It began with a vision. A belief that the people of northern Minnesota deserved access to the same public media resources enjoyed in larger cities across the country. On June 1, 1980, that dream came to life with the launch of Lakeland PBS—and 45 years later, it continues to thrive as one of the most cherished and trusted institutions in the region.

Today, Lakeland PBS proudly celebrates 45 years of public service broadcasting, reflecttional programming, community-centered storytelling, and a steadfast commitment to the people it serves.

A station built by and for the public

What makes Lakeland PBS unique isn't just its programming—it's the fact that it's truly owned by the public. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, the station belongs to the very communities it reaches, operating with a deep-rooted sense of responsibility and purpose.

From its state-of-the-art headquarters in Bemidji to its satellite office in Brainerd, Lakeland PBS runs two full-power digital broadcast

Minnesota Secretary of State to honor election workers on June 2

On Monday, June 2, Minnesota Secretary of State Steve Simon will hold a first-of-its-kind event to recognize the incredible work of three exceptional election workers who have dedicated themselves to serving Minnesota voters. The recognition ceremony will take place at 12:30 p.m. on Monday, June 2, in Meeting Rooms 1 & 2 on the lower level of the Land Services Building, located at 322 Laurel Street, Brainerd. This event marks the beginning of an ongoing effort to highlight the tireless efforts of election workers across the state, many of whom work behind the scenes to ensure

Among the honorees at this groundbreaking event will be three women whose contributions have been nothing short of extraordinary: Helen Burgstaler, Debby Erickson, and Kathy Toensing. Each of these women has gone above and beyond in their roles, playing pivotal parts in the smooth and fair administration of elections in Crow

Wing County. **Helen Burgstaler,** believed to be the longest-serving election judge in Minnesota, will be honored for an unparalleled 75 years of service. A lifelong resident of Crow Wing County, Helen started

18 in 1950. To put that into perspective, Harry S. Truman was president, and the Korean War was underway. Now, at the age of 93, Helen continues to serve faithfully at the polls in her county, working not just during presidential elections but also local, state, and primary elections, as well as an absentee ballot judge.

Debby Erickson's 31 years of service to Crow Wing County have seen her take on a variety of critical roles, making her a true resident election expert. Starting in the county assessor's office, Debby quickly moved up through the ranks. As Deputy County Auditor, County Auditor, Auhas been instrumental in strategic planning, finance, vital records, and most notably, election services.

She became Administrative Services Director in 2015 where she is responsible for strategic planning and oversight of finance, information technology, facilities, and election services, including coordination of annual budget and policies and procedures across the organization.

Kathy Toensing has worked for Crow Wing County since 2006 and is the Operations Support Supervisor and Elections Supervisor. Her countless hours and dedication to making our elections run smoothly have been key to Crow Wing County's success. Kathy works tirelessly behind the scenes to review ballot

Senator Keri Heintzeman update

The 2025 regular legislative session officially ended at midnight on May 20. It should've been enough time to finish the work on our agenda, but House Democrats refused to show up for the first three weeks. It was a deliberate, cynical tactic to block House Republicans from using their majority to govern. That lost time set us back, and now we'll need a special session to pass a full state budget as required by the

There's a lot left on the table. Nine budget bills remain unfinished. So does the tax bill. And a few other policy bills are still

I'm especially concerned about

a few really bad ideas that are still in the mix. Gov. Walz and Senate Democrats have proposed cuts to nursing homes and disability services. They have also recommended closing the \$6 billion deficit they created by shifting state costs to counties, which would cause significant property tax increases or cuts to services. These cost shifts don't fix anything. They just pass the buck, and Minnesotans will be the ones paying for it.

Despite the gridlock, some good work has been done. We passed a bipartisan Human Services policy bill that will help us crack down on fraud, strengthen oversight in long-term care, and ease burdens on mental health providers.

The agriculture budget delivers real wins for rural Minnesota, including support for farmers dealing with wolf and elk depredation, better Farm-to-School programs, and improvements to cottage food laws that help small food producers.

We will continue to work over the next couple days in preparation for the upcoming special session. While I am ready to work together with anyone to get a good budget done, I won't rubber-stamp or support a deal that raises taxes, shortchanges rural Minnesota, or fails to put Minnesotans first.

The sewer project received \$1,782,769 in total, including a \$1.43 million Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) grant and a 20year low-interest loan of \$356.554.

The water project received \$1,756,841 in total, including a \$1.4 million Water Infrastructure Fund (WIF) grant and a 20-year low-interest loan of \$351,368.

Background information

The Crosby projects were part of a \$44.2 million round of loan and grant awards to 15 wastewater and drinking water infrastructure projects throughout the state. Since its inception in 1987, the MPFA has provided \$6.9 billion for public infrastructure programs statewide.

The CWSRF is supported by federal capitalization grants from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and state matching funds. These funds, together with PFA revenue bond proceeds, are used to make low interest loans to communities throughout the state for wastewater and stormwater infrastructure projects. Loan repayments revolve back to make new loans, providing a permanent source of low-interest capital to help cities finance clean water infrastructure projects. Since its start in 1990, Minnesota's CWSRF has awarded more than 565 loans for over \$3.1 billion, providing over \$691 million in interest savings to local governments and their taxpayers.

Throughout the 1970s, John worked tirelessly to bring public television to the region, championing the cause when few believed it possible. His efforts paid off with the launch of KAWE Channel 9 in 1980, and later, KAWB Channel 22 in 1988, extending coverage to the Brainerd Lakes Area.

John's passion didn't end with airtime. He and his wife, Dana, gifted their lake home to Lakeland PBS, establishing a charitable gift annuity that continues to support the station's mission to this day. Though John passed away in 1999, his commitment lives on through the Lakeland PBS endowment fund, helping ensure the future of public television in the region he loved.

Call letters with cultural roots


Even the station's identity carries meaning. The call letters KAWE are more than just a technical label—they're a tribute to the region's Ojibwe heritage.

In 1979, as part of the FCC application process, the station solicited call letter suggestions from the community. The winning idea came from Earl Nyholm, a Bemidji State University professor and respected Ojibwe language expert. In Ojibwemowin, "kawe" or "akawe" means "first in a sequence" or "top







ATV safety training

Calling all young ATV riders. On Saturday, June 28, a hands-on ATV Safety Training session will be held at the Ironton American Legion, located at 232 Fourth Street, starting at 8 a.m. This class, hosted by the Cuyuna Iron Range Riders, is limited to just 25 students, so be sure to sign up early.

Minnesota law requires that ATV operators born after July 1, 1987, and OHM riders under 16 complete an approved safety course before riding on public lands. pre-register for the class. Here's what you need to know:

- •Students aged 10-15 must complete the Minnesota Online Safety Class at ATVcourse.com (\$34.95) before attending the handson session.
- Bring your own ATV (must have an engine size larger than 90cc).
- A parent or guardian must attend with the student.
