THIS IS VITAL: DO NOT CLICK "RESTORE" OR "RESTORE PAGES." Clicking this could bring the scary warning back! Choose "Start new session" or just close the message box. Open a fresh, new browser window yourself. What just happened? Why the scary message?

Criminals create these fake virus warnings. They want to scare you into calling the number on your screen. If you call, you'll likely reach scammers, often overseas. They'll sound urgent, maybe even threatening, claiming they're from Microsoft or your internet provider. They will lie. Their real goals are to:

• Trick you into giving them your credit card number to "fix" the non-existent problem.

• Convince you to install software that lets them take control of your computer remotely to steal your information or money.

 Pressure you into paying hundreds of dollars for nothing. Remember this: A real warning from Microsoft or your security software *never* looks like this, fills your whole screen, locks you out, or demands you call a phone number immediately. This was a scam attempt, not a real virus infection.

You outsmarted them! By shutting down completely and restarting without restoring browser pages, you stopped the scam. Keep this guide near your computer. If that scary warning pops up again, act fast: Unplug or Hold the Power Button for 30 seconds. Restart. Do NOT restore browser pages. Never call the number. Cut this article out, share it with friends, email me for a copy that you can send to loved ones. While we enjoy the phone calls and always love speaking to our customers, this can save us both a little time. Stay skeptical, my friends, until next time.

would indict numerous wealthy and famous individuals who would finally face prosecution for their suspected crimes. Furthermore, many evidence believed the would show what had long been suspected: that Epstein's death in a New York jail cell was not a result of suicide but of murder as part of a conspiracy of powerful people to ensure his silence.

This particular trick involves a recorded statement soon after an accident where the adjuster promises to wire money into your bank account for an oral but thorough release of all claims. The part that seems so reasonable is that they agree to pay for your medical expenses up through a certain date, usually 30 to 60 days from then or for a certain amount of money as long as the medical treatment is received by a certain date. People agree. The conversation is recorded. The money is wired and spent. Then the people find they can't get into the doctor for 30 to 60 days and they can't get the medical treatment they need.

Is that a valid release? It's certainly not in writing. I think any good lawyer could make an argument on either side. Once the money is accepted and spent, I think it makes the argument a lot tougher. Other companies are making offers "in the blind." Without knowing the extent of the injuries and soon after the accident they will make an offer of a couple of thousand dollars and will require a written release and that release is binding.

Certainly, and thankfully, there are plenty of accidents where no one is hurt. Sometimes people think they're going to get better, but they don't, or they have symptoms that develop within a few weeks. A disc herniation is a classic injury that can take time to develop symptoms. After that it's a matter of time before it's properly diagnosed and it can look like there's a delay, but that's a delay I can win, unless of course you have signed a release or given an oral release and spent the money.

congressmen. They bend the knee to President Trump, the MAGA herd, and donors. It is especially disappointing that Aderholt Congressman Aderholt voted for the reconciliation bill. He sits on the powerful House Appropriations Committee and understands the adverse implications of the new legislation.

The law includes continuation of earlier tax cuts, mainly for the wealthy, and more money for defense and immigration enforcement. This will be financed by slashing health, nutrition, and education funding and energy credits, and still produce a huge deficit that increases the national debt and interest payments.

Medicaid, which is losing \$1 trillion, currently provides health coverage to one million Alabama residents – over 20% of the population. Medicaid is the main health insurance lifeline for working families and support for rural hospitals. SNAP/food working stamps are vital to 376,000 households in our state, and that program faces devastating reductions.

New work requirements, which sound reasonable in principle but complicated to monitor, will result three million U.S.

recipients losing benefits. The so-called reforms involve increased paperwork and bureaucracy and will force the states to raise taxes and medical co-payments to maintain the programs - or allow our neediest neighbors to go without. Ironically rural areas that voted for Trump will suffer the most.

In short, the new law represents the biggest cut ever to programs for lowincome Americans and a boon for the wealthy. Keep that in mind when you next vote.

Medicare Minute "Signing up for Medicare Part 2"

Most Americans qualify for Medicare by turning 65 but there are other ways to qualify such as being disabled, having End Stage Renal disease (ESRD) or ALS. Today we are going to look at how you would sign up if you are disabled.

If you are under the age of 65 and disabled, you will automatically be enrolled in Part A and Part B after you have received Social Security or Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) benefits for at least 24 months. If you are disabled, covered by your or your spouse's group health plan and wish to stay on that plan, my suggestion is to contact the plan and confirm that you can remain on the plan even though you have Medicare. This may allow you to delay your Part B until a later date.

You are eligible for Medicare if you have End Stage Renal Disease and you've worked the required amount of time under Social Security, RRB or as a government employee OR you're already getting or are eligible for Social Security or RRB benefits OR you're the spouse or dependent child of one of the previous requirements. You should contact Social Security or the RRB for the amount of time worked to be eligible for Medicare.

If you're under 65 and have ALS your Medicare benefits should begin the first month you start receiving your Social Security or RRB benefits. Again contact Social Security or RRB for a list of the benefits.

Whether it's SSI or RRB disability, ESRD or ALS, I would encourage you to NEVER voluntarily leave your current health plan until you have covered all your bases with your current plan and Medicare. In most cases once you leave you cannot go back!! If you are faced with any of these 3 situations and need additional assistance feel free to contact our office.

Dear Dave. I just started listening to your radio show a few months ago, and I love your advice. I do have a question about the order of two of the Baby Steps, though. The list puts saving for retirement ahead of putting money aside for college if you have kids. Why do you suggest
