cured 3,404 votes, or 46.77% of the total in a crowded field of eight Republican candidates. Her nearest rival, John A. Howe, received 1,127 votes, or 15.49%, while Jennifer Carnahan garnered 812 votes, or 11.16%. Other candidates in the primary included Josh Gazelka (679 votes), Steve Cotariu (458 votes), Angel Zierden (407 votes), Doug Kern (363 votes), and Matthew Zinda (28 votes).
