



perfluorooctane sulfonate and PFOA is perfluorooctanoic acid. Both are part of a class of PFAS compounds.

These synthetic compounds provide a series of benefits for industrial usage. However, many end up in rivers and streams, and being a plastic or synthetic base, they don't break down in the environment over time. When ingested, they can resist our body's efforts to excrete or dissolve them.

Those who have lived here since the 60's and 70's know how badly the water quality in the Tennessee River has deteriorated in the last 50 years, the same with Shoal Creek joining the River about four miles east of Wilson Dam. The water used to be much clearer, and it was commonplace to see fish swimming well below the surface. No more. The water





When a personal injury case is settled, typically it is settled for a lump sum. If the case turns on whether or not someone else was at fault when the case is over, the case is over. In a workers' compensation

case, where fault (someone else being careless) is not an issue, the negotiation and settlement can and will address whether or not future medical bills are paid by the employer. Vocational retraining can be on the table. The payment can be by the week or in a lump sum. There are lots of options that can be important.

In a worker's compensation case, it's important to know if your client has applied or intends to apply for Social Security disability.

The law that applies to both Social Security disability and workers compensation limits people to 80% of their before-injury earnings. The law does not allow someone to make more money from the government and workers' compensation than they did before they were hurt. They're not going to allow people to make more money at home than they did while they were working.

Because a lot of math is involved in the settlement of a comp case and because that settlement can affect social security benefits, it's important to understand how the two go together. An attorney must negotiate a settlement that allows the client to get all of their social security benefits and all of their workers' compensation benefits. But if that's not addressed beforehand, the client could very well lose as much money from social security as they received from their worker's compensation case.

In an automobile accident case, the driver who caused the accident is not going to be responsible for any payments beyond the settlement or verdict if there is a trial. Future medical costs must be included the amount settled for or awarded by the jury. They will not be paid in the future by the driver who caused the accident. There are a lot of cases we see where we have to get an estimate of future medical costs and lost wages to give the insurance company or the jury the information they need in order to evaluate the case. But if it's not done, it won't be done.

In an on-the-job injury case, some people will settle their case for a lump sum leaving their medicals open so they can receive medical expenses for their on-the-job injury taken care in the future should they have medical problems that need to be treatment. For many people this is a good solution. For other people, it's not a good solution and shouldn't be done. It's important to know the difference.


Medicare Minute "Frequently Asked Questions"

We began in the Medicare business in 2010. Since that time we have been asked some interesting and unique questions about Medicare. However, the majority of the questions we are asked we get on a regular basis. Over the next few weeks we are going to discuss some of our most frequently asked questions.

Do I have to sign up for Medicare Part B when I turn 65 if I'm still employed? This is one of the questions we get asked the most. In most cases the answer to this is "no". When you turn 65, if you are still working and on your employer's health insurance plan you probably will not need Medicare Part B. I say probably because most employer plans do not file on Medicare if you have a claim. Because you have to pay a premium for Part B, Medicare does not require a person to sign up for Part B as long as you are on your employer's plan. Also, because the rules can be different for companies with less than 20 employees, the safest thing to do is check with the benefits coordinator at your place of employment for guidance or give us a call at our office.

I am on Medicare and Social Security Disability. I'm turning 65 soon. What are my options? Once you reach the age of 65 you have many more options than before. As you know if you go on Medicare and you are under the age of 65 your options for health plans are limited. When you turn 65 you will have another open enrollment period to sign up for any plan you wish to get. In other words, just because you are already on Medicare does not prohibit you from having all the options a person not on Medicare and turning 65 would have.

is always murky with visibility at zero. There have been warnings out against eating the fish caught in area waters for years.

That is not the fault of Florence Utilities. They can't help what companies and residents upstream Athens, Decatur, in Chattanooga, and rural Tennessee did to the water supply, just as the water dept. in Savannah, TN can't help what Union Carbide, Reynolds, Ford, and TVA may have contributed to poor water

quality up there. Environmental Protection Agency guidelines now allow four parts per trillion on PFAS. The city of Florence, for example, treats water from Cypress Creek which has

no PFAS detection and Wilson Lake which tested at 22 parts per trillion. In addition, ground water from two wells in the Killen and Center Star areas is piped in, blended with the two treated surface water sources and redistributed.

It is reported that excessive exposure can affect reproductive abilities. contribute to developmental delays in children, some cancers, and other health risks.

The chemicals can be successfully treated and the readings brought into compliance through a process called 'reverse osmosis.' The city was looking at a reported cost of \$135 million to implement that system by the imposed EPA deadline of 2029.

That will add а substantial monthly increase to existing water rates.

The current minimum monthly residential water rate in Florence is \$15.06, in addition to a 4% city tax that brings it up to around \$15.66. The minimum rate for rural users is \$21.06. and \$24.75 for Killen customers. Those minimum rates are for anything up to 3,000 gallons per month. The EPA has

now announced plans to weaken limits on some "forever chemicals" in drinking water that were finalized last year, but PFAS. However, not the deadline for water companies to comply with PFAS guidelines has been extended by two years to 2031.

It appears the folks in Killen are getting shortchanged in a couple of areas. The spring water generated from that area is piped into town, mixed with the treated water pulled from the river. It is then shipped back to Killen in a more compromised condition than when it left, and they have pay more for it. Eventually, after treatment mechanisms are in place, Killen residents will have to pay even more for the reverse osmosis treatment which the water there didn't need in its original state, anyway.

And that brings up other issues. How can the EPA just decide to soften guidelines and extend deadlines for what are alleged to be dangerous chemicals? Is it so technologies can catch up and make treatment cost less? What is more likely is that the price for the same equipment will go up by \$10 million in two more years.

Are the forever chemicals only dangerous until lobbyists convince some influential political players that they are not dangerous?

Are parts per trillion arbitrary limits just figures established by the health and environmental communities years ago? If not, how then can figures and deadlines be adjusted and it be okay for consumers in NW Alabama to be subjected to excessive levels of PFAS daily for another 700 days? If it doesn't matter all that much, and a certain number of deaths and sicknesses are acceptable, why not extend the deadline for five or ten years?

If the urgency is indeed real, maybe we should recognize the need for preserving our family's health and buy our own reverse osmosis system for home use at a cost of \$300-\$400. Then, in two years, we can tell the EPA, the lobbyists, the utility companies what we think about their requirements, delays, and seismic rate increases.





Dear Dave,

I've been talking to my creditors, because I want to pay off my debt as soon as possible. In dealing with them, I've noticed sometimes they are reasonable and understanding, while other times they are pushy and even mean. Do you have any suggestions on dealing with creditors when you're trying to make amends and correct financial mistakes of the past? Olivia

Dear Olivia, Let's start with a few basics. When it comes to dealing with debt collectors, keep track of all calls and emails between you, and be 100% up to speed on all your accounts. Have records of all the payments you've made, and the dates on which they were made. Know what you owe, who you owe and exactly how *much* you owe them.

If a collector agrees to settle the debt, get all the specifics of that agreement in writing, and keep the document as proof—just in case they "forget" they made the offer. Knowing the facts, and having them close by, gives you the upper hand in any situation. Plus, all this will make it easier to report them, and begin building a case file, if they violate the federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act.


Trust me, you'll run into all sorts of collectors no matter what kind of debt you have. Occasionally, they're friendly and reasonable. Others can be downright nasty. Whatever their approach, always remember one thing. Their endgame is to separate you from your money. Most

advantage of a person's lack of confidence and emotions. So, if you don't know your rights, they can scare you by using bogus threats. Always calmly explain your situation, the reason you're behind on the debt and how you plan to pay it off. Never let yourself get drawn into an argument, either. If they start yelling, calling you names or cursing at you, hang up immediately. Make a note of the call, and the name of the person you spoke with.

Any misbehavior aside, I want you to remember one thing. If you have debt, you have a legal and moral obligation to pay it. However, there's nothing wrong with you calmly and confidently calmly and confidently controlling these kinds of conversations. You may have made some financial mistakes in the past, Olivia. But that doesn't mean you should allow someone to insult and abuse you.





