



each of them making under \$81,000 playing basketball in the WNBA this coming season.

The league probably generated ten times that amount within 24 hours of Bueckers #5 jersey becoming available and many times more than that with Clark's.

According to SportingNews.com, rookies who were the Nos. 1-4 draft picks in 2025 WNBA draft will be paid \$78,831 their first \$80,408 their season, \$88,449 their second, third, and \$100,510 their fourth. Rookies drafted at spots 5-8 are paid \$3,000-\$4,000 less in years 1-4.

Granted, most will have endorsement deals that increase their income significantly, but that's not the point.

In addition, the average WNBA salary is \$147,745 this year, up from about \$113,000 in 2023.

I understand the WNBA league is much newer (founded in 1996) and doesn't generate revenue close the that of the NBA. I also don't begrudge the NBA players from getting all that team owners are willing to pay (even if the trajectory is unsustainable), but the payroll comparisons are still embarrassing. The highest paid WNBA player will make \$253,000 in the coming 2025 season. Conversely, there are five players in the NBA who make over \$50 million/year in salary alone, led by Steph Curry at \$55 million.

The WNBA salaries for each year are determined by the overall salary cap for the league. This year that is \$60 million, just a little over what Curry gets paid on his own.

As we pointed out in this space last year, the women's game has grown exponentially thanks to the attention generated by Clark and a few others. Bueckers is not going to hurt that excitement in the least.

The WNBA's collective bargaining agreement expires after the 2025 season, and a professional sports career is short. It is time for those ladies to get a lot more respect at the bank for their efforts on the court.

Big Truck Wrecks

Medicare Minute

"Medicare vs Medicaid" It seems like potential cuts to Medicaid are all over the news lately. People who confuse Medicare and Medicaid are

obviously concerned. This is easy to do because they both can be related to a person's health insurance. Although they

coordinate in many ways, they are two distinctive programs.

Medicare is a federal health insurance program. There are three ways to qualify for Medicare. The first way is to be 65 years of age or older. The second way is to have been on Social Security disability for at least 24 months. The third way to qualify for Medicare is be any age and have either end-stage renal disease or ALS. Medicare is not income based as far as qualifying. As long as you meet one of the three requirements above you will qualify for Medicare. Your income, however, can affect the amount you pay for your Part B premium. Medicaid is a state health insurance program. Medicaid is income and resource based, meaning you will qualify or not according to how much money you make and/or how much money you have saved. In 2025 if you made less than \$1,325 as an individual or \$1,783 as a couple you could qualify for Medicaid. Whereas Medicare has deductibles and coinsurance, Medicaid will take care of most of your healthcare cost. A person on Medicaid can also get a break on how much they pay on their prescription drugs. Medicare and Medicaid will coordinate in a couple of ways. In some counties in north Alabama there is a Medicare plan that will coordinate with Medicaid. To qualify for this plan you must be on Medicare and Medicaid. This is referred to as "dual eligible". Also, if you make more than the Medicaid limits but are under \$1,976 as an individual or \$2,664 as a couple you may qualify for "extra help". This would help you on your prescription drug cost. Strategies for Paying Off Credit Card Debt

Dear Savvy Senior,

My husband and I, who are retired, have accumulated about \$7,000 in credit card debt over the past few years and need some help paying it off. What can you tell us? Living Underwater

Dear Living,

I'm sorry to hear about your financial woes but know that you're not alone. Credit card debt has become a big problem in this country for millions of older Americans. According to a recent AARP report, 52 percent of adults ages 50 to 64 have credit card debt, along with 42 percent of those ages 65 to 74.

Rising costs of basic expenses like food, housing, utilities and health care are the main culprits. But now, new tariffs on products made in China and other foreign countries will make many goods more expensive, which could make this problem worse. Of older adults carrying a balance, nearly half owe \$5,000 or more, and nearly a third owe upwards of \$10,000.

While paying off credit card debt can feel overwhelming, it's doable with a solid plan and a bit of belt-tightening and persistence. Here are some strategies to help you tackle it: Create a Budget

Start by taking a close look at your income and expenses to see where you can free up money to put toward your

credit card debt. Also look for areas to reduce spending, such as dining out, entertainment or subscriptions. And see if you're eligible for any financial assistance programs (see BenefitsCheckUp.org) that can help boost your budget by paying for things like food, utilities, medicine and health care.

Call the Card Company While the average credit-card interest rate is more than 20 percent, some credit card companies may be willing to lower your interest rate or work out a payment plan, especially if

you're struggling. It doesn't hurt to ask. Pay More Than the Minimum

Credit card companies only require the minimum payment, but it's usually mostly interest. Try to pay more than the minimum every month to make a dent in the principal balance.

Choose a Repayment Strategy If you have more than one credit card, pick one and get serious about paying it off. Start with the card that carries the highest interest rate, or the one with the smallest balance.

If you focus on paying off the card with the highest interest rate first, you'll pay less interest over time, saving yourself a lot of money. Once the highest-interest card is paid off, move to the next highest, and so on.

Or you may want to start with the card with the smallest balance. Paying off smaller debts quickly can give you a sense of accomplishment and motivate you to keep going.

Consolidate Your Debt

If you have multiple high-interest cards, look into consolidating your debt with a low-interest personal loan from your bank or credit union. Or consider moving your debts to a balance transfer credit card with 0 percent interest for an introductory period, which is usually 15, 18 or 21 months. This will eliminate the amount of interest you're paying temporarily. But be careful! Once the introductory promotion ends, the card company will charge interest on any remaining balance.

Consider a Debt Management Plan

If you need more help, use a nonprofit credit counseling agency (see NFCC.org) to create a debt management plan for you. At no cost, a counselor will go over your income and debts and determine what's workable. The counselor will then negotiate with your lenders, to get a payment plan that will lower your interest and monthly payments and maybe forgive some debt.

If you accept their negotiated offer, you'll start making one monthly payment to the counseling service, which will in turn pay the issuers. You'll likely pay the agency a small fee and give up the cards included in the plan, but over time you'll be able to pay off your debt.


