



• Brainerd—August 8: Crow Wing County Land Services building (lower level), 322 Laurel Street, Brainerd

• Garrison—August 14: Garrison City Hall, 27069 Central Street, Garrison

• Crosslake—August 22: Crosslake City Hall, 13888 Daggett Bay Road, Crosslake

While nitrates occur naturally in foods like spinach and carrots, high levels in your drinking water could spell trouble. Question Two proposes a \$6 million investment in a new community wellness and recreation center attached to the new PreK-6 school. Question Two can only pass if Question One also passes.

"Having served our district since 1957, Rippleside is deteriorating and no longer meets the needs of our students and staff," said Superintendent Dan Stifter. "This
