When Eric and Kameron Swithin met in Houston, Texas, he was a business owner, and she had been working as a corporate attorney in oil and gas. Eric soon gave up his business to pursue consulting in big oil with his "eyes on the money," but would quickly find that corporate success

wasn't all he had hoped it would be.

"I was working in a skyscraper, chasing the American Dream," Eric said. "From the outside in, you know, it looked like we had everything you could ever want. Fancy house, fancy car, all the stuff, and yet, on the inside, I think we were

both really unhappy. We felt unfilled."

As he and his wife were both dealing with this feeling that they were lacking purpose in their lives, tragedy struck. Nearing Christmas of 2015, Kameron had gone to her mother's house to help prepare for the holidays, but when she got there, she found her mother unresponsive.

Kameron's mother had passed away from a stroke.

"That really rocked my world," she said. "Soon after that, we had a new baby, and over the next

year-and-a-half, God revealed to me that life is short. None of us ever know when we're going to die, and He revealed to me that God had more for me than working in corporate law."

As she was dealing with grief and searching for answers through her faith, her husband was fighting his own demons. Eric said he remembers turning a year older, and the day after his birthday, he hit his knees to pray.

"I was next to my bed, and I was weeping like a baby," he said. "I knew

this was not what I was meant for. I'm like, 'God, I realize now that I've been chasing money more than you.' I think because I grew up so poor, I saw money as security. I didn't want to have to go through what I went through as a kid, so I had made vows with myself that I was going to be really rich."

Moments after his prayer, Eric said he received a phone call from a stranger who initially called inquiring about his old business. Before the call ended, Eric said the stranger reminded him of other vows he'd made before finding success in the corporate world.

"She said, 'Would you please have a seat wherever you are,'" Eric recalled the conversation. "She said, 'I feel like I have a message from God. You made Him a promise many years ago that you would be a minister for him, and you went back on your promise.' I was like, OK, God, if this is from you, my wife gets home at 5 or 6. You have to convince her."

Together, the Swithins called the stranger back, and by the time Kameron

that question, which in philosophy is called the "problem of evil."

The Swithins believe they can prove the miraculous power of God through the eight stories they curated for their film.

Among those stories are people who experienced inexplicable healing from incurable disease; people who experienced radical transformations in their faith after experiencing a "profound vision" or "near-death experience" and people who had prayers answered in unexpected ways.

Eric said he and his wife both brought their past expertise to the project in selecting from dozens of worthwhile stories they felt compelled to share.

"Our goal was to ensure that if presented to a judge, each of these stories would stand up in a court of law. We asked ourselves, would these be perceived as true stories," Eric said, adding that he and Kameron both believe they would.

With the film's premiere coming up in May, the Swithins said they hope to challenge viewers who come to see the film regardless of their religion or stance on faith.

"This movie is for Christians who understand what is possible and a thought-provoking challenge for those who may be skeptical. Maybe they're struggling in their faith like I was for so many years," Eric said. "It's a really good film for saints, of course. I think it can recapture some childlike wonder. God is doing incredible things we can't even wrap our brains around."

"This film is also for seekers — people who are asking big questions who are looking, but they would like to see evidence."

hung up the phone, she was also convinced Eric needed to resign from his job and enroll in seminary school.

By the time they made the move to the Shoals about four years ago, Kameron had also left her career to pursue full-time ministry alongside her husband.

"I haven't looked back one time," she said. "I am

more fulfilled, and more content now than I have ever been in my entire life. Our purpose is to make God known, and to put His love on display for everyone to see."

The Swithins said that is their main goal for their upcoming film, "Show Me Your Glory," a documentary-drama that shares eight stories of people who have experienced a supernatural encounter in their suffering.

"Our heart is to show the world that their pain and suffering is not for nothing," Kameron added. "God loves them, and when they are suffering, He is with them."

Though the Swithins first produced their first film, "The Fatherless Epidemic," in 2023, Eric said their second film has been a long-time coming. Drawing from his time spent in service in Iraq, Eric said he's put much thought into the question of whether or not "God is still in the business of performing miracles."

"I've seen the destruction of war, and it's so ugly," Eric said. "Here I am, a man of faith, but I've seen these things and done these things. I just had a real crisis of faith, but when I got home from the war, I kind of buried it deep inside. I spent about 20 years, and now I'm getting my doctorate in apologetics. I just wanted answers, you know. That's really the genesis of the film is trying to answer

'Free' Healthcare is Not 'Free' at All

Editor,

"Free" So-Called Healthcare and "Free" Products for Review Cost Me Over \$15,000

Last year, due to not reporting extra estimated income, I had to repay \$900 in Obamacare. This year it is over \$4,000. I'm disabled and, while waiting for Medicare to kick in, chose the lowest tier of "healthcare" simply so I would have insurance in the case of something basically catastrophic – an accident or serious illness.

I've always thought that if my life was ruined in the process of saving

it, what would be the point? And I didn't want creditors taking what little I have or there being nothing left for my son when I'm gone. The coverage did nothing to save me money. There was no co-pay and my deductible was \$7,000. There was a "discount" with some bills per the "agreement" which is basically the most a provider can charge and be reimbursed. I've been between contracts before and uninsured and I am familiar with the self-pay charges that were often less than my out-of-pocket when I had group insurance so I know the "discounted charges" were actually more than what they would be if I had no coverage.

The "free" products were for Amazon Vine, an invitation only platform where I could select from

products that were sent free of charge with the expectation of writing a review. The "market value" of those products were reported to the IRS in the form of a 1099-NEC (non-employee compensation) which I file under "other income" as a hobby.

And this is how the \$15,000.00+ evolved:

- 1) I knew the "free" stuff would be taxable
- 2) Since it increased my "income" the full amount of my social security is now taxable
- 3) Since my income was increased, and I had no way to know how much ahead of time, I was above the threshold for the "premium tax credits" that I got through the worthless Obamacare for January



Medicare Minute

"Medicare Fraud"

As of October 2024, there were 64 million people enrolled in Medicare. A large majority of agents who assist Medicare beneficiaries are upstanding, ethical people. But Medicare is no different than any other industry. Where there is opportunity, there will be scam artists.

So, how are Medicare beneficiaries taken advantage of? Most scams happen over the phone. People who reach out to you by phone are known as telemarketers. Telemarketers are trained to get as much information out of you as they can, including your personal and Medicare information. They are also trained to talk fast and never take "no" for an answer. They may be offering walkers, wheelchairs, back braces, or Medicare Advantage Plans.

Here are some tips to help you avoid being scammed. First is never, never, NEVER give your Medicare or Social Security number out over the phone. If someone calls representing your insurance company, and they ask for your Medicare number, do not give it to them. If they are truly your insurance company, they will already have it.

The second thing to avoid is allowing anyone, except your doctor or other provider, to review your medical records or services. Third, never join a Medicare Advantage plan or Prescription Drug plan over the phone without checking with Medicare first. The commercials you see on television are designed to entice you to call an 800 number. Once you make that call the odds are you will be enrolled in a Medicare plan whether you wanted it or not.

The most important thing to remember is Medicare will never call you unless you have called Medicare and left a message. Also, Medicare will never visit you at your home. If you suspect someone has contacted you without your consent call 1-800-Medicare.

My Personal Example

Many of us can think of
situations in our lives that
can't be explained or when
we were more than lucky
to get through intact.

There were at least two
situations where I could
have died in separate
vehicular incidents a few
years apart, one in high
school and one in college.

One was a wreck where
the vehicle in which I was
a passenger was exceeding
90 mph on impact. The
other was a late-night
near wreck where I was
run off of Gunwaleford
Rd. Technically, no laws
of science or gravity
were broken in either.
However, my friends and
I were far more than lucky
in each instance.

Then there was the
time I was working as a
deckhand on the Tennessee
River one summer in the
late '70's when I would
have lost a leg if not for
something unexplainable.

Safety was drilled into
us as priority #1 on that
boat. The potential for
death and injury was
constant.

We were rearranging
barges in a port around
Chattanooga one warm
afternoon on a tow of
maybe 15-16 barges. I was
young, green, and stupidly
casual. While stretching
for the eye of a steel cable
with my left hand, I had
my right knee across one

of the barge's tow knees for
balance, not paying close
attention. (Tow knees are
short exactly vertical steel
columns on barges of that
day, two spread out on
each short side of the 195'
x 35' barges. The back side
of each tow knee tapered
in a triangular shape for
strength to keep each barge
precisely aligned when the
tow is secured and en route
to the next port.)

While toiling with it, I
suddenly felt pressure on
both sides of my knee and
jerked it back in panic.
What I saw is still surreal.
My knee had been pinned
by two tow knees when
another barge had slowly
drifted up to the barge I
was working on.

The tow knees met.
However, the one on the
other barge was bent back,

no longer at a vertical
90 degrees, and it just
allowed my knee to fit
snugly between the two.
Otherwise, my knee would
have been pinned, then
crushed instantly.

I had to sit down
and contemplate my
experience for about a
half-hour. I immediately
knew "lucky" was not the
right word. Neither was
"coincidence."

No one else on the deck
crew of that boat (one
a 12-year veteran) had
ever seen a tow knee bent
back like that. The boat
captain had been with
Igert Towing for 26 years.
Neither had he.

The laws of science were
not broken on that humid
July day, only several
laws of probability...
simultaneously.

How To Secure Your Smart Home Devices

Help keep your connected home protected with these security tips.

Today's homes feature a large number of devices connected to the internet — everything from kitchen appliances and smart thermostats to light bulbs and always-on security cameras. While there's convenience to being able to turn off forgotten lights, save energy by reducing usage when no one is home or monitor who comes and goes no matter what time of day, connected home devices can also create a security headache.

Cyber security protocols aren't nearly as strong for home devices as what you would find on a laptop or smartphone. And because they're connected to the Internet, these devices are a potential doorway into your laptop and smartphone if they're on the same network. Once there, cyber thieves have access to your identity, banking credentials, credit card numbers and other personal information. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) estimates that nine million Americans have their identity stolen each year.

What can help secure your smart home from a data breach?

- **Keep your smart devices to a minimum.** Take an inventory of the digital entry points into your home and consider consolidating. Only use those devices that you need.
- **Make sure your home network is secure.** Take some time and learn the different settings on your modem and router, the hub of your home network. There are multiple options for Wi-Fi encryption, each with their own benefits.
 1. WPA2 (Wi-Fi Protected Access II) is typically recommended.
 2. WPA and WEP are sometimes susceptible to brute-force type attacks.
- **Change all the default passwords.** Do this immediately, before you attach any computer or smart device to your home network. Make sure you are using a strong, unique password for each device.
- **Disable internet access to the router's admin screen.** Most home users do not need to change the modem or router's settings from outside the home.
- **Use a firewall.** Most routers at home act as a firewall by constantly monitoring traffic to block unexpected, unwanted or specifically malicious traffic. Even though the small computers inside your smart devices may not be capturing sensitive or personal information, they are an entry point so they should be behind a firewall.
- **Use the guest network option.** This allows guests to connect to your home network while not opening access to your personal devices. You can also use the guest network for connected home gadgets that you want separate from your personal network used for your computer, phone and printer. Most home routers have a guest network option. By connecting your home gadgets to that, a compromised refrigerator won't be the gateway for someone to move on to your banking.
- **Factor in multifactor authentication.** Don't rely on passwords alone to keep your devices safe. Check to see if your system offers two-factor authentication, which adds an extra security layer to the login process, such as a security key or a one-time code received by text. Even if a hacker is able to steal your password, it's much less likely that your phone can also be hacked.
- **Consider disabling Wi-Fi Protected Setup.** A rarely used feature designed to allow for easy device setup on a home network with a simple PIN, some implementations have serious security flaws.
- **Update regularly.** Just as you would update your computer or tablet, do the same for home devices. Vulnerabilities are found all the time in the software and firmware, and regular updates provide the necessary protection against them.
- **Use antivirus and antimalware software.** Make sure this is loaded on all your computers in your home and those guests might bring into your home.

ASK THE ATTORNEY

Common Problem

Ask the Attorney is sponsored by local attorneys, McCutcheon & Hamner, P.C., as a service to the residents of NW Alabama.

This week I spoke with a very nice gentleman who was disappointed with my opinion of his case. He felt as if the legal system was in some way broken. It's not, but it's the way it is for a reason.

Here's what we're talking about. This gentleman had worked in a well-respected industry and was living off his social security. He had a wreck that was not his fault. Money was tight, and he did not go to the hospital or see a doctor. He did not go to a chiropractor or a nurse practitioner.

He just toughed it out for over a year. He cut back on his activities and struggled to make himself comfortable. After 14 months he sees a doctor for the first time and gets an MRI. The gentleman then discovers that he has a herniated disc.

I believe the man is telling the truth. He had no medical history prior to the accident because he didn't go to the doctor. If he had seen a doctor on a regular basis for yearly check-ups, we would know that he probably had a good back, or at least he hadn't complained about it.

I tried a case in Huntsville for a very nice lady whose first complaint of shoulder pain was four months after the accident. She didn't complain about her shoulder to the ambulance crew or to the emergency room. She didn't mention it to her doctor nine days after the accident. She had shoulder surgery, and I valued that case between \$65,000.00 and \$75,000.00 for a variety of reasons personal to her case, such as how likable she was, how provably honest she was, and the poor result she got from the surgery. The jury gave me \$6,500.00. Not \$65,000.00. When I interviewed the jury after the trial, they felt that because she was so active with no complaints for four months, she could have injured her shoulder in one of the many activities she engaged in.

The legal reality is that a doctor has to say that the accident more likely than not or "probably" caused the injury that you are seeking compensation for. We've seen cases where people believe their cancer came out of remission or they're concerned that perhaps their ability to reproduce has been compromised. Without a doctor's opinion, you don't win. Without documentation of treatment, your case isn't what it would have been. If you are hurt, tell your doctor.

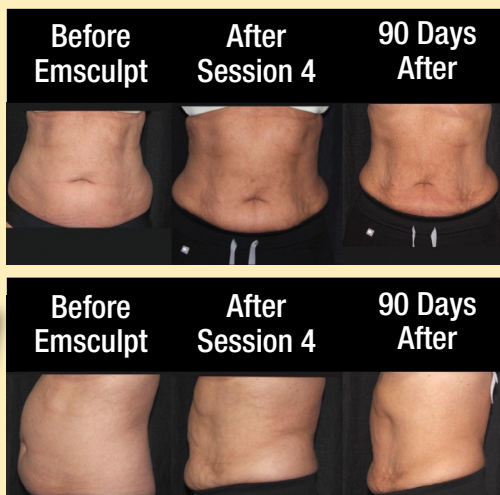

The Hawk Pride Water System is pleased to provide you with this year's Annual Water Quality Report. We want to keep you informed about the excellent water and services we have delivered to you over the past year. Our goal is and always has been, to provide to you a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to maintain and continually improve the water you receive and to protect our water supply.

Our water is groundwater drawing from the Fort Payne Chert aquifer. Each water system must complete a Source Water Assessment Program (SWAP). The SWAP is comprised of four distinct activities: delineation

of the source water assessment area, contaminant inventory, susceptibility analysis and public awareness. Hawk Pride has completed each required component of the source water assessment. We are interconnected with Franklin County for emergency purposes. To provide safe drinking water Alum, Aqua Mag, and chlorine is added as a disinfectant.

Hawk Pride Water is pleased to report that our drinking water is safe and meets federal and state requirements. All drinking water, including bottled water, may

reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of these does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800426- 4791).

The sources of drinking water (both tap and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and radioactive material, and it can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Hawk Pride Water System wants you to be aware that there is not a problem with lead in our drinking water. However, if present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Hawk Pride Water System is responsible for providing high quality drinking

water but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at <http://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead>.

MCL's are set at very stringent levels. To understand the possible health effects described for many regulated constituents, a person would have to drink 2 liters of water every day at the MCL level for a lifetime to have a one-in-a-million chance of having the described health effect.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by cryptosporidium and other microbiological contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (1-800-426-4791). All drinking water, including bottled water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some constituents. It is important to remember that the presence of these constituents does not necessarily pose a health risk.

Hawk Pride Water System also tests for disinfection byproducts in your water, such as trihalomethanes and haloacetic acids. Disinfection byproducts are contaminants that develop when chlorine breaks down over an extended period. All test results were well within state and federal standards.

Additional testing LT2 in our RAW water is on-going and there were no detection levels. This monitoring was performed by a state certified lab according to ADEM and EPA regulations.

Hawk Pride Water System strives to provide a dependable and safe supply of water to all consumers. We ask that you be considerate when accidents or mother nature hinder our efforts to supply your water. Regardless of the time, or weather, water works personnel are on call and working to keep your water flowing. Please help us protect our water sources, which is, a vital part of our lives, and our children's future.

It is important to remember that the presence of these constituents does not necessarily pose a health risk. This table has many abbreviations you might not be familiar with. To help you better understand these abbreviations we have provided the following definitions:

- **Not Required (NR)** – Laboratory analysis not required due to waiver granted by the Environmental Protection Agency for the State of Alabama.
 - **Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l)** - one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.
 - **Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter** - one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000.
 - **Parts per trillion (ppt) or Nanograms per liter (nanograms/l)** - one part per trillion corresponds to one minute in 2,000,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000,000.
 - **Parts per quadrillion (ppq) or Picograms per liter (picograms/l)** - one part per quadrillion corresponds to one minute in 2,000,000,000 years or one penny in \$10,000,000,000,000
 - **Picocuries per liter (pCi/L)** - picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water.
- **Millirems per year (mrem/yr)** - measure of radiation absorbed by the body.
 - **Nephelometric Turbidity Unit (NTU)** - nephelometric turbidity unit is a measure of the clarity of water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU is just noticeable to the average person.
 - **Variances & Exemptions (V&E)** - State or EPA permission not to meet an MCL or a treatment technique under certain conditions.
 - **Action Level – (AL)** the concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow. Treatment Technique (TT) - (mandatory language) A treatment technique is a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water. Maximum Contaminant Level - (mandatory language) The “Maximum Allowed” (MCL) is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.
 - **Maximum Contaminant Level Goal** - (mandatory language) The “Goal” (MCLG) is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.
 - **Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal or MRDLG** - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.
 - **Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level or MRDL** - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

Unregulated contaminants are those for which EPA has not established drinking water standards. The purpose of unregulated contaminant monitoring is to assist EPA in determining the occurrence of unregulated contaminants in drinking water and whether future regulation is warranted.

It's important to remember that the presence of these contaminants does not necessarily pose a health risk. The EPA or ADEM requires us to monitor for certain contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not change frequently. UCMR5
The Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) requires that once every five years the EPA issues a list of unregulated contaminants to be monitored by public water systems (PWSs).

The fifth Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR 5) was published on December 27, 2021. UCMR 5 requires sample collection for 30 chemical contaminants between 2023 and 2025 using analytical methods developed by the EPA and consensus organizations. This action provides the agency and other interested parties with scientifically valid data on the national occurrence of these contaminants in drinking water. Below is a list of the contaminants that are being tested for during the UCMR5 along with their results.

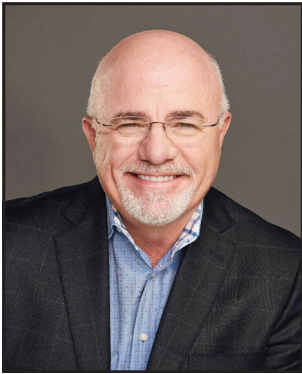
Dear Gerard,
That's exactly what you should do. I'm sorry to hear about your health issues, but at the same time, I hope you'll make sure you're only pressing the pause button on Baby Step 2. I'm talking about temporarily stopping the debt snowball and making only minimum payments on all non-mortgage debt for now. Can you manage that?

Things like this can be expensive, but they're part of life. At the same time, taking care of these kinds of issues doesn't have to mean giving up on gaining control of your finances. Emergency issues, especially medical emergencies, come first. Then, go back and pick up where you left off when things are better, and finish knocking out your other debt by restarting your debt snowball. After that, I've got a feeling you'll have the motivation to fully fund your emergency fund in Baby Step 3 all the way up to three to six months of expenses.

God bless you, friend. Keep your head up, and take good care of yourself while you're recovering. You can do this!

SIGNS OF THE PAST

HISTORY OF LEIGHTON UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

The region's rich history of Methodism predates the creation of Colbert County. Local Methodists helped raise \$10,000 to persuade the Tennessee Methodist Conference to build LaGrange College (4 miles SW), which opened in 1830. In 1837, William Leigh donated an acre lot on County Line Rd. in Leighton for construction of a brick building to be used as a meeting place by local denominations and the Masons.

By 1902, under the leadership of Rev. J.A. Brock, and with a membership of 168, the congregation of Leighton Methodist Episcopal Church, South, elected to build a new church on this lot. The building committee consisted of Thos. Lile, Claude King, F.R. King, J.H. Hall, D.L. Spangler, and J.A. Lindsey. Architects J.B. Carr & Co. of Birmingham designed the 400-seat sanctuary, which featured an elevated choir alcove, Sabbath school rooms, and a pastor's study. Construction began in May 1903. The marble cornerstone (donated by a Georgia firm) was laid on Sept. 14, 1903. The church was completed at a basic cost of \$6,200. The Ladies Aid Society raised additional funds to purchase curved cathedral pews that matched the altar. Congregants purchased stained glass windows as memorials. The first service was held on March 20, 1904.

What is Natural Gas?

Natural gas is made up of hydrocarbon gases, primarily methane, naturally occurring in rock formations deep below the earth's surface. The natural gas is withdrawn and transported to homes and businesses through an underground system of pipes.

Why use Natural Gas?

Natural gas is a fuel of choice because it is:

1. Efficient
2. Clean-burning (emits few pollutants)
3. Plentiful
4. Safe

Who uses Natural Gas?

- Residential users use natural gas in their homes to fuel furnaces, pool/spa heaters, gas lights, stoves, generators and space heaters.
- Commercial users use natural gas in businesses such as restaurants, hotels, and hospitals.
- Industrial users use natural gas for heating processes and as a fuel for the generation of steam.
- Electric utilities use natural gas to generate electricity.
- Natural gas pipeline companies use natural gas as a fuel to run compressor units.

Natural Gas Safety Precautions

Natural gas is colorless, odorless, lighter than air, and non-toxic. Breathing natural gas is not harmful as long as there is an adequate supply of fresh air to breathe along with it. Natural gas by itself will not burn, but with the proper mixture of gas and air combined with an ignition source, combustion can occur.

An odorant that smells like rotten eggs is added to natural gas so that it can be detected. The odor is a warning that natural gas may be present and, if ignited, could result in personal injury or property damage.

If the smell of gas is present inside your home or business (no matter how faint or strong),

Do Not:

1. Smoke or strike a match.
2. Operate an electric switch or appliance control.
3. Pull any plugs from outlets.
4. Use a flashlight or lighter.
5. Use a telephone or cell phone in the building.

If you SMELL A FAINT ODOR of natural gas INSIDE YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, check to see if any appliances have been left on accidentally or if a pilot light has been extinguished, which would cause the odor (rotten eggs). If the odor persists, TAKE NO CHANCES, get out of the house immediately, and then call us from a nearby phone or neighbor.

If a STRONG OR PERSISTENT ODOR OF GAS is present IN YOUR HOME OR BUSINESS, OR IF YOU HEAR A HISSING SOUND of escaping natural gas, follow this procedure:

1. Get everyone out of the building immediately.
2. Leave the door open.
3. Use a neighbor's phone or cellular phone outside the building to call us.
4. If you SMELL OR DETECT NATURAL GAS OUTSIDE, call us.

Leaks from natural gas pipelines are extremely rare, however it is important that you know how to recognize the signs of a leak if one were to occur in your area. A strong odor, hissing sound, or dirt blowing up from a hole are signs of a leak. Move away from and upwind of the suspected leak before calling us. Do not light matches, smoke, use a cell phone or attempt to start any motor vehicles in the area of a possible gas leak.

Call Before You Dig

Whether you are building a home, installing a sprinkler system, or just planting a tree, we want you to be safe. No matter the size of the project, before you dig, grade, or excavate, the law requires you to call for all underground utilities to be located. Please contact the One-Call Center for more information on this free service. (Alabama One Call 811) If you are digging and expose a gas pipeline, call us. Proper attention to pipe that has been exposed can prevent problems later.




