### **AN OUTSTANDING CAREER AS AN AUCTIONEER**



Ronnie Buchanan lives at Hallsville, a little place near Marshall. He spent 60 years as an auctioneer.

"I enjoyed it immensely," he says. "I did from three to six cattle sales a week."

After his junior year in high school, Mr. **Tumbleweed Smith** Buchanan went to auctioneer school at A & M.

"Auctioneering kind of appealed to me. I just wanted to try it." After high school he went to work for his father who had auction barns. His salary was \$75 a week. "One day I was in Homa, Louisiana and the auctioneer didn't show up. They knew I had been to auctioneering school and asked me to do it. I did my first sale right then. That evening that man paid me \$160. I went back and told daddy I was going to be an auctioneer.

"In the seventies, eighties and nineties I would sell five to six calves a minute. One every ten seconds. That's pretty fast. I was selling 10,000 head of cattle a week. I never had trouble finding a job. I would make the cattle bring what they were worth. That was one reason I didn't have trouble getting work. I would take the cattle myself if they were too cheap. And everybody knew it."

Occasionally he did three sales in one day.

"I just liked it."

Mr. Buchanan retired last December. At his peak he could sell livestock. He demonstrated his auctioneering skill: "Okay we'll sell this cow by the head. Five and a quarter, five fifty, five hundred seventy five, six hundred, six and a quarter, six and a half, six seventy five, seven hundred, seven and a quarter and a half, three quarters, eight hundred eight and a quarter. Sold it."

Just numbers increasing upward. No trademark phrases between numbers. Just no-nonsense style of auctioneering making the item being auctioned the main attraction. I told him he must be an auctioneering legend.

"That's what 's what everybody says," he modestly replied.

When I interviewed Mr. Buchanan, he spoke in a soft voice. I could barely hear him. He says that's the way he saved his voice, something he had to do when he had so much auctioneering to do. He used the best microphones, amplifiers and speakers money could buy.

"That's the only thing that kept me from straining my voice all those years. I talked real low. Didn't' scream into the microphone. I let the sound equipment do the work. Turned it up real loud."

All the time he was auctioneering he had a herd of cattle. He is still in the cattle business and says he will be as long as he can find places to lease.

### **Prescription Drugs and Vitamin D: An Overlooked Interaction That Matters**

In our fast-paced, symptom-focused healthcare system, it's easy to overlook the nuanced relationship between nutrients and medications. One such relationship—often ignored—is between prescription drugs and vitamin D, the "sunshine vitamin." As more people turn to long-term medication use for chronic conditions, a silent deficiency epidemic is unfolding that may be worsened by the very treatments meant to help.

Vitamin D plays a critical role in bone health, immune function, mood regulation, and even cardiovascular health. Yet an estimated 40% of U.S. adults are deficient, and the numbers are higher in older populations and people with chronic illnesses. What many don't realize is that some commonly prescribed medications can interfere with vitamin D absorption, metabolism, or activation—leading to worsening deficiency symptoms that may be misattributed to disease progression or aging.

Among the most well-known culprits are corticosteroids, anticonvulsants, weight loss drugs, and cholesterol-lowering statins. For example, corticosteroids like prednisone can impair vitamin D metabolism and reduce calcium absorption, contributing to bone loss and increased fracture risk—especially concerning for people with autoimmune disorders or asthma who use steroids long-term.

Similarly, antiepileptic drugs like phenytoin or phenobarbital increase the breakdown of vitamin D in the liver, often leading to osteomalacia (soft bones) and muscular weakness. Cholestyramine, a cholesterol-lowering resin, binds bile acids and reduces fat absorption, interfering with the uptake of fat-soluble vitamins like D, A, E, and K.

Even popular over-the-counter acid reducers, such as proton pump inhibitors (PPIs) like omeprazole, may reduce stomach acid to the point that nutrient absorption—including calcium and vitamin D—is compromised. This has major implications for older adults already at risk for falls and fractures.

What's worse, few clinicians regularly screen for vitamin D levels in patients on long-term prescriptions unless there's an obvious red flag like osteoporosis or rickets. The symptoms of deficiency—fatigue, joint pain, mood changes, frequent infections—can be vague and easily dismissed.

So, what can be done? First, awareness must rise—among both clinicians and patients. Medication reviews should include nutrient depletion risks, and patients should feel empowered to ask about how their prescriptions may affect vitamin status. Second, routine vitamin D screening should be considered in high-risk groups, especially those on long-term medications known to interfere with vitamin D metabolism. Lastly, supplementation should be discussed—not as a cure-all, but as a preventive tool, guided by lab results and individualized needs.

In functional and integrative medicine, we recognize that healing doesn't happen in isolation. The body's systems—and its nutrients are interconnected. By bridging the gap between pharmaceuticals and nutrition, we can offer safer, more holistic care that supports resilience rather than just disease management.

Vitamin D isn't just a wellness buzzword—it's a foundational hormone-like nutrient that deserves a permanent place at the table when discussing long-term medication use. Because the question isn't just what drug a person is on—but what it's silently depleting.
