## **FUN ON THE FARM**

These farms and nurseries provide a range of experiences, from picking fresh blueberries and flowers to exploring sustainable farming practices. It's advisable to check each location's current offerings and hours before visiting, as seasons and availability can vary.

## Berry Lucky Farm

#### 3542 W. Lemon Creek Rd., Bridgman, MI

A 6-acre blueberry farm offering U-pick experiences since 2019. Open from early July, coinciding with National Blueberry Day. Surrounded by wineries, breweries, and beaches, it's a peaceful spot for berry picking.

## Krieger's Wholesale Nursery

#### 9555 N. Gast Rd., Bridgman, MI

A wholesale nursery offering a wide selection of plants, trees, and shrubs. While primarily serving landscapers and garden centers, they also welcome retail customers looking for quality plants for their gardens.

## BRINGING THE STRONG TOWNS APPROACH TO SOUTHWEST MICHIGAN

Last year, the Southwest Michigan Regional Chamber took an important step toward building more resilient, people-focused communities by introducing the Strong Towns movement to our region. Strong Towns is a national nonprofit organization that helps communities become financially sustainable by focusing on small, incremental investments that improve quality of life and long-term stability.

As part of this effort, we hosted a two-day summit at Corewell Health's Frederick S. Upton Foundation Educational Pavilion featuring Charles "Chuck" Marohn—the internationally renowned civil engineer, urban planner, and founder of Strong Towns— where he challenged area leaders to rethink how we invest in our communities.

For example, rather than relying on big, speculative projects or top-down mandates, Strong Towns urges communities to make smaller, incremental investments that deliver real value over time. This approach, which prioritizes concepts like walkable streets, mixed-use zoning, incremental housing, and local leadership, has proven to build long-term stability and growth while preserving what makes each place unique.

These principles align closely with the work of the Southwest Michigan Regional Chamber and the Greater Bridgman Area Chamber and Growth Alliance (CGA). In fact, with Nancy Keirnan leading the charge in Greater Bridgman, we're already seeing tangible results. In just a year, we've seen multiple projects take shape that, while modest in scale, are meaningful in impactexactly the kind of steady, community-driven improvements that Strong Towns advocates for.

Small towns succeeding today focus less on growth at any cost and more on small, smart, financially strong steps. They prioritize making existing places better, safer, more vibrant, and more connected—without depending on one "silver bullet" solution like a new mall, tourism dollars, or major industrial facility.

As we look ahead, the Southwest Michigan Regional Chamber remains committed to advancing this work alongside our partners in Greater Bridgman and beyond. By embracing the Strong Towns approach, we are empowering local leaders, businesses, and residents to shape their communities in ways that are practical, sustainable, and deeply rooted in local values. Together, we are proving that small, incremental

steps can build stronger, more resilient towns-places where people want to live, work, and invest for generations to come.

Tabor Hill Winery is a pioneer in Michigan's wine industry, being the first to produce wines from European vinifera grapes in the state. They offer two locations: a tasting room in Bridgman and a full-service winery and restaurant

in Buchanan featuring a diverse portfolio of 30 wines, ranging from sweet whites to dry reds and notable events like the Wild Game Dinner and Vino & Flatbread specials.

## Transient Artisan Ales

Situated in Bridgman, Transient Artisan Ales is renowned for its innovative and small-batch beers. Founded by Chris Betts, Transient Artisan Ales is renowned for its innovative brewing techniques, particularly its focus on wild and spontaneous fermentation. The brewery emphasizes small-batch production, allowing for meticulous attention to detail in each brew. The brewery has garnered attention for its creative approach to brewing, making it a must-visit for craft beer enthusiasts. Spontaneous beers fermented with wild yeast, benefiting from the region's abundant fruit agriculture. Notable creations include "Foeder 2," a fruited sour beer aged in oak barrels, and "Agnitio," a farmhouse ale that won a gold medal at the Festival of Wood and Barrel-Aged Beer.





## **DISCOVER BRIDGMAN PUBLIC LIBRARY**





Bridgman High School boasts a 95% graduation rate, has been ranked #1 in Berrien County and #22 statewide, and offers rigorous academic pathways including AP and CTE programs. F.C. Reed Middle School ranks among Michigan's top 100 middle schools, while personalized instruction at Bridgman Elementary supports holistic child development.

The district offers 22 athletic programs, award-winning arts, and innovative extracurriculars like Robotics, Science Olympiad, and the WIN (What I Need) program. The community-supported Bridgman Aquatic Center provides year-round programs for students and residents alike.



## THE ALL-SEASON MAGIC OF WARREN DUNES

As the gateway to Southwest Michigan, Warren Dunes State Park lies only twenty miles from the Indiana border, yet feels like a world away from the congested, noisy urban centers that line Lake Michigan's southern shoreline.

A true standout among Michigan State Parks, it offers 1,952 acres of adventure and natural beauty. With three miles of sandy Lake Michigan shoreline, the beach features soft, golden sands that are perfect for sunbathing, swimming, and beach-combing. Among the parks towering sand dunes is the iconic Tower Hill, which rises approximately 260 feet above Lake Michigan. Visitors can climb, walk, run, or slide down sandy slopes, and climbing these dunes rewards visitors with panoramic views of the lake and the surrounding landscape.

The park also boasts six miles of hiking trails that wind through a variety of landscapes, including rugged forested areas, wetlands, and open dunes. There are two campgrounds: Mt. Randall, which is modern, and Hildebrandt, a semi-modern site. Both campgrounds include essential amenities such as drinking water, restrooms, and showers.

Visit once, and you will be drawn back again and again. Each season brings a new perspective, making this a year-round destination that captures the natural beauty and adventure spirit of Michigan.









## **ESCAPE INTO NATURE AT WARREN WOODS**

Nestled in the heart of Berrien County, less than 10 minutes from Bridgman, Warren Woods State Park offers a serene escape into one of Michigan's last remaining old-growth beech-maple forests. This 311-acre nature preserve, designated a National Natural Landmark in 1967, is home to towering American beech and sugar maple trees—some reaching over 125 feet tall and five feet in diameter—creating a cathedral-like canopy that filters sunlight and hushes the forest floor. The park's tranquil atmosphere and ecological significance make it a must-visit for nature enthusiasts and casual hikers alike.

Visitors can explore approximately 3.5 miles of easy hiking trails that meander through the lush forest and along the scenic Galien River. A charming footbridge spans the river, offering picturesque views and a perfect spot for wildlife observation. In spring, the forest floor comes alive with wildflowers, while autumn paints the canopy in vibrant hues of red and gold. Birdwatchers will appreciate the park's rich avian diversity, including sightings of pileated woodpeckers and various warbler species. Leashed dogs are welcome on the trails, making it an ideal destination for a peaceful, pet-friendly outing.

Whether you're seeking a quiet hike, a moment of reflection amidst towering trees, or a glimpse into Michigan's natural heritage, Warren Woods State Park offers a timeless retreat into the wild beauty of the state's southwestern corner.








## **DISCOVER BRIDGMAN ON BIKE**

Bridgman and Lake Charter Township will see a dramatic increase in non-motorized trails in the future! The first official non-motorized trail is a 1.2-mile trail connecting the City of Bridgman and Bridgman Public Schools High School to Lake Township Park. The trail, named in memory of past Lake Township Supervisor John W. Gast, runs along Gast Road and provides safe access for both cyclists and pedestrians. With so many recreational activities occurring at Lake Township Park, this trail will increase healthy lifestyles while creating a sense of community by connecting the city with this wonderful park.

The Friends of Berrien County Trails is continuing exciting trail development along Red Arrow Highway. This linear trail will

connect New Buffalo to St Joseph (and eventually South Haven) along Red Arrow Highway and the beautiful Lake Michigan Shoreline. The Marquette Greenway extension from Grand Beach to New Buffalo has already been completed, and this critical section will eventually connect to Chicago. The section from Sawyer to Bridgman will be completed in the next several years. The portion from the northern City limit to the Cook Power Plant is being prepared this year and is planned for completion in 2026. The benefits of the trail for the area residents will be a significant enhancement to our communities.







## **BRIDGMAN OPEN AIR MARKET**

#### Where can I sit?

You may eat or consume alcoholic beverages served in designated Social District cups at any City of Bridgman benches and cafe tables found within the boundaries of the Social District.



#### What types of alcoholic beverages can I purchase to carry around the Social District?

Beer, wine and liquor are allowable drinks when served in a designated Social District cup. Drinks must be purchased from a licensed business within the Social District.

#### Can I walk anywhere with my drink?




