

In tentative sale agreement, Cub Foods in Baxter to close in September

Miner's Inc. to purchases local Cub and SuperValu grocery stores

A major shift is coming to the grocery landscape in the Brainerd Lakes area as Miner's Incorporated announced Tuesday, July 15, that it has reached a tentative agreement to purchase S&R Quisberg Inc.'s Cub Foods and Supervalu grocery stores in Brainerd, Baxter, and Pequot Lakes. The agreement is poised to bring significant changes to the region, including a permanent store closure and employee layoffs.

Miner's, a fourth-generation family-owned grocery chain operating as Super One Foods, confirmed that the Cub Foods location in

Baxter will close in September 2025. According to a statement from the company, the closure is part of the market's need for "consolidation and efficiency." The move is expected to impact local shoppers and employees alike, with 235 people currently working at the three affected stores.

For employees, the closure means permanent layoffs starting September 25, 2025. While this news is difficult, Miner's has reassured those impacted by the closure that they will be offered interviews for employment with Super One Foods. Many of

the workers at these stores are represented by UFCW Local 663 Union, which will likely play a role in supporting them through this transition.

S&R Quisberg, which has been serving the Brainerd Lakes area since 1985. The Quisberg family has long been a staple of the local retail grocery scene, and the sale marks the end of an era for the family-owned business.

While the Baxter location will close, the other stores in Brainerd and Pequot Lakes are set for an immediate rebrand as Super One Foods. Miner's, which has operated in the Brainerd Lakes area for over 40 years, intends to overhaul these stores as part of the acquisition, including changes to retail pricing, product layouts, and branding.

The acquisition is still in the due diligence phase. Upon completion, Miner's will own and operate 33 retail stores spread across northern Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Michigan, making it a significant player in the regional grocery market.

Miner's, headquartered in Hermantown, near Duluth, has become a dominant force in northern Minnesota

grocery stores and 11 liquor retail over the past 80 years. The company's expansion into the Brainerd Lakes area is expected to strengthen its presence in the region and provide an opportunity to further cement its legacy of family-owned, community-focused business.

Benefit for Granholm on July 19

When disaster struck in the early hours of May 15, Joe Granholm lost everything except his life and the loyal dog who helped save it. Granholm's life changed in an instant when a fire tore through his home in the middle of the night. He was asleep when his dog, Molly, began urgently pawing at his face just after 1:30 a.m., waking him up in time to hear the sounding smoke alarms and discover the house rapidly filling with smoke. Thanks to Molly's per-

sistence, the quick response of a neighbor and the local police, Granholm and his beloved dog escaped the blaze through a window. He was later airlifted to Hennepin County Medical Center (HCMC), where he was treated overnight for severe smoke inhalation.

The benefit is more than a fundraiser — it's a symbol of a tight-knit community showing up when one of their own needs it most.


