# Hopps appointed as next Crow Wing County Attorney

In a unanimous decision, the Crow Wing County Board has appointed Kelsey Hopps as the next Crow Wing County Attorney, effective upon the retirement of current County Attorney Don Ryan on September 12, 2025. Hopps will serve the remainder of Ryan's elected term, through December 31, 2026, with an election for a full four-year term scheduled for November 3, 2026.

At the August 12, 2025, board meeting, the County Board expressed their full confidence in Hopps, recognizing her as the ideal candi-

date to continue the work of the office.

"We knew the retirement was coming down the pipeline, and we took a close look at the deep bench strength of our staff and asked them to apply. Encouraging internal applications reflects our commitment to a healthy organizational culture and the incredible talent we've cultivated over the years," said County Board Chair Steve Barrows. "The board is extremely confident in Kelsey's ability to take the baton and ensure a smooth

# Motorcycle club aims to prevent teen suicide through Smiles for Jake

Moose, of the Iron Range Motorcycle Club, Cuyuna chapter, is saddened by teen suicide. "In my family and friends group we've had five in the last two years," said Moose.

The Iron Range Motorcycle Club, Cuyuna Chapter, is affiliated with the Mesabi Range Club. Cuyuna maintains a clubhouse in rural Brainerd and has members from throughout the region: Hillman, Garrison, Pierz, Little Falls, Brainerd, Crosby, Aitkin and Cohasset. The Mesabi Range Chapter has existed since 1973, and the years old.

Moose explains: "We used to have a Sugar Ride where we donated the proceeds to diabetes-based charities. We like to keep our funds local and decided to donate this year's funds to Smiles for Jake, to prevent teen suicide.

"We are a charity-oriented non-profit organization," explained Goat Olson, club founder. "Our mission is to try to have an impact on our community in a positive way. All events and runs we do always pick a charity of some sort to help. In the past we've given to community food banks and to families

fire. The proceeds from the next event will be to combat domestic violence and teenage suicide.

Sarah Smith, the new executive director of Smiles for Jake, met the club members at their clubhouse to accept a \$2,000 donation from their ride on May 24, 2025. Throughout the motorcycle riding season, the club has eight ride events hosted by themselves and the Mesabi chapter. They also meet and ride informally for companionship.

The May 24 ride convened at Dunmires, Brainerd. They rode to the Pickled Loon Emtwo bars in Palisade -- The Rustic and They Muni. They proceeded to Block North in Aitkin and finished off at the Garrison VFH

"We have lots of stops and we raise money through entry fees, raffles and donations of cash.," Moose said of the fundraising. All the money is raised through the ride with the establishments throwing in to increase the total.

**About Smiles for Jake** 

Jake Haapajoki was your average 16-year-old kid. He was a son, a brother, a nephew, a cousin, a grandson, a friend, a boyfriend, an athlete, and active in his church. Jake had a family that loved and supported him in all he did. Jake's smile was nearly constant when he was in the presence of his friends and social environments. His smile could light up a room like no other. His wild hair and a unique love for his handsome self. He loved candy.

Jake couldn't see an end to his pain. Jake made a mistake. Suicide is always a mistake. Jake took his life on February 21, 2018.

Jake's family and friends, through their despair and grief, have launched the Smiles for Jake Movement to begin work to eliminate suicide and provide hope to all that suffer from darkness and despair. The hashtag #wearealljake was created to represent everyone needing an extra smile, a hug, a high five, kind words, or simply a moment of attention.

### What does the S.M.I.L.E. Advocate Program Teach?

S.M.I.L.E. (Supporting, Mentoring, Inspiring Life in Everyone) advocates mental health awareness and suicide prevention programs to educate individuals on

his shoes were dominant in various aspects related to mental health and suicide prevention.

This program is taught to area businesses, teachers and bus drivers for a one hour CEU and they also teach directly to students in 9-12th grades.

Advocates who volunteer for Smiles for Jake learn to recognize suicide warning signs, such as mood changes, expressions of hopelessness, social withdrawal and giving away possessions. The program emphasizes taking any mention of suicidal thoughts seriously and seeking help immediately.



# Minnesota DNR cautions wild rice harvesters to make sure rice is ripe

Wild rice season opened Aug. 15 and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources reminds harvesters that rice stands must be ripe before they can be legally harvested.

"The green rice law helps protect wild rice for future years by requiring people to wait until rice is ripe before harvesting," said Ann Geisen, Minnesota DNR wildlife lake specialist. "People interested in harvesting need to know the regulations and can check out our website and newsletter for wild rice conditions this year, tips on harvesting and other important information to know before heading

Harvesters are allowed to take ripe wild rice during the harvesting season that runs from Aug. 15 through Sept. 30, but Minnesota's green rice law makes it illegal to harvest unripe or "green" rice, even within the dates of the harvest season. So, although rice beds might look like they are ready, ricers must make sure the grain is ripe and falling easily from the stalk before

attempting to harvest it. Harvesters are required to be licensed unless they are residents under 18 years of age and accompanied by a licensed harvester. Tribal band members who possess a

valid Tribal identification card from a federally recognized Tribe located in Minnesota are deemed to have a license to harvest wild rice, and do not need the additional state wild rice harvesting license.

Harvesters also need to know where it may be unlawful for them to harvest wild rice, including national parks, national wildlife refuges and on American Indian reservations. Details about these restrictions and other regulations are available on the Minnesota DNR website (mndnr.gov/regulations/wildrice/index.html).

Minnesota DNR Wildlife staff compile a wild rice

each year. The report will be available by Aug. 14 on the Minnesota DNR's wild rice management webpage (mndnr.gov/wildlife/shallowlakes/wildrice.html), along with license, regulation and safety information, and DNR contact information to call about local conditions.

Early reports from Minnesota DNR and Tribal biologists indicate highly variable conditions across central and northern Minnesota, with individual waters ranging from fair to great.

"Every year, DNR Wildlife staff remind harvesters of the importance of scouting

harvesting outlook report waters before the season begins," Geisen said. "This year scouting will be especially important to find sites with harvestable beds."

Higher water levels on lakes and rivers means most rice stands should be accessible by canoe.

The Minnesota DNR sends out periodic newsletters about rice harvesting topics. People can sign up to receive the email newsletters on the Minnesota DNR homepage (mndnr.gov) by finding the "Get email updates" box, entering an email address, and selecting the "Go" button. Then in the subscription list, check the box for "Wild rice

harvesting."

Since wild rice is ripening at the same time as Minnesota's early waterfowl hunting seasons, over-water waterfowl hunters are urged to be aware of wild ricers nearby no matter where they hunt. Those who plan to hunt the early teal season on the Leech Lake, White Earth, or Mille Lacs reservations should be aware of hunting restrictions on or near wild rice waters. Important information about these restrictions is available on page 9 of the Waterfowl Hunting Regulations available on the Minnesota DNR website (mndnr.gov/regulations/hunting).

sota Department of Human Services announced it is shutting down the Housing Stabilization Services program after widespread fraud was uncovered. fraud cases, federal investigators uncovered a large scheme where providers billed for services that were never delivered. Investigators found multiple cases of forged documents, fake service logs, and billing for tens of thousands of dollars per client. The FBI has already raided multiple organizations, and DHS has suspended payments to 77 providers based on credible allegations of fraud. More than 1,800 providers had been part of this program.

READER RIBBET

DHS now says it will shut the program down and begin working on a redesign. They admit the current structure lacks the safeguards to prevent fraud or protect the people who were supposed to be helped. Despite all this, the public still has no clear answers on how this fraud was allowed to grow or how much money has been lost.

Once again, this is deeply frustrating. Minnesotans work hard and expect their tax dollars to be used responsibly, but instead they are watching their tax dollars get stolen in some new fraud scheme with each passing day.

Catching these fraudsters isn't enough. We need real oversight, real transparency, and real accountability. And above all, we need to restore trust and make sure public programs are actually serving the people they were created



# Northland Foundation awards \$40,000 to McGregor KIDS PLUS

The Northland Foundation has awarded \$40,000 to McGregor KIDS PLUS Somethingcool, Inc., a Mc-Gregor-based nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting youth and families in Aitkin County. The grant is part of the foundation's latest round of quarterly grants, totaling \$680,000 distributed across northeastern Minnesota and Tribal Nation lands from April to June 2025.
