
General Rules Governing Our Fair

- The Fair will employ guards to patrol the grounds. Anyone trying to fraudulently enter the grounds by climbing fences, or any other means, will be arrested and prosecuted.
- 2. Intoxication of any person on the grounds will be just cause for their removal from the grounds.
- 3. No pets allowed on fairgrounds except service animals. No weapons, drugs, outside alcohol, or coolers allowed on fairgrounds.
- 4. Everyone entering the fairgrounds shall be subject to such rules as set by the management. Refusal to follow such rules may result in ejection from the fairgrounds and being barred from entrance to future events.
- 5. The Fair reserves the right to change or cancel any show or event.
- 6. Directors of the Lincoln County Fair shall be ineligible to win door prizes
- 7. No purchase shall be made for the Fair without prior approval. No bill will be paid unless the purchase was previously approved by the Board of Directors or Executive Board if applicable.
- 8. All protests must be made in writing to the secretary or superintendent of the respective department and must state fully and specifically upon what grounds the protest is made. The protest must be accompanied by a \$25 fee, otherwise it will not be considered. If the case in protest is sustained, the fee will be returned.
- 9. Any exhibitor who publicly expresses disapproval of the judge's decision, or who is guilty of conduct unbecoming an exhibitor, will be excluded from all exhibitions, his premiums will be forfeited, and he may be excused from the grounds. Any exhibitor who enters an article and refuses to show, without good cause, may be subject to the same treatment.
- 10. Property of privileged and concessions people or patrons will be taken on the grounds at their own risk and kept in such places as they themselves agree to or provide. The Fair will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or theft of the same. The Fair will not be responsible for failure to perform its part of the contract should officers of the law seize, or prevent any concessionaire or privileged person from operation.
- 11. No privilege or concession granted by the Fair to any privileged person or concessionaire will be construed as granting the right to sell anything or to do anything that is contrary to state or federal law.
- 12. The Fair reserves the right to cancel at any time, for reasons satisfactory to itself, any concession privilege, without reimbursement.
- 13. Right is reserved to inspect at any time any show, concession, booth, stall or animal on the grounds.
- 14. Under no condition will any freight or express charges be paid by the Fair. Articles should not be addressed to the Fair, but to the owner, in care of the Fair.
- 15. All harness races will be held according to the rules and regulations of the United States Trotting Association.
- 16. The Racetrack will be under jurisdiction of race secretary at all times, except during races. The race secretary shall determine whether the track is in proper condition.
- 17. All articles (excluding livestock) exhibited for premiums must be strictly the product of the exhibitor; either grown, made, manufactured, or owned by exhibitor.
- 18. Competent judges will be provided. No one that is entered in a section as an exhibitor will be eligible to judge that section.
- 19. Judges will carefully observe and adhere closely to the specifications and conditions in each case.
- 20. No variation from the premiums listed in the catalog shall be allowed.
- 21. All premiums will be designated by ribbons or cards of the following colors: first prize, blue ribbon; second prize, red ribbon third prize, white ribbon; champion or sweepstakes, purple ribbons.
- 22. In cases where one person makes his own competition, only one cash prize shall be awarded, to be based on the merit of the exhibit, according to the opinion of the judges.
- 23. The name of exhibitor will not be displayed on exhibits until premiums have been awarded.
- 24. Any misrepresentation in connection with any entry, by fact stated or omitted, will render such entry not eligible.
- 25. No animals will be permitted to run at large on the grounds.
- 26. Hitching of animals will be only in spaces designated for this purpose.
- 27. All animals entered for exhibition must be entered in their correct names and in the names of the owners. Certificates of registration shall be required in registered classes.
- 28. No barren or impotent animals shall be exhibited in breeding classes.
- 29. All animals exhibited in competition must be under the control of the exhibitor at all times. Failure to accomplish this will result in the animal being excused from the arena.
- 30. No animal will be allowed to leave the arena after reporting for exhibition, except by permission of the judges.
- 31. All animals or articles exhibited in the arena will be under the immediate charge of the show superintendents and subject to their orders at all times, as well as the orders of the judges.
- 32. Any exhibitor refusing to comply with instructions or requests of superintendent or judges, or refusing to give information required, may be barred from such ring or any other exhibition and the fact made known.
- 33. Should a case occur not covered by these rules, decisions will be based upon the rules of the individual Show to which the class or breed belongs.
- 34. All beef and dairy cattle should be pre-registered by entry form deadline. Registration fee will be doubled if late.
- 35. All livestock must enter grounds through Amana Street gate (back gate) to load and unload at designated area. Free admission for Exhibitor only.







You should have your regular veterinarian draw blood for Coggins testing of your horse at least two weeks before a scheduled event where you will need these papers. A Coggins report is good for one year. Coggins must be original, no faxes.
- 3. Horses do not have to be registered in any registry.
- 4. Entry Fee of \$25.00 per horse (entry) for each race that is entered. (One horse can enter any or all races, but must pay an entry fee in each race entered). One (1) person/horse will be admitted in gate free. No fee for parking.
- Entries in all races must be made by 12:00 NOON DAY OF RACE. Lincoln County Residence Race entries must be in Fair Office on day of race by 12:00 Noon. Anyone else wanting to enter after 12:00 Noon will be charged a late entry fee of \$30.00 and will be assigned to last heat.
- Lincoln County Residence Race will have a flag start and may be divided into heats depending on number of entries. Prize money and entry fee will be same as other races. Any horse in this race cannot run in any other race. This is a ¼ mile race.
- Races will be run in heats with not more than five horses per heat when gate started.
- First and second finishers in each heat will compete to determine the final placing for each distance race.
- A draw will be made by officials to determine heat and starting position for each entry. A rider or family with more than one entry in a particular race can request to split his or their entries into separate heats. A \$10.00 fee will be charged for this request.
- Two false starts by any one horse will be cause for disqualification.
- Five minutes will be allowed between heats and ten minutes between last heat and finals of each race. All entries not at starting position within five minutes after finish of last heat will be disqualified.
- Race order subject to change as determined by the officials depending on the number of heats necessary to run each race. Decision of the officials will be final.
- Prize money will be awarded to first, second, and third place finished in final races.
- A ½ mile mule race will be run last. All mules will start together (flag) with same prize money as above awarded the top three (3) finishes.
- A ½ mile pony race will be run with all ponies starting together with same prize money as above awarded the top three (3) finishes. All ponies must measure 13.5 hands (54" tall) or less and rider must be thirteen (13) years old and under.

- A "Dinner Bell Derby" will be run (100 yard dash) for foals that were born in the current year and are not yet weaned. In this race, foals will start approximately 100 yards from the finish line with their mothers waiting at the finish line to greet them. Position in race order for this dash (and if there will be heats and a final race or just a single race will depend on the number of entries) will be announced at approximately 1:30 P.M. on race day. All entry times, fees and prize money are the same as other races. A person to hold the foal (for the start) and a person to hold the mare (at finish line) is required. Winner is first foal to nurse the correct mother.
- Children under 13 years old will be requested, but not required, to wear helmets during races.
- No riding whips or crops allowed. (Exceptions Mule, Pony, and Pacers)





The Sport in History

Is the sport of harness racing of fairly recent years? Hardly. Evidence exists that men were racing horse to harness more than 3,000 years ago, even with Ben Hur and his chariot competition a fairly modern innovation in comparison.

American harness racing as we know it today, however, is generally conceded to have begun in 1806, when records of sorts began to be kept and a gelding by the name of Yankee trotted a mile in less than three minutes for the first time.

The breed itself (trotters and pacers are called Standardbreds) got its greatest shot in the arm in 1788, when a grey Thoroughbred called Messenger arrived in America from England to become the patriarch of a family of fine trotting horses that included a descendant named Hambletonian.

Hambletonian, owned by William Rysdyk of Chester, New York, rarely raced, but quickly proved himself to be history's greatest progenitor of gait and speed.

Today, with more than 470 racing meetings offered annually in the United States—from the small country fair to the giant tracks of New York City—pacers far outnumber trotters, with purists in the sport concerned about the preservation of the trotting gait.

While the entire sport of Standardbred racing has been threatened in recent years by factors such Off-Track Betting, all-sports wagering, lotteries, and casino gambling, it has thus far remained a vibrant, colorful, exciting part of American life.







The Fairs

All the Standardbred racing offered in North America is not transpiring at the scores of brightly lighted pari-mutuel tracks spread across the land.

Harness racing is also very much alive and doing very well at the fairs, thank you.

The U.S. Trotting Association services some 400 fairs that offer harness racing, with the list including big and booming state exhibitions in Illinois, Indiana and New York. Some three million fans witness harness racing in the hot afternoons of summer.

Few of the fairs offer mutuel wagering, but almost all are rich in ferris wheels, multi-colored tents, hot dog stands, side shows,

exhibition halls, produce and livestock displays, and balloon vendors. Taken as a whole, fairs offer a cornucopia of sights and sounds, with harness racing—another distinct touch of Americana—adding spice to the entire production.

The nation's most prestigious Standardbred pacing race—The Little Brown Jug—is contested annually at the Delaware County Fair in Ohio. It lures crowds of nearly 50,000 each year.

Harness racing means fun and excitement wherever it is held, but there are few more pleasant experiences than sitting in the grandstand of a country fair on a warm, summer afternoon while trotters and pacers strut their stuff on the track below.

Harness Racing Lingo



Weanling/Yearling: All horses are considered weanlings from the time they are taken from their mothers until reaching their first birthday on January 1 (all horses celebrate their birthday on January 1, regardless of when they were born). A horse is called a yearling from the time he reaches age one until age two.

Colt/Horse: A male horse is considered a colt until he reaches his fourth birthday, when he becomes a horse.

Filly/Mare: A female horse is called a filly until she reaches her fourth birthday, when she becomes a mare.

Stallion: A male horse generally retired from racing that stands at stud at a breeding farm.

Dam: A mother of horses.

Green Horse: A horse that has not raced, or has raced only a few times.

Stretch: The last eighth-mile before the finish line of a given race track.

Covered Up: A horse in a race is covered up when he has other horses in front of him.

Break: Occurs when a trotter or pacer goes off his gait and resorts to galloping.

Jogging: Slow, steady tours of a race track or training track, much as a human jogs.

Choked Down: Occurs when a trainer or driver attempts to restrain or rate a horse and the animal's breathing is inadvertently cut off. The horse "blacks out" and often falls.

Boxed In: Surrounded by horses in front, behind and to the side of him, the horse is pinned to the hub rail.

Scoring: The brief warm-up sprints taken by horses between the post parade and the time they approach the starting gate.

Brush: The brief peak or peaks of speed reached by a horse in a race or training mile. Drivers like to preserve a horse's brush for the stretch drive.

Heat: One competitive mile in a race which requires two or more mile dashes to decide.

Maiden: Any horse, female or male, that has never won a race which carries a purse.

Lapped On: A horse is said to be lapped on another at the wire when its nose is at least opposite the hindquarters of the horse ahead.

Parked Out: A trotter or pacer is parked out when the positions of his rivals prevent him from reaching the rail. A horse forced to race on the outside must travel a longer distance and rarely manages to win.

Garden Spot: A horse racing in second position on the rail is said to have the garden spot, since the horse ahead of him is cutting the wind, yet he is close enough to the front to make a strong bid in the stretch.

Claiming Race: A contest where any horse in the field may be purchased by an authorized person or persons who must file a claiming slip and deposit a check before the race goes to post.

Blowing Out: A fairly fast training mile generally two days before a horse is scheduled to race.

Cooling Out: Walking a horse after a race or training mile until his body signs return to normal.

Morning Line: The probable odds on each horse in a race as calculated by an experienced track handicapper.

Handle: The total amount of money waged on a race, a nightly racing program or an entire season.

Punter: Someone who bets on the horses.

Shut Out: Arriving at a betting window after the wagering has closed.

Frequently Asked Questions







How fast is a harness horse?

Races usually are contested at speeds averaging 25-30 miles per hour for the mile distance. When leaving the starting gate, speeds close to 35 miles an hour are reached by top horses.

What causes horses to break stride?

Several factors can cause breaks. A horse may be going too fast to maintain his gait. He may be tired. He may be interfered with. He may also be lame.

Why do drivers sometimes hold their horses back?

If a horse can go a mile in 2:05 and no more, a driver may pull back on him to "rate" him if the pace is too fast. Coming down the stretch, a driver may hold firmly to the lines to prevent a tired horse from breaking.

Does a driver's weight make a difference in driving?

For years the experts have been saying no, except under muddy conditions. Some observers have noticed, however, that a majority of the sport's leading drivers have tended to be on the small and light side.

Is it better for a horse to race along the rail?

Definitely. Mathematicians have figured that a horse racing five feet from the rail will travel 62 feet farther than the horse at the rail at the mile distance over a half-mile track

Is driving dangerous?

A certain amount of danger is inherent in any activity that combines great speed and split second timing in decision. Harness racing contains both speed and the need for quick decisions.

Why do some horses have their legs bandaged?

For the same reason that human athletes frequently wear tape and other bandages to help support their legs and provide protection.

What is the colored roll worn on the face of some horses?

That's a shadow roll, a large sheepskin type roll worn across the face, just below the eyes. It cuts off the horse's view of the track so he won't shy at shadows, pieces of paper or other objects.

Enclosed is a summary of Tennessee regulations and health requirements for livestock and poultry at fair shows, exhibitions, other shows and rodeos.

Special Comments:

- 1. It is expected that all exhibitors bring only healthy animals to fairs and exhibitions. Although state and federal animal health officials will be performing as many inspections as possible, fair officials are responsible for ensuring that all animals entering fairs for exhibition are in overall good health and are accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Animals showing clinical signs of contagious disease should be sent home immediately. Violations should be reported to the state veterinarian or her agent.
- 2. Certificate(s) of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) are to accompany all animal(s) to the respective shows with the exception of in-state Tennessee equine and poultry. In-state Tennessee equine six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months. Poultry assembled at shows or exhibitions should be accompanied by evidence of a negative test for Pullorum-Typhoid within 90 days or be tested on-site prior to exhibition following strict biosecurity procedures or originate directly from a flock which has been certified as Pullorum-Typhoid Clean under the Tennessee Poultry Improvement Plan. As part of increased awareness and surveillance for Avian Influenza and other poultry diseases, the physical appearance of all birds should be assessed at the time testing is conducted.
- 3. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection issued in satisfaction of these Tennessee Fair Regulations shall be good for <u>90</u> days for Tennessee livestock only.
- 4. Certificates of Veterinary Inspection demonstrate that the animal showed no signs of contagious disease at the time of veterinary exam and CVI issuance. Animals developing signs of disease after inspection but during the period the CVI is valid are still subject to rules refusing entry of animals with contagious diseases to exhibitions and shows.
- 5. Please note that exhibition requirements for out-of-state livestock are the same as regular import requirements.
- 6. Warts, ringworm, scabies, contagious ecthyma (sore mouth), foot rot, cutaneous fungaland bacterial infections (i.e. club lamb disease, caseous lymphadenitis, pinkeye/conjunctivitis) are considered contagious and infectious diseases and are NOT permissible.
- 7. All out-of-state poultry must originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and aH5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative official Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

Also, please note that if highly pathogenic avian influenza is detected in Tennessee or a neighboring state, commingling of poultry at fairs and exhibitions may be suspended.

Fair Biosecurity

Below is a summary of recommendations for fair management by the National Assembly of State Animal Health Officials and the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians to better protect fair attendees from disease:

- o Provide easy access to hand washing stations.
- o Post informational signage that includes the following messages:
 - No eating or drinking in the animal areas.
 - Wash hands frequently.
 - No pacifiers, sipping cups or strollers in the animal exhibition areas.
- o Discourage sleeping in the animal exhibition areas.
- o If human or swine influenza-like-illness is associated with the exhibition, animal healthand public health officials should be notified immediately.
- o People who have influenza-like illness should leave the exhibition immediately and seekmedical care. They should advise their health care provider about their fair attendance.
- People at high risk for developing severe complications from influenza should limit their exposure to swine.

Also, be aware of the potential exposure of fair attendees to Salmonella and E. coli 0157 from animals exhibited on the fairgrounds.

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

I. GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- B. All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

I. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. SWINE:

All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

B. CATTLE

All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with individual permanent, official identification.

Lactating Dairy Cattle residing within Tennessee and moving to an exhibition, show, or sale within Tennessee (intrastate movement) do not require pre-movement H5N1 testing.

C. POULTRY:

- (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.
- (2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

E. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

F. GOATS

- (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4
- G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE:

Captive Cervidae must have an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

- (1) CWD susceptible species must have two forms of identification (including official USDA ID)
- (2) CWD susceptible species must not move from a CWD affected County to a non-CWD affected County.

III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry):

Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

B. CATTLE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis.
- (2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis.

 Test eligible cattle Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)
- (3) Per the USDA Federal Order, all lactating dairy cattle originating outside the State of Tennessee must have a negative H5N1 test within seven (7) days of interstate movement. Lactating dairy cattle can move back to the state of origin within ten (10) days of test.

C. SWINE:

No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.

D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES:

Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.

E. POULTRY:

Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

F. SHEEP

- (1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. GOATS

- (1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- (3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
- H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.
- I. CERVIDAE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.
- (2) Tuberculosis:
 - (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or
 - (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.
- (3) Two forms of identification (including official USDA official ID)
- (4) CWD:

(a) CWD susceptible species must be from a CWD Certified Herd

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter and shall notify the State Veterinarian or her agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.

MGR Show Rules - Applicable to Shows A and B

- Goats must be registered by the Myotonic Goat Registry. The ORIGINAL registration certificate MUST
 accompany the goat during check-in. Kids under three (3) months of age must be registered for any sanctioned
 classes. No pending registrations will be accepted at check-in.
- 2. MGR Rules to govern and take precedence over all others.
- 3. Any issue not specifically addressed in these rules will be decided solely by the show personnel whose decisions will be final.
- 4. Age eligibility for classes will be determined by date of birth on the registration certificate.
- 5. The full correct registered name of goat must be used on the entry forms.
- 6. The name on the entry form must match the Breeder/Exhibitor name on the Reg. Certificate unless you have a signed transfer application dated 45 days or less from the show date.
- The goat's permanent ID (USDA Scrapie tag, tattoo, or microchip) must be on the Certificate (as recorded by MGR) and registered with MGR.
- Goats must be checked in from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 12th or 7:00 to 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, September 13th. All animals must enter grounds through the Amana Street entrance (back gate) and unload in designated area. Admission is free for Exhibitor only.



- 1. Open to all owners and breeders of Ayrshire, Guernsey, Holstein, Brown Swiss, Jersey, and Milking Shorthorn.
- 2. Youth members may show in the Junior Youth show who have completed 12th grade and under as of January 1, of the current calendar year in order to be eligible to exhibit their dairy animals in the Youth Dairy Show. Exhibitors must be able to show their animal by themselves. To receive Youth monies, animal must be shown by member whose name the animal is registered.

The champion and reserve champion bred by exhibitor will be selected from the highest placing bred by exhibitor animals in the classes and will receive a plaque. (Youth only).
- 6. All entries must be on the grounds by 2:00 p.m. the day they are to be shown. Animals shown will be released at 9:00 p.m. Animals must be out of barn by 8:00 a.m. the morning after their show.
- 7. Feed and equipment must be furnished by exhibitor.
- 8. Absolutely no straw allowed.
- 9. All animals must be exhibited by competent handler. Youth exhibits must be exhibited by the registered owner. No ring assistance unless approved by judge or superintendent.
- 10. Herdsman Award: This will be awarded to the individual keeping the cleanest and neatest exhibit, observance of all rules and regulations, and cooperation with Fair Officials and Exhibitors.
- 11. No exhibitors will be allowed to have more than two monies in any one class, but may have as many entries in a class as desired.
- 12. Any concerns in regard to the show rules need to be addressed to the barn superintendent prior to the show.
- 13. Competition is open to all Youth members who qualify under Rule 2.



Exhibitors must be able to show their animal by themselves. To receive Youth monies, animal must be shown by member whose name the animal is registered.
- 2. All beef cattle should be pre-registered by entry form deadline. Registration fee will be doubled when late. Youth members exhibiting in open show must pay entry fee on each animal shown. All entries must be recorded in show book by 3:00 P.M. day of show. No entries will be taken after books close.
- 3. Animals must be owned by exhibitors and evidence of registration presented. Youth animals must be registered 30 days or more prior to show.
- 4. Any new breed may be added to beef show with a pre-registration of 10 head by 2 different exhibitors. Show will be held on Thursday at 5:00 P.M.
- 5. Bred By Exhibitor To be eligible for awards, the exhibitor must be listed as both the sole breeder and owner of the animal on the registration paper. The champion and reserve champion bred by exhibitor will be selected from the highest placing bred by exhibitor animals in the classes and will receive a plaque. (Youth only).
- 6. All entries must be on the grounds by 2:00 P.M. the day they are to be shown. Animals shown will be released at 9:00 P.M. Animals must be out of barn by 8:00 a.m. the morning after their show.
- 7. Absolutely no straw allowed.
- 8. All animals must be exhibited by competent handler. Youth exhibits must be exhibited by the registered owner. No ring assistance unless approved by judge or superintendent.
- 9. Herdsman Award: This will be awarded to the individual keeping the cleanest and neatest exhibit, observance of all rules and regulations, and cooperation with Fair Officials and Exhibitors.
- 10. No exhibitors will be allowed to have more than two monies in any one class, but may have as many entries in a class as desired.
- 11. Bulls over 1 year must be shown with bull leads.
- 12. Any concerns in regard to the show rules need to be addressed to the barn superintendent prior to the show.
- 13. Competition is open to all Youth members who qualify under Rule 1.
- 14. All livestock must enter grounds through Amana Street gate (back gate) to load and unload at designated loading area. Free Admission for Exhibitor only.
