O's Barnhart is Iowa Legion Player of the Year

Bowden Barnhart of the Iowa Great Lakes Okobojis American Legion Baseball Team is the 2025 Iowa American Legion Baseball Player of the Year and the Recipient of the prestigious Iowa American Legion Baseball Scholarship.

Barnhart was honored on Sunday morning, July 13, at the

Milford Post#384 Legion Hall in Milford, Iowa, during their monthly Omelette Breakfast. Aphton Rocha presented this award and scholarship. She is the Baseball Representative for Milford Post #384.

This award and scholarship is facilitated through the Iowa American Legion and Programs Director Eric Less and Baseball Commissioner Mike Weber and the Iowa American Legion Baseball Committee. Players are nominated by their team, and nominations are submitted to Iowa Ameri-



can Legion Programs along with three letters of recommendation and testimony and also the player's application that includes, in part, their High School Record, College Plans, Career Interests, and Community Participation Record.

Barnhart is a four-year player, and the only four-year member ever of the Iowa Great Lakes Okobojis American Legion Baseball Team that is sponsored by Milford Post #384. He has been a versatile player over the years playing every position on the field, and has been a selfless player and a great teammate. Barnhart settled in at 3rd base and pitcher the last two years in during the spring season and has been a huge contributor to the success of the Okobojis these last four years. The Okobojis just finished their fifth spring season as an American Legion Baseball Team, beginning in the spring of 2021.

Barnhart is a 2025 graduate of Harris-Lake Park High School in Lake Park, Iowa, and will be attending Iowa Lakes Community College this fall in Estherville, Iowa.

During his recent high school summer season with the Wolves at HLP, Barnhart played shortstop and pitched. In the summer season for HLP Barnhart hit for a .320 average and had an On-Base Percentage of .485. On the base paths he had 9 stolen bases. And on the pitching mound for the Wolves, he was at his best, as Barnhart had a perfect 5-0 record and very impressive 53 strikeouts in 31.1 innings pitched. Batters hit only .107 against him, and he carried a miniscule 0.67 Earned Run Average giving up only 3 earned runs the entire season.

Harris-Lake Park Head Baseball Coach Jared Rahe says of Barnhart, "I have had the privilege of watching Bowden grow into a remarkable young man who exemplifies the values of leadership, perseverance, and integrity - qualities that align perfectly with the mission of American Legion Baseball."

Barnhart will now be nominated for the American Legion National Player of the Year. Also, every State Baseball scholarship winner shall be considered for the American Legion All Academic Team sponsored by Diamond Sports, the official baseball for American Legion national tournaments. Eight players selected by a scholarship selection committee at The American Legion World Series will receive an additional \$2,500 scholarship. A ninth player, selected as the most outstanding member of the All Academic Team, will be awarded an additional \$5,000 scholarship.

The Iowa Great Lakes Okobojis American Legion Baseball team plays a spring season with tryouts in February and a 22 game schedule on weekends in March and April. The Okobojis room closes from 12-12:30 for eighteen player roster this spring of 2025 came from ten differcleaning. Our Next Breakfast ent high schools. This year the games will be held from August 14 to 19 and are nationally televised. The Dubuque County American Legion Baseball Team advanced to the 2018 and 2021 American Legion World Series in Shelby, North Carolina, to represent Iowa and our Central Plains Region. Hate is NOT Welcome Here

This past weekend my younger sister Julie was in town with her incredibly intelligent and beautiful daughter, Mya, and two of her friends. Mya just graduated from Roosevelt High School in Des Moines and will be heading off to Kennesaw State just outside of Atlanta, Georgia, with her good friend Jasmine. They will be heading out the weekend of August 8th, so this was probably their last trip to the Iowa Great Lakes this summer, a place they have both visited many times and would probably consider a second home.

Mya and her two friends from Des Moines, who all happen to be Black, were soaking in everything that is wonderful about an Okoboji weekend; Michelle and I had taken them boating on Saturday afternoon, they enjoyed a dinner with my dad after boating, went to Arnolds Park on Saturday evening, took in part of the concert on Saturday night, and then later were walking down Broadway Street that night with another one of my nieces, Devina, who is also Black, when their weekend was shaken by one idiot who ran by them and screamed the "N" word at them. That was all it took for these four teenage girls to have an ideal weekend in an ideal place shattered by one bigoted idiot who then didn't even have the courage to look them in the eye but took off running like the coward he was.

While I know that a majority of people around are not bigoted idiots, sadly all it takes is a few to ruin things for everyone. As a white male, I can't understand what it's like for my niece to live her life as a Black female in a predominantly white state, but what I can do is empathize with her, and not sit silent when things like this happen to her in OUR community. My hope is the idiot who said this to Mya and her friends isn't from the Okoboji area, but it still happened here, and that is unacceptable. So, as you read this, you may wonder, what can I do to make sure something like this doesn't happen again in our area? After all, I'm only one person. Well, the first thing you can do is not sit in silence if you hear something like this happen or if you hear a racist statement; call that person out. The phrase "silence is acceptance" is so true when it comes to things like this; if you sit silent and let these comments continue to happen, you are part of the problem instead of being part of the solution. It goes back to the old TSA statement of if you see something, say something. The same goes true here: if you hear or see something being said or done, don't just sit there; say or do something.

One of the things I loved about coaching Division I basketball was the diversity it surrounded our family with. It showed our kids that skin color doesn't matter one bit; it showed them that kids from Charles City and Sioux Central, Iowa, could be close friends with kids from Nigeria and Compton, California; it showed them that what truly matters is what type of person you are and how you act. We live in one of the best areas of the world with some of the best people in the world, but we are definitely one of the least diverse areas of the world. While we can't really control our diversity, we can control how we treat people. Let's make it a goal to be one of the most inviting places in the world, and a place where hate is not welcome here!

Dear Tony,

I feel stuck. I want to change, to grow, to become better. But every time I try, it just feels hard—emotionally, mentally, even physically. Why does self-improvement come with so much struggle?

I'm glad you asked, because it's a question I think more people wrestle with than they care to admit. We all love the idea of growth-but we don't always love the process. That's because true transformation doesn't happen without friction. It rarely comes wrapped in ease or comfort.

Years ago, I heard a quote by Alexis Carrel that hit me hard: "Man cannot remake himself without suffering, for he is both the marble and the sculptor." Think about that for a moment. You're not just the artist dreaming of change-you're also the stone being reshaped by your own hand.

We often want to chisel away the things we don't like about ourselves: impatience, fear, bad habits, limiting beliefs. But what we forget is that chiseling-real chiseling-requires effort. It's loud. Messy. Sometimes painful.

In 2005, I was passed over for a role I had been working toward for years. It was humbling-and if I'm honest, it hurt. I had checked all the boxes, taken all the right steps, and built what I thought was a strong case. But someone else was chosen.

I could have stayed stuck in resentment. Instead, I asked myself a hard question: What is this trying to teach me?

That season became one of the most transformational periods of my life. I didn't just polish the surface-I went deep. I sought feedback I didn't want to hear. I confronted blind spots I didn't know I had. I invested in books, mentors, and moments of uncomfortable self-honesty.

Was it easy? Not for a second. But slowly, I started to see change-not just in what I did, but in who I was becoming. And a year later, a different door opened. One I wouldn't have noticed before.

Here's the truth:

Growth hurts. But so does staying the same. One kind of pain leads to purpose. The other leads to regret.

If you're in the middle of something hard right now—maybe trying to break a pattern, shift a mindset, or rebuild after a loss don't beat yourself up for struggling. You're doing sacred work. You're reshaping a life.

And you're not alone.

Here are four reminders for anyone walking through the fire of transformation:

1. Don't fear the friction.

It means you're doing the work. The discomfort is not a sign of failure – it's evidence of growth. Embrace it. Let it sculpt you. 2. Progress isn't always visible.

Just because you can't see immediate change doesn't mean it's not happening. Some breakthroughs take time to rise to the surface. Keep going.

3. Get help with the hammer.

Even the best sculptors need apprentices and advisors. Surround yourself with people who see your potential-and aren't afraid to challenge you to reach it.

4. Remember what you're building.

This isn't just about removing flaws. It's about revealing something beautiful, strong, and uniquely you.

The person you're becoming? They're worth the struggle. So to the person who wrote in: if it feels hard, it's because it

- 2 tablespoons paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper 2 tablespoons garlic powder

- 13 ounces barbecue sauce, low sugar, if possible 1 ounce flat-leaf parsley, torn



8 hours. After chilling, remove the ribs from the fridge. Preheat a gas or charcoal grill to about 300° F. Cook the ribs on the grill, covered with a lid, until the meat is tender and pulls away from the bone, about 2 hours. As the ribs cook, periodically brush them with some barbecue sauce, reserving any unused sauce. When ready, remove the ribs from the grill and let them rest under aluminum foil for at least 10 minutes. After resting, brush the ribs with any reserved barbecue sauce before cutting and serving with a garnish of parsley.
