

The Union First: Community and Commitment in the First Iowa Infantry, on Tuesday, September 9, at 7:00 p.m. at the Dickinson County


Museum (1708 Keokuk Ave, Spirit Lake, IA 51360) as part of our HistoryLives! presentation series. She will tell the story of the very first young men from Iowa to enlist in the Civil War and of their commitments to reunite the Union. The story is based on the diaries of

George Burmeister Company K, Cedar Rapids; Eugene Ware Company E, Burlington; and the newspaper reports of Franc Wilkie, who was assigned to travel with the First Iowa Infantry throughout their ninety days of duty in the summer of 1861. Randee has spent the last seven years researching the history of how Civil War broke out in Missouri and how the Iowa soldiers marched COMMUNITY AND COMMITMENT IN THE FIRST IOWA INFANTRY through Missouri under brutal conditions and fought in the RANDEE FIESELMANN Battle of Wilson's Creek.

Randee Fieselmann has a PhD in sociology from the

University of Iowa and taught at the University of Iowa and at Coe College as a visiting assistant professor. Randee and her husband, John, who grew up in Spencer, now live in Iowa City and spend summers at Lake Okoboji.












I feel like I'm just going through the motions lately, and I can't help but feel like a failure. How do I make my life feel more meaningful?

I get it—because I've been there. In fact, one of the most formative chapters of my life started with what felt like total failure. My freshman year of engineering school, I failed calculus. Not "barely scraped by" failed—completely failed. For someone who had always been a good student, it was a blow to my confidence and my sense of direction. I remember walking out of the professor's office after getting my grade, wondering if

I'd made a huge mistake choosing engineering at all. After a few days of feeling sorry for myself, I made a decision. I would take a step back, figure out what went wrong, and try again. I retook the class, approached it differently, and asked for help when I needed it. Slowly, the numbers and formulas started to make sense. Over the next few years, I not only passed every math class, I aced them—including differential equations and advanced calculus.

That experience taught me something I've carried with me ever since: the hard seasons and the moments we'd rather erase often become the most valuable threads in the tapestry of our lives. They give the picture its depth, texture, and color.

The victories, the disappointments, the detours—they're all part of our becoming. Some threads are gold, shimmering with joy and success. Others are dark, pulled from seasons of difficulty. But together, they create something unique. And more often than not, those darker threads are where the richest lessons are woven.

We don't just live life—we create it. Every day, we can lean in or drift through. Some days, leaning in means tackling a challenge head-on. Other days, it means pausing to appreciate something beautiful or connecting deeply with someone we love.

If you're "drifting through the ether", here are a few ways to start weaving richer threads into your days: 1. Name the experience you want. Each morning, ask your-

- self, What do I want to experience today? Maybe it's connection, learning, or simply joy. Let that guide your actions. 2. Say yes to small adventures. Break the routine in simple
- ways—walk a new path, try a new food, or talk to someone you haven't met before. 3. Capture the day. Write down one moment from each day that mattered to you. Over time, you'll notice beauty you
- 4. Lean into the hard stuff. My failed calculus was an obstacle, but it became the very thing that built my confidence

and persistence. Challenges often carry our greatest growth. 5. **Share your experiences.** The lessons you've learned might

be exactly what someone else needs to hear. When I look back now, I wouldn't erase that failure—even if I could. It's part of the fabric of who I am, and it taught me that every experience has value if we're willing to learn from it.

So if life feels like it's on autopilot, remember—you hold the brush. You can add color. You can add texture. You can make it beautiful. And when you step back one day to see the whole tapestry, you might realize that even the dark threads had their place—and that together, they've created something far more beautiful than you imagined.






Be Kind!

"Student Support Services helps level the playing field and equips our students with the tools and confidence

Nationally, the SSS program has a proven track record. According to a rigorous 2019 evaluation by the U.S. Department of Education, students in SSS at two-year institutions were 48% more likely to earn an associate's degree or transfer to a four-year school. Students at four-year institutions were 18% more likely to earn a bachelor's degree compared to similar peers not in the program.

"TRIO programs generally and TRIO-SSS, in particular, transform students from the least resourced backgrounds into college graduates," said Kimberly Jones, president of the Council for Opportunity in Education in Washington, D.C. Ruthven Fire Department Launches Online Fundraising Campaign to Build New Fire Station

Ruthven, Iowa - The Ruthven Fire department, a 100% volunteer-run emergency service serving the City of Ruthven,

Iowa, Lost Island Township, Lake Township, Freeman Township, has launched an online fundraising campaign and set up an account at the Iowa State Bank in Ruthven to raise \$800,000 for the construction of a new, modern fire station.

The campaign, which is hosted through the department's Face-

book page and official website, allows community members and supporters to make small, secure donations via Venmo with the goal of building a station that meets current safety, equipment, and personnel needs.

"Every dollar truly makes a difference," said Fire Chief Kevin Bates. "Whether it's \$1, \$5, \$10, or more, we're inviting our communities alike to help us in coming together and help us build a safer future."

The current station, built in 1978, is no longer appropriate for today's fire and rescue needs. It lacks space for contemporary equipment, training areas, and safe volunteer accommodations during emergencies.

"We've been in tight spots before; on Mother's Day 1977, said Fire Chief Bates "our fire station burned down, resulting in a total loss." We were fortunate, we were able to reconstruct. Fire departments in surrounding areas donated fire trucks to assist with the rebuild," He recalls his father's time as a firefighter with this department. Chief Bates' family has a lengthy history of fire service.

Banana and Pecan Granola Bowl with Caramelized Bananas

- 2 tablespoons coconut oil 4 tablespoons maple syrup 2 very ripe medium bananas 1 teaspoon almond extract 100 grams (3.5 ounces) oats of your choice 3 tablespoons unsweetened shredded coconu
- tablespoons ground almonds 3 tablespoons sunflower seeds
- tablespoons chopped nuts, such as hazelnuts or almonds 40 grams (1.4 ounces) pecans Pinch of sea salt
- For the caramelized bananas:
- Coconut yogurt 1 teaspoon maple syrup (optional) Pinch of thyme (optional)
- 2 unpeeled bananas 1 tablespoon coconut oil To serve:
- Preheat the oven to 350° F. Blend the coconut oil, maple syrup, bananas, and almond extract in a blender until smooth. Add all the dry ingredients to a large bowl and mix well. Add the wet mixture to the bowl and stir well to combine. Line a large baking tray with baking paper and then tip the granola mix on to the tray and flatten out. Bake for 25 minutes, until starting
- to brown. Carefully flip over on the tray, then return to the oven and bake for a further 15 minutes (until you get a nice brown color). Leave to cool before breaking into smaller chunks, then store in an airtight container for up to 1 week (if not eating straight away). To make the caramelized bananas, chop off the top end of each of the bananas, then carefully slice through the middle lengthways. Now, peel the bananas. Melt the coconut oil in a pan on medium heat. Add the banana slices and fry in the oil on one side for 1 to 2 minutes until browned, then flip over to caramelize the other side for another 1 to 2 minutes. 





10th Annual Okoboji Blue Water Festival Another Huge Success

OBWF Publicity As Joe Henry, fishing clinician for last Saturday's Okoboji Blue Water Festival (OBWF) walked to the Big Tent around 8 a.m., to make sure that everything was ready for his 9:30 a.m. seminar, there was concern with rain starting to come down and heavy rain to the southeast as near as Emmetsburg (2.5"). As we worked beneath the Big Tent, the rain picked up and I worried what's going to happen? Will anybody

The answer: oh, my yes! By 9:30 nearly 150 people were in the audience, young and old alike! As I looked around, the green space, the Chalkstock artists were hard at work, people were beginning to mingle along Exhibitors' Row, families were heading to the Kids' Activities! Things were good, and it only got better highlighted by an enthusiastic crowd at the "Clean Water Panel."

 $OBWF co\text{-}chair\,Greg\,Drees\,reflected\,on\,the$ day. "Most certainly, Julie (co-chair) and I were concerned with the weather conditions early. However, we watched the radar, and there was the chance most of the rain would go south of us. Thankfully it did, and all we can say is thanks to vendors, workers, volunteers and speakers for hanging in there. It turned out to be a great, great day.

Exhibitors' Row More than 30 clean water exhibitors, a mix of lake protective associations, conservation organizations, & non-profit organizations shared their clean water message or natural resource message with all of the festival visitors. John Smeltzer, president of the Spirit Lake Protective Association, shared his thoughts. "We had a short rain delay at the start of the morning but quickly came to realize that most good Iowa rain was 'Blue Water', too, and jumped back into the game as the lightning moved out. The crowd was sparse at 9 and in the rain, but by 10 it was two and three deep along the entire length of the Promenade and virtually everyone had literature, food or a drink in hand. We noted time residents who had moved away from the dation; Larry Stone, photographer, naturalist, the band sang continuously without a break IGLs but came back this weekend for the Blue Water Festival and all of the attendant events."

Meanwhile, at the Okoboji Protective Association's booth, President John Fieselmann noted that out-of-town visitors to the festival wanted to learn about OPA's goals concerning water quality, wetlands and invasive species, while locals asked what OPA perceived as its most pressing issues. "They were effusive in their praise of our efforts to share water quality data on phosphorus and nitrate levels, E. coli, algae, and water clarity. They were appreciative of the efforts of the many volunteers, collaborations with the other lakes' associations and conservancies, the DNR, and the Lakeside Laboratory."

For the Iowa Great Lakes Fishing Club (IGLFC), it was a day for organizing a kids' casting contest while sharing the club's mission and goals. According to Terry Thomson, club president, "We enjoyed visiting with both current members and signing up new members, while at the same time, it was fun for us to work with the youngsters during the casting contest. Most importantly, they had fun, and all came away with a prize! It was also great to have Joe Henry here and for us to sponsor Joe for his fishing clinic! It was great to have Joe spend much of the day with anglers as they stopped by the booth."

Fishing Seminar

Joe Henry, Executive Director of Lake of the Woods Tourism, spoke with an angler's enthusiasm sharing the secrets of his topic: "Master's Level: Spinners for Walleyes." Henry noted, "The nice thing about using a crawler harness is that you can fish them almost anywhere, shallow or deep, open water or weeds, rocks and reefs, clear or stained water and in lakes or rivers."

Henry included everything from hooks and line and nuances to fish a nightcrawler and bottom bouncer trolling at 1.0-1.5 mph and keeping the line at a 45-degree angle. Henry said, "Length of the harness depends on water clarity. The clearer the water, the longer the snell.

His closing message was sharing the mission: KEEP IT CLEAN, a clean water initiative started on the Lake of the Woods in 2012. Over 60 organizations and over 1200 lakes now support the initiative with a new Keep It Clean Law now on the books in the state of Minnesota. Henry hopes that Iowans will consider joining this effort and making it KEEP IT CLEAN in Iowa to go along with the mission of the Okoboji



These are her thoughts on the Clean Water Panel, "The Okoboji Blue Water Festival gives everyone a $chance \, to \, pause \, and \, think \, about \, how \, important$ clean water is to all living things. This year the Clean Water Panel brought many current issues to the forefront with the opinions from government, non-profit conservation and a conservation journalist. Discussion included examples of what has been accomplished to date but also included their concerns for the future. It is their hope to continue to partner to enhance conservation in the Iowa Great Lakes and beyond. My husband, Walt and I both felt it was time well spent learning about the partnerships that exist between government and the non-profit sectors to promote conservation in Iowa."

2025 Butterfield Steam & Gas Engine Show | Voss Park, Butterfield, MN | Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 16-17

The Butterfield Threshermen will hold their 58th annual Steam and Gas Engine Show Saturday and Sunday, August 16-17, at Voss Park on the west edge of Butterfield, Minnesota, just off Minnesota Highway 60 in southwest Minnesota. Saturday, the Tanner Stark Band will take the stage at 8:00 p.m. On Sunday, the 8:30 a.m. open-air church service will feature some of the bluegrass groups.

Several steam engines and antique tractors will thresh about ten acres of wheat and oats during the show. Over 250 antique tractors, from Rumleys to Hart Parrs, will be on display. Equipment will parade on Saturday afternoon at 2:15 p.m. and Sunday at 3:15 p.m. along with classic cars and trucks.

This year's feature is Case tractors and equipment. There will be several examples on display during the 2025 show.






