The public is invited to attend a ceremony for two American Civil War veterans at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 7 at Hill Lake Cemetery in Hill City in Aitkin County. Guests are also welcome to wear Civil War-era attire in tribute to these soldiers. Two American Civil War veterans long resting in unmarked graves at Hill Lake Cemetery in Hill City in Aitkin County will finally receive the recognition they deserve.

On Saturday, June 7, at 1:00 p.m., a public ceremony will be held to dedicate newly installed U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs headstones honoring Private Daniel Hen-

ry Hughes and Private William Failing.

The event, organized by the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW) William Colvill Camp #56, will include full military honors, the presentation of a Grand Army of the Republic (G.A.R.) grave marker, and a solemn headstone dedication ritual that traces its roots to Civil War-era traditions. The ceremony is open to the public, with veterans, historians, and community members all encouraged to attend. Descendants of Private Hughes and Private Failing are cordially invited to attend as honored guests. Guests are also welcome to wear Civil War-era attire in tribute to these soldiers.

Private Hughes

Private Daniel Hughes was born December 28, 1832. and enlisted in the 1st Iowa Cavalry Regiment on December 29, 1863, at age 30. He served in Company L, taking part in campaigns throughout the Deep South, including the Camden Expedition in Arkansas He was likely present at the Battles of Elkin's Ferry, Camden Cross Roads, and Pine Bluff, and took part in the occupation of Little Rock.

At the end of the war his regiment scouted in Tennessee, Louisiana, and Texas. **Private Failing**

Private William Failing, born December 5, 1846, was just 17 when he joined the 1st Minnesota Heavy Artillery on February 11, 1865. His unit was stationed in Chattanooga, Tennessee, against an attack from General Hood. The Confederate advance never materialized. He was mustered out in September

Last veteran

1865.

Failing's regiment also included Albert Woolson, a 14-year-old drummer boy who would become the last surviving Union veteran, passing away in 1956 at the age of 106.

Ceremony rooted in history

Saturday's ceremony will be conducted by SUVCW Camp #56 Department of Wisconsin with assistance from Hill City's American Legion Post #340 and Palisade's VFW Post #1721.

The script for the dedication follows the original Grand Army of the Republic format, once used by Union veterans themselves to bury their comrades over a century ago.

Civil War veterans to be honored with full military ceremony Camp #56, though based in Wisconsin, encompasses all of Minnesota and is committed to identifying and marking the graves of Union soldiers in each of the state's 87 counties. According to the organization, the act of formally honoring Civil War veterans is not only a recognition of their service but also a reminder of the sacrifices made to preserve the liberties Americans enjoy today.

Founded in 1881, the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War is the official successor to the Grand Army of the Republic. Fleeting poppy-themed exhibit leaves a lasting impression in Brainerd

Although the stay was short its impact was large from the Cherrywood Challenge The Year of the Poppy, Seed Edition. It has wrapped up the exhibit in downtown Brainerd at the Crossing Arts

Alliance. Its next stop is the Minnesota Quilt Show in St. Cloud from June 18-21 where you may view it at the River's Edge Convention

Cherrywood Fabrics handdyes fabrics in Baxter and markets them all over the world. They come in bundles, and quilters used eight fabrics from a bundle to make a 20-inch by 20-inch original design. Any sewing techniques or embellishments are allowed. Embellishments include three-dimensional items like beads, buttons, heavy threads, crystals and decorative stitching such as embroidery, ribbons and fabric manipulations.

The traveling exhibit is split into three parts: The Seed Collection, The Bud Collection and The Petal Collection. Award winners are split up and displayed in the various locations. The Seed Collection has 45 pieces while the other two have 90 each. Third place was the highest award exhibited in Brainerd.

Fabric artworks shown in Brainerd from May 27-31 were awash with red pig-

Minnesota Quilt Show



Aitkin Public Schools bond referendum for new school / wellness center

The Aitkin School Board took a significant step toward improving educational facilities for the district's students. The Board unanimously approved a plan to put a \$70.44 million bond referendum before voters in November 2025. If approved, the referendum will fund the construction of a new PreK-6 elementary school, a transportation center, and a community wellness center.

The referendum is being

proposed in response to the deteriorating condition of Rippleside Elementary, which has served Aitkin for nearly 70 years. Superintendent Dan Stifter emphasized that ongoing maintenance and repairs are no longer sufficient to address the building's needs. "Our children deserve a school that is safe, healthy, and designed for how they learn today," he said.

If voters approve Question 1 of the referendum, the district will allocate \$64.44 million to replace Rippleside Elementary with a state-of-the-art PreK-6 school. The new building will include classrooms specifically designed for modern teaching methods, improved security systems, ADA-compliant facilities, and new HVAC systems that will enhance indoor air quality and energy efficiency.

"The needs of the building go way beyond basic repairs or renovation," Stifter said, citing issues with old security systems, inefficient heating and cooling, and ongoing water damage. "It's time to invest in our students' future by giving them a safe and effective learning environment."

Community wellness center Question 2 of the referendum seeks \$6 million to fund the construction of a community wellness center attached to the new school. This shared facility will include indoor recreation space, a walking track, and multipurpose rooms that can be used for meetings, events, and other community activities. "After careful planning and listening to the community, we believe this plan meets our most urgent needs while offering long-term value to our taxpayers," said Stifter.

Tax impact and funding

If the referendum is approved, the project will be funded through a property tax levy starting in 2026. Based on current estimates, the monthly tax impact for a home valued at \$175,000 would be approximately \$19 for Question 1 and \$2 for Question 2, for a total increase of \$21 per month. For a \$300,000 home, the monthly increase would be about \$36 for Question 1 and \$4 for Question 2, totaling \$40 per month.

The district is also exploring additional funding sources to help reduce the impact on taxpayers, including grants, state bonding, and commu\$5 million IRRRB grant

In a recent announcement, Stifter shared exciting news: the district has received a \$5 million grant from the Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation Board (IRRRB) to support the facilities plan. This funding will reduce the total bond referendum amount from \$70.44 million to \$65.44 million, lowering the cost for taxpayers.


