East Side Union High School District switches how trustees are elected

San Jose school district is changing ho'w its board members are elected and wants the public's help.

The East Side Union High School District has started redistricting its trustee voting areas as it switches from at-large elections. The district received a legal claim earlier this year saying existing trustee areas violate the California Voting Rights Act by denying marginalized residents equal representation.

To better understand its distinct neighborhoods, the board of trustees will host meetings to gather community input on draft maps. Trustees will vote on a final map in August ahead of upcoming elections for three board seats in November. Changing the trustee areas won't affect school boundaries or services.

Superintendent Glenn Vander Zee said although the current See TRUSTEES, page 3

maintain community voices to the highest level in choosing board trustees in the future," Vander Zee told San José Spotlight. "We encourage people to come to the meetings so they can understand what this process is and make sure they and their community voices are heard."

The next meetings will be held at 6:30 p.m. on June 26 at Andrew P. Hill High School and July 15 at William C. Overfelt High School. The meetings will be available online.

Trustees approved changing the election system in April. Once the board approves the final map, it will go before the County Committee on School District Organization under the Santa Clara County Office of Education for final approval. Additional information and a questionnaire about communities of interest — people who share common social and economic interests — is available on the district's website.

The district has hired consulting firm Redistricting Partners—

which strives to ensure the process is fair and protects communities — to handle the election system switch. During the first special board meeting on May 12 at William C. Overfelt High School, Redistricting Partners demographer Liz Stitt said U.S. Census data will be used in creating the maps.

"The most important aspect of redistricting is making sure the public is participating and engaged," Stitt said at the meeting.


Chuck Cantrell, a local economist and vice chair of the San Jose Planning Commission, asked how the board will ensure marginalized communities are contacted and reflected in the mapping process.

"There is a significantly marginalized community ... that represents maybe 2% of the student population here. It's still important," Cantrell said at the meeting. "I understand your district reflects your community ... but there's a specific group in the community that is not represented. I would implore you to do a much more active engagement processing that includes going to Black churches. I want to know there is a process to engage the most marginalized communities."

Vander Zee said he will follow up to ensure communities are able to express their voices and provide input.

Jack Hammer, president of East Side Teachers Association, expressed concern with board members influencing new district boundaries. Stitt said where trustees live isn't a consideration in drawing the maps but can be in the board choosing the final map. She said she prefers to use maps submitted by the community.

"We want this to be focused on communities and not incumbents," Stitt said.

Women's Club celebrates its 130th anniversary

he San Jose Woman's Club celebrated its 130th anniversary at its historic downtown clubhouse on May 22.

The club was born in December 1894 when nine women — described as "public spirited" in a 1929 newspaper article — gathered at the downtown studio of Fannie Estabrook.

Two of the big topics of discus-

sion in 1894 were women's suffrage and Prohibition. And there were definitely points of disagreement, according to historians.

The club and its members helped found the San Jose Day Nursery and were early supporters of the Sempervirens Club to save the redwoods in Big Basin.

Over the years, the club championed education and advancing women's rights. In 1939-40, the club sponsored the San Jose Junior Woman's Club for women under 40, and one of its first members was Betty Ann Chandler. At 107, the club's oldest and longest-serving member and still makes occasional appearances at events.

Today the club has 167 members — and that number has been trending upward since the COVID-19 pandemic, as the club continues to

host events for its members and rent out its Landmark Ballroom to other organizations.

Google joins state in media assistance

Partnership will help industry, but some say funds fall short of goal

etails regarding a hard-fought partnership between California and Google providing financial assistance toward the state's news media, an industry that shrunk dramatically in the digital age were revealed last week.

The creation of the California Civic Media Fund, a partnership between news media, Google and philanthropists, would dole out a mix of public and private funds to media outlets.

Critics, including a former state senator, say the agreement falls short of earlier proposals that would have forced Google and other tech giants to pay newspaper publishers for using their con-



tent or harvesting data.

Google's parent company Alphabet has agreed to contribute at least \$10 million for the project's first year and has also agreed to pitch in "additional matching dollars if more public, private or philanthropic money is raised," Wicks' office said in a news release.

Alphabet says it will continue funding other programs, including the Google News Initiative. Last year, the company threatened to axe the program as law-makers attempted to regulate the company.

The agreement is on pace to fall short of Google's pledge in August to contribute nearly \$173 million to the fund over five years, along with the AI accelerator. However, the company could contribute more in future years.

Bay Area Ridge Trail adds 14.1 scenic miles

Calero County Park addition completes 427 miles of 550-mile route

t has been nearly 40 years that visionaries worked together to build a continuous 550-mile trail around the Bay Area's ridgelines.

To the delight of hikers, bicyclists and horseback riders that like to get away from the hustle and bustle of city strife, the Bay Area Ridge Trail is a sanctuary for people who like to get away from their computer screens and enjoy taking a hike or bike ride.

The iconic trail which takes in stunning views of the Golden Gate Bridge from the Marin Headlands, San Mateo County forests above Crystal Springs Reservoir, and Mt. Hamilton total about 427 miles — about three-quarters done.

The new 14.1 miles is now open to the public for hiking, bicycling, and horseback riding. It runs from the Rancho San Vicente trailhead of Calero County Park in South San Jose to the Rancho Cañada del Oro Open Space Preserve in the meadows and rolling foothills between Los Gatos and Morgan Hill.

A public dedication is planned for 10 a.m. on May 31 at the Rancho San Vicente trail-





Want to watch the local high school game? Be aware of sports streaming scams

ou used to have to go to the stadium to root for your local high school athletic team or your favorite college or professional sports team. However, online streams now make it possible for people to watch games from the comfort of their living rooms.

Unfortunately, the scammers have followed. By sharing fake streaming links on social media, scammers aim to capture personal information, including credit card and Social Security numbers, as fans get tricked into logging in to watch their team play.

How this scam works

You want to watch the local high school's football game, or your niece's college softball team is playing in a tournament out of state. You search online to find a link where the game might be streamed, and sure enough, a fan has $shared\,a\,link\,on\,social\,media\,where\,you\,can\,watch$ for free! It's almost time for the game to start, so you eagerly click the link. The next screen asks you to sign up for the streaming service, so you enter your name and email... and then you get asked for a credit card number and potentially more sensitive information. Are you seeing red flags yet?

These scammers infiltrate social media with links to fake streams. The posts often will tag the high schools, colleges, or professional teams involved to make the post appear legitimate. The scammers hope the would-be viewer inputs their information and pays to watch the event. The consumer doesn't get to watch the game because the scammer has not set up a stream. Instead, whatever data they entered may be compromised.

As a new school year begins, BBB reminds consumers to do their research when looking to watch a high school, college, or professional sporting event online.


"Fans need to remain diligent in where and how they find the stream of a high school contest," Matt Troha, an Assistant Executive Director with the Illinois High School Association, told BBB. Troha said fake streaming links posted to social media lure unsuspecting fans.

"On [X] especially, take notice of account names and photos, which often seem random, and look at their follower and following numbers," Troha said. "Low follower counts indicate the account likely was just started. Look at the content of their posts as most are nothing but tweets to stream games."

Last year, state associations that oversee high school athletics in New Mexico, Indiana, and North Carolina issued warnings about the fake

"If you want to watch a specific school's game online, check with the school to see if it has streaming options available," said Michelle L. Corey, president and CEO of the BBB office in St. Louis. "While many schools do offer live streaming now, there are others who do not."

BBB Scam Tracker has received reports of fake sports streaming links. One consumer shared, "The link was posted under a high school football post claiming we could watch the high school football games for free. Then it asked for credit card information in order to charge \$1. After putting in credit card information, I was not able to watch any football games...my trial was for 24hours and if I didn't cancel, it would charge my credit card \$60 per month."


