Spencer, Iowa — The Clay County Fair Charitable Trust will host the 4th Annual Farm to Fork FUNdraiser on Saturday, May 3, at the Clay County Regional Events Center. The event will bring together community members for an evening of fine food, live music, inspiring stories, and impactful giving, all supporting the Clay County Fair.

The evening will begin with a social hour at 5:00 p.m., followed by dinner at 6:00 p.m. Dessert will be served at 7:00 p.m., and the live auction will begin at 7:15 p.m.

The event's highlight is a four-course meal prepared by the Events Center's own Chef Eric, using ingredients sourced from local producers. The menu includes local tomato bruschetta, spinach bibb salad, aged center cut filet mignon, and fondue. Guests with dietary restrictions are encouraged to call the Fair Office at (712) 580-3000 in advance.

In addition to the meal, attendees will hear from local youth involved in agriculture programs. These students will share their experiences of volunteering their time through these programs to assist with improvements to the fairgrounds' facilities. They will highlight the importance of agricultural education in shaping both their future and the future of the Clay County Fair.







On Tuesday, April 29th, 2025, Northwest Iowa Habitat for Humanity will host a Youth Rain Garden Project in collaboration with the Spirit Lake Middle School 5th/6th Grade Builders Club. The project will kick off the construction of a 100-year flood-resistant rain garden in downtown Spirit Lake. This vital project is designed to protect two newly built Habitat homes housing two families and five children — and the surrounding

neighborhood of future builds from future flood risks, while also restoring critical natural habitat.

The rain garden was developed through a partnership with Drew Howing, Assistant Professor and Environmental Studies Program Coordinator at Iowa Lakes Community College; Clint Haines of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS); and Eckard Landscaping. One of Professor Howing's students, under his supervision, designed the project according to NRCS specifications, ensuring long-term environmental sustainability and effective stormwater management. The rain garden will help absorb and filter rainwater runoff, serving as a natural flood defense while supporting native plants and pollinators in the heart of Spirit Lake.

The event will continue with a Public Volunteer Planting Day on Saturday, May 31st. Volunteers of all ages are invited to join Northwest Iowa Habitat for Humanity and help plant the final wave of native species. This event will offer a fun, educational opportunity to enhance flood resilience while beautifying the community with natural, sustainable landscaping.














Leanna Crawford In Concert At First Lutheran July 13th, 2025







What does it mean or what does it entail, when a newly elected officer or newly appointed board member takes the oath of office? It is more than a raised hand and reciting the words after me.

When lawmakers give special tax breaks to their friends and favorite industries, they shift the burden onto everybody left in the tax base". Warren Buffet was also quoted "We get tax credits if we build wind farms. The only reason to build them. They don't make sense without the tax credits."





Monumental Masters Moment for McIlroy

In what he termed the "best day of my golfing life" Rory McIlroy won his first-ever Masters Golf Tournament in dra-

matic fashion on Sunday evening; defeating Justin Rose, who was also after his elusive first Masters title, in the first hole of a



sudden-death playoff after each golfer finished 72 holes at -11. Rose started the day seven strokes back from McIlroy but shot an impressive 66 on Sunday to put himself in contention for the green jacket. This was McIlroy's first major victory in 11 years, and also gives him the impressive Career Grand Slam of Golf, which is championships in the four majors, the US Open, The Open, the PGA Championship and the Masters, joining legends Ben Hogan, Gary Player, Jack Nicklaus, Gene Sarazan and Tiger Woods as just the sixth golfer to achieve the Career Grand Slam.

The green jacket that has eluded McIlroy during his 17-year professional golfing career was not easily earned, as it rarely is. McIlroy started the day with a 2-shot lead over Bryson DeChambeau but quickly gave that lead up with a double bogey on the first hole. McIlroy appeared to take control of the tournament with a four-shot lead with just eight holes remaining. McIlroy then double bogeyed hole #13 after hitting the ball into Rae's Creek and followed that with a bogey on #14 that brought Rose and Louis Aberg back into the title hunt. The roller coaster ride would continue, after a tremendous shot on #15 that put him in position for an eagle, he would miss the putt but did make a birdie and appeared in control of the tournament again, especially after a birdie on #17 that gave him a two-shot lead over Rose. Rose then drained a long putt on #18 to trim that lead to one. All McIlroy needed was a par on #18 to claim his first green jacket, and he appeared in great shape after a monster drive, but Rory pushed a wedge to the right into the front bunker. After a nice bunker shot put him within six feet of the championship, McIlroy pulled the putt and had to settle for a bogey and playoff with Rose. When asked how he composed himself after the bogey, McIlroy gave all the credit to his childhood friend and caddie Harry Diamond, who reminded Rory as they headed back to the 18th tee for the playoff hole that he would have loved to have been given this opportunity at the start of the tournament. The playoff hole was filled with the typical drama of a Sunday at Augusta National, with both Rose and McIlroy hitting bombs off the tee box; Rose would hit to the green first and put a wedge within 12-feet of the pin; McIlroy had a very similar shot from the fairway that he had just hit on #18 but this time he hit a shot of a lifetime, putting that same wedge that had failed him 15 minutes ago within 5 feet of the pin. Rose just missed his birdie putt to the right and had to settle for par, setting the stage for McIlroy, who calmly made his birdie putt and immediately dropped to his knees.


When asked about that moment, McIlroy said at first it was relief and then celebratory as he hugged Diamond and then Rose and his caddie. McIlroy couldn't hold back his emotions as he hugged his family and friends and broke into tears. Those tears continued to flow as McIlroy made his way to the clubhouse through thousands of fans who chanted "Rory, Rory, Rory!" Moments like these are what make sports so great and transcending. McIlroy has been through many ups and downs in his career, and has been the voice of the PGA in their battle vs LIV Golf, not shying away from taking a stance about what he believes in while turning down millions of guaranteed dollars to stay with the PGA. Rory's final round was much like his roller coaster of a career, more ups than downs, but the downs are what normally stays with you the most. Those downs didn't stay with McIlroy on this historic day, as he found a way to stay mentally strong enough to get back up after being down with his two double bogeys and bogey on 18, climbing his way to the top with a memorable finish that he and many golfers will never forget.

David vs. Goliath: When Big Wind Blows to Town

As a local, small business owner and rural Dickinson County resident, my family and I have come to embrace country living. The peace, tranquility, and view-scape the countryside provides has been instrumental in helping our wedding business flourish. So once I found out about a potential industrial wind complex that would surround our acreage, I felt it was imperative to advocate for my neighbors, my business, and my family. Having spent countless hours researching and encouraging our county to update our outdated wind ordinance from 2009, another rural resident and myself were asked to represent the other rural residents and be part of a wind subcommittee formed by Dickinson County Planning and Zoning.

While on that subcommittee, we made reasonable requests based on recommendations from conversations we had with county officials across the state, real-life experiences of those living around turbines, and those backed by science. Of all the topics, setbacks, shadow flicker, and noise level were the most discussed. Below, I have included our requests and the reasoning for our requests, followed by a graph comparing our requests, the wind company's request, and the county's final approval.

Setbacks:

- Why property lines?

o The wind industry is one of few industries that can use the exterior of a landowners home for siting purposes. We felt it was important for every homeowner to safely enjoy their entire property, not just a portion of it. When building a home in city limits, the builder sites their build from the property line, NOT the exterior of the neighbor's house. Why should this be any different in the country?

Why 2,640'?

o The Nordex safety manual instructs their employees to move 1 km (3,280') away from a turbine during lightning strikes and inclement weather. We felt 2,640' was a compromise from the previous ordinance of 1,200' and the 1 km (3,280') safety requirement from the wind company's safety manual. If 3,280' is a safe distance away for a wind companies employee, is 1,600' really safe for county residents?

Why 1.1x turbine height from property lines?

o 1.1x turbine height would ensure that if a turbine were to tip over, no part of the turbine would fall on a non-participating landowner's property. As the current ordinance is written, if a turbine were to tip over, a significant portion of the turbine would fall on the adjacent property.

Shadow Flicker: No shadow flicker for non-participating landowners

o Shadow flicker may cause annoyance and can be concerning for people who suffer from photosensitive epilepsy and experience seizures. If non-participating land owners currently don't have to worry about shadow flicker, why should we ever have to worry about it?

Noise level:

35 dBA at night and 40 dBA during the day

o These levels are recommended by the World Health Organization. Turbine-induced symptoms are sleep deprivation, headache, ringing in the ears, heart palpitations, anxiety, depression, and daytime sleepiness

As you can see, the voice of the rural residents went unheard. Why would county officials choose not to listen to the people they were elected by, but rather a multinational wind company? Because they were afraid of being sued.

Although our ordinance was recently updated, it is still severely inadequate in terms of setbacks, shadow flicker, and noise. Since 2020, nearly 25% of Iowa counties have updated or are in the midst of updating their wind ordinances to reflect more modern standards. In those 4 ½ years, there have been 14 counties who have updated their setbacks to an average of 2,946'. In that same time frame, another 9 counties have enacted moratoriums until they can update their wind ordinances.

If this concerns you, please attend the Board of Adjustment hearing on Invenergy's Application for a Conditional Use Permit at the Dickinson County Courthouse on 4/28-4/30 starting at 6pm. If you cannot attend, please write an email addressed to the Dickinson County Board of Adjustment to mkardell@dickinsoncountyiowa.gov asking to deny the RedRock Wind Project until Dickinson County can update their ordinance to reflect more modern standards not dictated by the wind industry.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO SPECIAL PROPERTY TAXATION FOR WIND ENERGY CONVERSION PROPERTY

ORDINANCE NO

Be It Enacted by Board of Supervisors for Dickinson County, Iowa:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Ordinance is to PROVIDE SPECIAL PROPERTY TAXATION IN LIEU OF THE VALUATION AND ASSESSMENT PROVISIONS IN SECTION 441.21 (9) (B) & (C), AND SECTIONS 428.24 TO 428.29, FOR WIND ENERGY CONVERSION PROPERTY WHICH IS FIRST ASSESSED FOR PROPERTY TAXATION ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 1995, AND ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDINANCE SHALL BE VALUED BY THE LOCAL ASSESSOR FOR PROPERTY TAX PURPOSES AS FOLLOWS:

- A. FOR THE FIRST ASSESSMENT YEAR, AT ZERO PERCENT OF THE NET ACQUISITION COST.
- B. FOR THE SECOND THROUGH SIXTH ASSESSMENT YEARS, AT A PERCENT OF THE NET ACQUISITION COST WHICH RATE INCREASES BY FIVE PERCENTAGE POINTS EACH ASSESSMENT YEAR.
- C. FOR THE SEVENTH AND SUCCEEDING ASSESSMENT YEARS, AT THIRTY PERCENT OF THE NET ACQUISITION COST.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. For use in this Ordinance, the following terms are defined.

1. "Net acquisition cost" means the acquired cost of the property including all foundations and installation cost less any excess cost adjustment.

2. "Wind energy conversion property" means the entire windplant including, but not limited to, a wind charge, windmill, wind turbine, tower and electrical equipment, pad mount transformers, power lines, and substation.

SECTION 3. DECLARATION OF SPECIAL EVALUATION. Dear Tony, I struggle with learning anything new, especially with all the changes these days with artificial intelligence, technology devices, and applications. How can I have a better relationship with learning new things in my career and life?

Most of the time, learning something new brings anxiety and tension to our lives, and maybe even some self-doubt. The energy created in learning new things can turn negative and can even lead to avoidance if we don't handle it in a positive and constructive way.

The best way I have seen to do this is a process I learned a long time ago that brought me great peace as I was struggling to gain new skills in my career. It's a 4-step process that has immense power in alleviating stress and anxiety as you learn new skills.

Think about anything that you learned in the past few years. It may have been playing the guitar, using a video conferencing system, a new language, or anything new in your life. You most likely walked through each of the following 4 steps:

1. Unconscious Incompetence: You don't know what you don't know. Think of Donald Rumsfeld's "unknown unknowns". I think of my first 5 years of flyfishing as an example. It wasn't until I hired a guide that I was able to understand what I didn't know, and I didn't even know what questions to ask. Pro-Tip: Spend a moment to think about this and the next time you learn something new. Taking on a new job? Moving to a new city? Dealing with a substantial problem in your current role? Acknowledging that you don't even know what questions to ask is a great starting point.

2. Conscious Incompetence: This is usually where the anxiety sets in, and in my experience it's where the greatest threat to give in to frustration is realized. This is where you realize how bad you are (in the beginning) at something new. You are aware that you can't do something very well. It's easy to give up at this stage, but if you understand that it's normal and an expected part of the process, it becomes easier to accept and keep going.

3. Conscious Competence: This is where we start to meet with some initial success. It's still hard because we are focusing on the new skill, and it feels like a lot of work. For example, in perfect conditions I learned to cast a tiny fly across a river to a pod of rainbow trout, and a couple of times out of 10 or 20 casts it would land perfectly on the water where the trout would come up and eat the fly. This occasional success is a sign that you are doing something right. This stage is one about building confidence and momentum.

4. Unconscious competence. This is where you fall into a zone, and it all comes together without thinking. This is where I learned how to cast a fly to a trout, avoid the trees behind me, land the fly perfectly on the water, wait for the exact right moment to set the hook when the trout ate the fly, and carefully manage the currents and the fish to the net. All of this without thinking. Hours and hours go by and I'm doing things without thinking that I literally could not possibly do just a few years ago.

Take the time to acknowledge the important role of learning in your life, no matter where you are in your career and life. It's truly never too late to start. In fact, it can be energizing to realize that while you cannot rewrite the beginning of your life's story, you can write a new ending by changing how you think and learn right now, at this very moment. Take a step toward learning something new today and you will not regret it, and if you understand the 4-step process of learning, you will have less anxiety and stress.

Hopefully this 4-step process gives you confidence to learn new things with less anxiety. I know it has for me, and that is my hope for you.

The Milford West Okoboji Trail, featured in the 4-8-25 issue of the Lakes News Shopper, is planned to be installed and finished by July 20, 2025, for Ragbrai.

The trail will continue where it left off in 2006 at First Lutheran Church, heading east past Okoboji Classic Cars to the north side of Oak Hill Outdoor, then turning north to the cul-de-sac in West Okoboji. The Trail also goes south from Oak Hill Outdoor to connect with the sidewalk at the Highway 71 & 86 intersection at the Perkins corner.

This Milford West Okoboji Trail has been proposed to the Dickinson County Trails Board for 2 years. The Board has agreed to a bike trail from West O Beer to Jepson Road, by Heritage Landing, following a tree/fence line. The residents of West Okoboji on Okoboji Blvd. on Terrace Beach do not want bike traffic along West Lake Okoboji. The Milford West Okoboji project will help 80 percent of the Milford population on the west side of Highway 71 have access to the trails around West Lake Okoboji and Arnolds Park Amusement Park.

(Dickinson County does not need both east-west trails.) If the Dickinson County Trails Board and the City of West Okoboji were to abandon the West Okoboji Trail project, and award the same allotted money to the Milford West Okoboji Trail, Milford West Okoboji Trail will award the same allotted money to extend the bike trail connecting Milford to the Clay County line bike trail along Highway 71. Both trails are using Beck Engineering and Beck Excavating in their plans for the trails.

I have adopted a 2.5 mile section of Highway 86 from the Iowa Department of Transportation from Emerson Bay to Perkins for 24 years in the Adopt- A- Highway program. I have also adopted the section of bike trail from Emerson Beach to First Lutheran Church along Highway 86 for 19 years, since it was installed in 2006.

I will adopt the Milford West Okoboji Trail for trash cleanup if the trail is approved by the Dickinson County Trail Board. If the trail is not approved, all the highway and current trail continued trash cleanup will be in jeopardy.





Graphic Novels Face Lift

For our patrons who enjoy graphic novels, you will be excited to hear that we are expanding our collection! We have had a Juvenile Fiction Graphic Novel section for quite some time. Those are found near the on-line catalog in the library. Recently, we gathered together the adult and young adult graphic novels and now have them displayed at the end of the Young Adult section.

Graphic novels use sequential art to tell a story. These stories are usually stand-alone books. Graphic novels have more complex plots than comic books, and read left to right in the $traditional \, English \, reading \, pattern. \, However, we \, have \, \overline{more} \, than \,$ just graphic novels at the Spirit Lake Public Library!

Manga is another comic type of graphic novel, but it is different. Manga actually means "comic" in Japanese. This type of book is read from back to front, top to bottom and right to left, which is the traditional Japanese reading pattern. Manga is almost always published in a monochrome format, but with brightly colored covers.

The third type of comic that we are adding to our collection is called manhwa, which is Korean for "comics" or "cartoons." These are characterized by detailed linework, vibrant colors, and a left to right reading pattern. When published online as episodic digital comics, they are called Webtoons.

Come in and check out our graphic novel collections. They are fun and maybe you will discover something new that you like to read!




