damage or weakening to the roof before it causes further damage. Consider having a professional inspect the roof to prevent possible roofing surface damage, and also prevent putting yourself in harm's way.

Trim the trees. Safely prune lanky limbs and branches to help minimize potential debris that could land on your home or a power line.

Tidy up. It's called "spring cleaning" for a reason! In the event of a weather emergency, being able to easily navigate your home and access supplies — including knowing where you put them — is important. Keeping a clean home may help for just that reason, plus, it offers a chance to create a home inventory. Check out these tips for spring cleaningto help make it an easier task.

Surge protection. Part of storm preparedness means planning

for lightning. If you have a grounding system for your home, inspect accessible components like the lightning rod and grounding wire for damage or obstruction. If you do not, consider having a lightning protection system installed. Indoors, check that surge protectors on outlets are set up and functioning, especially for outlets providing power to expensive electronics.

Check the sump pump and grinder station (if your home has one **or both).** Test them to see if they are clean and operable, confirming that the outflow is draining properly. Consider adding a battery-powered backup sump pump to help keep the system working if the power goes out. Additionally, an automatic standby generator could further secure your home's capability to provide power to a sump pump and other electrical systems during power outages.

Stow your gear. When strong winds are forecast, secure patio furniture and other yard items or put them in your garage or a shed so they don't become dangerous projectiles.

Cover up. Close and secure storm shutters if your home has them. Keep blinds and shades drawn and tape or tack window coverings around the edges to help protect you from broken, flying glass. Consider securing thick blankets over vehicles that are exposed to the elements to diminish damage from hail.

Have a plan. Create a storm plan that fits the needs of you and

your family, confirming that each member of the household knows all elements of the plan, such as communication procedures or evacuation strategies.

Emergency supplies

If power outages are common in your area, consider having an emergency kit prepared for household members and pets. Familiarize yourself with the use and application of all the contents of your kit and keep it in an accessible and central location in your home. Suggested emergency supplies include:

- Flashlight and fresh batteries
- Battery or solar-powered weather radio and/or transistor radio First-Aid kit
- Hand sanitizer and/or wipes
- Three days' worth of non-perishable food (typically canned or dried food) and water

The Federal Émergency Management Agency (FEMA) offers lists of emergency supplies. FEMA also has additional preparedness tips for severe weather on its site. Once the storm has passed, if there is any damage, contact your State Farm® agent as soon as possible to get a claim started.



then be out some money or property, but that doesn't mean another person or company is automatically at fault and should have to compensate us.

Getting into a car wreck, dealing with avoidable medical missteps, or losing property because of a faulty appliance or a manufacturing defect can be tragic and lifealtering. If the situation could have been avoided, and quality of life issues have surfaced, then we absolutely should be able to seek legal avenues.

Thomas McCutcheon an experienced and well-respected local attorney and his "Ask the Attorney" column has been a weekly feature in the Courier Journal for decades. If one of us has a legitimate concern, he will happy to discuss the situation.

However, donning a back brace in public Monday-Friday with a cane when we can use a tiller and clean gutters from a ladder on weekends is dishonest and disingenuous. Just like trying to outnavigate those 90 days of credit card interest, trying to enrich ourselves with something that is not rightfully ours reverts to a greedy nature that tempts most of us to one degree or another. Something as simple as making sure we get the last couple of pieces of candy in the bowl can qualify.

Close to three decades ago, a spring-loaded door on a Courier Journal newspaper rack in front of a former office location apparently caused the rack to slide off its brick hase. A young lady claimed her arm and shoulder were injured when she opened it and had to "catch" the rack's two-inch fall.

From what I recall. she was seeking reimbursement for medical expenses and additional some compensation for pain, suffering, and restricted mobility.

Thankfully, attorney and some video evidence demonstrated that her injury didn't seem to interfere with her enjoyment of waterskiing.

FLORENCE BETHEL CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN AMERICA

The "Mother Church" of the Presbytery, Florence Cumberland Colored Presbyterian Church originated in 1898 on property deeded by the city. Led, in 1918, by Rev. Holt Smith, it bought property on Alabama Street and built a frame structure. In 1948, Rev. Earl McDonald led in the construction of the annex named for him and the Jerome Robinson Education building. In 1997, the name became Florence Bethel Cumberland Presbyterian became Florence Bethel Cumberland Presbyterian Church in America. The church continually proclaims the compassion of Christ throughout the world.

Location 34.8002°N, 87.6703°W 408 E. Alabama St. Florence, AL

This church was part of an important African-American area of an earlier Florence. Much of this neighborhood was displaced in the "urban renewal" of the 1960s and 1970s. This church is testament to the vitality of this section of Florence known as "East End".






