

### Crow Wing County Land Services plants seedlings for a greener tomorrow

In a vibrant display of environmental stewardship, Crow Wing County Land Services has wrapped up its 2025 tree planting program, blanketing 81 acres with 61,500 pine seedlings. The newly planted groves in Ross Lake, Mission, and Irondale Townships mark another milestone in the county's decades-long commitment to nurturing its forests. Since 1983, a staggering 4.2 mil-

lion seedlings have taken root across county-managed lands, weaving a legacy of green that promises to thrive for generations.

This annual ritual isn't just about digging holes and dropping in trees—it's about sculpting the future of Crow Wing's forests. While hardwoods like aspen, birch, and oak happily reseed themselves naturally, the county's focus on conifers, like these

system that hums with life. "Planting is a cornerstone of sound forest management," says Environmental Services Supervisor Tom Strack, his passion for the land evident. "It guarantees our forests will keep providing wildlife habitats, recreational spaces, and forest products for our kids and grandkids."


Crow Wing County oversees a sprawling 105,000 acres of forest, balancing timber production with trails, parks, and spaces for everyone from hikers to hunters. The forestry program is a quiet economic engine, too, generating roughly \$1 million annually. Those funds don't sit idle-they're funneled back into improving habitats, maintaining forest roads, and keeping the environment pristine for all to enjoy. Every step is guided by rigorous standards from the

and the Minnesota Forest Resources Council, ensuring the land is treated with care and respect.

But the county's green ambitions don't stop at its borders. They're calling on landowners to join the movement by planting trees on their own properties. For those ready to dig in, Land Services offers some practical advice: skip the burlap or plastic sacks, dig a hole wide enough to let roots spread freely, backfill ets, and give your new tree a good drink of water if you can. It's a small act that can ripple outward, adding to the county's leafy legacy.

As the pine seedlings settle into their new homes, Crow Wing County stands as a beacon of what's possible when a community commits to its land. These trees, still small today, will one day tower overhead, offering shade, shelter, and a reminder that the future is something we plant together.




