Some 300 people live in the community of Burton, not far from Brenham. In 1823 the Schwartz and Schwartz Mercantile opened for business in Burton. During the past 102 years the building has been a variety of stores, cafus, beer joints and various other enterprises. The woman who had it the longest, Annie Boehnemann, named it the A

Tumbleweed Smith TAVERN White Horse Cafa and placed a statue of a white horse in front of the building.

Allison Crowson of Brenham had a 29-year career as a school teacher, ending up as assistant principal at Brenham High School. She was also a church organist and played piano Saturday nights at the Pig and Whistle, a London style pub in Burton. "The White Horse became available and the landlord talked me into buying it and I've had it 13 years."You can't help but like Allison. She is extremely outgoing and loves She also plays polka music on accordion for an audience of people with Czech and German origins. "We have so much fun. They sing along with me. I don't speak either language, so sometime I don't know what I'm singing. But I love the music. It's happy music and has a lot of humor in it. Polka is very popular in this part of the state."

She also does tribute shows all over the state. "The first one I did was Loretta Lynn. It was a big hit. Then I did Tammy Wynette, Patsy Cline, Dolly Parton and Jeannie C. Riley. Jeannie lives in Brenham and came to see me singing her songs. That was a fun night." She does a big show in the American Legion Hall every summer that draws a big crowd and is a benefit for Burton Bridge, a non-profit ministry that provides medical and nutritional help for seniors and others who need help. It also has a food pantry.

Allison named her place the White Horse Tavern and cafa and has beer and wine. "I'm open for lunch Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, then open evenings Thursday, Friday and Saturday." On special occasions, she'll serve a meaty concoction called Cowboy Spaghetti served with creamed corn and fresh hot garlic bread.

After dealing with school kids for so long, she has learned a lot about human behavior. "I've found out that being a bar tender is a lot like being an assistant high school principal. " She sometimes rents out the tavern. People have a lot of fun here. It's used for pizza parties, Bible study, LEGO sessions for kids, wedding showers and other activities. "Anything to pay the bills." she says. "There's a group of retired men who come here on Tuesdays to drink and visit. They kept me afloat during Covid. I have a lot of fun here and get to hear some good stories. It's a great place to play music, enjoy a meal and be with friends."



Country Singer Jeannie Seely dies at 85

NEW YORK (AP) — Jeannie Seely, the soulful country music singer behind such standards like "Don't Touch Me," has died. She was 85.

Her publicist, Don Murry Grubbs, said she died Friday after succumbing to complications from an intestinal infection.

Known as "Miss Country Soul" for her unique vocal style, Seely was a trailblazer for women in country music, celebrated for her spirited nonconformity and for a string of undeniable hits in the '60s and '70s.

Her second husband, Gene Ward, died in December. In May, Seely revealed that she was in recovery after undergoing multiple back surgeries, two emergency procedures and spending 11 days in the ICU. She also suffered a bout of pneumonia.

"Rehab is pretty tough, but each day is looking brighter and last night, I saw a light at the end of the tunnel.

And it was neon, so I knew it was mine!" she said in a statement at the time. "The unsinkable Seely is working her way back."

Dolly Parton was one of several country music luminaries paying her tribute on Friday, saying she met Seely when they were both young and start-

ing out in Nashville.

"She was one of my dearest friends," Parton said on her social media accounts. "I think she was one of the greater singers in Nashville and she had a wonderful sense of humor. We had many wonderful laughs together, cried over certain things together and she will be missed."

Seely was born in July 1940, in Titusville, Pennsylvania, about two hours north of Pittsburgh and raised in nearby Townville. Her love of country music was instant; her mother sang, and her father played the banjo. When she was a child, she sang on local radio programs and performed on local television. In her early 20s, she moved to Los Angeles to kick-start a career, taking a job with Liberty and Imperial Records in Hollywood.

She kept writing and recording. Nashville was next: She sang on Porter Wagoner's show; she got a deal with Monument Records. Her greatest hit would arrive soon afterward: "Don't Touch Me," the crossover ballad written by Hank Cochran. The song earned Seely her first and only Grammy Award, for best country & western vocal performance in the female category.
