





of Alabama.

'Coach Kennard brought volleyball to the state of Alabama in the 1950s, and it all started here in Florence," said Johnson. I had the opportunity to inform Coach Kennard in person, and at 97 years old, she still has that coaching edge to her. The stories that she shared were inspirational and further evidence that she is worthy of this honor.

Coach Kennard was Title IX pioneer and relentless in her pursuit of opportunities for young women in sports. We are extremely lucky to have her as a member of our UNA Volleyball family."

Kennard's journey first started in Florence, where

and girls' basketball did not yet exist in the state.

For more than a decade, Kennard organized independent teams until girls high school sports were officially recognized in Alabama. In 1971, she led Bradshaw High School to the first AHŠAA state volleyball championship.

She spent 22 seasons at Bradshaw, coaching all girls' sports. During her tenure, she produced seven championships in volleyball and two titles in track & field. Kennard had an overall record of 150-82 in basketball and led Bradshaw to an area championship in the 1979-80 season. She was inducted into the Alabama High School Sports Hall of Fame in 1993.

Kennard also UNA connection to Volleyball, serving as the head coach during the 1974 season. In her lone year at the helm, she led the Lions to a runner-up finish in the state with a 28-8 record.



Dr. Jeff Goodwin, president of NWSCC, said the record enrollment reflects the college's growing impact in the region. "It truly is amazing to see the increasing number of students we have been able to serve," Goodwin said. "Our enrollment surge is a "Our testament to the hard work of our faculty, staff, and community partners who ensure NWSCC remains a top choice for students seeking academic and workforce development opportunities."

According to NWSCC Assistant Dean of Students, Dr. Amber McCown, the college's growth comes combination from a of expanded athletics increased programs, dual enrollment, greater education distance opportunities, and more

4,943 students, set in fall on-campus program offerings. "What excites program me is that this growth is balanced across so many different areas of the college, and it reflects real momentum for the future" McCown said.





# **How Does City Court** Work?

City court, formally "municipal court" deals with misdemeanors meaning that felony cases can't be heard. On those occasions when a city police officer is involved in a felony arrest the case is handled by either a grand jury or an indictment.

In city court there are no juries, and a judge hears the evidence

and applies the evidence to the law and makes a determination of guilt or innocence to some or all of the charges. Because there is no jury, people who are found guilty have an automatic right to appeal within 14 days. It is a process that must be done both correctly and within the time allowed by law. Once your appeal is "perfected", your case will be heard in the circuit court where you have the right to a jury trial.

I think what a lot of people don't realize about municipal court is that when you show up to contest your ticket, they then set your case for trial meaning that it's going to take two trips to get the job done. A lot of people give up and pay when they find they have to come back for trial. Really that's just part of the process so that the court can set aside the time for a trial and the prosecutor can make arrangements for the witnesses they need.

City courts, depending on the court, can be pretty flexible about how they handle different problems. I was a city court judge and if I had teenager show up with a parent who I thought was taking it pretty seriously, I'd cut them some slack. On the other hand, if I had some kid running 100 miles an hour and not taking it seriously, I would help them take it seriously. You try and do good and maybe it helps.

The flexibility issue can be used to help people in various situations that are important to them. However, once you plead guilty the flexibility is gone so if you're going to try and make a deal to try and protect a job or a military enlistment, the deal has to be made before the plea is entered. In those cases, it is worthwhile hiring a lawyer.



reductions in behavioralhealth resources, less help for kids with disabilities.

Trump's law will reduce funding and change eligibility requirements for the current SNAP food-assistance program, which authorizes children of enrolled families to receive free meals at school. Our politicians never mention any principle or article of our decrepit Constitution because Democrat and Republican alike are busy violating it every day.



the state HAD TO pay attention. What she helped accomplish was amazing.

Frankly, the AL.com State High School Girls Athlete of the Year Award should be named for Noona Kennard. However, that is another discussion deserves its own time from people more knowledgeable than me.

Kennard was an ideal leader of young women at an impressionable age at a critical time. She treated her student athletes like young adults, and she expected professionalism, dignity, class, and effort in return. Opposing coaches and teams knew that her leadership in any competitive situation was an advantage. Her teams were always going to be prepared, disciplined, and ready for adversity. And she'll be the first to tell you she couldn't have accomplished any of it by herself, pointing to many great athletes and others like assistant Joyce Tatum, whom she said helped "every step of the way."

Back to those sports... In addition to the 7 state volleyball titles, there were six runner-up finishes, five championshps in archery, three each in bowling and badminton, a .647 winning percentage in basketball...





What else?

Just think of how many more wins (and titles) her teams could have had if she were able to focus her energies on established girls programs for the first 20 years of her professional career.

Kennerd's influence spilled over, far outside her athletic teams into physical education. Thousands of others looked up to her, those who were as talented as her student athletes, but who developed greater levels of confidence and higher personal goals during a key point in history for women. Kennard's présence alone helped them realize that their abilities and personal aspirations did not and should not take a back seat.

A leader for young women, yes, but also for young people – period. Kennard can't go anywhere in the area without a host of former students and/or their parents recognizing her and thanking her for the impact she has had. She continues to be an active and positive influence on people well into her 90's. I'm sure there are days when she feels slowed and her knees hurt, yet you'll never know it from that engaging smile.

In recent years. you would also be hard pressed to see her without almost legendary 'Whosoever" apparel that

she markets (referencing the New Testament verse, John 3:16) That outgoing personality is what helps

her reach people.

I stopped at Coach
Kennard's house one night in the mid-70's with two of her Bradshaw athletes, one of which I was dating. I was an obscure teen, an outspoken crosstown rival Yellow Jacket, with near shoulder-length hair. She didn't know me outside of my black and gold track uniform from a distance, didn't know if I was good for her player, and certainly didn't know if I was trustworthy enough to be inside her house, yet she welcomed me into her home like I was family. Coach may not even remember that first meeting since we saw one another often at sporting events for a few years afterward. However, that initial gesture has remained with me for 50 years, and it speaks to who she is. She remained that same warmhearted person each time we ran into one another.

Noona Kennard's legacy as a coach and athletic pioneer in this state may be without peer, but that is far from the only reason why she is so highly admired.



# **Medicare Minute** Physician Charges

There are three ways your doctor can be paid if you are on Medicare. The three ways are through Medicare assignment, Medicare excess charges or by not taking Medicare at all. Today we will discuss these three methods

The most common way a physician gets paid is by Medicare assignment. These physicians are called "participating doctors". After the Part B deductible of \$257 is met, participating doctors will accept the Medicare approved amount for their services. These doctors charge Medicare 80% and the beneficiary 20% of the cost of the benefit. For example, if your doctor charges \$200 for a service and Medicare only approves \$100, Medicare would pay 80%, or \$80, and you would be responsible for the other 20%, or \$20.

A "non-participating doctor" can choose to accept or not accept Medicare assignment. If the doctor does not accept Medicare assignment you may have to pay an additional 15% of the cost of the service the doctor provided. This is call a Medicare excess charge. It means you would be responsible for 35% of the Medicare reduced amount instead of 20%. If we follow the example in the previous paragraph, if your doctor charges \$200 for a service and Medicare only approves \$100, Medicare would pay 80%, or \$80, but you would be responsible for 35%, or \$35.

Doctors who opt out of Medicare can charge whatever they want for their services and you are responsible of 100% of the cost. The majority of doctors in north Alabama accept Medicare, so you won't be faced with this situation very often.

Most people who have Medicare also have a supplemental policy that helps cover the 20% Medicare doesn't cover. If you are just entering Medicare and would like to know which policies cover what Medicare doesn't pay, you can contact our office for more information.



Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results we received in August of 2025 show that our system exceeds the standard or maximum contaminant level (MCL) for Total Trihalomethanes (TTHM). The standard for Trihalomethanes is 0.080 mg/L. The chart below lists the locations, disinfectant byproduct and levels that exceeded the maximum contaminant level.

Location	Contaminant	Quarter	Level (mg/L)
1760 Keller Quarry	TTHM	Jul-Sept 2025	0.081

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However, some people who drink water containing total trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

Since the exceedance of total trihalomethanes (TTHMs), several corrective measures have been implemented to improve water quality. Automatic flushers have been installed to maintain fresh water circulation in dead-end lines, helping to reduce stagnation. An evaluation of the current treatment process is also underway to explore alternative chemical options that may reduce TTHM formation. In addition, off-cycle testing will be conducted to ensure ongoing compliance with regulatory standards. In 2024, Sheffield Utilities initiated a comprehensive project study to upgrade the water treatment plant to meet both current and future regulatory requirements. Your drinking water remains safe.






