



A CONVERSATION WITH PASTOR KIKI **Entering Into Rest**

We live in a world that praises motion. The more we do, the more we are seen. The more we achieve, the more we believe we are worth. But eventually, all that running begins to wear us thin.

Rest is not weakness. It is not laziness. It is needed. It is healing. It is how we reconnect to what is real and meaningful in our lives.

There is something powerful about slowing down. About making space to simply be. Not

to produce. Not to prove. But to breathe. To reflect. To notice what we usually pass by.

In many traditions, this pause has a name: Sabbath. Not just a day, but a way of returning. A reminder that our value is not tied to what we accomplish, but to who we are. Sabbath is an invitation to stop reaching and start receiving.

Last month, data showed that approximately \$1.8 million in Alabama EBT expenditure occurred in the state of New York and approximately \$2.2 million was spent in Pennsylvania. We believe most, if not all, of this is fraud.

Tariffs Snarl Energy, Rural Development

Editor,

Despite record-high wind and solar generation, the U.S. renewable energy sector faces uncertainty. Tariffs and potential repeals of federal funding are creating roadblocks to the further buildout of energy projects. Wind, solar, and other

renewable energy projects have helped revitalize rural communities by creating jobs, generating new tax revenues, and providing lease payments to landowners.

However, energy projects rely on globally sourced components due to the U.S. supply chain's inability to meet rising demand. To avoid tariffs, developers solar are stockpiling panels, but the impact is only delayed. Battery storage is critical for grid reliability and faces tariffs of up to 65%.

The rising costs are forcing companies to

delay or cancel plans. the For example, the Plum

Creek Wind Project in Minnesota was cleared construction this for fall. but the project developer, National Grid Renewables, has pressed pause due to escalating costs tied to tariffs.

slowdown The threatens rural economies halting s and the local bv jobs long-term positions in operations and maintenance that new construction brings. revenues from Tax energy projects fund vital infrastructure and critical public services like schools, emergency services, and roads. In Iowa's Howard County, 147 wind turbines account for 14.5% of the county's total annual tax revenue.

the According to .S. Department U.S. of Agriculture, about 85% of U.S. farm households earned the majority of their income from offfarm sources. Hosting wind turbines or solar panels offers a stable source of income through

lease payments, but the additional income is at risk if renewable energy development declines.

Rural economies grown have thanks renewable to energy development, but without continued investment, many communities will not be able to unlock those economic benefits. Contact your



HIPAA Violation

We get calls on a fairly routine basis about HIPAA violations. HIPAA violations are serious, and they are an invasion of privacy. The law is designed to protect confidentiality of medical records which contain far more information than diagnosis and treatment. Healthcare providers are required to safeguard medical records and make sure that the information given to healthcare providers is not at risk of being shared without proper consent.

What is not widely understood is that the HIPAA Act does not really provide money damages to the person whose information was disclosed. Penalties are assessed against the healthcare provider but not paid to the person whose information was impermissibly disclosed. It could very well be that a person could sue for an invasion of privacy or a failure to safeguard their information adequately and recover damages (put money in your pocket) but the Act itself is designed to be enforced by the Health and Human Services Office or a State Attorney General.

There is a structure of fines that range from violations that the healthcare provider did not know about and could not have realistically avoided as the very first level of monetary penalties. The highest fines (level 4) are assessed against providers who willfully neglect the privacy of their patients and make no effort to correct or follow the privacy, security, and breach notification rules.

We do know that we have to use HIPAA compliant release of information language, and we also can use HIPAA to have access to our clients' medical information when healthcare providers occasionally want to hold it to attempt to coerce payment. There are also rules under the HITECH Act that allow us to get medical records in digital form for a very low cost. Sometimes medical records will be thousands of dollars in large cases.

Certainly, if someone's information was wrongfully given out, it could result in fines and it could result in a suspension or termination of the employee of the healthcare provider who violated HIPAA. The main enforcement actions of HIPAA deal with fines of the healthcare provider who breaks the rules, but not necessarily payment to the person whose information was disclosed.





Essential Legal Documents All Seniors Should Have

Dear Savvy Senior.

What kinds of legal documents do I need to help my family take care of me in my elder years? I would like to get my affairs in order but could use some help. Approaching 80

Dear Approaching, All adults, especially an older adult like yourself, should have at least five legal documents to protect yourself and your family. These documents will make sure your wishes regarding your estate are legal and clear and will help minimize any conflicts and confusion with your family and your health care providers if you become seriously ill or when you die. Here are the key documents you need, along with some tips to help you create them.

Durable Power of Attorney: This document allows you to designate someone you trust to handle your financial affairs if you become incapacitated.

Advance Directive: This includes two documents that spell out your wishes regarding your end-of-life medical treatment. The two documents are a "living will" which tells your doctor what kind of care you want to receive if you become incapacitated. And a "health care power of attorney" (or health care proxy), which names a person you authorize to make medical decisions on your behalf if you're unable.

To complement your advance directive, you should also consider getting a Physician Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment - see POLST.org. This is a state specific form that your doctor would fill out that translates your end-of-life wishes into medical orders to ensure your wishes are carried out.

A Will: This lets you spell out your wishes of how you'd like your property and assets distributed after you die, whether it's to family, friends or a charity. It also allows you to designate an executor to ensure your wishes are carried out and allows you to name guardians if you have dependent children.

In addition to a will, if you own real estate or have considerable assets, another option you may want to consider is a "revocable living trust." This functions like a will but allows your estate to avoid the time and expense of probate (the public legal process that examines your estate after you die) and helps ensure your estate's privacy.

HIPPA Release: This form gives your healthcare provider permission to discuss your medical care and medical bills with those you designate. You may need specific HIPAA release forms for each medical professional or health care establishment you deal with.

Do-It-Yourself

If you have a simple estate and an uncomplicated family situation, there are do-it-yourself resources that can help you create all these documents for a few hundred dollars. Some top-rated options to consider include Quicken WillMaker & Trust software (see WillMaker.com), Trust & Will (TrustandWill.com) and Legal Zoom (LegalZoom.com).

Ğet Help

If, however, you want or need assistance or if you have a complicated financial situation, blended family or have considerable assets, you should hire an attorney. An experienced lawyer can make sure you cover all your bases - especially when writing a will or living trust - which can help avoid family confusion and squabbles after you're gone.

Costs will vary depending on where you reside, but you can expect to pay somewhere between \$500 and \$2,000 for a basic estate plan that includes a will, power of attorney and advance directive. If you want your estate plan to include a living trust, that can run anywhere between \$1,500 and \$5,000.

The National Academy of Elder Law Attorneys (<u>NAELA.org</u>) and the National Association of Estate Planners and Councils (NAEPC. org) are two good resources that have directories on their websites to help you find someone in your area.

If money is tight, check with your state's bar association (see <u>FindLegalHelp.org</u>) to find low-cost legal help in your area. Or call the Eldercare Locater at 800-677-1116 for a referral.

\$200 or more.

If you can't make that full-time commitment, think about becoming a foster home to a pet or two. That can help relieve some short-term housing burdens at local shelters.

And many from breeds that are flat labeled "dangerous" or "aggressive" such as pit mixes are big softies looking for a lap and a real life with loving people.

As humans, our pets should be a big part of our lives. As pets, their humans ARE their lives. We are their everything. There are times when age or health issues of the pet require tough quality of life decisions be made. Those are always hard.

There are very few acceptable reasons that justify taking a family dog to animal control and none that justify dumping one (or a litter) off somewhere away from off somewhere away from home and driving off. That selfish and callous mindset requires some serious selfreflection.

The economy is certainly an issue. Pet ownership is not inexpensive, and prospective pet owners need to understand that it's more than some dry food, a brush, some cat litter, and a \$12 rabies shot annually. Those cute little puppies and kittens grow up into adult pets that need upkeep.

Sometimes senior pet owners pass away or are displaced from his/her home to a care facility or new living arrangement where pets are not welcome. That is unfortunate, and often heartbreaking, for the pet and the owner. New environments are strenuous enough, but that loss of the mutual companionship between the pet and owner doubles the heartache. Arrangements often can and should be made to keep both together, even if more concerted efforts need to be made by the custodial agents.

It's hard to envision my giving away a pet or taking it to the shelter because we are moving to a place that doesn't accept pets. Find a different place. If they don't accept the furry family members, they don't get the rest of us. aside,

All that irresponsibility is the biggest culprit for overcrowded shelters.

Some people let their dogs run loose. Some refuse to get their animal spayed or neutered, relying on an assortment flimsy excuses and of justifications.

Frankly, being chained out or boxed into an 8 x 8 space outside - winter or summer - is no life for any mammal, especially one that loves its family and close contact so much.

As a community we MUST accept greater responsibility that comes with pet care and ownership. We must be better stewards of those lives that depend on us so.

Spaying and neutering should be a priority, as should having appropriate space, water, and activities for outside dogs. We can't tell pets that are in heat to simply resist the advances of other animals.

No dogs or cats should roam neighborhoods, city or county, EXPECIALLY around sunrise, dusk, or at night. Safety is a concern for animals, drivers, pedestrians, and homeowners. In addition, with wooded habitats being so aggressively eliminated by urban sprawl, coyotes are everywhere, including local subdivisions. They are patient, keen hunters, and very organized. They WILL find food, wild or not. Don't kid yourself into believing otherwise.

If you already own a pet that is not "fixed," there is a local nonprofit that can help if the cost of spaying or neutering honestly presents hardship, financial Northwest Alabama Spay and Neuter Assistance nasana2015@yahoo.com. Another, Shoals Spay and Neuter Coalition, shoalsspayandneuter coalition@gmail.com, should soon be active.

One or two apathetic pet owners can unknowingly help create hundreds of additional dogs or cats in a few short years, animals that will place even greater burdens on the system. We are better than that. We must remain concerned.

If we think about it long enough, we can understand how our small actions (or inactions) can impact the quality of life for so many furry friends.

Medicare Minute

"Medicare vs Employer Coverage"

We meet weekly with individuals who are currently working but becoming eligible for Medicare. Their dilemma is often whether to stay on their employer coverage past the age of 65 or go on Medicare.

Here are a few things to think about. For those of you who are married you will want to know how it will affect your spouse if you leave employer coverage. If your spouse is not old enough for Medicare it may affect your decision differently than someone whose spouse is also Medicare eligible. If your spouse is also Medicare eligible you will want to know what your exact premium will be for you and your spouse together and separately. If that cost is high you may benefit by looking at a Medicare plan outside the company.

One important factor is the prescription drugs, if any, that you are taking. Often employer coverage will cover expensive prescription drugs better than Medicare. Also, employer coverage does not have the "donut hole" or coverage gap that Medicare drug plans have.

How Medicare works and how it coordinates with other Medicare plans can be very confusing. Some companies require their employees to go through a third-party call center to obtain their Medicare health plan. The biggest disadvantage with going through a call center outside of the area is you lose the ability to have a local agent explain your coverage face-toface and that can go to the insurance company on your behalf if you have a problem.

In most cases it's best to stay on your employer sponsored plan. I would never encourage anyone to leave their employer coverage but the decision to do so is an individual one. What's best for your former coworker may not be what's best for you. Feel free to contact our office anytime if we can be of assistance.
